

To Professor Joseph M. Golemme go our thanks for his counsel, assistance, and guidance throughout our last college years. His difficult task of reorganizing a segment of the original Class of 1950 into a separate class in our Middler Year has been well rewarded by the co-operation received from all colleges and the functions which our class has successfully sponsored.

Professor Golemme was born October 9, 1915, while his parents were touring Italy. A graduate of Northeastern's College of Business Administration in 1938 with a Bachelor of Science degree, he returned to N. U. to teach Accounting, and at the same time, study at Boston University, where in 1940, he was recipient of a Master of Arts degree in Economics.

World War II found our adviser serving three years in Europe with the Finance Corps of the United States Army as an investigator in Italy, France, Germany, and Switzerland. Upon release from the service, Professor Golemme returned to Northeastern, where in 1948, he was appointed Assistant Professor of Accounting. He now resides with his wife and family in Boston.

Senior History

As the drums of war became more muffled, talk of returning to the Co-op Plan became louder and louder with each succeeding term.

In the fall of '46 the mighty Class of 1950 split, and sections A and B surged ahead. We, who were left, became the Class of 1950C (FT). In 1947, another split put 40% of the class on the co-operative plan and we, the remainder, closed ranks to become unique in the fact that we would be the last group of Northeastern's full-time students.

It was not until our Middler year that we became a class in ourselves with a definite purpose; namely, to study and graduate in June of '49. It was like coming out of darkness into light. Before this, elections, offices, and functioning as a class did not mean


much to us. In our last two years we have become a unified class with a popular president and officers elected by a class vote higher in percentage than many classes before us.

In the future, we shall reminisce of these days: the Junior Prom, Senior Week, with its dances, stag party, and informal get-togethers; of sell-out Pops Concerts; of professors who win new cars; of the increasing number of youngsters in the freshman classes; of convocation speakers; and on and on goes the vine of reminiscence.

Most memorable, above all, is our leaving Northeastern in its fifty-first year. We have seen the Student Center Building grow from the bud of a dream, to a blueprint, and into a concrete reality. The Fiftieth Anniversary of Northeastern will be remembered as the time when our university came of age. Of this we are proud.

Our Class Gift established the Library Building Fund. This act, of which we of 1950C (FT) may justly be proud, will to future classes, be a precedent for them to make gifts for as worthy a purpose.







Student Council

The purpose of the Student Council of the Day Colleges of Northeastern University is to express, to lead, and to direct student opinion.

As an advisory board the Council meets with the faculty to discuss extra-curricula activities and to formulate plans regarding them.

As a legislative body, it determines rules under which class elections are carried on. In this capacity, a controversy over the validity of the '50C A election was settled by the Council this year, who ruled for a reelection. Complaints about the sophomore election were settled in a like manner.

As an administrative organization the Council is responsible for the planning of certain over all extra-curricula activities.

The annual Student Council sponsored Football Dance was held on November 12, at the University Club. The proceeds of the dance went for equipment for the football squad.

Northeastern was among twenty local Universities represented at the meeting of the Greater Boston Student Council. C. Henderson Beal, '50LA, David Churchley, '50LA, and Alfred DiScipio, '50E, helped formulate a calendar of intercollegiate social activities. Beal and a former graduate, Joseph Courtney, started the Council last year to provide inter-school co-operation on a free basis.

Northeastern's Student Council consists of thirty elected members, fifteen from each division, who remain as members until graduation. In addition, six others are members ex-officio. These include the Presidents of the five classes, and the Editor-in-Chief of the "News."

Any eligible member who is suggested by fifteen or more students may be placed on the ballot as a nominee for Council membership and may be subsequently elected by the student body.

The Council acts through the following standing sub-committees nominated annually by the president: traditions and customs, class elections, freshman affairs, complaints and suggestions, social activities, and faculty-student relationships.

Varsity Indoor Track

Highlighted by their first meet victory in three years, Northeastern's 1949 varsity track team concluded its indoor season with two wins in five dual meets.

In their first meet of the year, the trackmen were downed by Tufts, 71-2/3 to 36-1/3, at Medford. The Jumbos swept the broad jump, 35 lb. weight throw, and shotput, besides taking all but one-half point in the 50 yard dash.

Ray Randolph was top N. U. scorer with 6-1/3 points by winning the pole vault and taking part in a three-way tie for second in the high jump. Paul Zappulla also had a good day, placing second in the mile and third in the 1000.

Northeastern's varsity mile relay team, John Flanagan, Jack Shea, Harry Barteau, and Payson Kenyon, showed Harvard, Maine, and B. C. the way around the Boston Garden boards at the K. of C. Meet on January 22. Two weeks later the team, minus Shea who was injured during the week, led Tufts, B. U., and Bates to the tape at the 60th Annual B. A. A. Games on the same track.

Lewiston, Maine, provided the setting for the Tattonmen's first indoor meet victory in three seasons. The Red and Black runners trounced Bates, 80-2/3 to 36-1/3. Willette paced the Huskies by winning the high and broad jumps, and placing third in the shotput. Kenyon, another double winner, copped the mile and 1000.

The following week the M. I. T. tracksters walloped the T-men 68 to 31 at Cambridge. Captain Kenyon's victories in the 1000 and mile, and Willette's in the high jump, were the only Northeastern bright spots in the meet.

On Washington's birthday, the Huskies traveled to Amherst, where they romped over the University of Massachusetts, 72 to 41. Willette, who was the high scorer, set a new Pratt Cage record of 6 ft. 2 in., in the high jump.

Despite the victories of Kenyon in the 1000 and mile, and Zappulla in the two mile, the men from N. U. were dumped 72 to 38 in the season's finale by the University of Maine at Orono on March 5.



Cross Country

Despite finishing 8th in the N. E. I. C. A. A. A. Meet, Gerry Tatton's Varsity Harriers experienced their most successful post-war season.

Paul Zappulla was the first N. U. man to cross the finish line in 16th place, with Payson Kenyon in 17th position. Captain Harry Hart came in 20th. Finishing the N. U. scoring were Walt Simon (60th), and Murray Goldman (71st).


The Husky Harriers prepped for the meet by defeating Devens, 20-38, at Fort Devens on November 5th. Harry Hart won the race, beating teammate Paul Zappulla by only one foot. Walt Simon finished fourth, Goldman sixth, and Walt Kuhlen eighth. This was the fifth win in seven starts for the Huskies.

N. U. began the season by edging the strong University of Massachusetts team, 27 to 28. Following this, the University of New Hampshire, 25 to 30, and the University of Connecticut, 22 to 33, were taken in stride. The Red and Black continued their winning streak by whitewashing Bates, 15 to 50.

Olympian Ted Vogel and his Tufts' teammates handed the Huskies their first loss in a tri-meet with B. U. The final count was Tufts 33, N. U. 40, and B. U. 49.

The only dual meet loss was suffered at the hands of a strong Springfield team, 15 to 42.

Captain Harry Hart, Payson Kenyon, and Paul Zappulla were the consistent top performers for the Tattonmen. Walt Simon, Murray Goldman, Jack Nolan, and Harry Barteau all aided in making it a very successful season.



Hockey

Surging finishes and sparkling playoff competition highlighted Northeastern hockey in the '47-'48 and '48-'49 rink seasons. After two seasons of mediocre early-contest play, Coach Herb Gallagher's scrappy squad, led by Captain "Deke" Kerivan, battled their way into N. E. League playoff spots, and in each of the three playoff games, either toppled or threatened highly touted opponents.

The Huskies rode the crest of a five-game win streak to the third-place spot in the loop and a crack at a vaunted Terrier sextet. From the outset of the game, Harry Cleverly's charges knew that they would have a battle for their title, but the boys from B. U., often mentioned as N. C. A. A. bid contenders, looked like sure winners to the smart folks.

In the opening stanza the Gallaghermen flashed into a 3-1 lead on two goals by Jim Reid, and a spectacular solo tally by Jimmy Bell. The Huskies belted in another score, but at the end of the frame, B. U. had cut the lead to 4-3. In the third canto, the Terriers came back to tie at 4-all, but Jack Heavey tallied twice and from there on they were never headed. The 8-5 victory put the tired N. U.ers in line for a title match with the fast, smart, and heavy B. C. aggregation.

March 9, 1948, will be a date long remembered by Northeastern hockey fans. For that was the night when fighting heart nearly overcame exhaustion as the Husky sextet battled the Heightsmen to within ten minutes of an N. C. A. A. bid, then succumbed by a 6-4 tally, to sheer physical exhaustion and the depth of Eagle reserves. The tired, inspired play of the sauad, with special mention to Jimmy Bell, Don Kerivan,

and the superb net-minding of Larry Tilley, will live in the hearts of N. U.ers for many years to come.

After an up and down start, climaxed by defeats at the hands of B. U., Harvard, and B. C. in succession. Herb Gallagher's charges flashed into a playoff spot in the New England circuit by winning seven of their last eight encounters. The defeat, a near whitewash job, was administered by a classy B. C. team to the tune of 9-1. The Huskies rebounded from the defeat to pile up a five-game win streak which included a 5-4 triumph over a cocky Harvard squad. Of that affray, Coach Gallagher said, ". . . the best played intercollegiate hockey game I've seen in my years of coaching." The Husky mentor was to revise his opinion later.

Clinching the number three spot in the loop set the stage for a final Husky-Eagle clash, but hopes were low before the game as sports writers and fans predicted a swamping of the Gallaghermen by "Snooks" Kelley's powerhouse. Apparently the Husky squad didn't know they were up against the class of the nation, or if they knew, they didn't care. Sterling play, accurate passing, and close checking kept the lads from the Heights wondering if Coach Gallagher had borrowed a few stars from Michigan or Colorado. It was, in reality, the regular Northeastern squad playing the brand of hockey they save for playoff games. The G-men held the vaunted Eagles to a 2-2 score in the opening frame on markers by scrappy Bob Barry and Sophomore Bobby Byrne. Coach Kelley's squad racked up two quick tallies in the second session, only to be tied by scores off the sticks of winger Jim Reid and ace Bob Byrne. The final stanza saw spirited rushes by both squads frustrated by slick goaling by N. U.'s Bob Howell, and the Eagles' Bernie Burke. As the sixty minute mark arrived, the scoreboard registered 4-up and drove the now worried league leaders into overtime. In the ensuing overtime period, loyal Huskies' hearts were finally broken when Jim Fitzgerald from the Heights sank the winning score from thirty feet out to give the Eagles a 5-4 edge.

Looking back it is hard to pick an outstanding feature of the two seasons. In the '47-'48 fracas, Northeastern had five of the first six scorers of the circuit, with Jimmy Bell top man in the league. Jack Heavey, Bob Barry, Jim Reid, Dave Mac-Kenzie, and Frank Rando were up there in order. "Deke" Kerivan's effortless skating and smooth, hard checking were outstanding. So was the net play of Larry Tilley, particularly in the playoff games. So was the team spirit and clean sportsmanship of the squad.

'48-'49 is no easier to label. The Harvard game was a high spot. The smooth stick-handling and elusive skating of Jimmy Bell, which again made him the league's leading scorer with 42 points, can't be counted out. The superb work of game little goalie Bob Howell (of Quincy and throat-protector fame) must be considered. The fighting spirit of the whole team, personified by peppery little Bob Barry, is a factor. The beauty and heartbreak of the B. C. playoff game brought Herb Gallagher to say, "That was the best college hockey game played in Boston for at least the last ten years."

Coach Gallagher, Captain "Deke" Kerivan, and the whole squad deserve more acclaim than this book can give them. They've given us an example of the best in teamwork and sportsmanship and fighting heart. We wont forget it.

At the annual banquet, diminutive Charlie Diehl, the slick ball handler of "push-shot" fame, was elected captain. "Inga" Walsh was named to the All-New England Team.




Coach Johnny Grinnell's retirement at season's end instigated the appointment of amicable Joe Zabilski, the former Boston College football star and University of Maine coach. Zabilski carried on in the successful footsteps of his predecessor to attain a record of 12 wins and 6 losses.

It was through the wizardry of Tom Blair and "Inga" Walsh, together with the superlative play of Captain Charlie Diehl, Urban Landini, Joe Creedon, and Wally Keyes, that the Huskies attained their best hoop record since 1934, rounding out a season that found them undefeated at their home court.

The season's highlights were Tom Blair's late season surge, which reached its peak at the M. I. T. game, in which he scored 31 points. Inga Walsh again led the scoring parade with 320 points, thereby breaking the scoring record held by Al Pajonas back in 1934. At the final game of the season, the Zabilskimen shocked the local hoop circle by completely outplaying a highly-touted Tufts team before a "standing-room only" crowd at Johnson Memorial gym.

It was the final game of their college careers for "Inga" Walsh and Tom Blair, in that they already have had four years of competition. As they departed from the court, the tremendous ovation given to these two great stars, was a warming tribute from the hearts of the Northeastern rooters. The spirit, hustle and caliber of their play, will long be an inspiration for future Northeastern greats.


WON 9 LOST 7



MILESTONES OF BETA GAMMA EPSILON

Beta Gamma Epsilon Fraternity was founded on February 12, 1919, by seven men who had served together in World War I and wanted to preserve their friendship throughout their college days. This was the first fraternity at Northeastern College, as the University was called in those days. After functioning for eight years, moving from rented rooms to rented houses, eating at the "greasy spoon," the fraternity served its first meal. From that day to this, the serving of food in the fraternity house has met with overwhelming success and has been essential in building fraternity spirit.

The tenth anniversary of the fraternity was celebrated at the Mohawk Club in Lexington, and this occasion marked the first time an annual meeting was ever held away from the house. The meeting was interrupted by the call of "FIRE," and in true B. G. E. fashion, the members put out a roof fire in time to welcome the Lexington Fire Department. At this meeting the Alumni Corporation was formed to promote the welfare of B. G. E. Fraternity and to this end was successfully operated for the last twenty years. The efforts of the Alumni Corporation kept the fraternity alive through the depression years and through World War II. Our last rented house was closed in June, 1943, since the members were joining the armed forces faster than new members could be initiated.

On March 14, 1947, after being homeless for four years, the Active Chapter, consisting of seven men,

moved into our present house at 234 Commonwealth Avenue, which was purchased by the Alumni Corporation. The problems of these seven men were very similar to those of the original group. After the house was put in proper order, including the cleaning of the crystal chandeliers, the formal open house was held on May 24, 1947. The guests were generous in their praise of the beauty and appointments of the new home.

We have had many successful social functions; the first was after the last N. U. football game of the '47 season, when we had dinner, followed by a dance, at the house. The next memorable affair was the annual formal dance on January 26, 1948. Unfortunately, there was a blizzard that night, and those who got to the dance, were forced to walk home through 20 inches of snow. The Active Chapter was the quest of the Alumni at the 30th Anniversary dance held in Newton on January 29, 1949, where everyone thoroughly enjoyed themselves. The next day, 20 Alumni and 20 members attended a buffet dinner at the house. After dinner, the annual meeting was held. Two trophies, denoting the Inter-Fraternity Bowling League Championship of 1947-1948 were on display.

Throughout the life of the fraternity, B. G. E. men have been prominent in Northeastern sports and scholastic standing. Judging from the record of the past 30 years, we feel certain that B. G. E. men will continue to be a leading fraternity at Northeastern.
