## ABILL

To provide additional Clothing and Privileges to Troops in the Field.

1 Whereas the armies of the Confederate States of America, unawed by the powerful combinations of our enemies, or the fearful depreciation of the national currency, continue to pre-3 sent an instance of lofty patriotism and self-sacrificing fidelity, 4 unexampled in the history of wars; and whereas it is the duty 5 of this government to extend to all its actual defenders alike every respect and consideration, and to provide them with every 7 personal comfort not incompatible with the interests of the public service: Therefore, 9 Section 1. The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That the non-commissioned officers, musicians and 2 privates of the confederate armies in the field, exclusive of re-3 serves, details, and those absent without leave, shall be provided 4 each with one complete suit of uniform clothing. to be presented 5 them by the government, in addition to their present pay and 6 allowances, as an expression of the gratitude of the nation for

- s their gallantry, their sacrifices and their unflinching devotion to
- 9 the country.
- 1 Sec. 2. All officers and soldiers of the Confederate States
- 2 armies, who volunteered previous to the passage of the con-
- 3 scription act, April 16th, 1862, and who have since been cou-
- 4 tinuously in the army, except while absent on leave, or because
- 5 of sickness or disability, or when detained by imprisonment,
- 6 shall be entitled to wear, in consideration of their long service,
- 7 such distinguishing mark or badge as the President or Secretary
- ~ of War shall designate.
