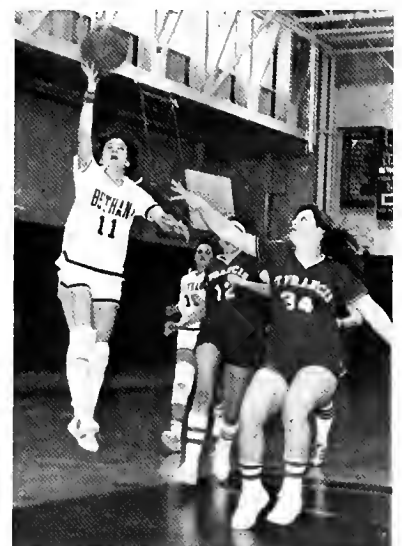

The weekend came to a close with an outdoor concert by Gene Cotton who was at Bethany two years ago.



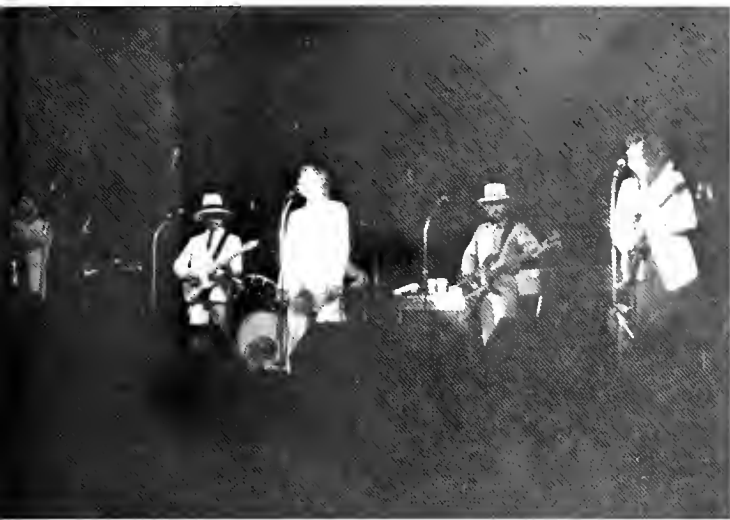

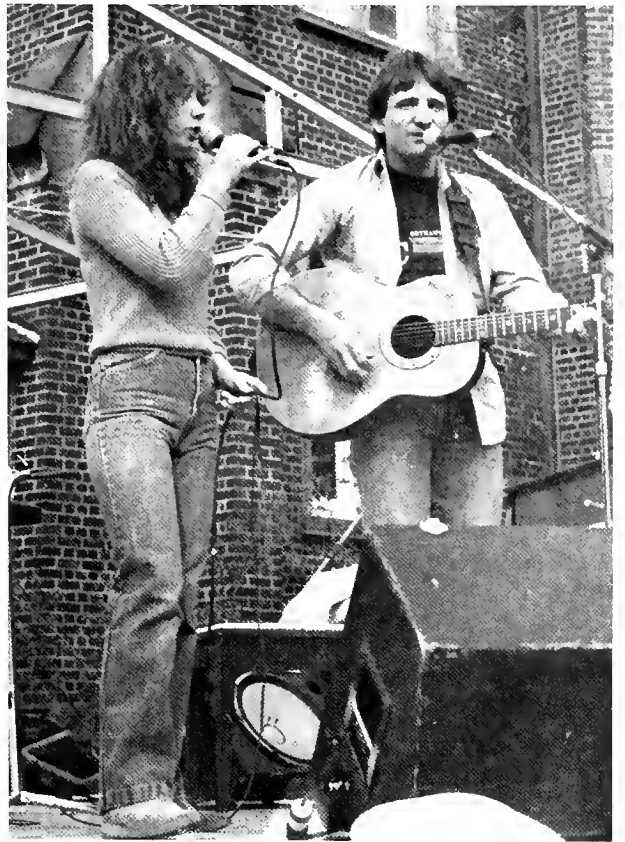
