The Annual Banquet of the Club is one of the great social events of the year.

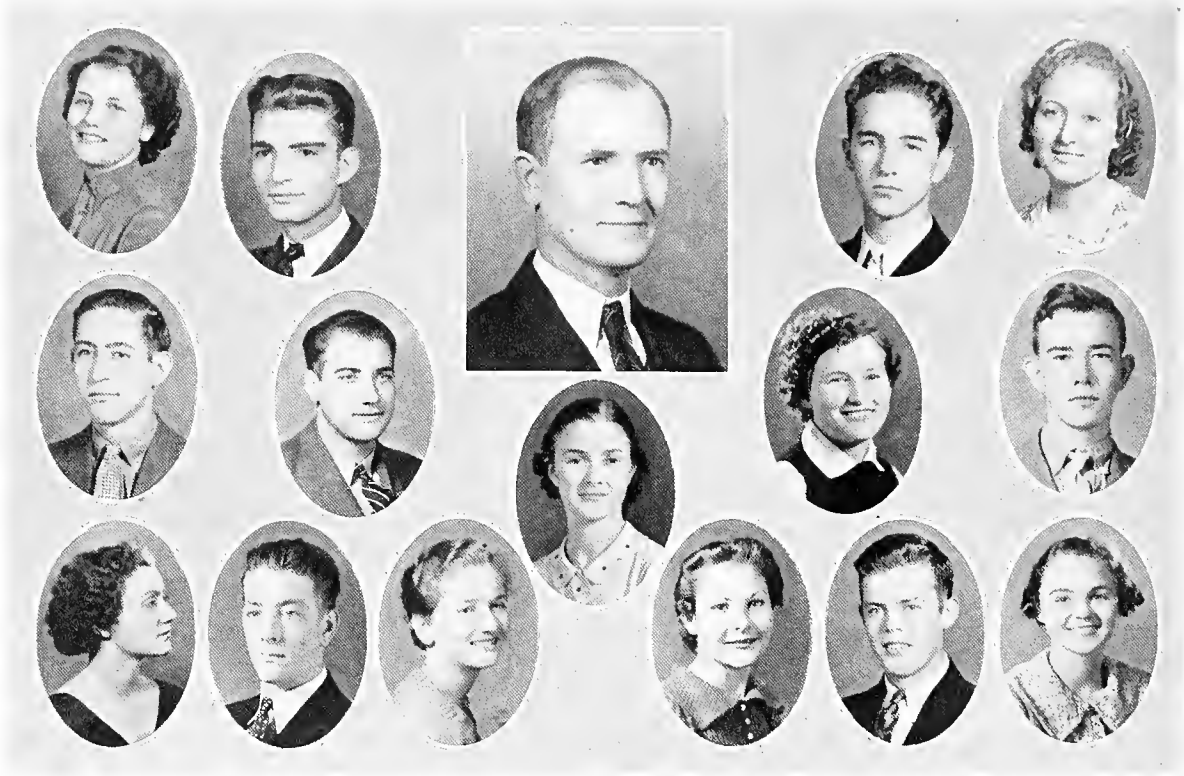
