The sizes of engraved parts are given in inches and fractions thereof; the first indicates the height, the second the width.

R. CHARLES BURT was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, November 8, 1823. After the usual seven years' apprenticeship, he came to this country, and rose rapidly to eminence in his profession. He settled in Brooklyn, where he died March 25, 1892.

He was a pupil of the celebrated painter and engraver, William Holme Lizars (a classmate of Sir David Wilkie).

Mr. Burt taught etching to Professor John Wilson, well known as "Christopher North," of Blackwood's Magazine, Edinburgh. In 1860, Mr. Burt was the second president of the Graham Art School, of the Brooklyn Institute, and in 1864, at the time of the Sanitary Fair, held in Brooklyn, he took a leading part in the getting up of an exhibition of engravings, contributing many specimens from his own portfolios. With the assistance of his friend, Mr. John M. Falconer (who has also given valuable aid in the arrangement of this catalogue), were arranged and hung some two hundred and forty-six engravings. This was the first public exhibition of the kind ever held in this country. Mr. Burt had many pupils, whom he was always ready to aid, and by whom his counsel was highly valued. Many of the postage stamps of foreign nationalities were the work of his burin. Italy, Russia, Brazil, Chili, Canada and other governments solicited his services, and he served them most satisfactorily. But his first ambition was to serve the country of his adoption—for to it he gave his best speech and devoted integrity. For many years he was the principal engraver in the United States Bureau of Engraving and Printing in Washington, D. C., and at the time of his death had been considered for many years the master of line engraving in this country.

His character, as a husband, father and friend, was pure as the unfallen snow. His home he beautified by his presence and his works.
