LEAGUE OF NATION IS IN BALANCE

SECESSION OF GREAT BRITAIN IMMINENT.
BIG FOUR HOLDS SECRET SESSION.
CRISIS NOT PASSED.

(Associated Press.)

Paris, May 30. The Big Four in the executive council of the League of Nations held a two hours' secret session this morning, at which the threatened secession of Great Britain and Germany was discussed. All four refused to talk for publication, but their troubled faces show that the danger of another world war has not yet been averted. Ex-Chief Justice Ernest BfuKin, representing the United States, has not slept for ninety-two hours in his ceaseless effort to bring about reconciliation. All eyes are turned on the man of the hour.

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION

California Stirred—Senator Clegg
Speaks to 20,000—Audience
Spellbound.

(Associated Press.)

Nearby, Cal., May 29.—Last night at the Skylight Coliseum Senator Hugh H. Clegg, the originator of the "Three Fold Education Bill," spoke to twenty thousand prominent citizens of California in the interest of international education.

Senator Clegg held his audience for six hours while he expounded his doctrine of "honor to ourselves and justice to our children" by "passing on to posterity the highest type of manhood. We owe it to ourselves, we owe it to our country, we owe it to society, yea, we owe it to our God who made us, to develop the future generation spiritually, intellectually, and physically," the Senator said in conclusion.

Senator Clegg of Mississippi is one of the nation's foremost lawmakers, and majority leader of the Democratic party in the Senate.

Dippy Ducky and Prep would win.

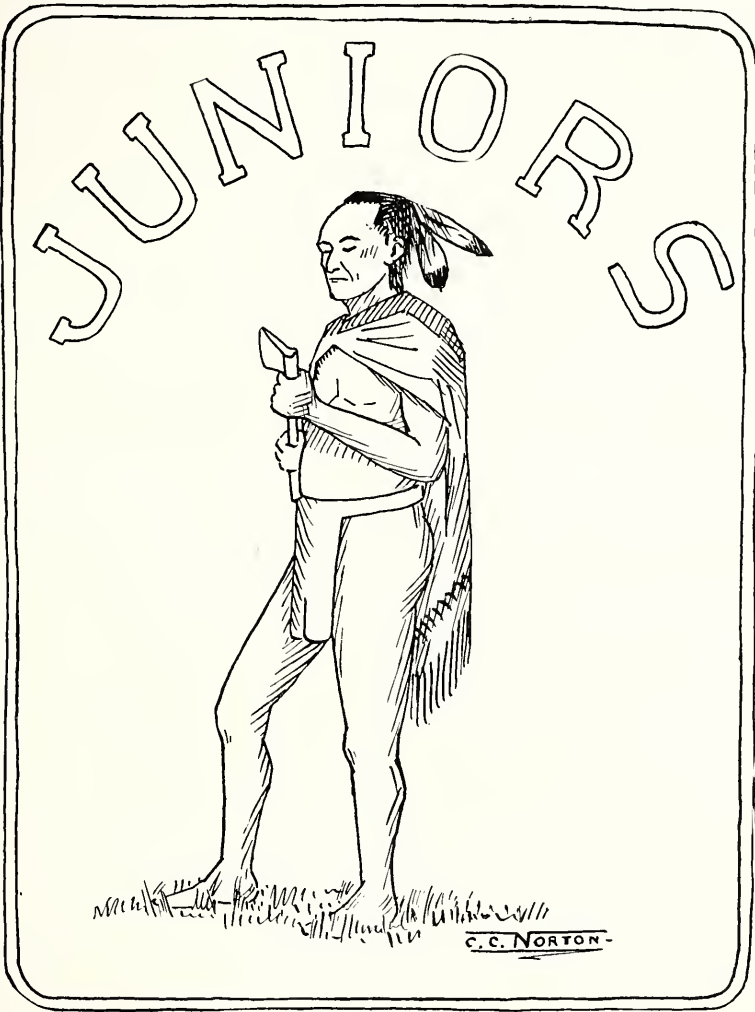

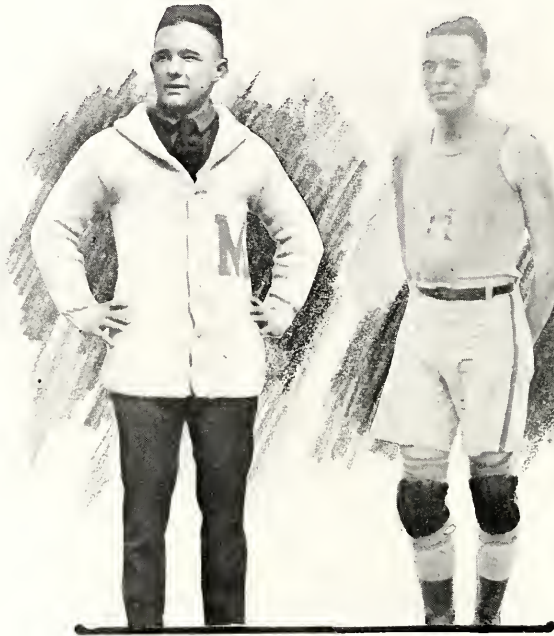
SOPHOMORES DEFEAT JUNIOR-SENIORS. 14 to 0
