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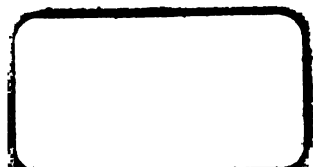


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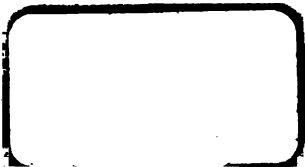
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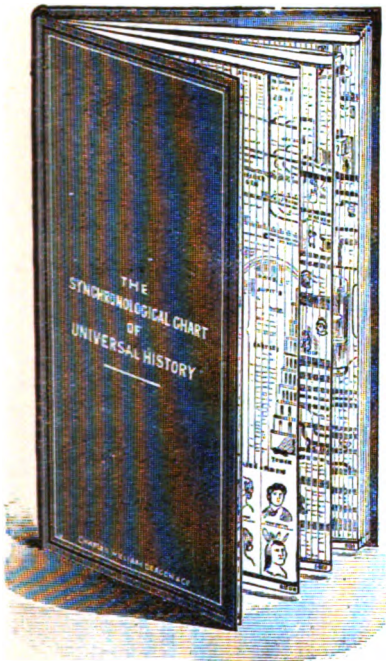
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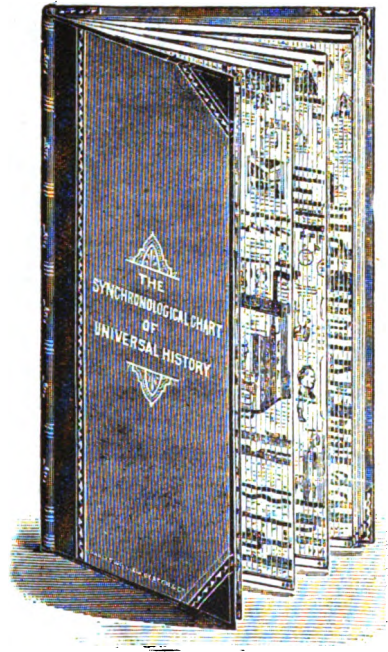
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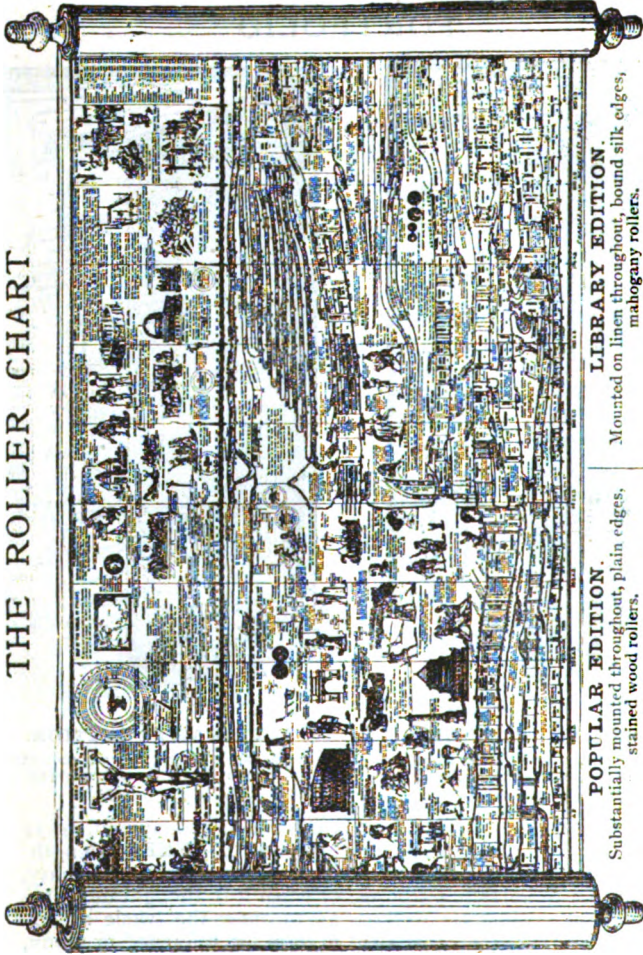
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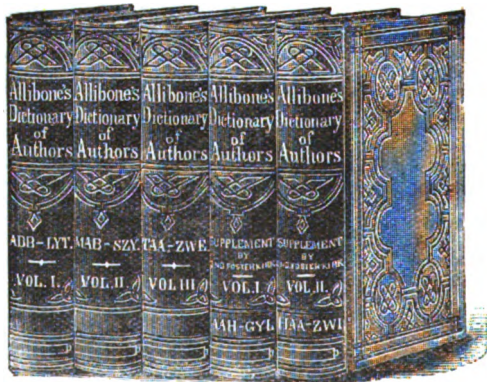
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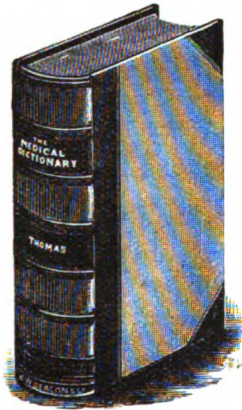
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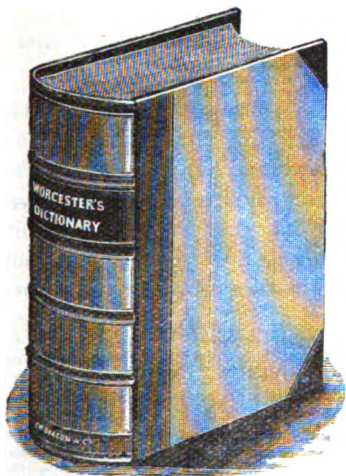
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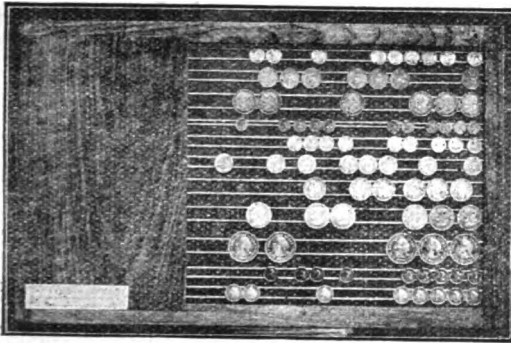
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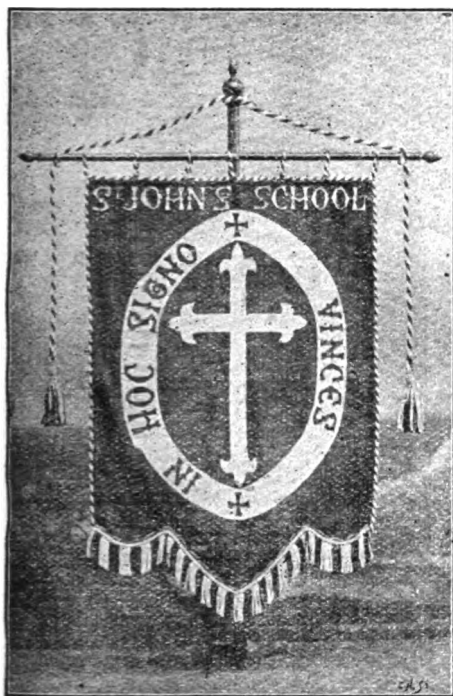
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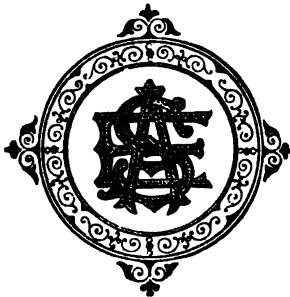


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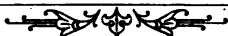
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Fig. 16.—A Sacrifice¹ (*Mon. d. Inst.*, ix. 53).

The representation is of a sacrifice to Apollo (who stands on the right). An attendant holds some flesh on the fire on a long spit. Victory herself provides wine for the libation.

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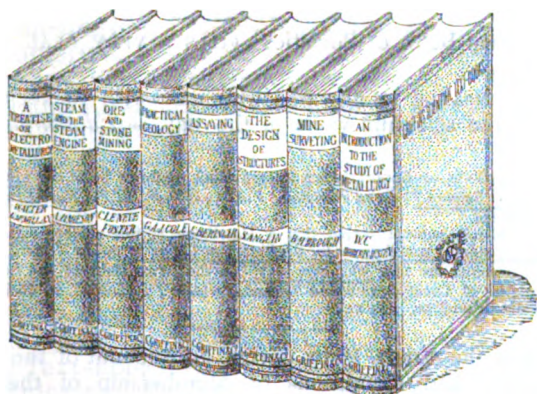
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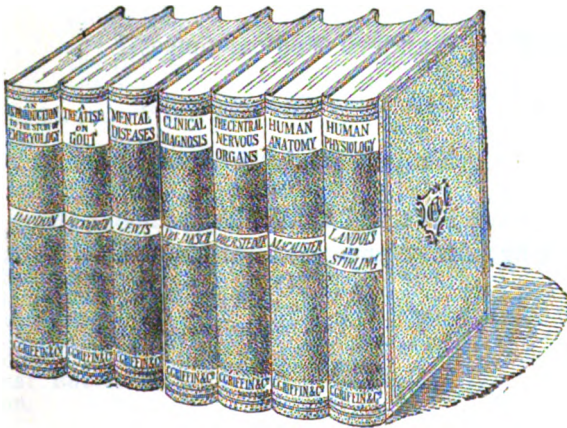
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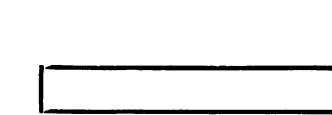
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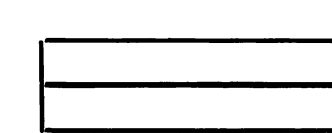
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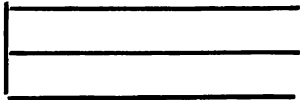
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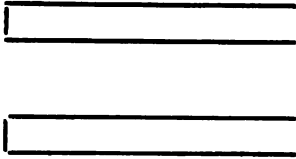


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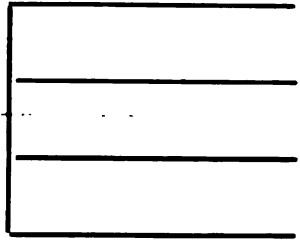
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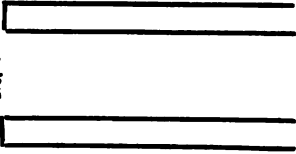
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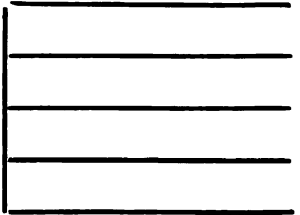
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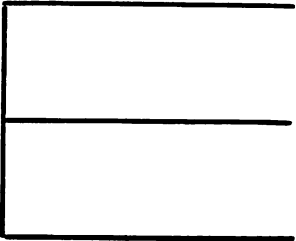
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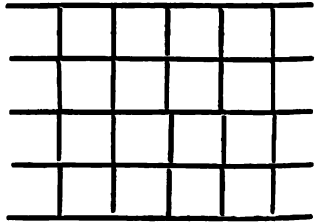
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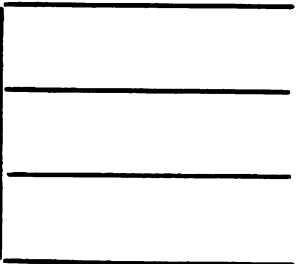
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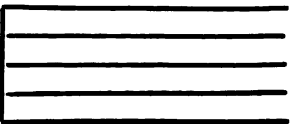
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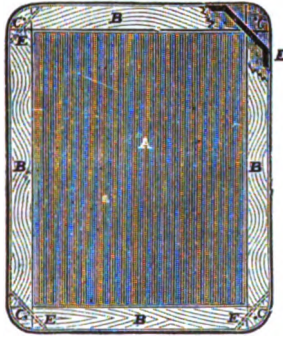


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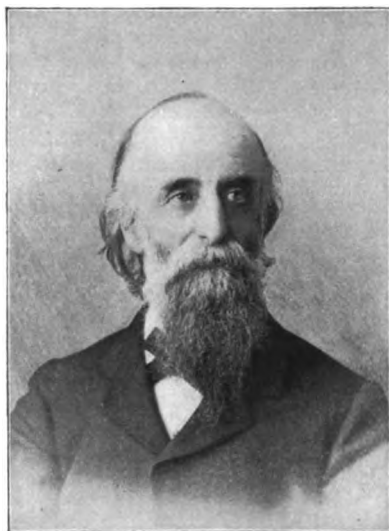
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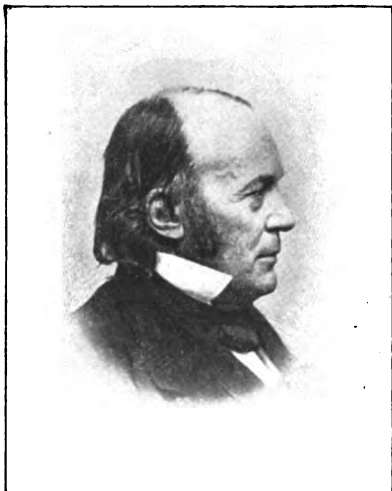
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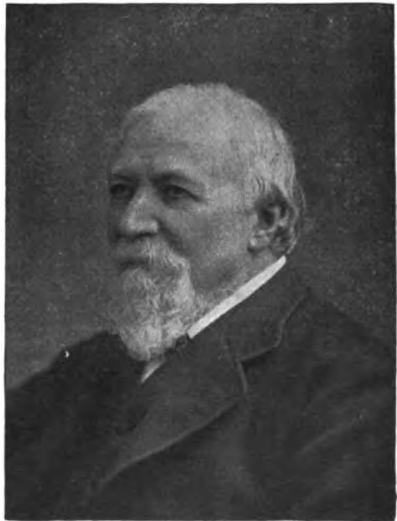
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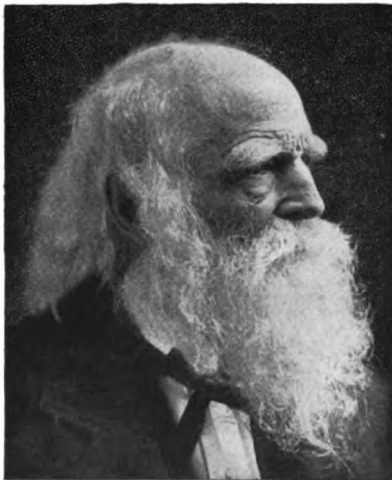
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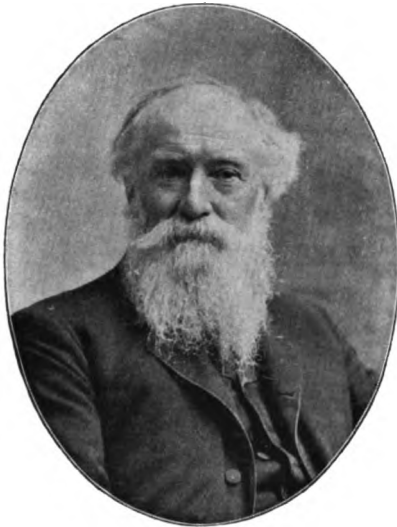
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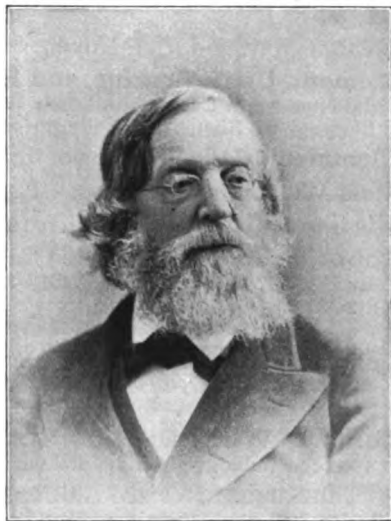
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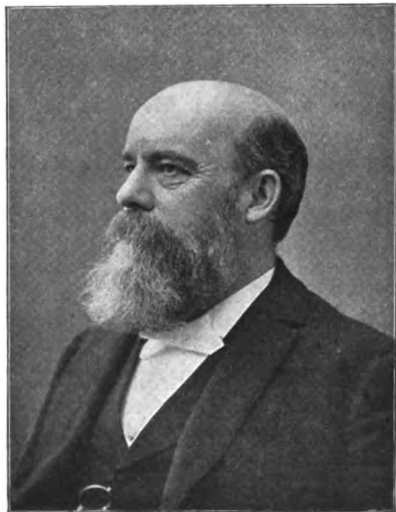
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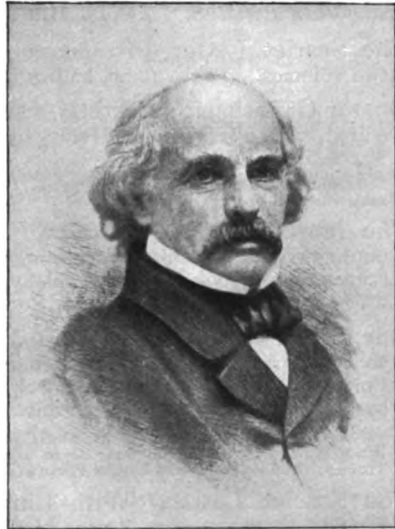
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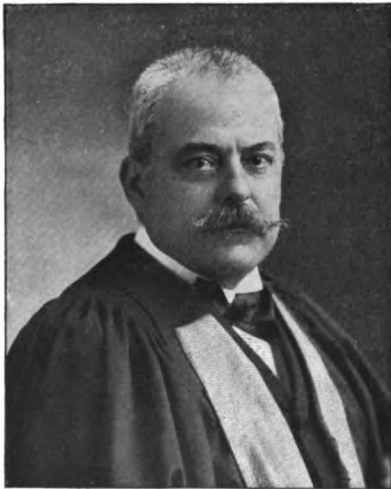
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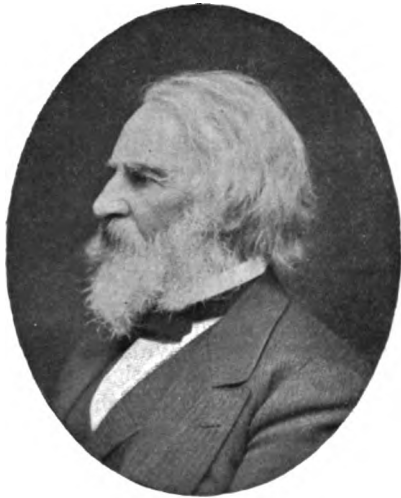
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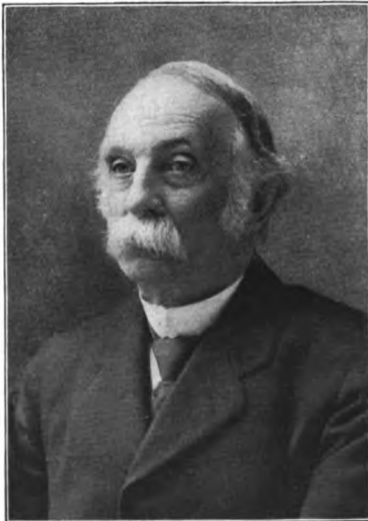
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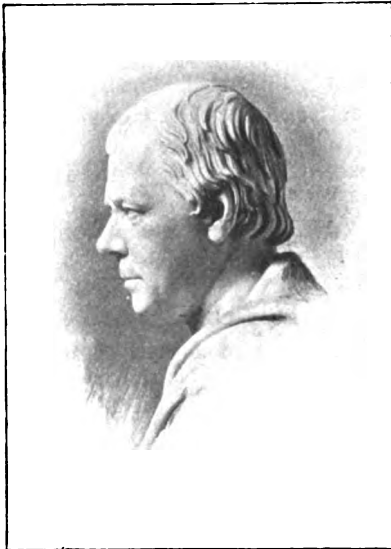
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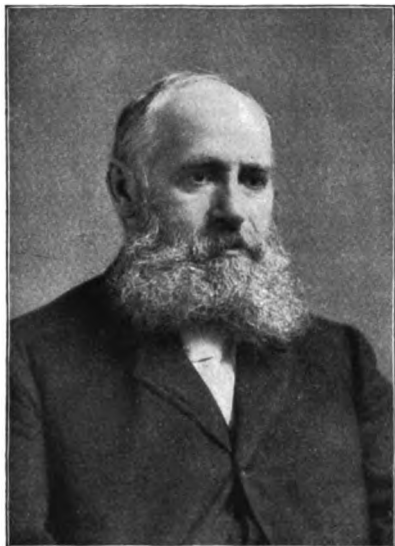
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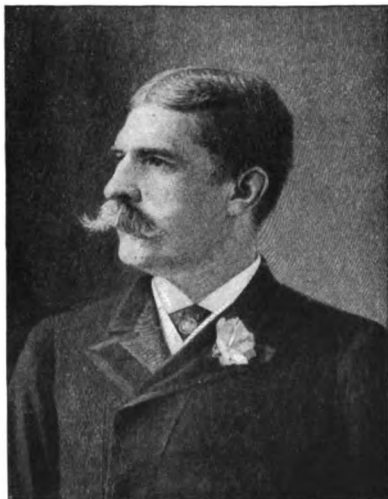
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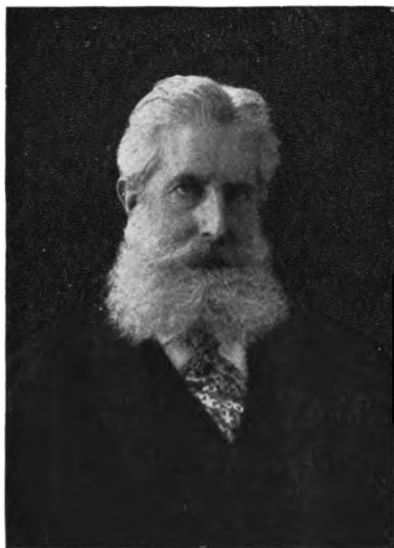
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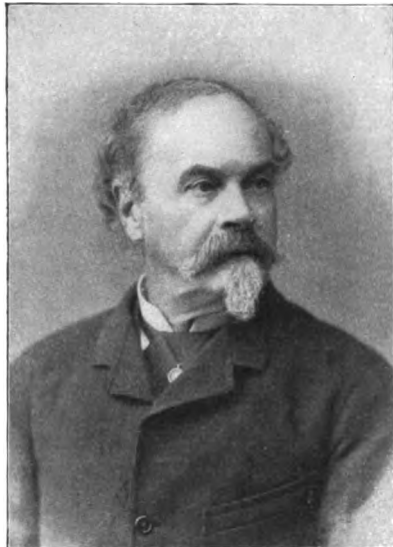
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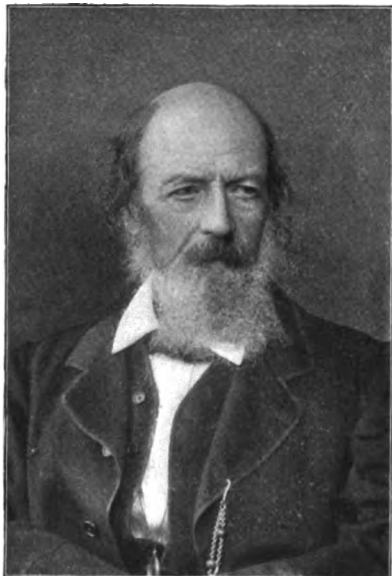
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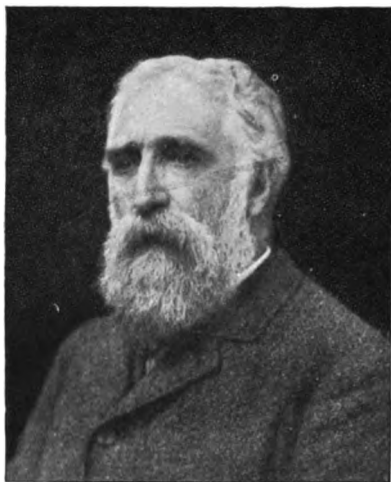
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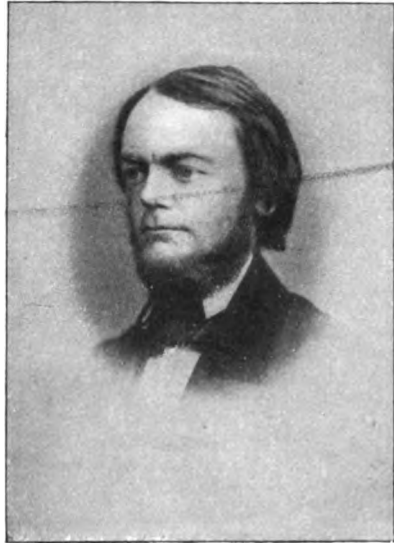
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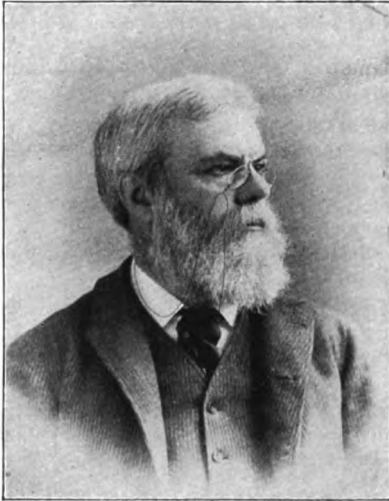

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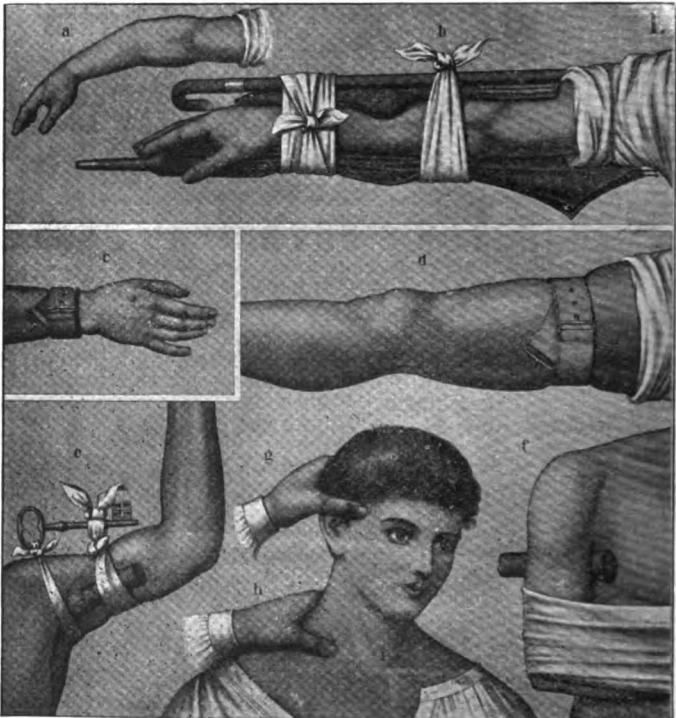
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(B) **THE MUSCULAR SYSTEM** of the entire human body, as well as of separate portions.

THE CHEST AND ABDOMEN, showing the grouping of the internal organs, *i.e.*, the Lungs, with the Bronchial tubes; the Heart, the Diaphragm, the Stomach, the Intestines, the Liver, the Gall Bladder; also separately, the Heart, with the circulation of the blood, the Lungs, the Stomach.

PLATE IV.

THE ORGANS OF THE SENSES, the Nerves, the Skin.
