SENATE, November 22, 1864.—Read first and second times and referred to Committee on Commerce. Nov. 28, 1864 —Reported with an amendment, and bill and amendment ordered to be printed.

A BILL

To exempt the cargoes of vessels owned by the States of the Confederacy from existing restrictions upon exports and imports.

1 SECTION 1. *The Congress of the Confederate States of America do*
2 *enact*, That the cargoes of all vessels owned or chartered by any
3 of the States of the Confederacy or by the executive authorities
4 thereof, are exempted from the provisions of the several acts
5 entitled "An act to prohibit the importation of luxuries or of
6 articles not necessaries or of common use," approved the 6th day
7 of February, 1864, and "An act to impose regulations upon the
8 foreign commerce of the Confederate States to provide for the
9 public defence," approved the 6th day of February, 1864.

A BILL

To exempt the interest of the States of the Confederacy in the cargoes of all vessels from existing restrictions upon exports and imports.

1 SECTION 1. *The Congress of the Confederate States of America do*
2 *enact*, That the interests of the States of the Confederacy in the
3 cargoes of all vessels are exempted from the provisions of the
4 acts entitled, "An act to prohibit the importation of luxuries or
5 of articles not necessities or of common use," approved Febru-
6 ary 6th, 1864, and "An act to impose regulations upon the
7 foreign commerce of the Confederate States to provide for the
8 public defence," approved February 6th, 1864.
