Mr. ROSENBERG introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

For the purchase of the Oldroyd collection of Lincoln relics, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, or so
4 much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated,
5 out of any money in the United States Treasury not other-
6 wise appropriated, for the purchase of the entire Oldroyd col-
7 lection of Lincoln relics, containing three thousand pieces,
8 more or less, and for the acquisition, by purchase, condemna-
9 tion, or otherwise, of the premises known as number five
10 hundred and fourteen and five hundred and eighteen Tenth
11 street northwest, Washington, District of Columbia, adjoin-
12 ing the government property known as the house in which
13 President Lincoln died, and for the removal of such adjoining
14 houses, beautifying and parking the grounds, making fire-

1 proof the house in which the said relics are stored, and for the
2 erection of a suitable and adequate addition or wings to the
3 aforesaid Lincoln house.

4 SEC. 2. That the amount herein appropriated shall be
5 disbursed and expended under the direction of the official in
6 charge of public buildings and grounds of the District of
7 Columbia.
