### FOREWORD

THE present Exhibition has been formed by the INTER-NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF ANTIQUARIAN BOOKSELLERS with the object of illustrating the progress of the Art of Typography in this country from its inception to the year 1800.

Various foreign presses are naturally inseparable from the early English Book Trade, and for divers reasons have been included in the present Exhibition. Our prototypographer Caxton and several of his successors learned their trade abroad, and, indeed, many of the foremost printers and publishers settled in this country in the fifteenth and early sixteenth centuries were of foreign extraction. In many cases, as a matter of necessity, books in English (usually those prohibited for reasons connected with religious controversy) or service books intended for the English market, were printed by foreigners who had never set foot in these isles, and apart from their interest as regards our language, have been included to show their typographical influence on English printing.

The books are arranged under the names of their printers, as nearly as possible chronologically, taking the dates of the earliest production of each press as a guide. These dates are given, together with the year of the termination of the press, at the head of each section dealing with a particular printer or publisher. Each item is arranged according to its date, actual or supposed, its description being preceded by the name of the author (in some cases, by that of the translator, if better known); then the title and imprint, usually transcribed from the first page of the book; then the size, and date. The words of the colophon next follow, with occasionally brief remarks on the contents, woodcuts or bindings. In the case

of undated books, the approximate year, ascertained from other sources, is placed within square brackets, sometimes including the word "circa."

Each individual exhibitor is responsible for his own descriptions and for any statement contained therein.

Transcriptions of titles, colophons, etc., are as literal as possible consistent with brevity, but when the descriptive slips, as in this case, are by different hands, and when there is not ready access to the original books for confirmation of minor points, it is hardly in the power of an editor to ensure absolute uniformity in the plan of descriptions, but it may be noted that no pains have been spared to reduce discrepancies in the Catalogue to a minimum as far as possible. It is hoped, therefore, that the following pages, as a record of a collection of representative printing in this country, may have somewhat more than ephemeral value.

The best thanks of the Association are due to the Right Honourable the EARL OF CRAWFORD, K.T., for the loan of a series of Broadsides and Proclamations; to the GOVERNORS OF ST. BRIDE FOUNDATION for many exhibits; and to the WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF STATIONERS for the use of their Ancient Hall, than which no place could be more appropriate for a retrospect of the Book Trade of this country, seeing that the formation of the Company itself preceded by about fifty years the Invention of Gutenberg, and thus has a history extending over more than five centuries.




