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THE REPORT

THE Council submits the following report and statement of accounts for the year ending 30 June 1942 for the consideration of the Society.

The thirty-seventh Annual General Meeting was cancelled on account of the war.

The publications for the year 1940-41 are Part CXI, the conclusion of the Register of Bishop Woodlock, and Part CXII, Volume I of the Register of Archbishop Chichele. The publications for the year 1941-42 are Part CXIII, Volume III of the Register of Archbishop Chichele, and Part CXIV, the conclusion of the text of the Register of Archbishop Winchelsey. The delay in issuing the publications is mainly due to the war. It is expected that Volumes I and III of Archbishop Chichele's Register will be issued together in the late autumn.

The thanks of the Society for the speedy completion of the Woodlock Register are due to Canon Goodman, Hon. Librarian of the Cathedral Church of Winchester. The publication of the Register in so few years was made possible by generous grants from the British Academy.

For the year 1942-43 it is proposed to publish the final part of the Register of Hamo de Hethe.

The Treasurer's statement will be found on pages 4 and 5. The thanks of the Society are due to the British Academy for another grant of £100 which will facilitate the completion of the Register of Hamo de Hethe.

Chancellor H. B. Vaisey, K.C., D.C.L., and Mrs. Morris Davies have joined the Society.

The Council records with regret the deaths of Chancellor F. H. L. Errington, Mr. Walford Green, Mr. L. C. C. Lindsay, Mr. A. E. Preston, and Mr. A. Ivor Pryce. Four resignations have been received. Five libraries and three institutions exchanging publications, marked ‡, are in enemy and enemy-occupied countries.

There are now 60 individual members and 128 subscribing libraries, making a total of 188.
