## THE LOW COST OF ELECTRICITY

(Editorial in May Issue of Dukw Power Magazine)

Everyone, of course, knows that the trend of rates for electric service has been constantly downward from the very origin of the elpe. tric power industry. The ase of elpetricity in the home has just as consistently increased. As a matter of fact the constant inerease in the amount of eurrent used per consumer has been responsible for the constant decrease in the rates paid for that service.

Today, with more than 21 million American families enjoying the conveniences and advantages of clectric service in the home, with approximately 15 million radios in service, with more than eisht million electric refrigerators in service, with well up toward a million and a half electric ranges and tens of thousands of electric water heaters in service, with an increased appreciation of lighting which has steppet up the use of electricity for this purpose tremendonsly, and with millions of electric irons, coffee percolators, thasters, vachum cleaners. washing machines and other appliances in ose, the cost of this servier to the average American home is approximately 9 cents per day.

And whi'e the average family is paying 9 cents per day for electric service that same family was traying $\$ 1.17$ per day for governmental costs in 1932. And, of course that govermmental cost is substautially more today than it was in 1932 .
