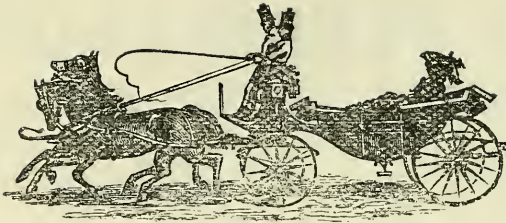

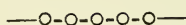

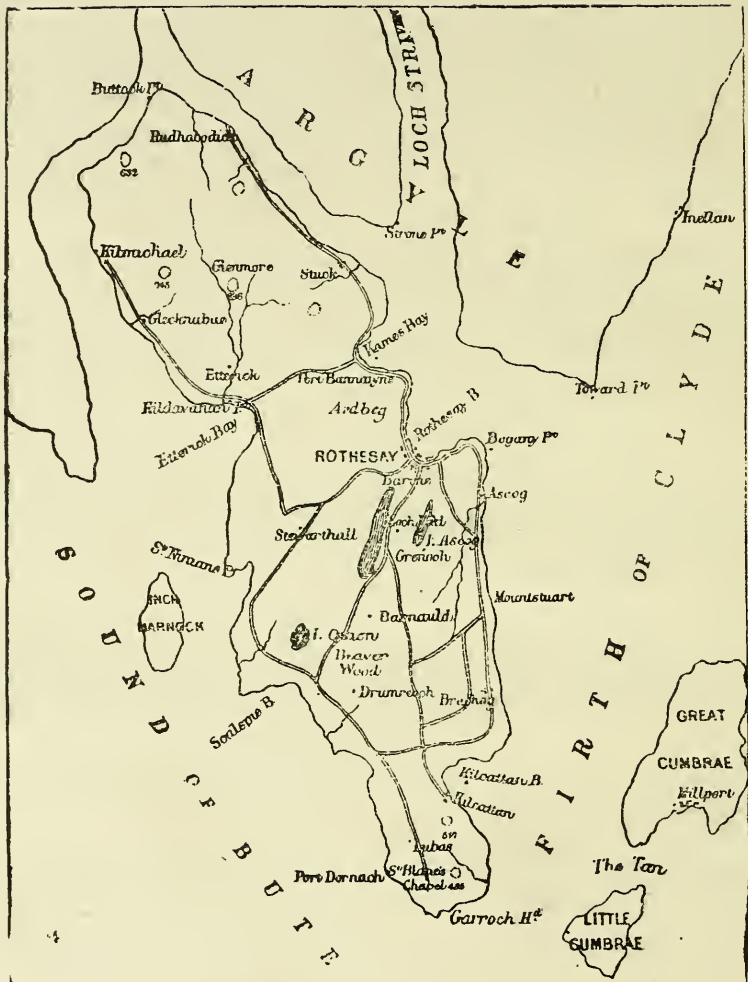

COUNTY OF BUTE.

The County of Bute comprises the seven islands in the Firth of Clyde, viz. :—BUTE, the most populous ; ARRAN, the largest ; the GREAT and LITTLE CUMBRAES, off the Ayrshire coast ; HOLY ISLE and PLADDA, off Arran ; and INCHMARNOCK, off Bute.

The principal **Industries** are farming and fishing.

The **Agricultural Returns** for 1892, recently published, give the area of the county at 139,432 statute acres ; total area of land and water, 140,307 acres. 48,105 acres are mountain and heath land used for grazing, and 25,648 acres are under all kinds of crops, of which 5,279 are under corn and 2,428 under green crops ; 9,634 acres are under rotation and 8,140 not under rotation. Of the cultivated land, 24,600 acres are occupied by owners and 1,048 by tenants. There were 1,400 horses, 10,018 cattle, 52,000 sheep, and 616 pigs in the county.

The **Population** in 1891 was 18,404—8,211 males and 10,193 females. There were 4,232 families, 4,001 houses, 17,346 rooms, 4·35 persons to the family, 1·06 families to each house, 4·60 persons to each house, 84 persons to the square mile, 7·6 acres to each person, 206 yards as the approximate distance between person and person. 29 persons spoke Gaelic only.

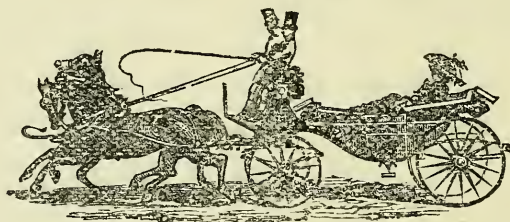
