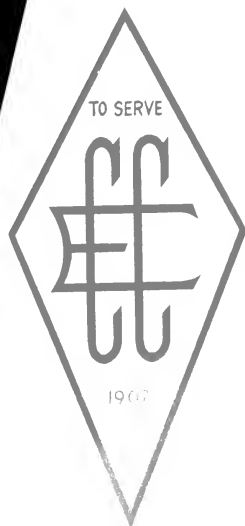

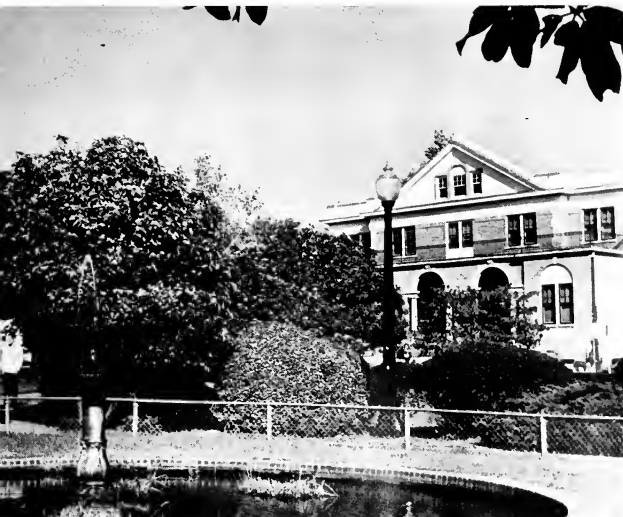

Keeping pace with the growing demand for scientists, technicians, and business personnel, Flanagan Building has justified the foresight of those men who brought higher education to eastern Carolina.

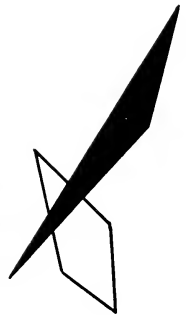


For those moments away from books, the College Union has provided a wealth of activities for those students who seek more than a repertoire of facts.

Representing more than two million dollars, Joyner Library is the largest research facility in eastern North Carolina.

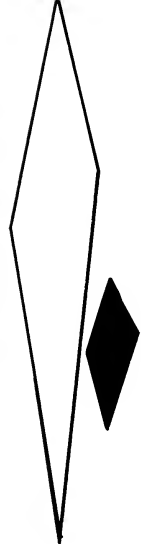

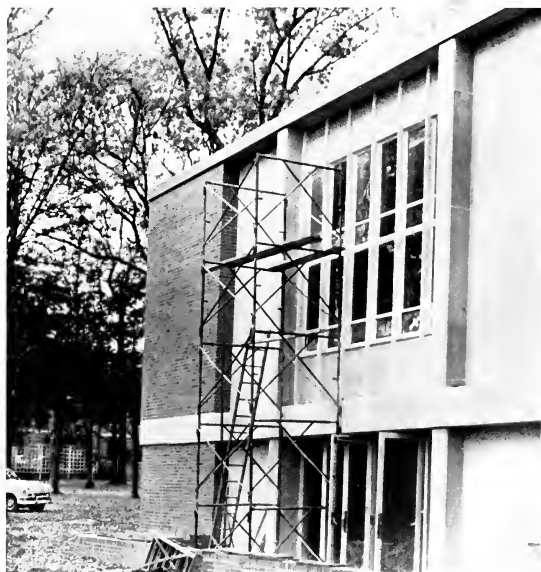

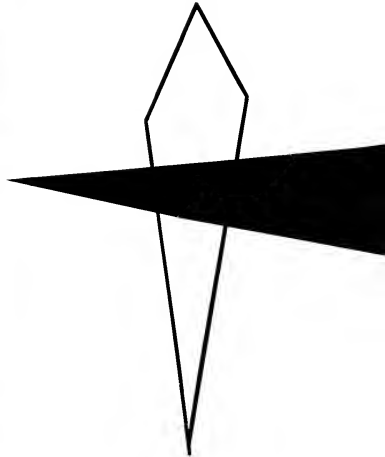

Various programs have been set up in science, offering specific degrees in Biology, Chemistry, and Physical Science, as well as general B.S., B.A., and M.A. degrees.

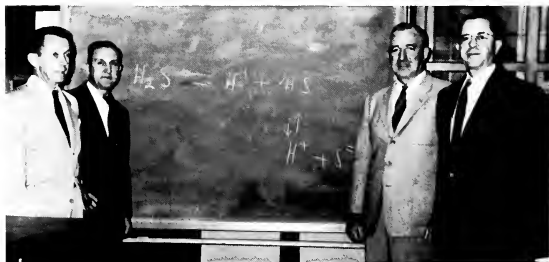

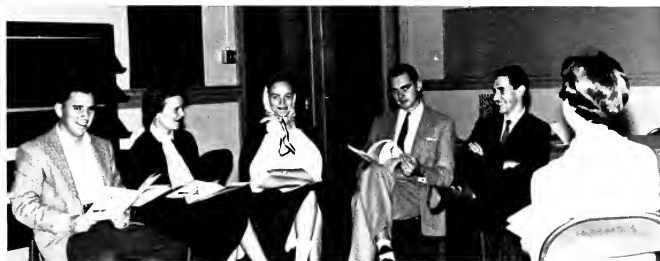

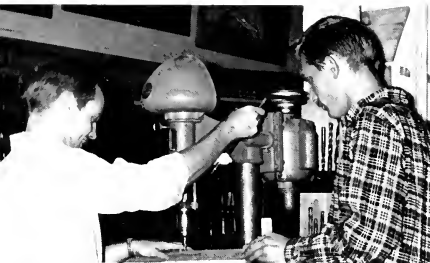

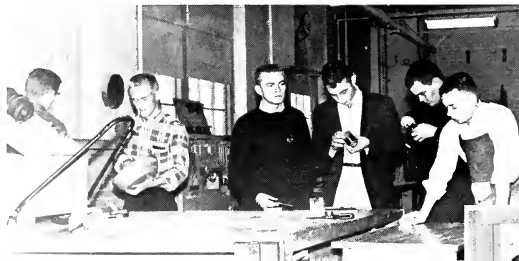

Graduate School

The Graduate School offers a program of study leading to the Master of Arts degree in Business, English, Health and Physical Education, Industrial Arts, Library Science, Mathematics, Music, Science, and Social Studies. The program of study in these nine areas meets the requirements for Graduate Certificates issued by the North Carolina State Department of Education. The student who does not wish to obtain

Graduate Certificate may take an academic major of twenty-seven quarter hours in any one of the various departments of the college which offers graduate work. For the school year 1958-59 there were approximately six hundred students registered for graduate courses. About four hundred of these were working to meet the requirements for the Master of Arts degree.

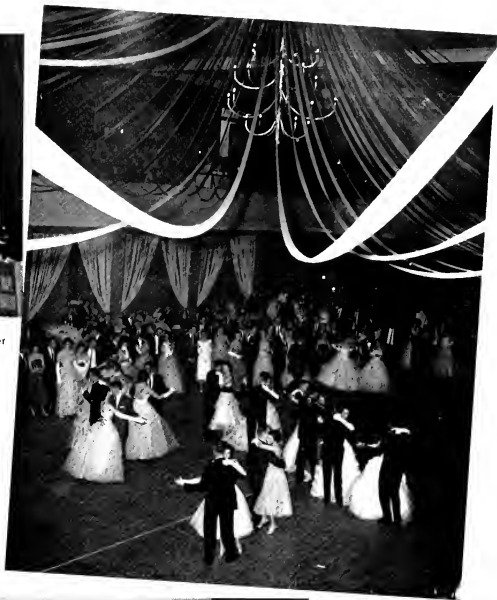

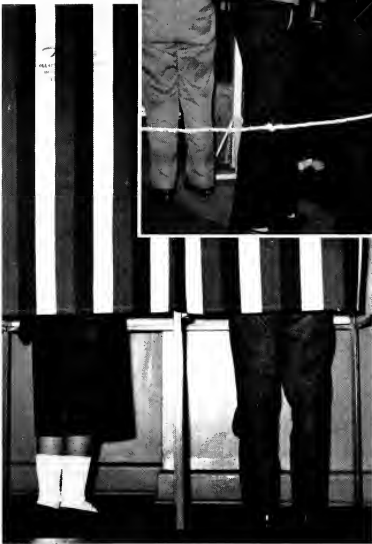

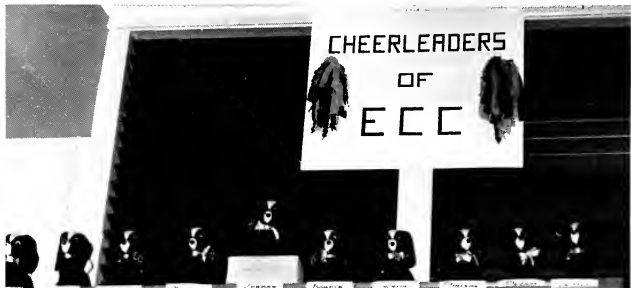

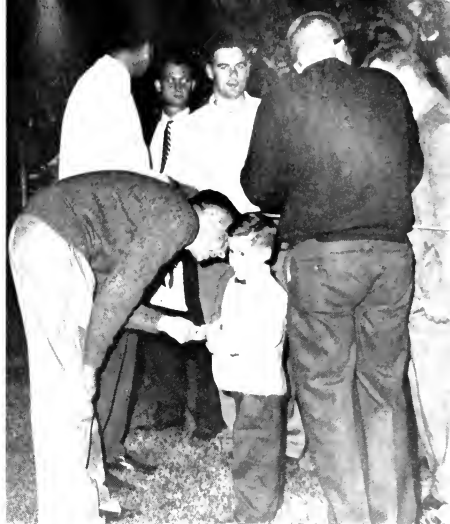

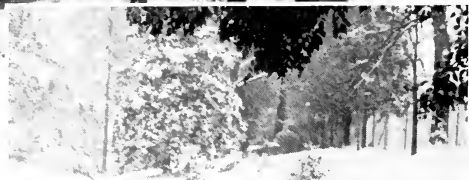

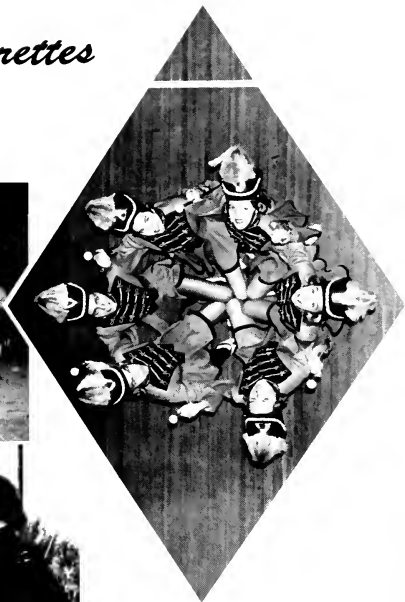

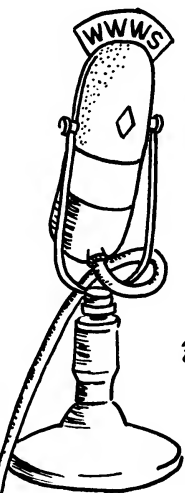

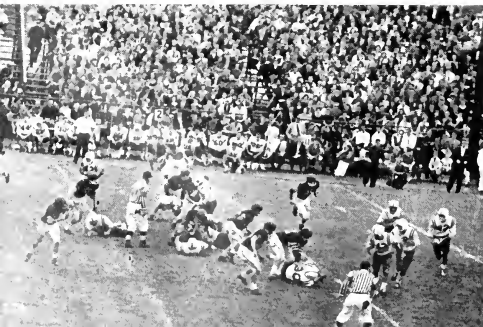
ECC stops Western Carolina 18-7...

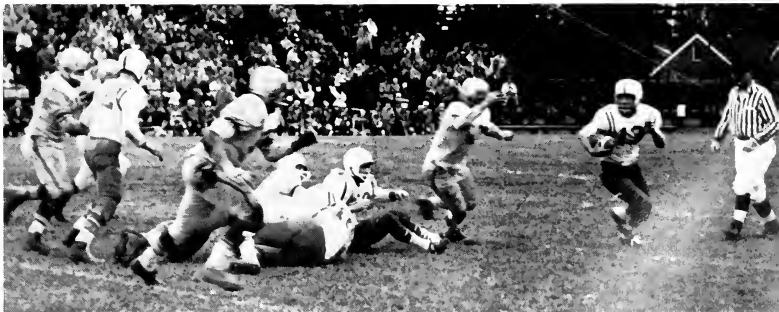

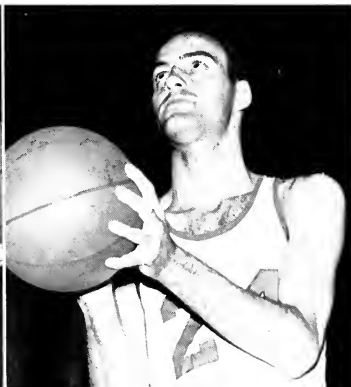
