A.—The money they paid for the corn.

A.—He said Joseph is not, and Simeon is not.
- 28 Q.—Did he say anything about Benjamin?  
A.—Yes, he said they would take Benjamin away, too.
- 29 Q.—What did Jacob's sons then say?  
A.—That they would not go without him.
- 30 Q.—Then what did he say to them?  
A.—My son shall not go with you.
- 31 Q.—When they had eaten all of their food, what did  
Jacob say to his sons?  
A.—Go down to Egypt and buy us food.
- 32 Q.—Who told his father that he would not go without  
Benjamin?  
A.—Judah.
- 33 Q.—What reason did he give?  
A.—That Joseph said they should not see his face without  
Benjamin.
- 34 Q.—What did Judah promise if his father would let  
Benjamin go?  
A.—That he would bring him back.
- 35 Q.—What if he did not bring him back?  
A.—He said he would bear the blame forever.
- 36 Q.—What did Jacob do at last?  
A.—He consented.
- 37 Q.—What made his father consent?  
A.—The want of bread.
- 38 Q.—What did he send by his sons to Joseph?  
A.—A present.
- 39 Q.—When they arrived in Egypt what did Joseph do?  
A.—Commanded the ruler of his house to bring them  
home.
- 40 Q.—What did the steward do for them?  
A.—He gave them water to wash their feet.
- 41 Q.—What did they do when they met Joseph?  
A.—Gave him their father's present.
- 42 Q.—What obeisance did they make?  
A.—They bowed down to the earth.

- 43 Q.—What did Joseph say to Benjamin?  
A.—“God be gracious unto thee my son.”
- 44 Q.—Where did Joseph go to weep?  
A.—Into his chamber.
- 45 Q.—How did he prevent his brothers knowing that he had been weeping?  
A.—He washed his face.
- 46 Q.—Where did he have the men dine?  
A.—At his own table.
- 47 Q.—How did he serve them?  
A.—According to their birthrights.
- 48 Q.—In serving the plates, how much larger was Benjamin's portion than the others?  
A.—Five times.
- 49 Q.—What, besides corn, was put into the men's sacks?  
A.—The money they paid for the corn.

A.—“I know it, my son, I know it.”
- 14 Q.—How was Jacob's eye-sight then?  
A.—Very dim.
- 15 Q.—To which did he give the greater blessing?  
A.—To Ephraim.
- 16 Q.—Who did Jacob call together?  
A.—His sons.
- 17 Q.—For what purpose?  
A.—To bless them.
- 18 Q.—How did he bless them?  
A.—Each one separately.
- 19 Q.—Where did he tell them to bury him?  
A.—In the cave of Macpelah.
- 20 Q.—Who was buried in the cave of Macpelah?  
A.—Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebecca and Leah.
- 21 Q.—After telling them where to bury him, what happened to Jacob?  
A.—He died.
- 22 Q.—What did Joseph do when he saw that his father was dead?  
A.—He fell upon his father's neck and wept.
- 23 Q.—What did he command the physicians to do?  
A.—To embalm his father.
- 24 Q.—How long did it take to embalm him?  
A.—Forty days.

A.—Seventy days.

A.—Pour it on dry ground.

A.—Blood.
- 25 Q.—What excuse did Moses make for not doing as the Lord told him?  
A.—He said he was slow of speech.

A.—He said He would teach him what to say.

A.—No; he made them heavier.
- 53 Q.—What did they say to Moses and Aaron?  
A.—That they were making things worse.

A.—The history of the world.

A.—From the beginning of Nebuchadnezzar's reign.
- 27 Q.—To what time?  
A.—The time we live in.
- 28 Q.—What did it say about this time?  
A.—That God should set up His kingdom.
- 29 Q.—What, in the dream, represents the kingdom of God?  
A.—A little stone.
- 30 Q.—How did the "little stone" seem to Daniel as he saw it in vision?  
A.—To be cut out of a mountain without hands.
- 31 Q.—What did the "little stone" do?  
A.—"It rolled and filled the earth."

- 14 Q.—How did they begin?  
A.—They met together and all went to the king.

- 15 Q.—What did they pretend to him?  
A.—That they wished to do him honor.
- 16 Q.—In what way were they going to do it?  
A.—By having all prayers and petitions made to him?
- 17 Q.—For what length of time?  
A.—Thirty days.
- 18 Q.—Would they allow nobody to pray to God?  
A.—Neither to God nor man, except the king.
- 19 Q.—How did they accomplish it?  
A.—They wrote a decree.
- 20 Q.—What did they do with the decree?  
A.—They asked the king to sign it.
- 21 Q.—How were those who broke that law to be punished?  
A.—Thrown into a den of lions.
- 22 Q.—How did they plead with the king to sign it?  
A.—They said, “that it might be like the law of the Medes and Persians.”
- 23 Q.—How were the laws of the Medes and Persians?  
A.—They could not be altered.
- 24 Q.—When the king signed the decree, did he know what they were doing?  
A.—He never once thought of it.
- 25 Q.—What did Daniel do when he heard of the decree?  
A.—Just as he always did.
- 26 Q.—How was that?  
A.—He knelt and prayed.
- 27 Q.—How many times in a day?  
A.—Three times: morning, noon and night.
- 28 Q.—What did he think of the decree?  
A.—He was not afraid of it.
- 29 Q.—Why not afraid of a king’s decree?  
A.—He trusted in God.
- 30 Q.—Who told the king that Daniel prayed to God?  
A.—The wicked men that got up the decree?
- 31 Q.—What did they say to the king?  
A.—That Daniel did not respect him, nor his decree.
- 32 Q.—What did they say about his prayers?  
A.—That he prayed to his God three times a day.

33 Q.—How did they know of his praying?

A.—He had his windows open.

34 Q.—How did the king feel when they told him?

A.—Angry with himself.

35 Q.—Why was he angry with himself?

A.—Because he had been foolish enough to sign that cruel decree.

36 Q.—How long did he try to save Daniel?

A.—Till the sun went down.

37 Q.—Who kept all the time urging him to have Daniel put into the den?

A.—The men who wanted Daniel destroyed.

38 Q.—When they forced the king to yield, what did he do?

A.—He ordered that Daniel should be put into the den.

39 Q.—How did the king speak to Daniel?

A.—He told him his God would save him.

40 Q.—What did the king do after Daniel was cast into the den?

A.—He fasted, and was awake all night.

41 Q.—When did he haste and go to the den of lions?

A.—Early in the morning.

42 Q.—How did he cry to Daniel?

A.—In a sorrowful voice.

43 Q.—What did he say?

A.—O Daniel, servant of the living God!

A.—Good and happy.

A.—Because they obeyed their father.
- 16 Q.—What else pleased Him?  
A.—That they would not tell a lie.
- 17 Q.—Why did the Lord tell the prophet to give wine to them?  
A.—To let them show what they would do.
- 18 Q.—Did not the Lord know what they would do?  
A.—The Lord did, but the people did not.
- 19 Q.—Do you think the Lord ever tries us?

A.—Revelation from God.
- 9 Q.—What did Jesus say He would give to Peter?  
A.—The keys of the kingdom of heaven.
- 10 Q.—What did Jesus say should be bound in heaven?  
A.—What Peter bound on earth.
- 11 Q.—What are the keys which Jesus gave to Peter?  
A.—The authority of the Holy Priesthood.
- 12 Q.—Who now holds the keys that Peter held?  
A.—The President of the Church of Jesus Christ.

A.—That He was the bread of life.

A.—The sacrament.

A.—Because it was evening when Jesus partook of it last.
- 40 Q.—Why do the Latter-day Saints partake of the sacrament?  
A.—The Lord has commanded them to partake of it often.
- 41 Q.—What do we keep in remembrance by it?  
A.—The death and sufferings of Jesus.
- 42 Q.—How does the Lord say we must partake of it?  
A.—Without feeling any hardness towards anyone.
- 43 Q.—What is His promise if we partake of it as we should?  
A.—That our sins shall be forgiven.

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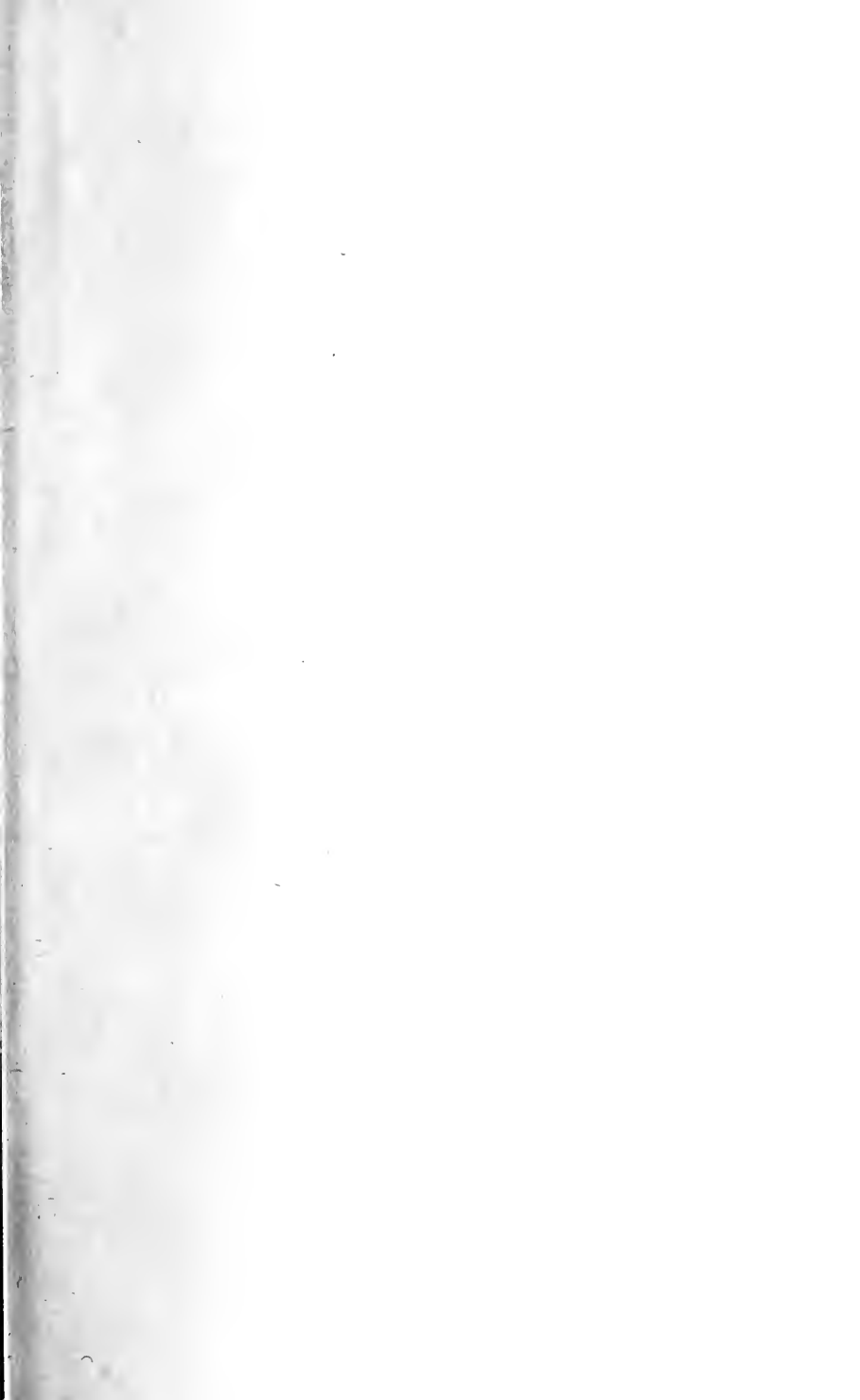
This book is not designed to be placed in the hands of children for them to study, but to assist those who have charge of the children.

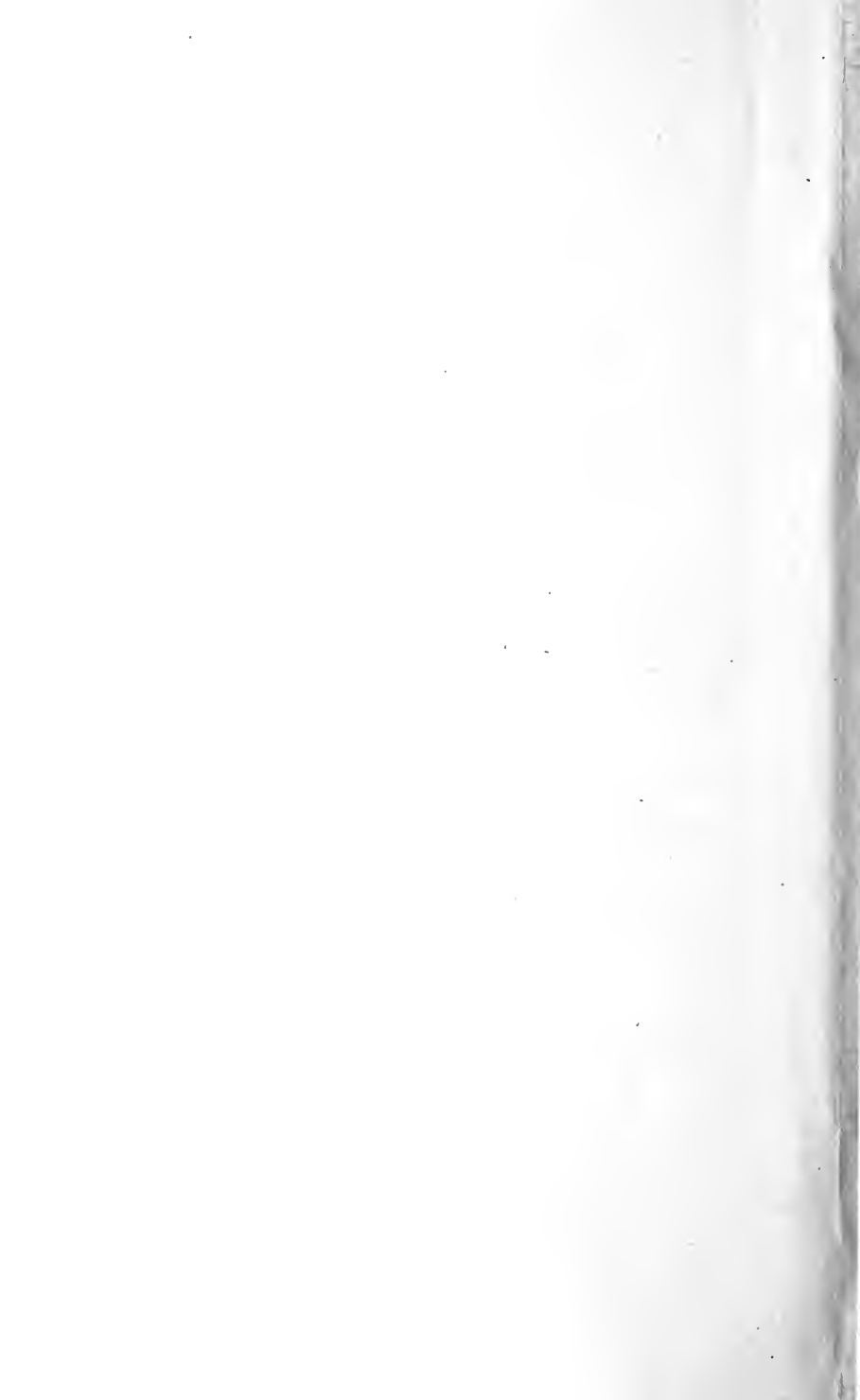
