

WAR DEPARTMENT, OFFICE OF THE CHIEF OF STAFF, Weshington, October 28, 1914.

This revised manual gives the list of articles of engineer, ordnance, and signal property required to equip the organizations, headquarters, and individuals enumerated herein for field service and which must be accounted for by organization commanders and by regimental adjutants as prescribed by War Department orders.

Upon receipt of this manual organization commanders will adjust their unit accountability equipments by turning in to the proper supply officer all surplus articles on hand and supplying deficiencies by requisition, so that the articles on hand for the unit accountability equipment of their respective organizations will conform to the number herein au-

thorized.

Commanders of the old organizations, "Regimental headquarters," "Machine-gun platoon (headquarters detachment attached) "and "Noncommissioned staff and band," will at once make proper transfers of the accountability for the property of the old to the new organizations as enumerated herein, and invoice to the proper supply officers all surplus articles. As early as practicable after these adjustments have been made the commanding officers of these old organizations will render to the chiefs of the staff departments concerned final returns, made on Form No. 451, A. G. O., accompanied by a copy of each voucher pertaining thereto, to balance and close their accountability for the property pertaining to the old organizations.




