A BILL

Providing for the establishment and payment of claims for property taken or informally and unwarrantably impressed for the use of the Government.

SECTION 1. The Congress of the Confederate States of America do 1 2 enact. That it shall be the duty of the Secretary of War to 3 appoint or assign, in each Congressional District, an agent, not liable to military duty in the field, who shall, under the direction 4 of the post quartermaster, receive, takes proof in support of, õ 6 and examine all claims in the said district growing out of property heretofore taken or informally and unwarrantably impressed 7 for the use of the Government or the army, and report the facts S of each ease to the proper bureau for such action thereon as may 9 be just and proper in the premises. 11)

1 SEC. 2. In case the head of the bureau, to whom the report 1 provided for in the first section of this act shall be made, shall 3 be of opinion that any such claim is just and ought to be paid, 4 he shall forthwith order the same to be paid in such manner as is 5 now provided by law in other cases.
