"The Cenci," begun at Rome on the fourteenth of May, 1819, was finished about the middle of August and printed in Leghorn the same year, though not published in England till the spring of 1820. It has a few errors of the press incidental to the Italian compositor's ignorance of English and is a characteristic piece of typography; but, on the whole, a preferable text to the second edition.

This copy of the "Ode to Naples" probably was copied by Mary Shelley for the purpose of printing it in the "Posthumous Poems" of Shelley published in 1824.

There are small differences in the text of this and the published versions which may have been changed in the proofs.
