CARE OF FERNS IN THE HOME

The foundation of most fern troubles, says

(ext. horticulturist or floriculturist), is improper watering, especially keep-

ing the plant soaked or permitting it to become dry. Ferns should be watered
sparingly but should be kept moist at all times. It is especially difficult
not to over-water when the fern is in a jardiniere, where drainage is necessar-
ily poor. In spring and summer, ferns require three times the water necessary
in autumn and winter recommends keeping
ferns in a strong light although they grow well, says, without
full sunlight. They should be repotted every year.
