





### REPORT OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

DEPARTMENT OF STATE,
OCTOBER 10, 1884.

To his Excellency, JEREMIAH M. RUSK.

Governor of the State of Wisconsin:

SIR:—In conformity with the laws of the State of Wisconsin prescribing the duties of the Secretary of State, I have the honor to submit the biennial report of this department, showing the condition of the several funds, a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures during the biennial fiscal term closing September 30, 1884. The report also includes various statistical tables and other information of interest to the people of the State.

#### GENERAL FUND.

This fund embraces all the revenue of the State applicable to the payment of the ordinary expenses of the State Government.

The sources from which it is derived are the annual State tax, tax on civil actions, licenses of railroad companies, plank road companies, telegraph companies, insurance companies, hawkers and peddlers, notary public fees, office fees and sales of laws and reports. The expenditures therefrom are authorized by permanent and temporary appropriations, and by the several laws requiring the Secretary of State to audit accounts. A detailed statement of the transactions in this fund will be found in Appendix "A."

#### SCHOOL FUND.

#### The School Fund is composed of:

- 1. Proceeds of lands granted by United States for support of schools.

- All moneys accruing to the state by forfeiture or escheat.
   All penalties for trespass on school lands.
   All fines collected in the several counties for breaches of penal laws.
   All moneys paid as an exemption from military duty.
   Five per cent. of net proceeds of sales of United States public lands.

#### SCHOOL FUND INCOME.

The interest received on School Fund investments and on the principal due for sales of school lands, constitute the School Fund Income. The amount of this Fund in the Treasury on the 1st day of June, is annually certified by the Secretary of State to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, and by him apportioned, under the provisions of section 554 of the Revised Statutes, among the several counties of the State, for the use of common schools in the manner provided by law. The apportionment is made according to the number of children in each town, village and city, over the age of four and under the age of twenty years, as shown by the report of the State Superintendent during the year preceding.

#### UNIVERSITY FUND.

The proceeds of sales of land granted by the United States to Wisconsin for the support of the State University by Acts of Congress, approved June 12, 1838, August 6, 1846, and December 12, 1852, form the University Fund. The principal or capital, excepting the small cash balance in the State Treasury, is productive, drawing interest mainly at seven per cent.

The number of acres of unsold land is 1,791.

#### UNIVERSITY FUND INCOME.

This fund is derived chiefly from the annual tax levy authorized by section 390, Revised Statutes, and from the interest on University land certificates and loans, and is perpetually appropriated to the support and endowment of the State University by section 389, Revised Statutes. By provisions of said section, this entire fund is placed at the disposal of the Board of Regents by transfer to the Treasurer of said Board, and the detailed record of its expenditures is

#### AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE FUND.

The proceeds of sales of 240,000 acres of land granted by the United States to the State by act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, for the support of an institution of learning, where shall be taught the principles of agriculture and mechanic arts, form the Agricultural College Fund. The number of acres of unsold land is 13,205.

The cash receipts and disbursements during the last two years have been as follows:

## TAXES FOR DEFRAYING EXPENSES FOR YEARS 1886 AND 1887.

As will be seen by the estimates of receipts and expenditures, based on preceding years, there will be no necessity of levying a state tax for general purposes for either of these years. In case, however, the legislature makes extraordinary appropriations, it will be necessary to make provision for the same.

### Apportionment of Taxes.

### STATE TAX FOR GENERAL PURPOSES.

Chapter 195, laws of 1883, authorizes the levying of \$240,000 as a state tax for 1884, in addition to taxes required to be raised by section 247 and 260 Revised Statutes, which sums are for school purposes, and chapter 300, laws of 1883, for University fund. With the amount now in the State Treasury, together with the increased revenues from licenses paid by railway, insurance, telegraph and telephone companies, with minor sums received from other sources, which will be amply sufficient to defray the expenses of the state during the ensuing year, I have concluded to make no apportionment of this \$240,000 to the various county clerks, believing that in so doing the interests of the tax payers will be best subserved; that it is contrary to good public policy to levy a tax to lie idle in the vaults of the State Treasury. It would seem advisable that chapter 195, laws of 1883, be repealed.

### APPORTIONMENT OF TAXES.

The Secretary of State is required by section 1070, of the Revised Statutes, to certify to the county clerk of each county, on or before the second Monday of October in each year, the amount of State Tax and Special Charges apportioned to and levied upon his county. In this certificate are to be included the amounts due from counties for the support of persons in the Hospitals for the Insane and the Industrial School for Boys. These amounts are obtained from reports made by the State Board of Supervision to the Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 21, chapter 298, laws of 1881. The time prescribed in said chapter for reporting to the Secretary of State is the twentieth of October, which is after the latest date when the Secretary must certify the same to the county clerks. The law should be

### BOUNTY ON WILD ANIMALS.

The legislature of 1883 so amended the law relating to bounties on wild animals, that it now devolves upon the county, wherein the animal was killed, to pay to the claimant for bounty a sum equal to that paid by the State. This, with the cutting off of bounties on foxes, and reduction of one dollar per scalp on wolves, has materially reduced the amount paid by the State compared to the year 1882.





DEPARTMENT OF STATE, October 10, 1884.

To His Excellency, JEREMIAH M. RUSK, Governor of the State of Wisconsin:

SIR: We have the honor to submit herewith our biennial report for the term ending September 30, 1884.

The important operations of this department during the two years last past, aside from the routine work required by law, have been the completion of the printing and binding of the Geological Reports of the State, the purchase of paper and the letting of the state printing contract beginning January 1, 1885, for two years.

#### STATE PRINTITG.

The state printing contract with David Atwood was completed December 31st, 1882, and since that time the Democrat Printing Company, of Madison, the successful bidders for doing the state printing for two years from that date, have done the work.

On July 22d of the present year, the commissioners having previously advertised in accordance with law, met in

The Democrat Printing Company, of Madison, having bid the greatest per centum of discount from the maximum rates as set forth in chapter 20 of the Revised Statutes, was awarded the contract according to law. It will be seen that the next contract, which begins January 1, 1885, is not quite as low as the present one, but we consider it a very reasonable bid.

#### PURCHASE OF PAPER.

On account of the change in the law, providing for the printing of public documents, agricultural and other reports, the number of copies of the latter two being greatly increased, the demand for paper has of course increased correspondingly. We managed, however, by economical management, and by utilizing much of the surplus stock on hand and by a few light purchases, to run through the year 1883 without advertising for a general stock. On the 1st of August of the present year, the commissioners advertised for a stock of paper according to law, and on the 2nd day of September the commissioners met in the secretary of state's office and opened the bids.

### Stationery — General Expenditures.

SUMMARY OF THE REPORT OF THE SUPERIN-TENDENT OF PUBLIC PROPERTY FOR THE TWENTY-ONE MONTHS FROM JANUARY 1, 1883, TO SEPTEMBER 30, 1884.

Office of Superintendent of Public Property, Madison, Wis., September 30, 1884.

To His Excellency J. M. Rusk, Governor:

I have the honor herewith to submit the following report of the affairs pertaining to this office for the period commencing January 1, 1883, and terminating September 30, 1884.

#### STATIONERY.

As shown by inventory submitted with the report of this office for the year ending January 1, 1883, there were stationery supplies in my hands at that date to the value of \$3,725.47. There has come into my hands by purchase, during the period covered by this report, stationery to the value of \$2,970.30, as shown by statement of purchases herewith, marked "Exhibit A." There has been disbursed to the state and legislative officers the amount of \$4,656.12, shown by accompanying detailed statement, marked "Exhibit B." leaving on hand at this date the amount of \$2,039.65, an inventory of which is submitted with the full report.

The legislature of 1883 appropriated for the purchase of stationery for the use of state officers for the years 1883 and 1884, and for the legislative officers of 1885, the sum of \$6,000. Of that sum there remains in the treasury unexpended at this date the sum of \$3,029.70. Most of this will be expended to pay for stationery contracted for, and that must be purchased before another appropriation can be made.

#### GENERAL EXPENDITURES.

The expenditures through this office under Chap. 293 of the Revised Statutes, have been swelled during the period cov-

ered by this report beyond what has been usual, by reason of the disaster to the south extension of the capitol last November. Under advice of the Governor, expenses of burying the killed and caring for the wounded and their families have been paid by the state to the extent of \$5,117.04. other ways the enlargement of the capitol has tended to increase the labors and expenses of this office. Additional laborers have been necessary, and most of the north extension has been provided with new furniture necessary to its occupancy. Expenses incident to the session in the capitol of the National Educational Association last July; the rebuilding of the west portico and steps of the capitol, found necessary for the safety of that portion of the building; and the extension and repairing of the asphaltum walks and drive-ways in the park, are other extraordinary expenses during the past year.

The total expenditures since my report of January 1, 1883, other than for stationery, were as shown by statement herewith, marked "Exhibit C."

#### FURNITURE.

The value of furniture and other movable property in the capitol can only be estimated as heretofore. Adding the amount purchased since the last report to the estimated value of what was then on had, and deducting from the product ten per cent. per annum for wear and tear and breakage, will perhaps give as nearly as practicable the value of such property in and about the capitol at this date, as follows:

#### FUEL.

The fuel supply for the coming year has been contracted for but not yet delivered. The enlargement of the capitol

increases the consumption of fuel about one-third, and provision has been made accordingly. The amount on hand at this date is estimated to be 150 tons of coal, valued at \$1,200. About six hundred tons per annum is the quantity estimated to be necessary for the enlarged building. About 400 tons was the amount annually consumed previous to the building of the extensions.

#### BOOKS, PAMPHLETS, ETC.

Since January 1st, 1883, twelve thousand copies of Volume 1, and four thousand copies of Volume 4 of the report of the Geological Survey of the State have come into the custody of this office, and have been disposed of according to law. One thousand copies of each volume were reserved for sale as the law directs. But few have thus far been sold, the remainder, being, at this date, in charge of this office.

There has been realized from the sale of geological reports and other books the sum of \$664.45, which has been paid over to the state treasurer.

Two hundred copies of Shepard's Digest, purchased pursuant to chapter 243, laws of 1883, have been distributed as that statute provided. The session laws of 1883, and the report of the State Agricultural Society for 1884, received by this office since my last report, have been disposed of as the law requires. Of the latter, (12,000 copies) about one-half were delivered to the secretary of the Agricultural Society, pursuant to chapter 320, laws of 1883.

Any statement of the number and value of books and documents in charge of this office must be merely an estimate. On January 1st, 1883, the estimated value of this class of property on hand was \$34,833.25. The additions since that date, less disbursements, show that there is now on hand such property to the value of about \$37,500.00 Most of this property being subject to distribution, no attempt had been made or required up to two years ago to keep even so much as an approximate account of it.


