
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
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

INTRODUCTION.

THE CLUB OF ODD VOLUMES accepted some months ago the invitation of the Administration of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, to make an exhibit of book-plates in the Print Rooms of the Museum. For a long period the Club's Committee has been working most harmoniously with Mr. S. R. Koehler, the Curator of the Museum's Print Department, and a great deal of precious time and strength has been given to the subject. The Chairman of the Club's Committee has been for a full year most painstakingly and continuously attentive to the work of assembling the plates and arousing a wide-spread interest in the project. The result of all this effort is that the exhibition now opened is confidently believed to be the most carefully chosen, the best arranged and, indeed, from all points of view, the most useful and important to the student of book-plates, as well as to his brother-collector, who regards the book-plate as but a humble by-product of the arts of engraving and design, that has yet been given.

The chief aim of the exhibition is to afford the attentive visitor an opportunity of tracing the artistic development of the book-plate, from its rude beginnings many centuries ago, to the elegant works of the famous masters of the present day. In maintaining this primary purpose of showing the progress of the art of the book-plate, several secondary purposes are also well subserved. In selecting the specimens to be shown the aim has been to obtain plates signed by distinguished, or by at least identifiable engravers, and to disregard those by unknown hands, or by engravers who bear no especial part in the development of the book-plate. Some plates which are not signed, but which upon the best authority, can be assigned confidently to known engravers, are included, and it has also been in mind to make use of dated plates as far as possible. The experienced collector will realize at once, that the exhibition has been planned with the utmost care, and will appreciate both its peculiar value and the amount of labor it has required to gather the plates and to compile the studied catalogue herewith presented.

Something over two thousand plates are listed, and all of these, with the exception of a few loaned by the Museum of Fine Arts and the Public Library of Boston, and ten plates loaned by Mr. Charles William Sherborn. the foremost engraver on copper in England today, are taken from the collections of the members of the Club of Odd Volumes. The visitor will wonder, possibly, why, in the Third Print Room, among the plates used by United States government institutions, public libraries, colleges, etc., so many uninteresting and even extremely ugly things are shown, most of which are, indeed, simply typographical labels of the most tasteless kind. The reason, however, for bringing together this mass of utilitarian hideousness is obvious. It has been gathered with the distinct aim of showing how unsatisfactory the great number of book-plates used by the public libraries, the libraries of colleges and of other institutions of learning, is. There are over eight million volumes in the public libraries of the country, and a very small proportion of them is marked with suitable plates. Hundreds of libraries have been founded by the generous gifts of interested men, and thousands of books are purchased annually with money that is freely given, yet in how few instances does one find the books suitably identified with the donor. Among these institutions, which loan books to the vast army of readers and students throughout the land, and which are thereby given an unusual opportunity of fostering good art, the book-plate is too little The various public libraries of Boston possess regarded. a score of well engraved plates which are exceedingly creditable, and which record the gift, and perpetuate the memory of the giver very acceptably, and which may well serve as an example for others to follow. The renaissance of the book-plate has given a great impetus to the arts of engraving and etching on copper. Indeed, the increased employment of these delightful arts may almost be called a revival, for they were certainly languishing. Today they flourish. This welcome reanimation is widespread.

Introduction.

It is not confined to one nation even, but is really worldwide. It is due to the enthusiasm and industry of many active individuals, interested in books and their treatment. In the early days of the book-plate, the libraries were the leaders among its users; today, they are far behind the private collector of books. It is an interesting fact that of the three earliest authentic book-plates known, two were made for the express purpose of recording gifts of books to public libraries, or at least to the libraries of institutions as distinguished from individuals. Princely gifts were made to libraries of those days, and princely gifts are made to the libraries of today. It is gratifying to observe that several of the wealthy and larger libraries are now using engraved plates of the highest type, but it is very much to be desired that the custom of providing and using a fitting book-plate should prevail more widely.

Although we cannot claim that this is the first catalogue in which the plates are grouped under the names of the engravers and designers, arranged alphabetically (for Mr. J. Carlton Stitt used this method, in a part at least, of his catalogue of the exhibit given by the Liverpool Art Club. in January, 1895), it certainly is the first to deal with the engravers and their work with such fulness of detail, and in the thorough, scientific manner of the expert on engraving. The catalogue was planned and begun before Mr. H. W. Fincham's excellent "Artists and Engravers of British and American Book Plates" was published. In dealing with the engravers, a very brief biographical note has been given to aid in identification, and while there is no attempt at a full detailed description of the plates, the date is given and the manner of signing. As far as practicable, too, the process employed in making the plate has been indicated. This has not been a light task, especially in the case of the modern plates, for there are many processes employed, particularly of the photo-mechanical kind, which aim to resemble hand work closely, and to distinguish between them is not always easy. In the case of plates executed by means of more than one process, as engraving and etching, the one which preponderates is named.

In the first exhibition room (Case 5) the visitor will find an interesting assemblage of designs, copper-plates, blocks,

and trial-proofs, showing the engraved plate in various states, arranged thus to show the book-plate in process of creation. The articles gathered here are representative, and furnish a suitable preface to the rest of the exhibition. the same room, in Cases 10 and 11, the finished plates are seen doing duty in their intended place, - on the inside of the book's front cover. Here are old books. with old plates in them, and books once owned and read by distinguished men, and their book-plates remain in Here is one of the books which Bishop Huet prethem. sented to the College of Jesuits, in Paris, very near the end of the seventeenth century; here are volumes from the libraries of Horace Walpole, David Garrick, Charles Dickens, William Penn, Robert Hale, Peter Kemble, Randolph of Roanoke, and George Washington. These are books which give one a foretaste of the good things which attract the collector of book-plates. In the remaining cases in Room 1, are plates from Germany, France, the Netherlands, Italy, Spain, Switzerland, Denmark, and Sweden. while Rooms 2 and 3 are filled with plates produced in Great Britain and the United States. These cover a long range of years, fully four centuries, in fact, and afford an unusual and most instructive panorama of the progress of the book-plate.

The exhibit of present day plates, made by American artists, is very encouraging. Delightful examples of engraving on copper, of etching, of wood-cutting, and of black and white design, reproduced by photo-mechanical processes are numerous. This part of the exhibition is worthy of careful study, and the assemblage of so many examples of so many artists' work, should tend to increase the interest in artistic book-plates very perceptibly.

Although America was one of the last of the nations to be affected by the book-plate revival, it has taken the lead in the matter of artistic plates and in the number of good plates produced, to say nothing of its prominence on account of the number of its engravers, etchers, artists and designers, whose work is of the highest grade. It must be remembered that the great impetus came only about five years ago. In this short time, with the encouragement of enthusiastic collectors, our book-plate engravers and designers have placed this country ahead of all others in quantity as well as quality of work, for they have produced the greatest number of the finest plates, and the group of widely-known men to whom the credit is due. is larger than any other country can boast. There is today an eager demand from across the Atlantic for the best American plates. At the same time the work of Sherborn and Eve, the leading book-plate engravers of England, is eagerly sought, and the plates of Bell are popular, while every collector is anxious to get as nearly full sets as possible of the work of French, Hopson, Spenceley, Garret, Smith, and Hollyer, who are the foremost American engravers and etchers. There is too a growing number of black-and-white designers whose output demands commendation. In Germany the unquestioned leader is Joseph Sattler, while in the case of France it is difficult to specify any particularly prominent workers in book-plates, though the names of Paul Avril and Aglaüs Bouvenne will occur to many.

Every one then who takes a genuine interest in book-plates congratulates himself upon the position held by the United States and looks forward with great content to the coming centuries when the plates of to-day have become scarce and rare and will excite the comment and speculation of the collectors of those days. But book-plates can never again become so really forgotten and disregarded, or so rare as now, for records and books and collections are better preserved today than ever before, or at least we think they are, and there are many libraries which possess considerable collections, and especially notable is that of the British Museum of some 150,000 examples given by the late Sir Wollaston Franks.

The student of book-plates gives to Germany the honor of originating these marks of book possession, and regards that country as producing the earliest design used as a book-plate. It is true we are told that in Japan the bookplate was in use even in the tenth century, but as yet the statement, though it comes from a good authority, has had little chance of proof. Possibly future years will bring us to the conclusion that China, from which country Japan got her printing art, used the book-plate in even more

remote ages: still, as far as investigation has gone today. the collector halts at the plate known as that of Hildebrand Brandenburg, and considers it the earliest plate known. This plate is one of the small rude wood-cuts of the fifteenth century, crude in drawing, yet by no means bad. It represents a soaring angel carrying a large shield by its upper corners. On the silver shield is a blue forktailed ox, with a black ring in its nose, — the arms of the Brandenburg family. No name or inscription appears. except such as is written by hand. This written sentence tells us that the book in which the plate was found, belonged to the said Hildebrand Brandenburg of Bibrach. who was a monk in the Carthusian monastery of Buchshaim and to which institution he gave the book. These plates are printed on pieces of paper which have printing on the reverse and they are tinted with two or three colors.

Closely associated with this plate is one which was found in the same monastery, and which we know by its similar written inscription was used in books given to the library of the monastery by Wilhelm von Zell. This plate is probably not much removed from the other in point of time. Their date is fixed approximately at 1480. These plates are exceedingly interesting to the collector, and they furnish almost unbounded opportunity for speculation and question. In considering them, one must take also into account the famous "St. Christopher of 1423", the earliest dated wood cut known and which to our great satisfaction was also found in this same monastery of Buchshaim where the Friar Brandenburg and Younker von Zell book-plates were unearthed.

Heineken discovered this engraving pasted on the board cover of a volume which had been given to the monastery by Anna, canoness of Buchaw, but there is no reason to take it for a book-plate. It was one of the "Helglein", and was without doubt the work of one of the Formschneiders of Nuremberg or Augsburg. It is in the heart of Suabia that the earliest wood engravers flourished, and it is a matter of considerable satisfaction to the book-plate collector, that the prints he especially appreciates were made in this very region, within a comparatively short time of the "St. Christopher of 1423". And it is also of some importance to observe that the earliest use of the bookplate was for the purpose of recording the gifts of private donors to public libraries. The librarian of this old monastery has claims upon the regard and estimation of present-day librarians, and the example he set so long ago is worthy of close imitation today. He made use of the newest and best that the art of his day could supply. It may be noted in this connection, that not only the Formschneider but also the Kartenmaler contributed to the making of these plates. They were colored by hand, as well as cut in the wood.

The plate of Hans Igler, which for a time was considered to precede these, is not now believed to be as early as at first announced. It is a very curious plate and one well worth attention. It is pictorial in character and conveys by its motto not only a striking hint to the possible bookthief, but in connection with the pictorial representation of a hedge-hog, which occupies the centre of the design, a very passable pun. This picture shows the porcupine with a leaf in his mouth trampling on blossoms and leaves, he has apparently plucked in his passage. The motto reads "Hans Igler das dich ein igel küs", which may be said to mean "Hans Igler may a porcupine kiss you."

It gives the book-plate collector great pride and no small content to know that Albert Dürer designed bookplates. It dignifies the object of his patient search. The earliest to bear a date is heraldic, of course, and has the words, "Deus refugium meum; liber Hieronimi Ebner". As is to be expected, it far surpasses the older plates as "a thing of beauty" and in the eve of the collector fully justifies the conclusion of the well-known proverb. Eight years later, Dürer made a plate which is perhaps, more famous,--- the plate for his friend, Bilibald Pirckheimer, the Nuremberg jurist, historian, philologist, and royal councillor. This plate is shown in the present exhibition. It is extremely interesting. The central portion presents the arms of Pirckheimer and those of his wife, Margaretha Rieterin. The Pirckheimer arms illustrate the odd punning heraldry of the age, the birke, or birch-tree, being undoubtedly in reference to the family The Rieterin arms represent a crowned mermaid name.

with two tails, both being held in her hands. These arms are shown on two shields which are supported by a pair of substantial angels, who also contrive to bear an unusually big helmet and a correspondingly immense crest. The abundance of fruit and flowers and angels (some of the last in evident and quite surprising gayety of action) may denote the wealth of good things that in this life surrounded the owner of the plate. Not infrequently the books which have this plate within the front cover also hold on the back cover the portrait plate (if it is a real book-plate) of the same bulbous-faced jurist. There is another variety of the Pirckheimer plate, signed "J. B. 1529" which the late Sir Wollaston Franks first brought to the notice of book-plate collectors, although it had been mentioned long years ago by Bartsch. It is based on a design by Dürer but not by his hand.

Although signed with the initials "R. A." the plate of Dr. Hector Pömer is ascribed to Dürer, for he in all probability drew the design, the initials being those of the wood-cutter. This book-plate is among the best from the artist's point of view that Dürer made. It is a large one, thirteen inches by nine, showing the Pömer arms, a figure of St. Laurence in the monkish dress (for Dr. Pömer was the Prior of the Abbey of St. Laurence in Nuremberg), and the motto "To the pure all things are pure", in three languages, Hebrew, Greek and Latin. The most interesting copies of this plate known today are in the two folio volumes containing Erasmus's edition of the works of St. Ambrose, which were given by Erasmus himself to Dr. Pömer. They are from Froben's press, and according to Hardy, are today owned by the Rev. H. W. Pereira.

Turning to Bartsch we find a list of about a score of "Armoiries" by Dürer. It would be easy, but not safe, to conclude that these were book-plates. Indeed, it may be well to state here that the collector has need of great care in claiming as book-plates many of the old heraldic engravings he discovers, or in believing too readily the statement of dealers who offer genuine book-plates (socalled). There were many places for heraldic engravings besides on the book cover.

In the sixteenth century, German book-plates become

really numerous, and their value as works of art increases rapidly, though, to many, there is no work comparable to Dürer's. The warm-hearted and well-expressed praise, bestowed upon him in Bryan (Graves's edition), is well worth quoting here.

"Dürer's art is essentially German in character, and those who only admire the Italian ideal, find nothing in it to desire. But in his art we find a noble expression of the German mind, with its high intellectual powers, its daring speculative philosophy, its deep-seated reverence, its patient laboriousness, and above all, its strange love for the weird and grotesque".

Another most interesting book-plate by Dürer is the Behaim von Schwarzbach, which is exhibited here.

We are fortunate, too, in having a copy of the famous Holzschuher plate by Jost Amman, another plate of punning heraldry, in which the wooden shoes, used as charges on the field, refer to the family name. This plate, it must be remarked, is engraved on copper, and is signed "J. A". Amman was a painter as well as an engraver, and his copper-plates are inferior, as a rule, to his woodcuts. He was a prodigious worker, for we know of well over five hundred prints from his woods and coppers.

Another early engraver was Hans Siebmacher, who is represented here by his plate for Andreas Beham. This is an etching and is dated 1595. We have also an anonymous plate dated 1581 and the plate of Henry, Bishop of Augsburg, which bears the figures 1600.

Of the seventeenth century plates we show Georg Ludwig Kirchmair's, which is dated 1611. One of the most important plates of the first quarter of this century is that of the Ducal Library of Bavaria, which is dated 1618. It is known in several sizes and states. The plate of the Thierhaupten Monastery bears the date 1667.

In the eighteenth century the plates are more numerous than ever before and a still greater number of engravers must be considered. Among the representative men of this period, which the Club of Odd Volumes is able to represent, are Martin Tyroff, a German, Daniel Nicolaus Chodowiecki, Joh. Boehm, Jacob Andreas Fridrich, the younger, and engraver to the Duke of Würtemburg, Johann Ulrich Kraus of Augsburg, Franz Leopold Schmittner of Vienna, Franz Xaver Jungwierth of Munich, Peter Fehr of Francfort, I. E. Gericke of Berlin, Joh. Heinr. Wicker of Francfort, and Anna Rosina Wicker, his wife, Johann Martin Bernigeroth of Leipsic, Carl Gottfried Nestler of Dresden, and Joh. Rud. Schellenberg of Switzerland.

Coming to the present century and the modern plates, we find Emil Doepler, Jr., a Berlin lithographer, Prof. A. M. Hildebrandt, whose designs are usually reproduced by lithography, and Clemens Kissel of Mayence, Ernst Krahl of Vienna and Eduard Lorenz Mayer of Hamburg, whose works are reproduced by photo-mechanical processes. Among the best known of all the present day German bookplate designers, however, Joseph Sattler is far-and-away the best.

In 1895, the late F. Warnecke published in England a series of forty-two plates designed by Sattler, which at once took the attention of collectors everywhere as the most remarkable and original drawings for book-plates which had been seen in a long time. In his preface to these plates, Herr Warnecke said : " Sattler proceeds by a method of his own. Heraldry is almost entirely neglected. most of the plates bearing emblematical or allegorical designs. His ideal is Albrecht Dürer, but he does not copy him. Whether he is worthy to be called a disciple of this great master the following plates will show. That his designs are original and exquisitely executed no one can deny. Though some of the sketches are fantastic or grotesque, we cannot quarrel with the artist on that account. It must be remembered that he has not been free to consult his own taste only he has had to study also the tastes of his employers. Be that as it may it is certain that every true amateur and collector will greet with favour this work of a young and promising artist, whose drawings have already - 1893 - won for him a "mention honorable" in the "Salon deParis".

Herr Warnecke is inclined to compare Sattler's work with that of the late Aubrey Beardsley and considers it rather remarkable that two such similar and peculiar geniuses should have arisen at about the same time. Another artist whose work has been attracting attention is ^{¬itz} Erler of Munich. Introduction.

In summing up the history of the book-plate in Germany, after an examination of the works already mentioned and those of such artists too as Holbein, Hans Sebald Beham, Lucas Cranach, Johann Troschel, Wolfgang Kilian of Augsburg and Virgil Solis, one is inclined to agree that, like the art of printing, which sprang fullgrown into the world and whose first performances have never been improved upon, if even equalled, the art of the book-plate reached during its very early years a degree of perfection that may well stand, and does in fact, to a large extent, as the model of to-day. The early German plates are rough, but strong. They never became delicate, though losing something of their rudeness as years pass on, and to-day the best German designers are distinctive and firm. while the older examples retain their marked superiority over the work of other nations.

The earliest dated book-plate which France can boast is the simple typographical label bearing the words :

EX BIBLIOTHECA CAROLI ALBOSII E. EDUENSIS

EX LABORE QUIES.

1574.

It belonged to Charles d'Aileboust, Bishop of Autun, who died in 1585. This label and the manuscript ex libris (and here one naturally drops into the use of this term in place of the better one for general use, book-plates, because its use is sanctioned by the authorities and because it fits the present object of remark better than the other) which is often found in the early French books, are typical of the earliest book-plates in France. Frequently one comes across a written note beginning with the expressions "Ex Libris Domini," "Ex Libris Monasterii" and "Ex Libris Conventua", in the old books, which takes the place of the engraved book-plate. Ecclesiastical book-plates are not very numerous in France, or very old. The earliest dated armorial book-plate was engraved by Léonard Gaultier in 1611 and was for the books of Alexander Bouchart, Vicomte de Blosséville. There is one dated 1613 and one in 1644, which, with the already mentioned plate recording the gift of Dr. Peter

Daniel Huet, to the Paris Jesuits, about completes the list of seventeenth century dated or signed plates.

French book-plates are, as Hardy observes, interesting on account of their owners more than by reason of their engravers, though it is, of course, a pleasure to come across plates by Boucher, Eisen, Gribelin or Gravelot. But the plates of the monarchs, the women, the authors, and the statesmen of France have a special interest. The plates of Emeric Bigot, the bibliophile, and of Alexander Petau, who collected fine books and manuscripts, the plates of Pierre Seguier, of Louis XV. and his three daughters, Madame Victoire de France and the Princesses Adelaide and Sophie, of M. de Joubert, of Gueuelette the dramatist, of Madame Roland, of Lavoisier, of Charlotte Corday, of the Chevalier d'Eon, of Madame de Staël, of de Piis the dramatist, of Napoleon's brother Lucien, which bears the inscription "Ex Bibliotheca Principis Canini", of Alphonse Karr, of Maximilian, Emperor of Mexico (which properly belongs in the American lists but is mentioned here because of its owner's connection with Napoleon III.), of the Duchesse de Berry, of Leon Gambetta, of Victor Hugo, of Theophile Gautier, of Paul Lacroix, which has the words "P. L. Jacob Bibliophile", of Charles Monselet, and of the Vicomtesse de Bonnemains are instances.

The book-plate of France is different from that of all other countries : for a time it displays heraldry; for a time it is ornate and exceedingly pretty; plain styles have their vogue and during certain periods no one shows any heraldic trappings. One reason why the book-plate has not been so popular in France as in other countries, is because of the attention given in that country to the binding of books. Far prettier possibly, certainly more aristocratic, is the special binding of elegantly tooled morocco, with the arms or device of the owner elaborately inlaid or stamped thereon. To these outside marks of book possession collectors generally have given the name "super libros", though in France they are included in the term "ex libris" along with the printed plate. In this exhibition one may see a most interesting sequence of finely bound books showing the super libros of royalty in France

from Henry III. to Napoleon III. Grolier, who used no book-plate, used to have the following line stamped upon many of his bindings :

JO. GROLIERII ET AMICORUM.

And by this he proclaimed himself more generous in spirit than most of his successors in the love of books prove themselves to be.

The other Continental countries may be disposed of with a word. Book-plates are in use and old examples are known in all of them. Sweden has a plate dated 1575, Switzerland has one bearing the figures 1607, Italy has one dated 1623, and examples of Spanish, Danish, Russian and Austrian book-plates, while not so numerous, find their way into the collector's album.

In England the book plate has been more generally used than anywhere else, and its examples have been studied more than those of any other country. Lord de Tabley originated the division into styles which still obtains among collectors, and which is likely to endure, with few changes, as long as book-plates are collected, exhibited, written of, and talked about. What is known as the "Early English" style is chiefly characterized by the arrangement of the mantling, which usually is made to envelop the shield of arms, spreading out at the sides like a mass of foliage. These plates were in use previous to the eighteenth century. From about 1700 to 1745, the prevailing style was very conventional in decoration, and was remarkable for its solidity rather than for its grace-The two sides of the shield exactly coincided, fulness. and the whole arrangement was rather stiff and formal. It resembled the furniture of the day; it was massive, wooden, imposing from its very weight. This style is known as the "Jacobean".

The Chippendale style came in with the new ideas in upholstery and furniture making, which the famous T. Chippendale introduced into England. The decorative art of the day was greatly influenced by his ideas, and the book-plate, which is, in all countries, exceedingly susceptible to the changes of style, at once lost much of its old stiffness, and took on some of the grace and lightness of

Introduction.

Chippendale's cabinets and chairs and coverings. After this had held sway long enough, there came into use a plate, less abundant in decoration, relying principally upon a ribbon, and a wreath or spray of palm or holly for its effect. The shield of arms was plain in design, and was placed over a ribbon which carried the motto, while on either side there rose sprays of holly tied with a ribbon in a big bow-knot at the bottom. This is called the "Ribbon and Wreath" style. After this came the Plain Armorial which discarded all attempts at decoration, and was an unadorned coat-of-arms. All along, with these various styles, there ran the pictorial plates, the allegorical, the library interior, the literary, the portrait, the book-pile, and the trophy, all of which, unless it be the last, are sufficiently explained by their very names. The trophy plate is one in which the principal decoration is supplied by the introduction and careful disposal about the shield, of any number of military accoutrements, such as flags, cannon, muskets, drums, and similar implements. Ladies' plates are now a distinct branch, and a goodly number of lady designers are now making plates. This rapid survey of the principal styles will enable the visitor to place the specimens seen in this exhibition, and for a further study of them, he must be referred to the many books on the subject.

The earliest dated plate England can boast was owned by no less a personage than Sir Nicholas Bacon and bears the date 1574. Earlier by something like half a century is the plate that once graced the books of Cardinal Wolsey, a gorgeous ecclesiastical affair, but having no date. It is quite out of the question to enumerate here the many interesting plates which England has yielded up to the investigations of the collectors. The present exhibition is rich in good examples and there is abundant opportunity for comparison and study. To the experienced collector no less than to the tyro does the collection commend itself.

In America, within the borders of the United States at least, the earliest known dated plate was owned by Governor Dudley and bore the following inscription, "His Excellency, Joseph Dudley, Esqr., Governor of New England, 1702". The plates of William Penn and Thomas Page (the last being from Virginia) are dated 1703, and in the next year there are two, those of Thomas Prince, and the Society for Propagating the Gospel in Foreign Parts, which is perhaps not rightfully claimed as American, though the copies so classed were certainly used in the American Colonies. Very probably the colonies got the book-plate fashion from England. Beyond question books with plates in them came over with many a party of the richer adventurers, and as the country grew and prospered we know that books and plates were ordered from the old country. These went more to the places south of New York than to those north of that city, for in New England most of the early book-plates were made by native selftaught engravers on copper, whose work of course was rougher than that of the London experts.

These book-plates of the early period are extremely interesting for two good reasons. The memorials of important old families are always attractive, and the first native work in any branch of worthy effort possesses a peculiar value. So then we find many plates that are interesting by reason of the position of their old owners, in colonial matters, either as lawyers, statesmen, soldiers, ministers, professional men or laymen of "parts". Then too, when a plate bears a signature, or can be accurately assigned to a known engraver, it rises in the estimation of the collector. One of the best and most popular makers of book-plates in old New England days was Nathaniel Hurd of Boston, whose work was done for the best families and was the best that could be had in the colonies. The few book-plates that we know were done by the hand of Paul Revere, the Boston patriot, have also an especial value and one of them has the distinction of having sold at auction for the highest price yet paid for an American This is the Epes Sargent. plate.

Other important men in the New England group were Abel Bowen who was the first wood-engraver in Boston, and whose Harvard College plates are much prized, Joseph Callender, a Boston-born engraver of whom little is known, Henry Dawkins, who according to Dunlap was from New England and who engraved the wildest sort of Chippendale plates, Nathaniel Dearborn who was associated with Bowen here in Boston, Amos Doolittle, the famous Connecticut engraver, who made several plates for societies and libraries, notably one or two for the literary societies at Yale, Gideon Fairman of Connecticut, John Mason Furnass, nephew of Hurd, who engraved the rare Eli Forbes plate, Harris and Hill of Boston, Jocelyn of New Haven, Thomas Johnson who reposes in King's Chapel Burying-ground, and James Turner who engraved the exceedingly rare plate of John Franklin of Boston.

The New York and southern group comprised, besides Maverick, who was the best known, John Boyd, Edward Gallaudet, Abraham Godwin, Francis Kearney, William Rollinson, Smithers, Sparrow of Annapolis, Thackara, Trenchard, and Vallance. As the visitor examines the numerous examples of these engravers' work, he should not judge them too harshly from the artistic stand-point, nor compare them too sharply with the examples of the same date which were made across the Atlantic. The conditions under which these men worked was very different from those of the English engravers, and considering all the disadvantages under which they labored their bookplates are remarkably good.

The prolific period of these early American plates was during the last quarter of the eighteenth century. After the War of 1812, there was a continual diminution in the number of book-plates engraved and presently there began a period when for quite a stretch of years the output was very limited. Along about 1850 the custom began to revive and plates were made in greater numbers, but the real revival is now upon us. During all the periods since the introduction of book-plates in this country there has been a great number of typographical labels. These abound in a number of different combinations of wood-cut and type-set designs, and are chiefly interesting as indicating a very general desire to give books a personal mark, even if it could not be, for any reason, on the elaborate scale of the engraved specimens.

As we come over into the present day, we are met with a profusion of plates, and a large number of workers with graver, needle, and pencil, whose product is of great value. Edwin Davis French of New York, William F. Hopson of

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New Haven, J. Winfred Spenceley of Boston, Edmund H. Garrett of Winchester, Howard Sill of Baltimore, Sidney L. Smith of Boston, Samuel Hollyer of New York, and Schweinfurth of Boston, Louis Rhead, George Wharton Edwards, D. McN. Stauffer, Henry C. Eno, and Thomas Tryon, all of New York, are among the best known of the engravers and artists of the day who design and execute book-plates. Edwin A. Abbey and Henry Sandham have made one or two highly-prized designs.

The plates of the present day in this country are generally free from heraldic insignia, though they are sometimes used. The late Eugene Field used a very simple and effective book-plate showing the old Field coat-ofarms, but Dr. Oliver Wendell Holmes chose for his design the nautilus, which he had long before celebrated in verse, which will never die. The aim to-day is to express the personal bent of the owner, his pursuits, his favorite books and authors, his especial delights in collecting. Pictorial features and actual representations of interiors or pleasant views, historic buildings or even famous portraits are frequently incorporated in the design.

The earliest collector of book-plates of whom record is left, is Miss Jenkins of Bath, England, who about the year 1820 was an active student of these delightful marks of book ownership and whose collection reached the respectable proportions of over 5000 specimens. In the thirties, Dr. Joseph Jackson Howard began collecting, and by the year 1877, he had amassed 20,000 examples. He absorbed the collection made by Miss Jenkins, which was contained in four quarto volumes and was sold at the auction rooms of Messrs. Puttick and Simpson, as well as the collection formed by Dr. Wellesley of Oxford, which was devoted almost entirely to Continental plates and which contained a great number of remarkably fine things. Bagford, of course, gathered book-plates, but not with particular relish and the few he owned are in the British Museum today. It is beyond question true, that bona fide book-plates had found their way into many of the great and small collections of prints which were made before this time, but it seems probable that the book-plate was not regarded interesting, per se, until the present century.

In 1823 the "Gentleman's Magazine" contained a contribution from one "C. S. B." who mentions the Fust book-plate and those made by Hogarth. The first use of the term "Book-plate" to distinguish these charming engravings, is, so far as is known today, found in John Ireland's "Hogarth Illustrated", whose first volume was published in 1791. Ireland says "the works of Callot were probably his (Hogarth's) first models, and shop-bills and book-plates his first performances". Were it not practically certain that Hogarth engraved the book-plates of John Ireland and Elis Gamble, as well as one for his own use, and a few others, it might not be safe to take this use of the word as a deliberate reference to the particular bits we are considering, for the expression might easily have been used in reference to the plates for regular book illustration. Indeed we have a case in point. some time it has been the habit of book-plate collectors to refer to a passage in the diary of Samuel Pepys as the first mention in print of the book-plate. The researches of Mr. Henry B. Wheatley, however, lead that unquestioned authority to state in his new edition of the great Diary, that this passage does not refer to the book-plates which the vain old babbler used to denote his ownership of books. but concerns guite a different subject, namely, the preparation of four engraved plates of the King's dock-vards. The passage occurs under date of July, 21, 1668, and reads as follows :

"21st. . . . So home to the office, where all the morning, and so to dinner, and then all the afternoon at the office, only went to my plate-maker's, and there spent an hour about contriving my little plates, for my books of the King's four Yards."

In a foot-note, Mr. Wheatley refers to the use bookplate collectors have long made of these lines, and calling attention to an entry under date of the 27th of the same month, which more fully explains what these plates were, completely upsets the view hitherto held.

About the middle of the last century, a book-seller named Joseph Barber plied his trade in Newcastle. Thomas Moule reproduces on page 367 of his "Bibliotheca Heraldica", a curious excerpt from an old copy of the "Gentleman's Magazine", which refers to a large copper plate of the equestrian statue of King James which Barber had published, and which was embellished with an enclosing frame made up of the arms of the gentlemen and ladies who had subscribed for copies of the print. In this excerpt, it appears that Barber wishes to call the attention of his subscribers to his intention of cutting up the large copper, and of selling to their various owners, for the further sum of 2s. 6d. each, the pieces which contain their arms. In explanation of this attempt to get a double price out of his customers, he says:

"The design of this proposal is a useful and necessary embellishment, and a remedy against losing books, by lending, or having them stolen; by pasting one print on the inside of the cover of each book, you have the owner's name, coat of arms, and place of abode, a thing so useful and the charge so easy, 'tis hoped will meet with encouragement".

This early reference to the book-plate, though it is not so named, is very interesting, and so is the fact that books are still preserved having "on the inside of the cover", prints from the coppers advertised by the enterprising Barber.

The interest in book-plates as an object worthy the attention of the collector spread very gradually. Until quite recently, one may say, the few who knew what they were and what was interesting in them, could purchase them at a penny a piece, without distinction as to age. size or any of the other features now eagerly regarded as adding to the value of a plate. There are many collectors in England who remember the good old days when both in London and along the quays of Paris they could stuff their pockets with good plates for almost nothing. But those days have passed away and today the book-plate has a marketable value, is sold at auction, is listed in catalogues, nay, even has risen to the dignity of having a good sized catalogue published in which nothing but bookplates are considered, and has still further been honored with a book by no less an authority than Mr. J. H. Slater, which gives the sale prices of some three hundred good examples.

The first book devoted wholly to the consideration of book-plates was "The Study of Book-Plates", by Hon. L. Leicester Warren (the late Lord de Tabley), which was published in 1880. Lord de Tablev was a choice poet and a ripe scholar, and he approached his subject with a mind well stored with information and with an imagination which fitted him to write of these plates and the collector's delight in them, with rare grace. The book is hard to get now, but those that have it may rest assured that in spite of all that has been written on this subject since its appearance, they still possess absolutely the best work, the only one that is indispensable. The interest which this book excited was communicated by one booklover to another until a considerable territory was affected and the contagion spread across the ocean in several directions, reaching France, Germany, Sweden and the United States at about the same time. Societies of collectors were formed soon after, the first being The Ex Libris Society, whose headquarters are in London and which was started in 1801. The interest in the subject spread beyond all conception, a literature began to spring up, and almost before it was realized, the book-plate had passed out of the hands of a few quiet and scholarly men who loved them, and had become a popular hobby, in which at first only bookish men were interested, but which at length, and in a surprisingly short time, was taken up by many who had no especial interest in books, but wished to be collecting the popular thing.

And so it came about that within a dozen or fifteen years from the publication of Lord de Tabley's delightful book, the collecting of book-plates was a wide-spread "fad". This is a word your genuine collector hates to have applied to this interesting branch of collecting, yet it is a fit one with which to describe the situation today. Plates are "collected" by persons who have little interest in them and whose idea of collecting is to buy wholesale, and to purchase, at whatever price, the plate that few collections can boast. It is true that all this has resulted in what may be called the science of book-plate collecting and has caused a money value to be set on the best plates, all of which brings certain advantages. Still those can

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be found who do not care for the publicity now attached to the whole subject, and who would be glad to return to the old days of quiet exchange and of correspondence with chosen friends of congenial mind, of unbothered investigation which returned information it was not necessary to publish.

One of the great trials of the careful and genuinely fond collector of book-plates today is that he is classed with those whose ways are different from his and are of the sort that merit and receive condemnation. It is a new instance of an old experience, — the good suffering with the wicked.

Now and again criticism of the collector appears in the public prints and very often some well-meaning collector attempts to make reply to the scathing remarks of his accusers, but such contests are of doubtful value. There are collectors and collectors. There are those who have no sense, and who will maltreat a book to get the plate from its dainty cover, and there are those who know when to take a plate from a book, and when to take book and plate and let them remain the inseparable companions they were meant to be. Collecting bookplates is an entirely worthy and laudable pursuit. It serves many good purposes. It preserves interesting mementos of by-gone worthies in several walks and grades of life, which have been for years disregarded and thoughtlessly destroyed. It preserves books and the memories of their writers, as well as the works of engravers whose names are known round the world. It adds not a little to the sum of interesting information that helps the days to pass pleasantly, and it gives joy and comfort to many a lover of books and prints as he sits by the wood fire and displays his treasures to his interested caller.

But beyond his value as a preserver of things likely to be lost and the re-awakening of an interest in persons and things well-nigh forgotten, the book-plate collector is of value to the present and the future years. He has exerted a wonderful influence on the art of design and has put new life in the fast dying art of copper-plate engraving. In summing up these points wherein the book-plate hobby (for this word is quite satisfactory) is of value, no mention has been made of the inward delight and mental pleasure of the collector himself, which is not to be overlooked, for though it cannot be measured and weighed, it contributes its share to the pleasure of the passing days, and innocent enjoyment is gain.

Society for Propagating the Gospel. This is a 37. different version, - not a different state; but another engraving, — of the plate, No. 1783 of this catalogue. It is bound into a copy of Eliot's Indian Bible, of the edition of 1685. Underneath the plate is printed in type: "Printed by order of the Society, John Chamberlayne, Secretary". This would seem to indicate that it ought to be found in all copies of the Eliot Bible, but of the copies now known, this is the only one which contains it. On a comparison with the plate shown under No. 1783 the differences will be readily seen, the most obvious being, that the sun is without rays, and that the scroll below, instead of containing the "Gift" inscription, is filled up with an engraved tint. At the back of the book still another impression of the same society's plate is bound in, which, at first sight, appears to be of the same version as No. 1783, but with the date, 1704, almost erased. Closer examination, however, reveals quite a number of differences, which would seem to show that it is from the retouched plate.
