EXPLANATION.

Consecutive numbers are placed on the left margin against those names which are afterwards mentioned as heads of families. No two names have the same number, although the same name may appear twice under different numbers—first as child, then as parent. Where a number is found in parenthesis (—) after a name, it refers to a subsequent record of the same name, as parent. The bracketed number [—] found after the name of the parent, refers back to the previous entry of the same name where the person appears as a child.

Also, after the name of a parent, the generation is indicated in parenthesis, (—) with small figures above, showing to what generation the name belonged. Thus, parent's name, Amasa⁷; father's name, Willis⁶; grandfather's, Stephen⁵; and so on down to Thomas¹. When no number appears after a name, no further information will be found.

The usual abbreviations are employed: *m.* for married; *b.* for born; *d.* for died, etc.

INTRODUCTORY CHAPTER.

Several of the older members of the Wood Family having died recently, I felt that some record of the family ought to be made before the present generation should pass away. In searching for names, dates, etc., I found a record of the Tyler, Taft, Wood, Bates, and Hill Families, compiled by Newell Tyler of Worcester, to which I am indebted for information concerning Solomon Wood, Jr., and his son Simeon's family.

Solomon Wood, Jr., was born in 1702, lived at Uxbridge for several years, and was buried in Dudley, Mass., in 1780. For some time I could learn nothing previous to this date, (1702,) but after writing to parties in Uxbridge, Mendon, and other places, several times without success, I visited Uxbridge, Mendon, and Farnumsville, and, at last, found the record of Solomon Wood, Sr., father of the above, who died in Uxbridge in 1752, and his wife, Mary (Hazeltime) died in 1749. Both of these were buried in Uxbridge.

From 1729 to 1730, Solomon Wood transferred about twenty-one different lots of land, from one to forty acres each, to his son, Solomon, Jr.

Uxbridge was set off from Mendon in 1727, and that year Solomon Wood, Jr., was Moderator, Town Treasurer, Highway Surveyor, etc. Later, he was chosen a member of the committee on building a church. He was one of the Board of Selectmen several times between the years 1738 and 1765. In 1762, he was Representative to the General Court. In 1759, he is called Captain, and about 1763, Colonel Wood.

I find that Solomon Wood paid £3. 6s. 8d., and his son, Simeon, £2. towards a church. Afterwards they each paid £8. 9s. for No. 11 pew. Eight or nine others by the name of Wood also paid sums for the same object.

I found later, the parents of Solomon Wood, Sr., to be THOMAS and ANN, who are first mentioned in Rowley, Mass., in 1654, when they were married. I have no certain knowledge as to the place from whence Thomas came, but probably was born in England about 1635.

One record gives a William Wood who came from Matlock, Derbyshire, England, in 1638, at the age of 56, with his nephew, Hon. Thomas Flint, and settled in Concord. He died May 14, 1671, aged 89. He is supposed to have been the acute author of a book entitled, "New England Prospect." Shattuck says his children were: Michael, Ruth, Abraham, Isaac, Thomas or Thompson, Jacob, John, and Abigail, which is probably correct, although some accounts give him only the first two and Michael the rest. Possibly the Thomas above mentioned may be the one found in Rowley in 1654, but I have been unable to ascertain positively in regard to that.

WOOD GENEALOGY.

First Generation.

1 THOMAS WOOD is first mentioned on the Rowley records April 7, 1654, when he married Ann Her maiden name is not given, but there is much reason for believing her name to have been Hunt, and she was probably of Ipswich. John Grant of Rowley, married Mary Hunt, who made her will in 1697, and called Ann Wood, and Susannah Todd, wife of John Todd of Rowley, "sisters;" and in papers on file in the Essex County Probate Court with the will, both Ann and Susannah are mentioned as being about 60 years old in 1697. In the will of John Todd, he mentions "Brother Hunt." In an affidavit filed in Vol. 23, 27, County Court papers, in the office of the Clerk of Courts, Salem, Mass., Thomas Wood calls himself about 40 years old in 1675, and calls John Todd "brother."

Thomas Wood was a man of good social position there, though, according to the Church Record, he had quite a contest in the church with the minister, Rev. Samuel Phillips. He was buried Sept. 12, 1687. His widow, Ann, d. Dec. 29, 1714. Children—all born in Rowley—

Their golden wedding occurred in 1883, at Worcester, where he has been for years. He graduated at Brown University, Providence, in the class of 1827. This College conferred on him the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws (LL. D.) in 1858. He read law and was admitted to the Bar at Worcester in 1830, and is now in the 54th year of his practice at the Bar in Worcester County. Was the first Representative Worcester ever had in the General Court of Mass., the first year of her existence as a City, in 1848. He is the oldest living Ex-Mayor of the city, having been chosen two years in succession, 1851 and 1852, and having been

preceded by Gov. Lincoln and Judge Henry Chapin, both deceased.

He was appointed United States Register in Bankruptcy in 1867, in which office it was a part of his duty to decide the various questions in bankruptcy that came up in the cases that were brought before him, under the United States Bankruptcy Law, passed in 1867, and repealed about 1878. It was also his duty to preside at the bankruptcy meetings held before him.

Although at the advanced age of 80 years, he is yet actively engaged in the pursuit of his chosen profession. Children :

Simeon Wood procured the last will and testament of his father, Solomon Wood, Esq. The records of Uxbridge also say: "It seems that Simeon Wood owns the Common." The farm of Solomon and Simeon consisted of 172 acres of land and buildings thereon, and was located on the old road to Smithfield. The house was on the east side of the road, just south of that of the late Levi Thompson. The original house has been gone many years. Simeon moved to Dudley about 1776, and bought the greater part of what is now the centre of Webster, which he left to his heirs. His children were:

Amasa Wood was named after him. At the early age of eight years, he went to work in the North Village cotton factory. When ten years old he lost his mother, who died of consumption: six years later he bought his time while working for the Merino Woolen Co. His health failing, he was obliged to seek out of door employment for a while, but in 1839, entered the employ of Hamilton Woolen Co., of Southbridge, where he remained about seven years, four of which he had charge of the pressing and finishing department. He joined the Methodist church there about 1843, in which he played the clarionette, and assisted in the choir most of the time while there, and contributed toward the building of a new church. Was married while there, and returned to Webster in 1846, and for about thirty years, with his brother, D. A. Wood, took the job of moving and sawing, by horse-power, the wood used on the railroad between Webster and Jewett city. During seven years of this time he was engaged in the same business on the railroad between Providence and Waterbury. Built a house on Mechanic street, which he afterwards sold, and bought about 1 1-2 acres of land, called the McNeil place; opened Union street and part of Wood street. Kept a wood yard one year, sold that and four house lots, beside building three houses containing fourteen tenements, which he still retains. Never very healthy, he was taken with hemorrhage of the lungs in 1852, was very low for more than a year, and narrowly escaped death. He belonged to the Methodist church nearly forty years, and was one of the Trustees several years, and paid for

church purposes about \$3,000 during that time. Eight years ago he changed his religious belief and became more liberal in his views.
