## ECLIPSES FOR THE YEAR 1879.

There will be three Eclipses this year，two of the Sun，and one of the Moon．
The first will be an Annular Eclipse of the Sun，on January 22nd，at 6 o＇clock 1 min ．in the morning；invisible here；visible in South America，Atlantic ocean， and Africa．

The second is an annular Eclipse of the Sun，on July the 19th，at 3 o＇clock 25 min．in the morning；invisible here；visible in Europe，Africa，and Indian ocean．

The third is a partial Eclipse of the Moon on December the 28th，at 10 o＇clock 42 min ．in the forenoon，therefore invisible．

## CENTENNIAL ALIMANAC FOR 1879.

## mercury is the ruling planet tiī́s year．

The following is an extract from the＂Centennial Almanac＂for the jear 1879.

Mercury is this year the reigning planet．
Tear in general．Is more dry and cold than warm，and seldom fruitful．

Spling．The end of March will be warm，April， until the 25 th，dry，afterwards cold；May will have some cold days in the commencement，so that the fruit will be in danger．

Summer．Will have a good deal of rain，by which the earth will，however，not be properly refreshed． The hay and grain can be brought in pretty well， though it will be best not to deliy with it．

Actome．In the commencement there will be a great deal of rain and there will be early frost；but when the half of October is past，there will be dry weather，until the commencement or advent．

Winter．After a pleasant autumn，winter will fall in suddenly in the commencement of December；it will be cold，and snow until February，which will ap－ pear rather mild；but from the middle on to the 4 th of March it will be cold；and from thence on to the termination，storms and tempests will take place．

Cultivation of Spring Grain．Will succeed pretty well．It is a favorite year for barley．Oats peas and other leguminous plants must be sown when the ground is neither too dry nor too wet and damp． Hemp and llax will be good，but the hemp will re－ main short．

Cultivation of Winter Grain．Is various．If the summer of the preceding ycar was very warm， Wheat and rye will in the present year yield largely in straw，but little in the grain；but if the preceding year was humid，they will yield well in the grain．Rye and wheat will be endangered in the blossoming．

Audest Seeding．The carly and the late will be the best；the middle one will be consumed by the fies．The early sown grain can be pastured by the sheep in the Spring，but the late sown not．
Fruir．In some places it will grow abundantly， in some places tolerably，and in others there will be none at all．
Hors．Wrill not be abundant nor strong．
Grare Culture seldom succeeds；probably in five or six years once；is always rough，whe if ever it promise faisty in the spring，it seldom produces any－ thing good；for two unproductive years will follow yet，viz．，that of the Moon and Saturn．
Tempests and Thendenausts．The east wind will be the most prevalent，sometimes the west，but seldom the north wind：during the summer there will be but few thundergusts．
Fisies．There wili bo but few fish in the streams during the summer；in autumn they will increase
Diseases．Can be cured only slowly in this year， and they prevail mostly in the spring und latter part of autumn．Epidemic diseases generally prevail among the cattle this year．

## INTRODUCTORY.

Another year of our era is draving to a close, and will, ere long be numbered with the past. The new and apprnaching one will bring to all who live to see, labors to be performed and trials to be endured It will bring many of our race into existence, and witaess the departure of many from time to eternity. The rapid flight of time is very generally acknowledged, but its solemn and practical lessons not so geuerally beeded.

A mong the conveniences of life is the Almanac We have in acrordance with our custom, prepared our family and church Almanac for 1879, and offer it to our Fraternity and the public We have endeavored to make it as complete in its different departments as possible, and hope it will not be found inferiur to any of its predecessors Our purpose har been, and will be still to improve in this as in all our productions.

In addition to the common ountents of an Almanac, we have added such reading matter as we hope will be useful and edifying to the families into which it is introduced. The ministerial list being a desideratum in our work, a considerable part of it is occupied with it, and we have tried to make it as complete and correct as possible.

The favor which the Brethren's Almanac has met with from both our Fraternity and the public is appreciated, and a liberal patronage is solicited.

## OUR CHURCH HISTORY.

In almost all histories of the religious denominations, when a description of our church is given we find it, in some way or other, grossly misrepresented, or mixed up with some other scet. The following, as given in Prof. Roswell D. Hitcheock's "Dictiouary of Religinus Denominations" is the nearest correct of anythiog we have yet seeu, and in order that historians and others may have a more correct idea of us, we publish it in our Almavae:
"Tuniers - From the German Tunken, 'to dip.' Also called l)unkers. Call themselves the 'Cburch of the Brethren.' Originated in Germany in 1708, and were severely persecuted. In 1719 began to emigrate to I'onnsylvania; and in 1799 the whole church had come over. Now fount in fifteen of the United States, though most numerons in Penesylvania, Maryland, Virginia, Ohio and Ludiana, and namber about 100,000 commanicants. Baptism is by trine-iw'uersion, and administered only to believers. The Lord's supper is celebrated in the evening, with fectwashiag. Tae Kiss of charity is giren. There
is also tha laying on of handy and the noointiog the sick with oil, when desirel. Ministers are ehosen from the deacons and laity. No special training is prescribed, and an fixed salaries are paid, but ministrers are supporled, and the poor are provided for.

Goose--Bone Weather Predictions. - The goose-bone is more closely, watched in Keutucky than in any other part of the country. It has been hauted down among the carly traditions of the State, and may be called the Kentucky weather prophet. It is to be found in most Kentucky conntry homes, and iu many parts of the State the farmers consult it, and prepare for handling their crops in accordance with its readings. The prophecy of the goose-bone does not extend beyond the year in which the goose was batcbed, and the prediction is for the three winter months only. 'Take the breast bone of a last spring's goose and divide it into three equal parts, and the different divisions will represent December, January and February. The breast bone of a goose is translucent, aud if clear when held up to the light, the weather will be mild and pleasant; but if covered with cloud like blots it will be gloomy and cold; the heavier the blots the colder will be the weather.

## TRIALS OF EARLY GERMAN EMIGRANTS

## Monored and Beloved Sir:-

Confidence in
your wisdom and clemency made me so free as to write this letter to you. I would not have that anybody stould know these privatelines, otherwise it would have become me to get a hand who is able to write in a proper manner and style to a person as your station requireth.

It is now thirty gears since $I$ came to this province, out of a country where no liberty of conscience was, nor humanity reigned in the house of my then country lord, and where all the people is owned wlth their bodies to the lord there, and are obliged to work for him six days in every week, viz.: three days with a horso, and three days with a hoe, shovel or spade; or if he cannot come hifnself, he miust send somebody in his room, (or stead). And when I came this provinee and found everything to the concrary from where I came from, I wroce largely to all my friends and acquaintances of the civil and religious liberty, privileges, \&c., and of the goodness 1 have heard and seen, and my letters were printed and re-printed, and provoked many a thousand people to come to thas province, and many thanked the Lord for it, and desired their friends also again to come here.

Some years the price was five pistols $\ddagger$ per head freight, and the merchants and captains crowded for passengers, fiuding more profit by passangers than by goods, de.

But the love for great gain caused that Steal. man lodged the poor passengers like herrings, a ad as too many hod not room between decks, he kept abundance of them upon deck; and sailing to the southward, where the people were at once out of their climate, and for the want of water and room, became sick and dipl very fast, in su:h a manner that in one year no less than tho thousand was buried in the seas ard Philadelphia. Steadman, at that time, bought a leense in Holland that no capt:in or merchant could load any as long as he had not two thousand loaded. Tuis murdering trade made my hear ache, especially, when I heard that there was more profit by their death than by carrging thee alive. I thought of my provoking lewters teing patty the cause of so many people's dealb. I wrote a letter to the magistrate at Rotterdam, and immediately the Monopolium wastaken from John Steadnam.


Our Legislature was also petitioned, and a law was made as good as it is, but was never executed. Mr. Spaffort, an old, poor captain, was wade oversecr for the vessels that eame loaded with passengers, whose salary came to from $\$ ? 00$ to $\$ 300$ a year, for concealing the fact that sometimes the poor people had but twelve inches place, and not balf bread nor water: Spaffort died, and our Aesembly chose one Mr. Trotter who left evers ship slip, although he seen that a great many people had no room at all, except in the long boat, where every man perished. There were so many complaints. so that many in Philadelphia and almost all Germantown signed a petition that our Assembly might give that oflice to one Thomas Say, an English merchaut, at Puiladelphia, of whom we have the confidence that he would take no bribe for concealing what the poor poople suffered; or, if they will not turn Mr. Trotter out of office, to give him an assistance of one !aniel Mackinett, a shop keeper in Philadelphia, who speaks Dutch and Englisu, who wight speale with the people in their language-but in vain, except they have done what I know not.

Among other grievances the poor Germans suffer is one, viz: that when tho ignorant Germans agrees fairly with merchants at Holland for seven pistols and a half, when they eowe to Philadelphia the merchants mabe them pay what they please, and take at least nine pistols. The poor people on board are prisoners. They durst not go ashore, or have their chests delisered, except they allow in a boul or pay what they owes not; and when they go into the country, they loudty complain there, that no justiec is to be had for poor strangers. T'sey now their agreementw, wherein is fairly mentioned that they are to pay seven pisto's and a half to Isaac and Kachary Hoke, at Rotterdam, or their order at lhiladelpha, dre., and as this is so much practiced, that at least 2000 or 3000 pounds in each yerr the cuntry is wronged from. It was much desired that among wholesome laws, such a one may be rade that when such vessels arrier, that a commissioner might be appointed to inspect into their agree:n nt and judge if $7 \frac{1}{2}$ pistols mabe not seren and $u$ half. Some of the Ascmblymen was askut whether there was 110 remedy: 'They unswered, "the law is such that what is above forty shithings must be decided at court, and crery doe mat make his own cause appear good and inat a til.al." A very pour comfori fur two ar three thmenand wroeged people, to live at the diseretion of thecir merchants. They ane solonging toy inan and fill ouce their bells, that they allair aid ity what

adjourned, I was desirous to know what was done concerning the Dutch bill, an 1 was told that your Honor have consented to all points, except that the German passengers mu $t$ not, (or need not) have their chests along with them; and beeause you was busy with more needful business, it was not ended. I was sorry for it, and thought, either your Honor have no good eounsellors, or you can't think of the consequences, otherwise you could not insist on this point. Therefore I hope you will not take it amiss to be informed of the case, and of some of the consequences, viz. :-The crown of England found it profitable to peopleing the American colonies, and for the enoouragement thereof, the eoming and transportation of German Protestants was indulged, and orders waa given to the officers at the Customs houses in the ports of Eagland, not to be sharp with the vessels ef German passengers-knowing that the populating of the British colonies will, in time to come, profit more than the trifles of duty at the custom houses would import in the present time. This the merchants and importers experienced.

They filled the vessels with passengers, and as much of merchant's goods as they thought fit, and left passengers chests, \&o., behind ; and sometimes they loaded vessels with palatines chests by itself. But the poor people depended upon their chests, wherein was some provision, such as they were used to, as dried apples, pears, plums, mustard, medicines, vinegar, brandy, gammons, butter, clotaing, shirts, and other necessary linens, money and whatever they brought with them; and when their chests was left behind, or shipped in other vessels they had want of nourishment, and when not sufficient provision was shipeed for the passeagers, and they bad nothing themselves, they famished and died Or, when they arrived alive, they had no mouey to buy bread, nor anything to sell; if they would sell spare clothes, they had no clothes nor shirt to strip themselves, nor was they able to cleanse themselves of iouses and nastiness ; or, if they was taken into houses, and trusting on their effects and mones, when it comes, it was either left behind, or robbed and plundered by the sailors behind in the vessels; or if such $a$ vessel arrived before them, it was searehed by the merchants bays, de., and their best effects, or all taken out, and no remedy for it. And this last mentioned practice, that people's chests are opened and their best effects taken out, is not only a practive this twenty five, twenty, ten or five years, or sometime onls; but it is the common custom and daily complaints of, to the week last past, when a prous man living with me, had his chest broke open and three fine shirts and
a flute was taken out. The lock was broks to pieces, and the lid of the chest split with iron and chisels. Such, my dear Sir, is the case, and if your Honor will conntenance the mentioned practices, the consequence will be, that the vessels with passengers, will be filled with merchant's goods, wine, do., as much as possible, and at the king's oustom they will call it passengers drink and necessaries for the people, their houschold goods, de., which will be called free of duty. And if they please to load the vessels only with chests of passengers and what lies under them, that will be called also free of duty at the custom houses; and as there are no owners of the chests with them, and no bill of loading is ever given, nor will be given, the chests will be freely opened and plundered by the sailors and others, and what is left will be searched in the stores by the merchants' boys and their friends and aequaintances. Thus, by consequevce, the king will be cheated, and the smugglers and store-boys will be glad of your upholding and encourageing this, their very profitable business; but the poor sufferers will sigh or carry a revenge in their bosoms, aecording as they are godly or ungodly, that such thievery and robbery is maintamed.

If such a merchant should lose thirty, forty, fifty, or ten thousand pounds, he may have some yet to spend and to spare, and has friends; but if a poor man's chest is left behand, or plundered either at sea or in the stores, he has lost all he has. If a rioh man's store, or house, or ehest is broke open and robbed or plundered, there is abundanee of noise about it; but if a 1000 of poor men's property is taken from them, in the mentioned manuer, there is not a word to be said.

If I was ordered to print advertisements, that people who lost their chests, by leaving them behind against their will, or whose was opened and plundered at sea, when they was sent after them in other ressels, or whose was broke open and plundered in the stores at Philade!phiashould come and roceive their value for it (not four-fold) but only single or balf; your Honor would be wondering of a swarm from more than two or three thousand people. But as such is not to be expeeted, it must be deferred to the decision of the great, great, long, long day, where certainly an mplartial judgment will be seen, and the last furching must be paid, whereas, in this present time, such poor sufferers had, and will have no better answer than as it is commonly given: "Can you prove who has opened and stolen out of your chest;" or "bave you a bill of loding?" This has been the practice by sowe of the merchants at Philadelphia, and if it must contınue

"As we heve, therefore, oppurtunity, le: w. do good anto all $11 . \mathrm{H}$, empecially unto them who are of the bocoumod if fatb" Gal. o: ル This Christian admonituon implied that Guse universal family has a claim upon our Chriatial benevolence. And if the great tamily of mar. kind to which we belung havo such a claim, that more limited circle, in which wo live and nove, and to which we are allied by tho moet tonder and endearing tien, and which wo ca! our family or housohold, surely bas special claims upon us. This is plainly implied in the tollowing inspired language: "It inny provido not for his own, and erpecially for thoso of hia own house, ho hath denied the taith, and is worse than an intidel." 1 . Tim. 5: 8. Admit. ting that hislangarge applies to tho tompural provisions of our families, or even primarily to such provisions, we mast conclude that their spiritual interosta are also includud, ur that the duty of the father to the apiriturl interests of bis family is taught sulficionty plain elsewhere; for surely tho spiritual interests of those under our caro aro not of

less importance than are their tomporal interests.

But whilo the Christian Scriptures toach that it is the duts of hoads of familios and parents to labor to promote tho salvation and spiritual interests of those undor their care, and to bring op their children "in the nurture and admonition of the Lord," Epb. 6:4, is it the duty of parents to establish and observe family worship? Or can thoy do all that is required of them towards their children, and be clear of their blood should they be lost, without having family worship? Theme arequestions that, from the weight of their import, commend themselvea to the prayerful and can did consideration of all Cbristian parents, and should be examined and answered in viow of the fact that wo are to te judged bs the perfect law of liberty, -by its general principles, as well as by its precepts and probibitions.

Do we ask for a direct procept or positive law enjoining family worship? And if there is no euch procept or law pointed ont, shall wo conclude that we aro under no obligation to observe or practice it? Wo should not forget that one way of teacbing duty in the gospel is by general principlos. We cannot expect a direct precept tur every duty obligatory upon Christians in all ages in which thoy live, and under overy circamstance under which they may be placed. It is by reasoning from Christian principles rather than from positive precepts, or prohibitione, that our duty in regard to what is to be done, or what is not to be done, is often ascortained by us. And we would remind the brethren and sisters of our own fraternity that it is from general principles more than from positive precepts, that wo maintain our order of plainness in our attire and in our general habits.

But is not the fact that it is the privilege of the bead of the family to bring all his fiamuly before God around the family altar and there invoke the blessing of heaven upon it, a sufficient warrant for family worship? If the parents feel the solemn responsibility that rests upon them to train up their off pring for immortality and heaven, and foel their own insufficiency :o do it, should they not rejoice that they may erect the family altar. and upon it offer their daily prayers to God for bis grace to help them to do their duty, and for his converting power to come upon the unconverted members of the family, that they may be saved? Surely they should. It there was a sovereign who like Pharaoh, king of Egypt,
possessed all the necessaries of lifo withia his kingdom himself, and thus render all his onb. jects entirely dependent upon him tor tho mouns of their subsistence, and would inform them that they could come to the royal pulaco and ob!ain a!! the necensaries of lifo that they shonld need; would not the knowledge of the fact that the king would give them all they needed provided they would respectinlly petition him, be sufficient without ifsuing a deroreo com. manding them to come? Wopresme it would. How cheerfully and gladly then should the father, as the high priow of his family, bear all his honsehold kelore God in prayor.

But owing to our reluctance to perform our duties, the Lord bas not only made it our privilege to pray, but he has alio made it our duty. And though there is no formal precept, and clear and unquestionulle examples of tho practice of tamily prayer, we bavo ecriptural examples and precepts which seem to constitute authority for it. The prophet Juremiah says, "Pour out thy fury upori tho heathen that know thee not, and upon the families that call not on thy name." Jer. $10: 35$. It would bere appear that families neglecting to call on the Lord were omitting duty, and consequently were exposed to the judgment of God.

Again; the practice of famils prayer agrees well with the gespol injunctions enjoining various and frequent praser, and indeed would scem to we included within those injunctions. We aro commanded to "pras without ceasing," 1 Tbess. 5:17. And the apostle says, "I will therefore that men pray every where," 1 Tim. $2: 8$. And agsin ho suyn, "prayiag always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereuntu with all perseverance and sapplication for all saints." Eph. 6:18. 'These admonitions to prayer, let it be noticed, are given to believers in general, and not to any particular class. In such admonitions Christians are admonished to observe all kinds of prayor, and to pray on all suitable occasions. And whas kind of prayer is more beautiful, appropriate and becoming than family prajer? (if all societiea formed, the first in time, and first in import. ance is that of the family. And ia proportion as all its varions and relative duties are discharged, faithfulness to the charch and to society in general, may be looked for. Aud houschold devotion if properly pertormed, will be a great belp to the perlormance of hovisehold duties. By uniting in disily prayer, tho members of the family both joung and old

will be reminded that there is a God, and that they have to do with him, are dependent upon him, and accountable to him. And such a remindor cannot woll fail to have a salutary effect upon them.

But there is a passage of scripture standing in such rolations to other passages inculcating domestic duties, that its application can bardly bo understood in any other sense than as referring to family prayer. The words are these: "Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving" Col. 4:2. This text occurs in a serics of admonitions and precepts given by the apostle Paul for the government and conduct of families and immediately follow his admonitions to mastors. Its connection soems to associate it with family duties.

The example of the pious patriarchs, and of such whose practices are spoken of as com. mendable, recommends the practice of family prayer. Of Abraham God said, "I know bim, that he will command bis children, and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the Lord, to do justice and judgment; that tho Lord may bring upon Abraham that which be hath spokon of bim.' Gen. 18:19. Of Moses it is said, He "was faithful in all his house as a servant, for the testimony of those things which were to be spoken after." Heb. $3: 5$. Josbua said, "As for me and my houso, we will serve the Lord." Josbua 24:15. Following the description we have of Noah and bis family leaving the ark, it is said, "And Noah builded an altar unto the Lord; and took of overy clean beast, and of every clean fowl, and offered burnt offerings on the altar." Gen. 8:20. And of Cornelias, the first of the Gentile converts, it is honorably said, that he was "one that feared God with all his house; which gave much alms to the people, and prayed to God always." Acts 10:2. Dr. Cave, in his Primilive Christianity, p. 1ะ7, when speaking of the piety of the Christians of those anciont times, says, "At their first rising in the morning, they were wont to meet together, and to betake themselves to prayer, (as is plainly implied in Chrysostom's exhortation, to praise God for the protection and retreshment of the night, and to beg his grace and blessing for the following day; this was done by the master of the house, unless some minister of religion was present."

The benefits arising from the practice of frmily paayer, are many. (1) It will, it
properly attended to. and if its result is sach as it should be, throw a holy influence around the family that will greatly restrain the rombers of whatever conduct is contrary to the Chriatian protession. (2.) It will promote domeatic uaion and peace. Under the intluence of boly worship the heart has otten been softened into a tenderness which will lad to a suppressing of those irritations and unkind feelinge, which if left to remain in the heart, would produce trouble. It also operates in keeping such foelings from possessing the mind by filling it with better thoughts and feelings. (3) The father or mother who leads in family worship, will be more likoly to secure by so doing, from their children and all the otaer members of the family, the respect to which their authority entites thom. It the children and domestics are called together daily and have a portion of the Bible read to them, and a simple and heartfelt prayer offered in their presence and for them, such holy exercises will have a happy effoct upon all daring the day. The father will bo more kind and patient, the mother more careful and considerate to those around her, and the children more peaceable, and the employecs more accommodating. (4) Family worship is an important means for imparting religious instruction. Although the portion of scripture read is small, still if there is one or two lessons read every day, in the courso of time much can be learned. (5.) The tendency of family worship is to impress the minds of the young and all who engage in it, who are yet unconverted, with the importance of salvation, and to belp them to sook it. (6.) The last benofit of family prayer that wo shall notice, is, that it is a means of drawing down God's favor and blessing on the family that practices it, and on all who bolong to it. "Ask, and ye ahall receive," is a promise of our Lord. And family prayer, as well as other kinds of praser, has in its very act a tendency to promote the common or lawful objects of prayer. The Spirit of holiness and peace will shed its precious and divine influence over the tather and mother, and all who worship with them. Religion will dwell in that family making all who receive it the better by its presence.

In view of the many advantages that family prayer has to recommend it, let an altar be built if it has never been built in yonr home. Around that altar gatber daily, and there perform such holy services as you are able to

## HISTORY OF THE BROWNSVILLE CHUROH, MARYLAND.

BY EMANUEL SLIFER.
Dear Editors:-Perceiving that you wish matter to be inserted in the forthcoming Bretbren's Almanac, I will therefore give you a concise history of the church at Browsville, Washington Co, Md.

The Brownsville church comprises the lower part of Washington county, known as Pleasant Valley, also the southern part of Middletown valley, Frederick county, Md.

I'his congregation is located upon territory which was once embraced in what is now known, as then, as the Grosnickle's cougregation in Middletown Valley, Frederick county, Md., which embraces Machanicstown, Frederick Co., Md., now in D. I. Saylor's congregation to a point six miles beyond Charlestown, Jefferson Co, W. Ya. The Virginia portion of the aforesaid Grosnickle congregation is now under the supervision of Elder D. Long of Washington county, Md. After cutting oft the two extreme points of the Grosnickle congregation, and assigned as above. Middletown valley alone was left to the last named congregation, with the lower portion of Pleasant valley, Washington county, Md. Still leaving the territory quite extensive, say twenty miles north and stuth, and eight miles from east to west. In time this territory was divided by the great national turnpike which here runs from Baltimore westward All the memwers south of said road, belong to the Brownsville congregation. Soon after the close of the Revolutionary war, our brethren of Pennsylvania emigrated to this section of the country. Among those early pioneers was my grandfather John Slifer, , whose name appears once or twice in our minutes of those earlier days-'Two of his brothers in-law, l'eter Niller and Peter Gaver, and my great-grandfather, (on my mother's side) whose name was - Myers. Those named took up land around what is now known as Burkittsville, Frederick county, Md,
whilst Rudolph Brown about the same time setiled in Pleasant valley, Washington county, Md. Brownsville being named after him. Burkittsville and Brownsville are but two miles apart, yet the South mountain runs between them. And here is Crapton Ciap at Burkitsville, a place rendered fanous in history by a battle being fought during the late eivil war, which took place on the 14th of Sept. 1862.

1 will now proceed to name the ministering bretheen of the (irosnickle congregation, until Brownsville was separated. For a number of years the scattered members through this section of country, were dependent upou traveling ministers. My recollection extends back to brother by the name of Fergason, and whose co-laborer was the grandfather of elder Jacob Leatherman, who died some few years ago. Afier Fergason, the elder, Christian Harshman and a brother by the name of Holler. (who now has three sons in the west preaching.) After those came Christian Harshman jr., and Jacob Leatherman to whom I huve already referred. Next in succession Daniel Brown. Jacob Leatherman was the first elder I remember. Then followed Henry Koonth, Geo. Bear, Emanuel Slifer, Daniel Boyer, Ezra Gilbert, (ieorge Grosnickle, and Jonathan Baker. About this time Grosnickle circuit was divided, April 1864. Bro. George Bear at this time was also an elder, who was assigned to Brownsville congregation. Bro Jacob Leatherman had the supervision still, of the Grosnickle church. The ministers now of that eburch are (ieorge Leatherman and Daniel Gibbon. Bro. Bear continued as eider of our congregation until his death, which occured on the luth of April, 1872, aged 83 years. In 1873, October 14th, Emanual Slifer was ordained elder of the Brownsville congregation, whose assistants are Cornelius W. Castle and Eli Yourtee. This brings our history up to the 15 th of Sept, $187 \%$. Since the 30th of January last we have ndded to our number forty-three souls. We are now finishing an addition to our meeting-house. Our number is now about 134 . That the Lord may continue to prosper his $/ /$ ion should lye the prayer of all.

But to give a correct history of everything that transpired, or even a condensed sketch, since its orgabization, would be impossible, as no records were kept for the first one hundred years of its existence, ur if kept, were not preserved. By the aid, however, of some of the oldest fathers and mothers now living, and some who have recent'y died, some valuable information may be given. The church was organized, as nearly as we can get at it, about the middle of the Dighteenth century, not later we think than the year 1752. It was first named the Cobococheague congregation, a name given by the Iadians to a strean flowing through our county. The nanes of the winisters from its organization to the year 1800 are not now known, except two, viz.: George A. Martin and Wm . Stover. For the first fifty years the brethren suffered many privations on account of the French war in 1755, the Revolutiou 20 years later, and subsequent Indian wars together with many inconveniences incident to a newly settled country, as our part of the state was at that time. For upwards of forty years no meeting-bouses were built; the brethren worshipped in their houses and barns, and sometimes in the open air. The dread of the Indian's tomahawk and scalping knife, was cverywhere felt. In the morning before going to the fields to work, the farmer and bis sons often lid good-bye to the balance of the family, fearing they wight not return, or if pernitted to do so, would fiud their loved ones murdered by the Indians. Such was the state of affairs bere then Some, indeed fell victims to the ruthless hand of their dreaded foe, but owing to the strict vigilance of the settlers, the Indians were finally banished, and a brighter cra dawned over the community. The long dark night of woe gave way to a beautiful morn betokening a pleasant day, which the brethren, with others have enjoyed through the present century. In 1798 our first meeting.house was built where the brethren still meet every two weeks for worship It is commonly known as Antietam, or Prices chureb, built on the banks of the Antietan near Waynesbor, Pa. Since then other meetinghouses have been built, making five at the present day. Four Annual meetings have been held in the congregation within the present century, viz: In 1810 at Antietan meeting house; In $18 \% 3$ with Bro. Geo. Royer ; in 1847 with brother Isaae Deardorff; in 1866 with brother Jaeob Price. The names of the ministers elected sivee 1800, are as follows: Daniel Stover; John Lisjer; Jacol Holsinger, sr.; Henry Strickler ; Jacob Fahrney; Israel Senger; Daniel Keefer ; 1). In fater years out of it the Ridge, and Falling Spring churehes were also formed into organizations of their own. For the prosicrity of our church, all praise, only is due to the supeme Ruter of all things without whose aid no good could have been accomplished May her menters remain united, and love prevail that her mission way be fully carried ont, and many souls saved from eternal Jeath.
