This curious doll was purchased by Col. Wm. Hoffman, U. S. Army, of the Sioux Indians, at Fort Laramie, in 1853 or 1854. The price paid for it was \$20 in gold. It was made by the squaws of the tribe for the Chief's daughter. Col. Hoffman informed Mrs. Hewson that he had been stationed at different posts near the wild Indian tribes for almost twenty years, and in all that time had not seen another Indian doll, nor an attempt to make one. It may be considered the only Indian doll ever made, and therefore a very rare curiosity.

729. TWO PIECES OF PLYMOUTH ROCK, donated by *Wm. T. Davis, V. P. of the Pilgrim Society.* Mr. D. writes of them as follows:

When the foundations for the Monument were laid, in 1859, it was found necessary to remove a small portion, which has been preserved with jealous care by the Pilgrim Society. Having some of these pieces in my possession, as an officer of the Society, it has occurred to me that Western patriotism, on the anniversary of the Landing of the Pilgrims, the day of the opening of your Fair, would appreciate

such a memento of the deeds of our fathers, which have given us the country we are now endeavoring so faithfully to preserve.
