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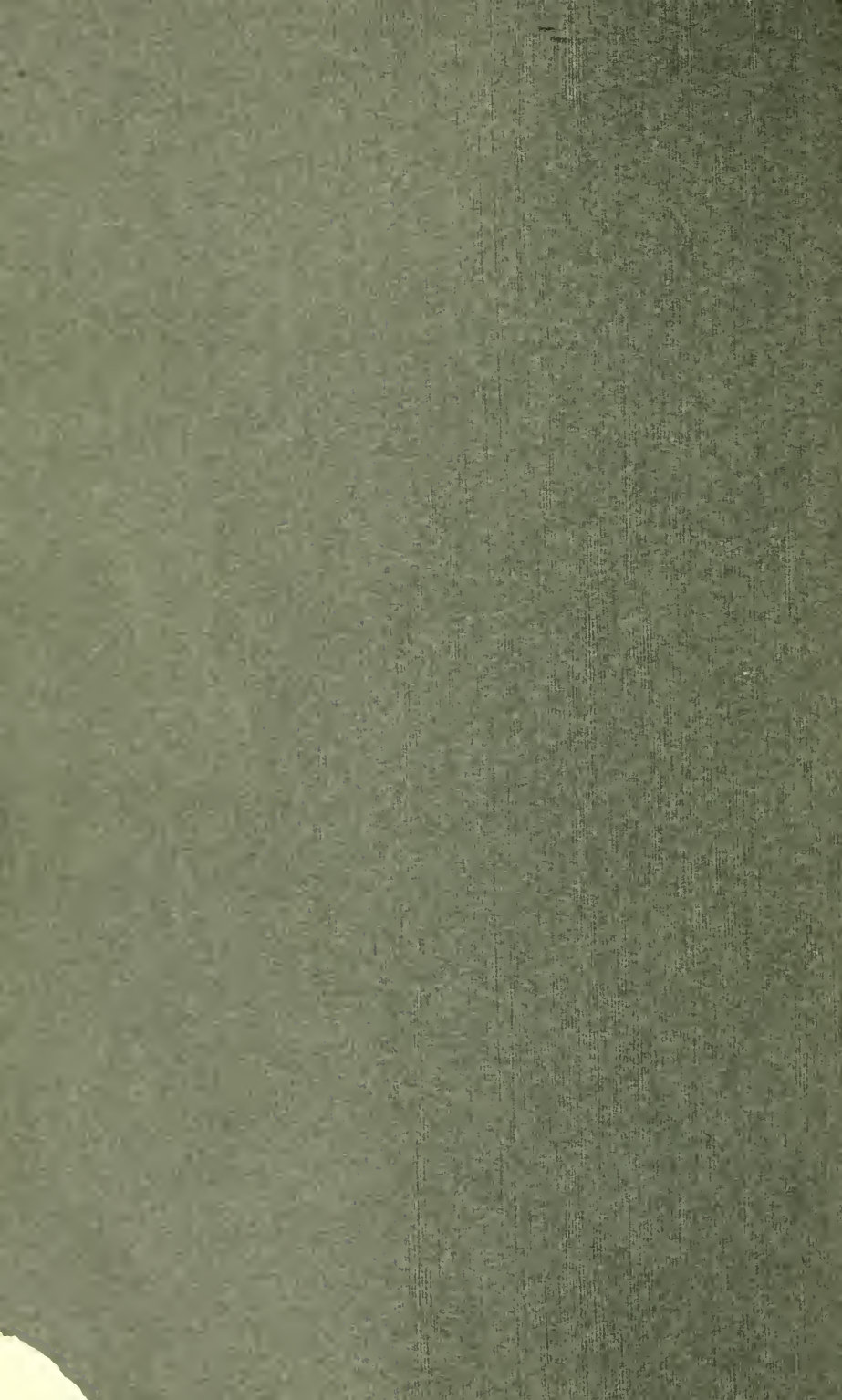

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In 1899 the Grolier Club held an exhibition of Lincoln Portraits and issued a catalogue of same with an admirable introduction by Charles Henry Hart. This was the first attempt to make a systematic record of Lincoln Portraits, and described 159 items.

During the intervening years many portraits have been added to collections. Practically all engravings of Lincoln are based upon photographs, and 100 of these photographs have been reproduced in Frederick Hill Messerve's book issued in 1911. I suppose it would be proper in a definitive list of Lincoln Portraits to list the photographs and identify the engraving with the photograph on which it was based.

This catalogue is in no sense a definitive one. I had long felt the need of a list of my collection for my own use, and during the past summer I had a card index made. This work having been done, I decided to have the list printed as a basis for a definitive list and as a convenience to other collectors.

This will explain why I have included a lot of process portraits and broadsides, which have no right to be in a list of Lincoln Portraits; why I have had the list printed on one side of the paper only, and why I offer no apology for errors or crudeness in the descriptions.

I hope that this addition to the Grolier Club catalogue may result in a complete catalogue, compiled along proper lines, so that collectors may have the benefit of a complete list of the portraits of Abraham Lincoln.

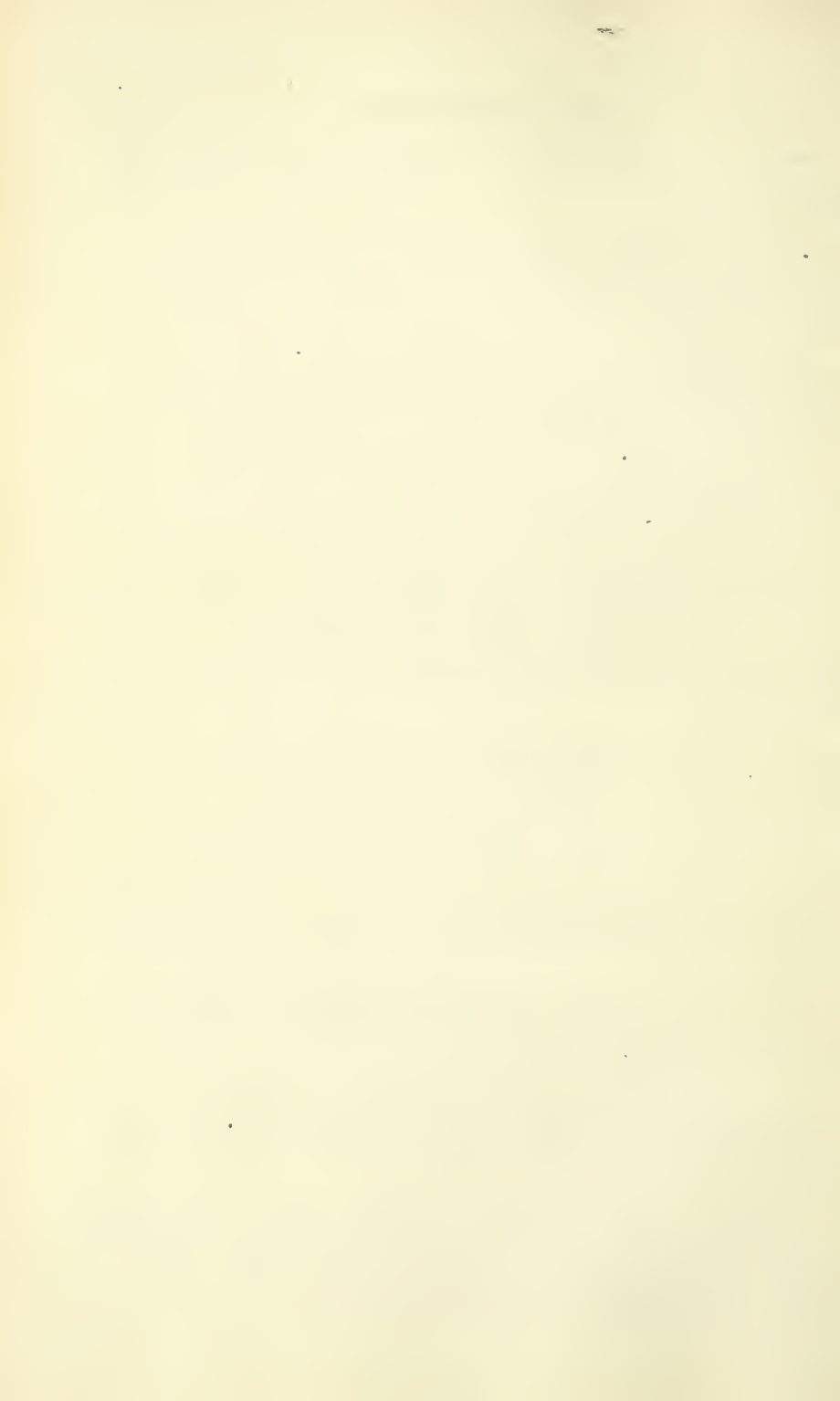

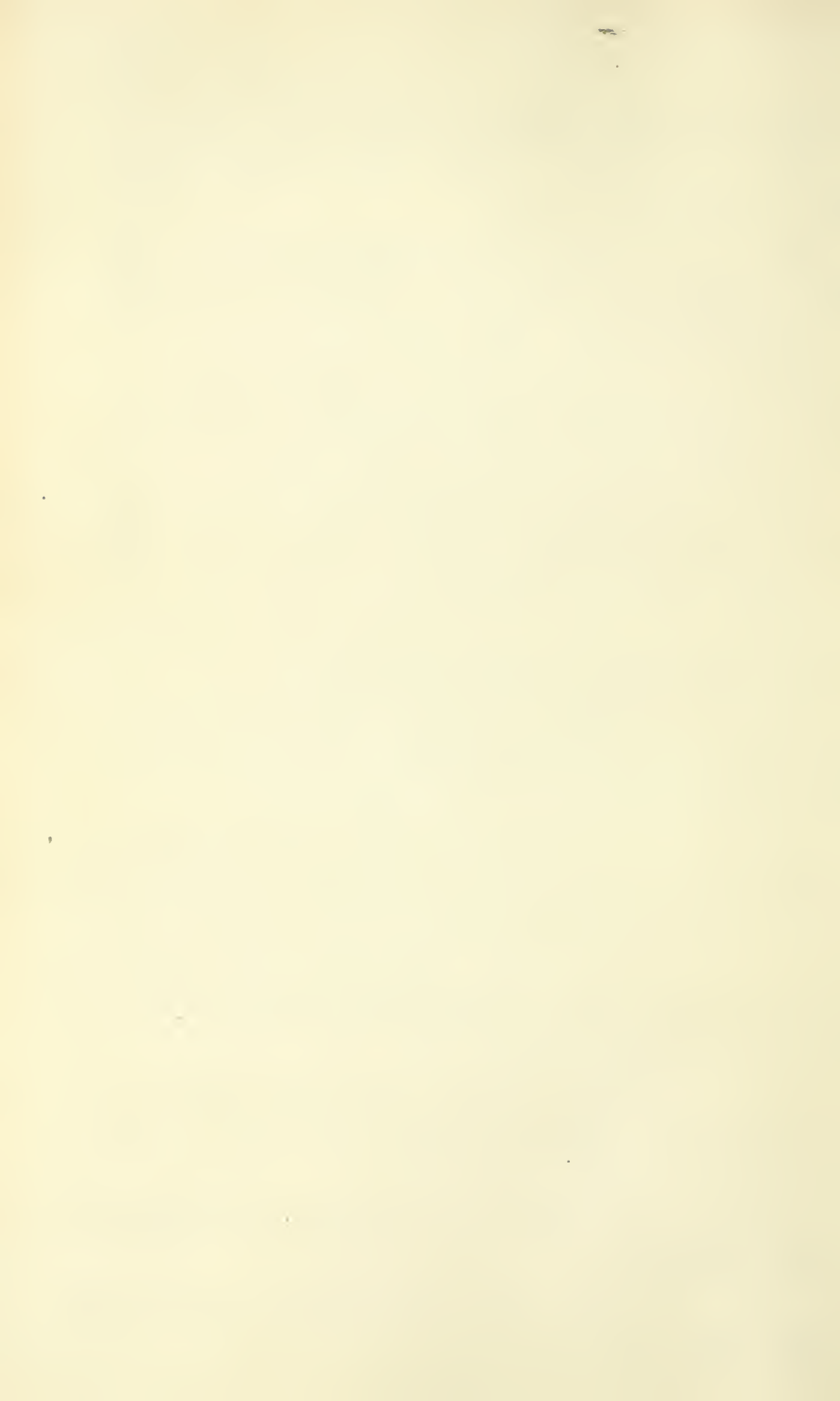
