MIDWINTER CONCERT AND DANCE

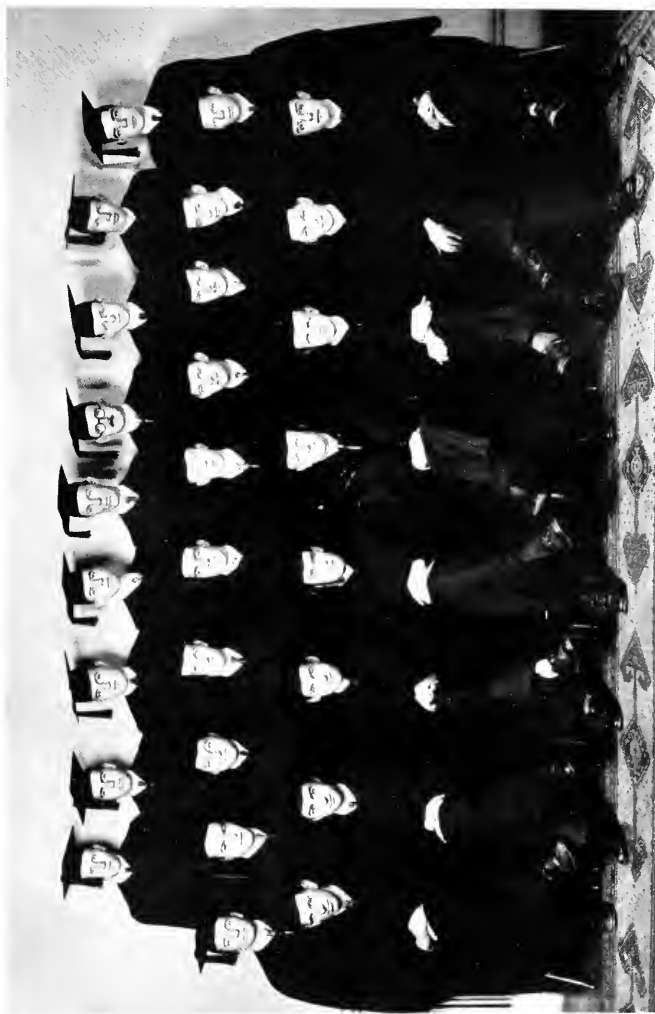

Through its Service and Welfare department, which sends flowers, books and cards to sick students, and through its Lost and Found department which returns an average of one hundred articles a week, the Student Union renders a great service to the students.

By means of its diversified intercollegiate contacts the Union has given a dignified publicity to the University. Delegates are sent to a large number of student conferences throughout the year to discuss problems of common interest to all college students.

The Soccer Season



WHILE the Northeastern soccer team failed to match the brilliant showings of former Husky elevens, Captain Al Booker's booters turned in a very creditable record, winning five of the eight games on the schedule. Coach Dave Priestly, who brought Northeastern to the top in college soccer circles, was forced to give up his connections with the team early in the fall, and Jim McDonald, genial manager of the local "Pros", was engaged to tutor the "kickers". Mac proved a capable teacher and much of the success of last year's eleven was due to his untiring efforts to produce a winner. Dave was able to attend a few practice sessions and his interest in the team was also greatly appreciated.

Weakened by the loss of the brilliant Herb Tiffany, Les Kershaw, Dinny Gorbell, and Lyn Stetson by graduation, and also by the failure of certain veterans to report, Coach McDonald had to rebuild the Husky machine considerably before the 1931 model made its debut. Once the season opened however, Captain Al Booker and his mates did themselves proud on the pitch.

The booters opened against Bridgewater on Huntington Field on the 26th of September. The future teachers put up a great fight but bowed before the strong home eleven, 6-2. Johnny Dodson and Booker starred at the full-

back posts. On October 3, the team journeyed up to Springfield where they faced the New England Champions of 1931. N. U. opened up with a two-goal lead as the forwards played a strong passing game. Holding the lead until the final period, Northeastern lost the services of its "mighty mite", Mario Franco, because of an injury. Springfield capitalized and forced five goals through his position before Northeastern found the scoring punch again. Although the final score read Springfield 5, Northeastern 3, the Huskies played a great game and with better luck, might have returned to Boston, victors.

On the 17th, again at Huntington Field, the Red and Black eleven met Fall River Textile School. The Huskies scored first, and held the upper hand throughout most of the contest. In the final minutes, a bit of carelessness allowed the visitors to tie the score at one—all. Before the final whistle in the regular game, Northeastern lost a chance to win when they failed to convert a penalty kick. Thus the game went into overtime. In the extra session the visitors scored again, winning the verdict, 2-1.

Connecticut Agricultural College came to Huntington Field on the 31st and gave the Red and Black all they could handle for a while. McDonald's teachings prevailed however, and beautiful work by Gil MacDonald, Franco, and Benson, gave the Huskies a fine win, 3-1.

On the 7th of November, Brown University was host to the Back Bay booters, and proved to be a most ungenerous host, shutting out Capt. Booker's boys, until near the end of the game, while tallying twice themselves. Tirri, Kirkland, and Davenport did well for N. U., the latter scoring on an unbeatable boot in the final session. Final score, Brown 2, N. U., 1.

Playing their best game of the season, Northeastern faced Worcester Poly Tech in the "heart of the Commonwealth" on November 14. Gil MacDonald was sensational between the sticks, Franco a mighty powerhouse on both offense and defense, Tirri, a strong attacker, and our fullbacks were almost perfect. Presper, Gallagher, Pimental, Scobie, and Johnson all played well. While Worcester scored a pretty goal, Northeastern never gave them the upper hand, and beat the Tech goalie twice on surefire shots, while missing by inches only on countless other tries.

The final game of the season was played at Medford against Tufts College on the 21st. The Jumbos gave the Red and Black rooters a big scare when they took the ball directly from the opening kickoff, through the entire Husky eleven, and drove it past MacDonald for an early score. Soon after that both Johnny Dodson and Captain Al Booker were injured and forced to leave the game for repairs. This strange train of events, instead of routing the Northeastern eleven, caused them to rise to a fighting pitch, and by sheer fight and will to win, the Huskies kicked three goals through Jumbo's posts, to win their final booting contest for N. U.

At the squad banquet, varsity soccer letters were awarded to Captain Booker, Franco, MacDonald, Presper, Shervs, Johnson, Pimental, Scobie, Tirri, Benson, Gallagher, Kirkland, Trought, Davenport, Dodson, and to Manager Harry Feldman. It was announced at the dinner that soccer would be played no more at Northeastern, at least for the next few years. Football, king of American College athletics, will be the major fall sport for the Red and Black in 1933, following a season of freshman football in 1932.

Northeastern rose from a very obscure beginning in college soccer circles, until victories over Harvard, Dartmouth, Springfield, M. I. T., Brown, Clark, Worcester Poly Tech, and other colleges gave the Huskies a rating near the top. Dave Priestly and Jim McDonald will long be remembered as coaches. Players like Bancroft, Foster, Melia, Tiffany, Burton, Hess, Howard, Sampson, Kirshaw, Medeiros, Franco, MacDonald, Booker, and others too numerous to mention, brought fame and glory to the Red and Black while performing on the pitch.

It is too bad that the soccer players will not have the opportunity of continuing their favorite pastime on Huntington Field during the next few years. However, the Scotch game, while popular with the kickers, was not strongly supported by the student body in general. The Faculty Athletic Committee acceded to the will of the majority when they instituted football at the expense of soccer. With pleasant memories of the past, the soccerites must bide their time until it is possible for the University athletic heads to include soccer as well as football on the fall program.

The Hockey Season



THE Northeastern sextet, led by Captain Bill Carter, played through its most successful season in the short history of the popular ice sport at N. U. The Huskies won six of their seven contests, and later avenged their early set-back at the hands of Brown University. Coach Nelson Raymond's players can justly claim the small college championship of the East, having defeated Colby, the Maine state champions, and twice conquering Technology, the strongest local contender for the mythical title.

Bill Carter, brilliant right winger, led in goals scored for the second successive year with eleven tallies. Herb Gallagher, dependable center, was runner-up to his captain for scoring honors with ten markers. The season brought to light several new Husky ice aces. Bill Dingwell's craftsmanship in the nets won for him starting honors over the veteran Jimmy Denton. Si Anderson came into his own as a dangerous left winger, his brilliant rushes providing thrills seldom equalled in college ranks. Elmer Walker, John McKee, and Arnold Alcorn, all senior forwards, played dependable hockey.

Mathew Walsh a veteran, and Tom Leverone, a newcomer, showed remarkable improvement at the points during the season, and in the final games gave Northeastern its strongest defense since the days of Charlie Kerins and Roger Emery.

The season opened with an impressive, clean-cut victory over Massachusetts Institute of Technology, 3-0, at the Arena. Denton's clever work in the strings stopped several Beaver scoring attempts by his acrobatic saves. Herb Gallagher opened the scoring on a brilliant dash through the entire Tech team, drew out the goalie, and poked the disc into the far corner. Gallagher later scored again on a long shot which whistled into the Beaver's net so fast that the goalie never had a chance to save. Bill Carter caged the final marker when a penalty face-off was ordered in front of the M. I. T. goal. The game was played on January 6, just a few days after Tech's victory over B. U., making Northeastern's victory all the sweeter.

On January 13 the Huskies planned an encounter with the New Hampshire Wildcats at Durham but the weatherman ruled otherwise, so the squad remained in Boston. Two nights later, Carter and Gallagher each tallied twice and Ken Cahoon caged another as the Huskies chewed up Bowdoin's Polar Bears on the Arena surface. Anderson provided plenty of fireworks also, but failed to make the red light blink. Final Score: Northeastern 5, Bowdoin 1.

The night after the Bowdoin encounter, January 16, the Husky pucksters travelled to Providence to do battle with the Big Brown Bear. Early in the game Brown flashed some very pretty stickwork and at the end of the first period the Bruins led, 2-0. The Providence sextet scored again to open the second period before Northeastern settled down to business. In the closing minutes of the second canto, Si Anderson carried beautifully through the Brown team only to be robbed by Hutton's sensational save,

Carter being right on deck to slap home the rebound however, making it 1-3. In the third period Anderson again cut loose, this time passing to Gallagher who sank a rifle shot and gave Northeastern renewed hopes of victory. With only a few seconds remaining Northeastern fought gamely to tie it up and finally Capt. Carter was successful after taking Gallagher's pretty pass. In the resultant overtime period Brown scored on Johnson's long shot, to win a sensational victory, 4-3, handing the Red and Black its only defeat of the winter.

Colby came to town on February 3, and demonstrated to Northeastern rooters some real ability on the runners. Although Northeastern held a 1-0 lead, the visitors went ahead 2-1, before the middle of the second session. Ken Cahoon and Bill Jack combined, the former scoring to take the lead for Northeastern again after Herb Gallagher had tallied a fine unassisted goal. In the first few minutes of the last period, the Colby White Mules gave Husky supporters heart-failure when they sank two long drives to go ahead again 4-3. Here the Mule kicked up his heels a bit too vigorously and penalties weakened the Maine defense. Bill Jack dug the puck out of a scrimmage to tie the score, and eight seconds later Gallagher rode through the Mule ranks to score the prettiest goal of the evening, giving Northeastern a well-earned decision, 5-4.

New Hampshire paid a visit at the Arena on February 9, but returned to Durham on the short end of a 6-2 score. Elmer Walker and Jack McKee broke into the scoring column, while Bill Jack followed suit. Bill Carter's two goals were great and Gallagher's additional rally topped off a very successful evening.

Northeastern hoped to meet Bowdoin at Brunswick on the 15 of February but again Old Joe Jinx, the weatherman, intervened so the Brown Bear was the next on the card, appearing at the Arena on the 19th. The Red and Black opened up with a two-goal lead on scores by Carter and Gallagher in the initial session, only to see Brown come out fighting in the second period, the Bears tying it up, and making a third period Northeastern rally vitally important. Having all the better of the play, N. U. could not seem to score on Hutton, although Carter, Gallagher, and Anderson had many chances. Finally Carter did dent the strings on a penalty face-off and the Providence defeat was avenged, 3-2.

February 23 was the red-letter day of the season. M. I. T. had just defeated B. U. again, and Northeastern went into its final game with the possibility of winning the local "championship" should they defeat the Beavers. Giving all they had, Carter, Gallagher, Anderson, in fact the entire sextet, put on their best exhibition of the year, soundly beating the Cambridge Engineers, 6-1.

At the banquet in the Hotel Kenmore on March 9, thirteen players and the Manager, Earl Decker were awarded their letters, the players being Captain Carter, Gallagher, Anderson, Leverone, Walsh, Denton, Dingwell, McKee, Walker, Alcorn, Cahoon, Rice and MacLeod. Walsh was elected captain for next season and Paul Noonan was named as the new varsity manager.

The Basketball Season



THE basketball team, led by Captain Roy Rymph, completed the best season in the history of Husky basketball, winning ten of the fifteen games scheduled. Coach Al McCoy was the man at the helm, and it is to his credit that all teams under his direction, in every season, have bettered their performances of previous years.

Bud Rymph led the team for the second time, this winter, and was high scorer with 105 points, topping Ray Roughlan by two markers. Rymph was picked All-Boston center by the local coaches and proved to be a tower of strength on both offense and defense. Ray Coughlan and Charles Brown, regular forwards, were good team men and fine scorers, Brown tallying over 100 points. Ralph Christensen and Gil MacDonald, regular guards, held down their positions with distinction, the latter being called the outstanding guard of the season by two rival coaches. Elmer Hintz, McCoy's "sixth regular", proved a valuable adjunct to the team, and more than once made sure of a North-eastern victory when all other factors proved unequal to the task.

While Captain Rymph, Coughlan, Hintz, Christensen, and MacDonald graduate, Coach McCoy will have Brown, Stan Kramer, Adolph Jachym, Ade Cleveland, leteermen, back next season. Charlie Brown was elected 1932-'33 cap-

tain at the banquet, held on Tuesday, March 8, at the Hotel Lenox.

The season opened at home against a strong Alumni five, headed by the famous scoring twins, Herb Tiffany and Bill Symancyk. The Huskies kept the grads well in check throughout the evening, winning 38-18. Brown University visited the "Y" on the 12th and a great battle developed. The lead changed hands with lightning-like rapidity in the closing minutes. With 30 seconds remaining, Captain Caulkins sank a circus shot to win for the invaders, 38-37, the only home defeat on the Northeastern season's record.

Clark fell before the Huskies at Worcester on December 16, 39-26, with twenty players seeing action for the Red and Black. On the 19th, Bridgewater kept a noon engagement in Boston, and the embryo teachers put up a great battle. Elmer Hintz had a field day however, and his nineteen points gave N. U. the verdict, 26-21.

To start the new year off right, Captain Rymph and Company, sank Newport Naval, 48-19, on January 2nd at the "Y". One week later, Clark fulfilled a return date and managed to score 16 points while Northeastern chalked up 41. The first battle with Rhode Island State took place at Kingston on the 13th. Northeastern led up until the final minutes but finally bowed before a strong Keany aggregation, 37-33. On the 16th, Middlebury brought a fine basketball team to Boston and expected to lick the Huskies. They departed on the short end of a 43-29 score, however.

January 23 was the date of another noon game and this time the U. S. Coast guard trained their big guns on the Red and Black colors. After the last gun was fired, Husky's pennants still waved triumphant, 42-33, being the final margin of victory.

The New Hampshire Wildcats were scheduled to invade the Hub on January 30, but the Northeastern management very kindly consented to transfer the game to Durham to add color to the Wildcats' big winter carnival. Although Northeastern put up a valiant struggle, victory was not to be, the Durhamites emerging on the long side of the 33-26 score.

In the second big home contest of the season, the Tufts Jumbos appeared on February 6. Captain Rymph, MacDonald and the rest, played sensationally, while Tufts was always a dangerous competitor. Coughlan was high scorer with twelve of N. U.'s 29 points. Tufts caged 24 markers. Thus Northeastern won its first home basketball contest, ever, from the Jumbos.

After a long and hard trip to New York, McCoy's boys were nosed out by Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, 32-31, on Lincoln's Birthday. The party left by boat on the night before the game, a heavy fog rolled in, and so the big E. S. S. boat anchored all night in the harbor, docking in Boston at noon, with just time enough for the basketeers to catch the noon flyer for New York.

On February 16, the team took another journey, this time to Cambridge to meet Harvard. Northeastern never led and appeared tired throughout the contest which was filled with close guarding, many fouls being called. Bud Rymph gave a great exhibition of foul shooting, sinking eight straight markers from the penalty line. A large crowd of Northeastern rooters watched the contest which ended in Harvard's favor, 32-23.

February 20 will long be remembered by Northeastern men who attended the basketball game that night. Rhode Island State was the big attraction, and the gym was packed to capacity. At half-time, Little Rhody had drawn ahead to an 18-12 lead. Brown starred in the opening session, however, keeping N. U. in the ball game. With only twelve minutes to play, Northeastern still trailed by 10 points. Right here the fireworks commenced. The same Northeastern outfit that finished at half time, an apparently tired and beaten quintet, scaled the heights and determined to end the Rams' domination. First MacDonald, then Rymph, then MacDonald again, then Coughlan, Rymph, Rymph, etc., filled Little Rhody's basket to the top. This glorious rally totalled twenty-six points while the Red and Black held the enemy absolutely scoreless until the last few seconds. Coach Keanv's crew retired to the wilds of little Rhody on the bad end of a 40-26 shellacking. What a game! And what a way to end the spell of a jinx!

Arnold College closed the schedule on the 27th, in a fast game. Captain Rymph finished his court career in a blaze of glory as Northeastern won, 31-19. Coughlan, Hintz, MacDonald and Christensen also starred.

The Baseball Season



THE 1931 baseball season showed marked improvement over the efforts of its immediate predecessors, Captain Dick Cook's aggregation winning seven and tying one out of seventeen contests. Notable victories were scored over Brown, Worcester Tech, Bowdoin, and Massachusetts State.

Fortunately only three veterans will be lost to the team next year. They are: Cook, Nutter and Tiffany. The loss of Tiffany will probably be felt the keenest, not only by the baseball squad, but by the basketball and soccer teams as well. Tiffany has been a stellar performer in athletics throughout the last four years and was the winner of the "Kontoff Cup", awarded each year to the athlete "who shows the finest co-operation in team work, true sportsmanship, and real Northeastern spirit."

Northeastern University opened its baseball season with Harvard at Cambridge; here the Huskies suffered their worst defeat of the year, twenty to nothing, on April 8th.

Despite the fine pitching of Gallagher, a yearling making his first appearance in the box for Northeastern, the Huskies lost the second game of the year to the hard hitting Friars of Providence College at Providence, April 11th, four to one. Gallagher displayed a fine brand of pitching, in

fact, he gave as fine a performance as any Red and Black wearer has uncovered this year, and promises to be one of the mainstays of the staff next year.

The Tufts-N. U. game played on the home grounds April 13th proved to be void of excitement. Tufts emerged victorious, ten to four.

The Husky ball chasers chalked up their first win of the season by defeating the Brown Bears at Providence to the tune of five to one. The Huskies showed real form throughout the nine innings, April 15 being the red-letter day.

A few days later on the 18th, the prevailing jinx which Rhode Island State seems to hold over the Red and Black asserted itself when the Huskies went down to a heartbreaking defeat after a hard uphill battle fell short. Though the Huskies outthit R. I. S. fourteen to nine they lost eleven to nine.

On their annual New York trip, April 20-21, Northeastern broke even by defeating St. Stephens, ten to nothing, then lost to Manhattan, nine to nothing. In the next game Luke Corbett pitched a two-hit contest against W. P. I. and together with his teammates' stick-work enabled the Huskies to win sixteen to nothing. The game was a walkaway, the Red and Black collecting a total of nine bingles. This happened on the 23rd.

N. U. was not so fortunate in their next encounter. On a field swept by cold winds, rain, and snow they lost to the Colby aggregation eight to seven, on the 29th.

The Bowdoin Bears proved to be an easy mark for the Husky ball tossers, on May Day, who won their fourth game of the year nine to one. Corbett gave the Bears but seven scattered hits.

Continuing the winning streak, the Red and Black trimmed U. S. Naval, May 2nd, and Clark University on the 6th. Thirteen errors and twenty-four hits, of which N. U., collected fifteen, were some of the highlights of the first encounter. In the

second game the Red and Black ran roughshod over Clark and ran up a score of six to one.

N. U. on the 9th, lost again to Tufts in the following encounter. The victors displayed a brand which was keeping them in the undefeated class. This was the second time this season that N. U. lost to Tufts.

Middlebury proved a little too tough for the Red and Black at the next contest, the Vermont team winning six to four, on the 15th. In the succeeding game it seemed as though old King Pluvius was on the Huskies' side, for it was mainly because of rain that Northeastern was able to tie Union College at Huntington Field the next day. The steady downpour proved a decided boon to the Red and Black. The Union team had broken the five-to-five tie in the first half of the eleventh when the game was called. The score of the tenth was taken as final.

The next game was called because Kid Pluvius was still showering the Huskies with his affections.

The old Rhode Island State jinx still held sway for Northeastern lost their second game of the season to them, four to nothing, in the final scheduled battle of the year, on May 25th.

Captain Dick Cook and his senior mates wound up their baseball careers in a blaze of glory defeating Massachusetts State at Huntington Field by a score of 10-4. Rudie Johnson on the mound for the Huskies, was master of the situation at all times. This game followed the R. I. State battle and officially closed the season.

Letters were awarded to sixteen members of the squad, namely: Burger, Carter, Cook, Corbett, Dunlap, Gallagher, Grosz, MacDonald, Moulthrop, Murray, Nutter, Petrone, Presper, Tiffany, Wignot, McKee.

With a letterman back for every position on the nine, Coach Al McCoy is looking toward a banner season. The schedule which lists contests with Brown, Rhode Island State, Upsala, Union, Massachusetts State, Maine, Colby, Clark, Bates, Bowdoin, Worcester Tech, New Hampshire University, Tufts, and Middlebury, is probably the best ever compiled for a Northeastern baseball team.

As usual the Rhode Island State games will be the big objectives and Captain Bill Carter and his mates have a great chance to even up a few old scores. Early season practices indicate that plenty of veteran material will be augmented from the ranks of promising newcomers. With veteran outfielders and batterymen on deck, Coach McCoy's biggest task will be to build up an infield to replace last season's "all-captain" quartet.

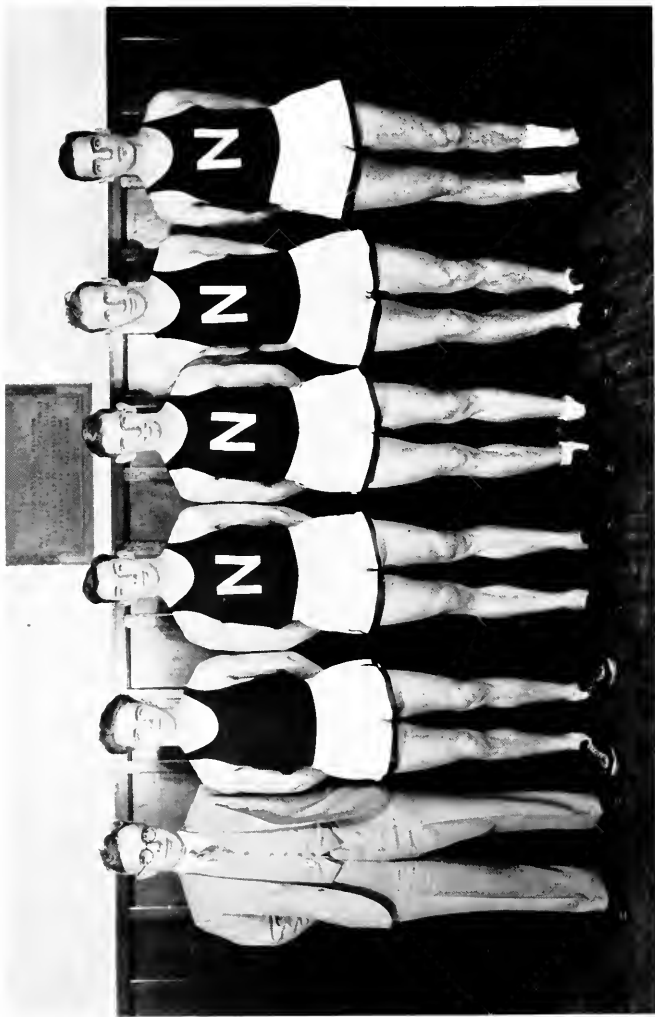
April 17 the tracksters took a flying trip to Springfield and matched speed and brawn with the strong Springfield College team. Both teams showed great power and several record breaking performances were turned in. Frank Shea set a new N. U. record in winning the 440. Bud Rymph broke the college record in the shot. Bob Greenleaf clipped 4 seconds off the existing record for the 2-mile run. Shaw of Springfield bettered the Eastern Intercollegiate mark in the high hurdles while his teammate, Cooley, tied the record in the pole vault. Springfield had the edge and won 76 to 58 but only after a hard fight.

The next week-end, the relay teams competed in the famous Penn Relays at Philadelphia. Coach Parsons picked six men, Shea, Hanson, Falt, Grieve, McCrudden and Fischer to uphold the colors of N. U. at the games. This group proved worthy of the task and covered themselves with glory. Saturday afternoon a quartet consisting of Hanson, McCrudden, Grieve and Shea, showed their collective heels in a match race to Temple, Amherst and Delaware. Frank Shea, the stellar N. U. anchor man finished 10

yards to the good. About an hour later a second N. U. mile team consisting of Falt, Fischer, Hanson and Shea competed in the Class B One Mile Relay Championship of America and placed third. Jim Falt, N. U. lead off man ran one of the best races of his career and handed over a five-yard lead to Ed Fischer, from then on the battle waxed hot and furious, but the boys had the stuff, and Frank Shea, the anchor man, finished with a drive that brought him to within a couple of strides of the Colgate and Navy men who finished 1, 2 respectively. Several highly routed outfits were left in the dust among them were Army, M. I. T., Columbia and Lehigh. As trophies the boys carried home four silver cups, a large bronze plaque and four medals. Quite a success for this mile relay team!

The Boston Intercollegiates held in the Harvard Stadium May 1 and 2, gave the entire squad a chance to prove their calibre. The meet was won by Harvard with N. U. second, B. C. third, B. U. fourth and Tufts last. The feature event of this contest was the great 440 race between Frank Shea and the B. C. flash, Don Fleet. The judges announced Fleet as winner and Shea as runner up; a split hair decision. It was the stellar work of the veteran members of the team that brought success to the Red and Black.

The Huskies met Bates College at Lewiston, Me., in their second dual meet of the season. The closeness of the score tells its own story: Bates 68, Northeastern 67. Bates won through the brilliant work of Chapman and Knox for this pair rolled up 25 points between them. Bud Rymph put in a big day's work, collecting eleven big points for N. U. The other members of the team were by no means idle and the only regret was that just one more third place was not copped by an N. U. man; not that anyone wished Bates bad luck. A great meet!

Luck did not favor the Red and Black in the Eastern Intercollegiates that were held at Worcester the following Saturday. To start off wrong N. U. lost two valuable members through sickness in their families, and then, to keep things wrong a couple of adverse decisions in the running events were just enough to prevent the Huskies from winning the Eastern Championship. N. U. and Springfield engaged in a bitter battle for points; Springfield emerged with 53 1-3 and N. U. with 52 1-2; Worcester Tech came in third with 19 1-3. Five new records were established in the heat of the fierce competition. N. U. produced four champions in Shea, Falt, Fischer and Freeman who copped their specialties.

The Huskies closed their 1931 outdoor season by placing fifth in the New England championships. The University of New Hampshire won the title. The 440 was the outstanding event of the meet. Arnie Adams the Bates sensation, won this great match just one stride ahead of Bernie McCafferty of H. C. and our own Frank Shea who placed second and third, respectively; time, 48 2-5 seconds. Jim Falt placed second in the broad jump, Bud Rymph third in the discus, John Matukas picked up fourth place. Scott and Freeman were in a tie for second place in the high jump. Forsberg placed fourth in the javelin.

So ended the 1931 season, a great success and also a disappointment. At the annual track banquet Frank Shea was elected to pilot the team for the next year.

The Red and Black started off the new school year when they defeated Brown at Providence, 45 to 27. Although losing the services of Captain Shea. Gay Millbrandt broke the N. U. shot put record by about five feet. Bill Hanson, one of our well known "Three Musketeers", set a new record in the 300-yard run, winning by a wide margin. The other events were almost all N. U. triumphs, Brown won only the hurdles, the 1000-yard run, and the shot put.

The rest of the indoor season is a story of the performances of the mile relay team which closed the season without a defeat or a tie. At the Prout Games in the Boston Garden the mile team composed of Falt, Grieve, Shea and Hanson licked New Hampshire as they pleased and by 30 yards. The next week at the Millrose games at New York the same team broke the streak of bad luck that followed N. U. teams at this particular meet. The Huskies trimmed

Fordham and St. John's in the fourth fastest time of the carnival and setting a new N. U. record of 3 minutes 27 3-5 seconds. At the B. A. A. games the next Saturday, this quartet again beat New Hampshire and M. S. C. in a hair lifting race. Bob Grieve was the hero of the hour and to him belongs the credit. In the afternoon of the same day Allen won the N. E. A. A. U. 600-yard title in a fine fashion.

The last meet of the indoor season was the University Club games. N. U. was placed in Class A along with Harvard, Yale, Dartmouth, B. C., M. I. T., Springfield and New Hampshire. The other New England colleges were in Class B. Gay Milbrandt broke his own shot put record in winning second place while Jim Falt placed second in the broad jump. The relay team certainly did their best for they beat B. C., and M. I. T. in the third fastest time of the evening, without Captain Shea who was at home sick in bed. However Ralph Phillips took Shea's place and acquitted himself nobly. Scott picked up one point in the high jump to make a total of 12 for N. U., Harvard won the meet.
