Our President, Rev. J. R. Cantrell, is the first alumnus to return as president. He finished Boiling Springs College in 1919. After receiving his A.B. from Wake Forest College, he attended short sessions at the Southern Baptist Seminary.

His first pastorate was the First Baptist Church of Hillsboro. He was then with the General Board as an Evangelist for three and one-half years. He was pastor of the First Baptist Church of Newton for seven years, then Calvary Baptist Church in Morganton for about one and one-half years.

Mr. Cantrell came to us at Boiling Springs in 1939, and has given this college one of its most successful years.

There are certain ideals that have, as you know, always characterized this institution, and may it be highly resolved by one and all of us that these ideals and traditions shall not be lost, nor lowered, but shall be exalted and perpetuated, thereby giving the old School more prestige and power.
