MATRICULATES OF BETHANY

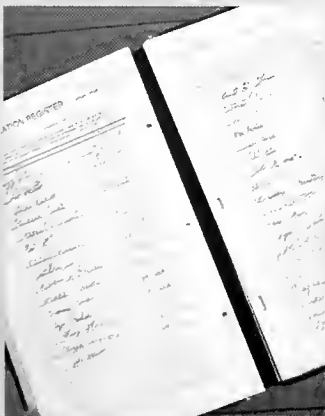
matriculation

Matriculation holds a deep traditional value within Bethany College. Dating back to the beginnings of the college in 1840, it was custom for all students to sign the Matriculation book at the beginning of each academic semester. Along with entering their signature and birthdate, students also included their parents' names and hometown. Over the years, this tradition has changed to encompass only incoming freshmen and transfer students to walk through the Oglebay gates and proceed up to Commencement Hall where the Matriculation ceremony is held each Fall.

To kick off the 2006- 2007 school year SAC sponsored Casino Night to help incoming freshmen meet new people. 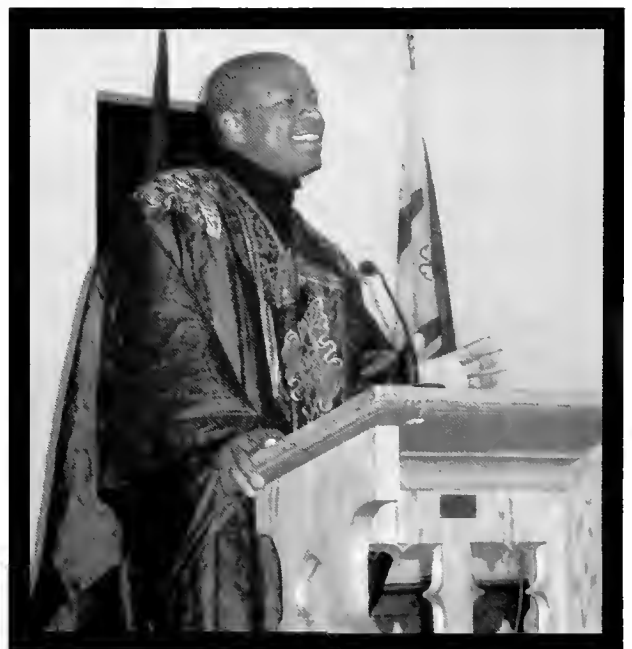

From February 4-10th, Bethany College sponsored (RED) Week to bring awareness about the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Africa. The week was sponsored by the Student National Education Association, Student Activities Council and Brian Fernandez. (RED) offers objects to be purchased and then proceeds from products go towards buying medicine for people in Africa that are infected with HIV/AIDS. Our own Project (RED) supporters organized a fashion show, (RED) Dance, an all red food dinner, raffles selling chocolate bars and tee shirts, and hosted a speaker. Bethany's Project (RED) raised over \$5,000 to support the cause.

Relay for Life was held on November 11, 2006 at the Recreational Center. 186 people participated in the walk which began at 6:30 PM Saturday evening and lasted until 6:00 AM the following Sunday morning. A Luminary Ceremony was held at on Saturday evening and is a ritual that honors those who have struggled with cancer. Throughout the week, students also organized a fashion show, scavenger hunt, tie dying, a corn-hole tournament, and many prizes were raffled off including Pittsburgh Steeler tickets. Many fraternities, sororities, athletic teams and clubs helped out by organizing teams. Relay for Life at Bethany raised \$5,327 in funds for cancer support through the American Cancer Society.

Homecoming 2006 was a huge success for Bethany. Hundreds of students, faculty, staff, alumni, and parents turned out for the day's events.

The Bethany athletic teams were quite successful. The men's soccer team beat Thiel 6-0, while the women's team won 3-1. The volleyball team lost to Thomas More 3-0, but the spirit of the day was not soured. The football tailgate area was packed with tents housing cookouts and reunions. The fraternities, sororities, faculty, and parents made a strong showing as always.

At halftime of the football game, the Homecoming candidates were introduced. Sabrina Iqbal was named 2006 Homecoming Queen, and T. J. Parker was named King. The Bison football team triumphed over Grove City College by a score of 34-28, giving Bethanians all the more reason to celebrate the day. Following the football game was a performance by Missing Pages, an up-and-coming band from Pittsburgh, as tailgating festivities continued throughout the night.

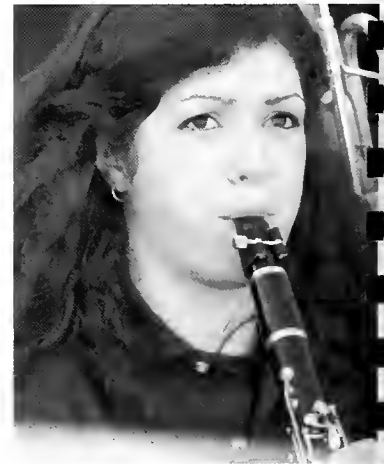

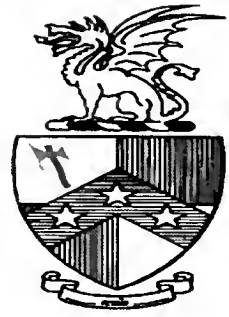

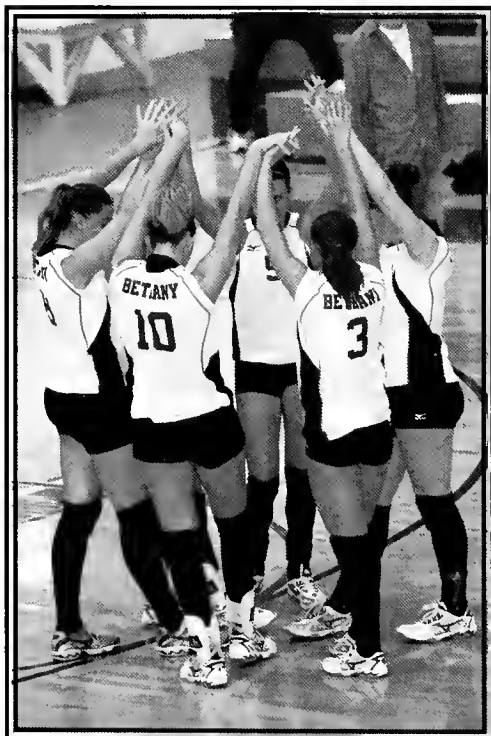

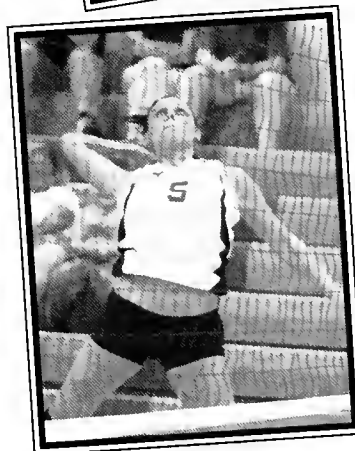

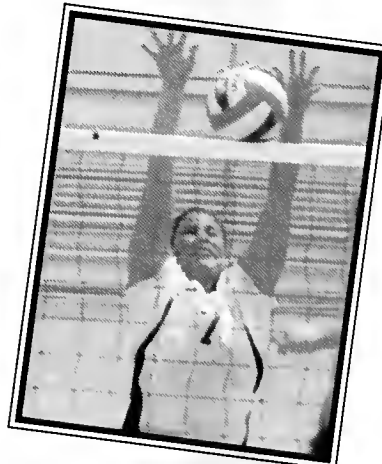

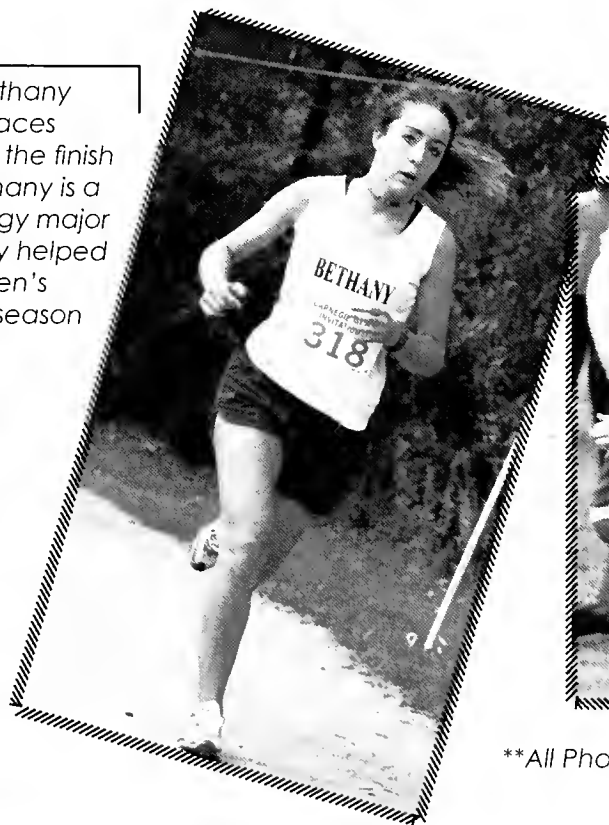

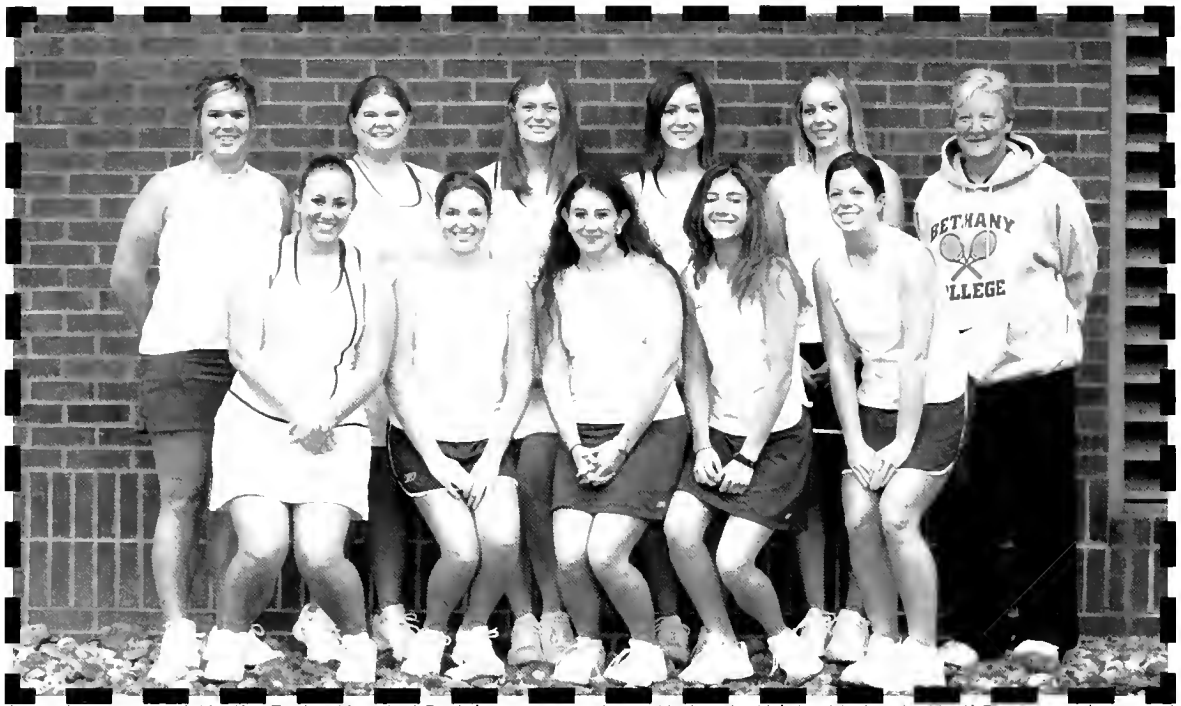

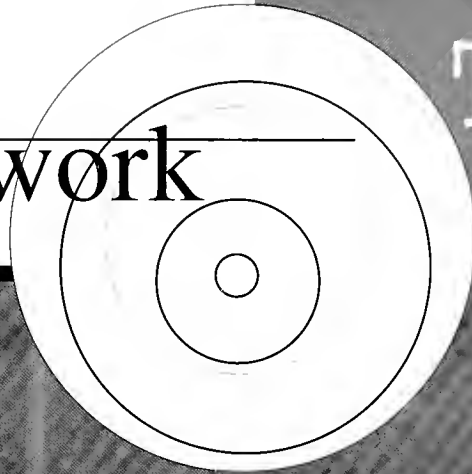

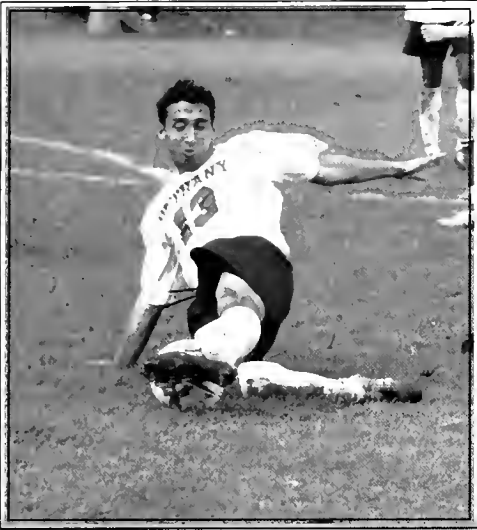

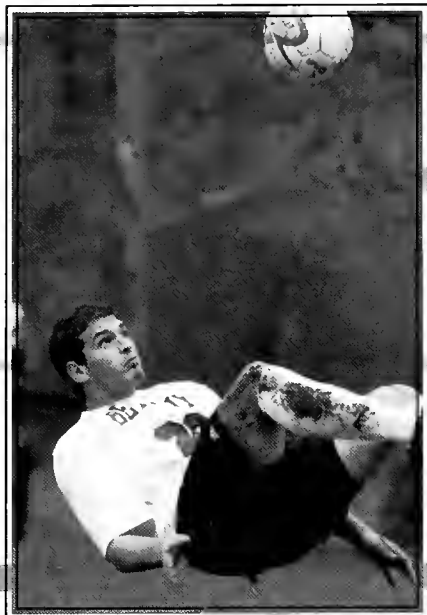

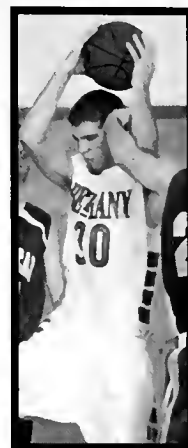

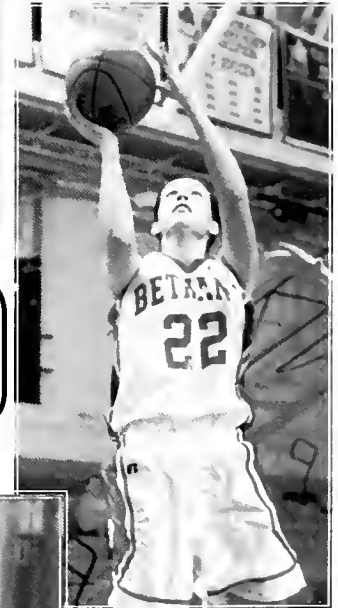
