CENSUS OF AMERICAN BUSINESS, 1933

A separate report should be prepared for every retail or wholesale place of business, every service business, hotel, theater, or other place of amusement. Combined reports for two or more establishments, even though under the same management or ownership, cannot be accepted except on special instructions from Washington. All reports should cover, if possible, the full year's operations for 1933, even if ownership has changed during the year. If the fiscal year ends within a month before December 31 the fiscal year can be reported. Otherwise report the business of the 12 months of the calendar year 1933. Units of chains which must be reported from the home office should fill out this form as far as possible; at least blocks 1, 2, and 3. (The balance of the information will be obtained by Washington from the chain's home office.) Only sworn employees of the Bureau of the Census will be permitted to examine your report, and no information will be given out by the Bureau of the Census which would disclose, exactly or approximately, any of the figures in your report, provided that identifying data may be used to compile a central card file of business establishments in the United States for Government statistical purposes.

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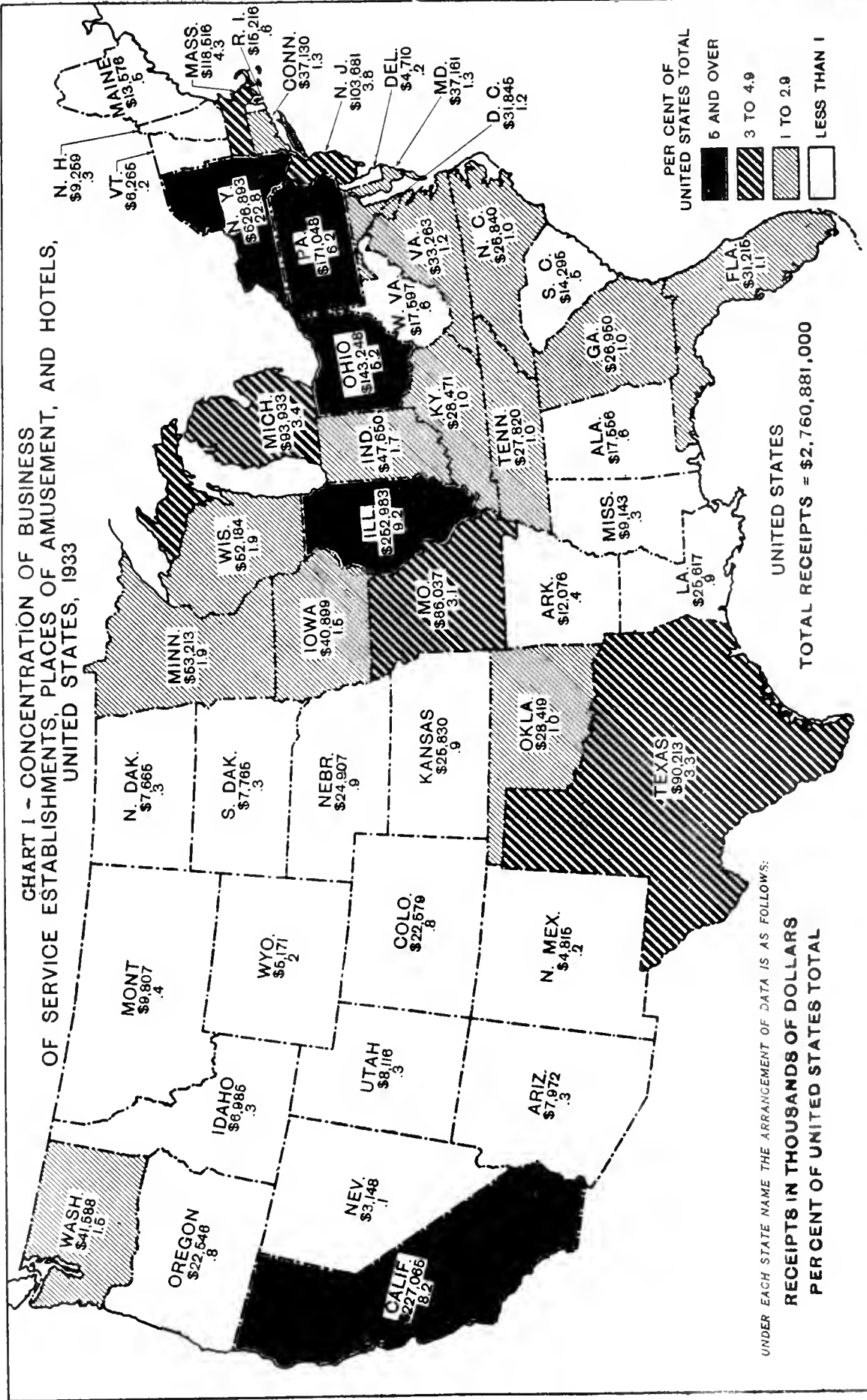

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UNITED STATES SUMMARY

This report contains summary tables for the United States, by kinds of business and by States, presenting the results of the first nation-wide census of service establishments and places of amusement taken as part of the 1933 Census of American Business. Hotels which are also covered in this publication were canvassed for the first time in connection with the 1930 census of distribution. Additional data for States, counties and cities of 2,500 inhabitants or more are contained in other volumes. (See "Plan of Presentation").

SCOPE OF THE CENSUS.---The census was taken by enumerators who visited each place of business for the purpose of obtaining the required census report. Separate reports were secured for each place of business, even though two or more establishments were under the same ownership. The census includes only businesses which could be readily identified by the enumerators and does not include businesses conducted from the residence of the proprietor without a sign or other indication that it was a business establishment.

The classification "service establishments" as used in this report includes places of business performing personal service for the public such as barber shops, beauty parlors, shoe shine parlors, hand laundries and similar establishments; business services such as credit and collection agencies, cartage and trucking establishments, etc.; mechanical repair services such as automobile top and body repair shops, electrical repair shops, watch, clock and jewelry repair shops, blacksmith shops and other classes of shops making mechanical repairs; and miscellaneous services such as window cleaning, storage garages, parking lots, etc. Places of amusement serving the public for revenue such as theatres, amusement parks, shooting galleries, dance halls, etc., are included in this survey. The census also includes both year-round and seasonal hotels. Aside from the kind of business classifications shown in the accompanying tables, more than two hundred other kinds of business were canvassed, the data for which are included in the "other service" or "other amusement" groups. The classifications shown separately represent the more important kind of business groups as measured by volume of receipts and number of establishments.

In many cases, establishments are engaged both in retail trade and service or amusement activities. As a rule such establishments were included in the retail census if more than 50 per cent of the total receipts was derived from the sale of merchandise; and as service establishments or places of amusement if more than 50 per cent of the total receipts was for services or amusements. There are a number of exceptions to this rule which are explained in the definitions of the individual classifications. The most important of these is the group of automobile repair shops, frequently regarded as service establishments. A considerable share of the revenues of such shops accrues from the sale of automobile parts and supplies. They are included in the retail census to maintain comparisons with the 1929 census of distribution.

A number of kinds of business which might reasonably be regarded as service establishments or places of amusement were not included in the canvass. Some were excluded because they are being covered by other adequate statistical series and others were not canvassed on account of the limited funds available to take the census. The more important

kinds of business excluded were public utilities, power laundries and cleaning and dyeing plants, transportation companies, financial institutions, real estate companies, insurance companies, construction companies, educational institutions, hospitals and sanitariums, professional and scientific services.

In drawing definite conclusions from the details of the accompanying tables, it should be borne in mind that the irregularities and deficiencies in coverage are more pronounced in certain classifications than in others. The coverage was particularly incomplete for establishments of a seasonal character which were frequently not in operation at the time of the enumerator's visit.

AREA AND PERIOD COVERED.---The canvass covering the 48 States and the District of Columbia was conducted in the first four months of 1934. The activities of establishments for the calendar year 1933 were reported. Seasonal establishments and new enterprises reported for that part of the year during which they were in active operation.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

Establishments.---Only those service and amusement enterprises having a recognized place of business are considered establishments; and such establishments, to be so classified, must be engaged primarily in providing service or amusement. Each unit of a chain is considered a separate establishment. Service and amusement concessions, operated independently in connection with other businesses, are classified as separate establishments. An individual's residence was considered a place of business if a sign indicated that the occupant was engaged in a service business.

Receipts.---Receipts represent total revenue of the establishment less refunds for returned merchandise. Receipts were reported in answer to the following inquiries:

- (a) Receipts from sale of merchandise (deduct returned sales).
- (b) Receipts from service sales, parking, storage, repairs, cartage, cleaning, etc.
- (c) Receipts from room rentals (hotels, auto camps, etc.).
- (d) Receipts from sale of meals (and from fountain).
- (e) Receipts from admissions (theatres and other places of amusement, athletic contests, dance halls, billiard halls, bowling alleys, etc.).
- (f) Receipts from other sources (specify sources).
- (g) Total net sales or operating receipts (total from "a" to "f").

Proprietors.---The enumerators were instructed to include as proprietors all owners of unincorporated establishments and adult members of their families who were actively employed in, and devoting the major part of their time to, the business. Inactive proprietors or partners were not included. Inquiry concerning proprietors did not relate to incorporated establishments. Salaried officers of incorporated companies were considered full-time employees and not proprietors.

Average Number of Employees.---The average number of full-time employees for the year represents a total of the reported full-time employment (payroll nearest the 15th of each month), for the twelve months of 1933, divided by twelve. Average part-time employment is computed in the same manner. However, in drawing conclusions concerning part-time compensation, it should be remembered that part-time employment for the individual employee may vary from one hour to any part of a week which would not normally constitute full-time employment. Employees include salaried officers of corporations, other executives, salesmen, clerks, operatives, etc.

Full-time Employees.---Employees working a full day each day the establishment is open for business, even if this represents less than a full working week or month, are reported full-time employees. This principle is followed with reference to each payroll period for which information was obtained. Therefore, persons employed on a full-time basis for only part of the year are regarded as full-time employees for that part of the year. Employees working on a full-time basis in seasonal establishments are also treated as full-time employees.

Part-time Employees.---Persons employed only a few hours or days of the normal work-week or other payroll period are considered part-time employees. It is possible, however, that this definition was not followed uniformly by all reporting establishments as the average annual wage for part-time employees in some instances appears to be higher than would be justified on the basis of this definition.

Sex of Employees.---A distribution by sex of the combined number of full-time and part-time employees on December 30, 1933, or nearest representative day, was required of each establishment. The ratio resulting from this inquiry was used as a basis for computing the sex distribution of the average number of employees.

Payroll.---Total payroll represents the salaries, wages, commissions and bonuses paid part-time and full-time employees and salaried officers during the year. It does not include compensation of proprietors except the fixed salary of active partners if such salary is paid in addition to the partners' participation in profits. Such salaried partners, found predominantly in large businesses, are comparable to salaried executives of a corporation and are counted as employees rather than proprietors. Payroll figures are not shown in the tables when the total for a given classification is less than \$500.

Average Annual Earnings.---This average is obtained by dividing the full-time payroll by the average number of full-time employees. No average for part-time employees has been computed because the irregularity in the number of days or hours which various part-time employees work makes such an average of doubtful value.

Average annual earnings for classifications having less than ten full-time employees are not shown as the number of employees in such cases is too small to yield a representative average.

Total Operating Expenses.---Payroll, rent, interest, traveling expenses, advertising, taxes, insurance, light, heat, power and similar expenses are included in total operating expenses. Cost of merchandise, as distinct from that of materials and supplies, is not included.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSIFICATIONS

PERSONAL SERVICES

BARBER SHOPS.---This classification covers all barber shops with the exception of those operated as a part of some other type of establishment or institution such as a retail store, hotel, club, etc. Barber shop concessions operated independently in other establishments are included in this classification. Barber colleges and barber shop concessions on trains and steamships were not included in the census. The receipts reported include revenue from other services rendered in barber shops such as shoe shining and manicuring and from the sale of small quantities of merchandise. Employees in these establishments include those engaged on a straight salary as well as on a percentage commission basis.

BATHS (Turkish, etc.).---Turkish and other health and weight-reducing baths operated as separate establishments are included in this classification. On account of incomplete coverage, this classification is not shown separately in all State and United States summary tables.

BEAUTY PARLORS.---All beauty parlors operated as separate businesses are included, but the classification does not include beauty parlors operated by department stores, women's ready-to-wear stores, or incidentally as an adjunct to any other business. Beauty parlors operated as concessions in retail stores are included as they are separate businesses. Receipts from the incidental sale of cosmetics and hair goods are included. Schools for the instruction of beauty parlor operators were considered beauty parlors if such schools make a charge for the services performed by the students. Establishments engaged essentially in retailing cosmetics, though rendering beauty parlor service as well, are included in the census of retail trade.

CLEANING, DYEING, PRESSING, ALTERATION AND REPAIR SHOPS.---This classification includes several classes of closely related businesses, each of which derives the larger portion of its revenues from cleaning, dyeing, pressing and repairing men's and women's garments including hats. These establishments are variously known as cleaning and pressing shops, valet shops, the small tailor shop which derives most of its income from cleaning, pressing and altering clothing, and so-called cleaning and dyeing agencies, operated as retail branches by the larger cleaning and dyeing plants. Many of the establishments in this classification also act as agencies for commercial laundries. The commercial type of cleaning and dyeing plant is not included in the census of service establishments. This industry is canvassed every two years in connection with the biennial census of manufactures. Custom tailors who derive the greater part of their income from making clothing to order are included as retail establishments in the retail census even though part of their income may come from cleaning and pressing and alteration work. The receipts as reported by all establishments in this classification represent the total intake from customers and not merely the commissions received from the commercial cleaning and dyeing plants for which they act as agents.

COSTUME RENTAL AGENCIES.---Establishments, other than retail stores, engaged principally in the rental of costumes and other accessories for theatricals, costume balls, etc., are covered by this classification. Such establishments frequently reported small amounts of merchandise sales which are included in the receipts.

FUNERAL DIRECTORS AND EMBALMERS.---Undertaking, particularly in rural areas, was frequently reported in connection with retail furniture establishments. Such establishments were included in the census of retail trade and their revenues from undertaking services are not, therefore, included in the receipts of "Funeral Directors and Embalmers". These receipts include sales of caskets and burial clothing.

FUR REPAIR AND STORAGE SHOPS.---Fur repairing and storage are services performed, for the most part, by retail furriers which are included in the retail census. This classification includes only those establishments engaged solely in fur repairing and storage and those whose retail sales comprise less than one-third of their total receipts.

LAUNDRY AGENCIES.---Many of the larger commercial laundries operate branches for the purpose of receiving and delivering laundry. The enumerators were instructed to consider these branches as separate places of business and were directed to secure reports for this class of establishments. However, the enumerators were frequently unable to secure reports for such branches as the commercial laundry maintained only one set of books and did not keep a record of business done through the individual branches. For this reason, data for laundry agencies are not shown separately but are included under the classification "Other Personal Services".

LAUNDRIES, HAND (Not including commercial laundries).---This classification includes all classes of laundries other than power laundries canvassed biennially as part of the census of manufactures. Chinese and French hand laundries are included. Small power equipment is sometimes used for certain kinds of work, but the majority of the work is done by hand.

PHOTOGRAPHIC STUDIOS.---Receipts of some of the establishments covered by this classification include merchandise sales, presumably picture frames. The revenue from photography is considered to be for service and not from the sale of pictures. Studios operated as departments of retail stores are not included in this classification.

SHOE REPAIR SHOPS.---The shops included in this classification are engaged principally in the repair of footwear, but in many cases they also do shoe shining. "Valet Shops" and "Harness, Leather and Shoe Repair Shops" also do shoe repairing but are classified separately. Shoe repair shops operated as departments of retail stores are not included in this classification.

SHOE SHINE PARLORS (Including hat cleaning).---Shoe-shining departments of retail or other service establishments are not included. Establishments engaged solely in hat cleaning are included in the classification "Cleaning, Dyeing, Pressing, Alteration and Repair Shops".

OTHER PERSONAL SERVICES.---Under this classification have been grouped a number of kinds of business which, for various reasons, are not shown separately. In some instances, the kind of business was unimportant both in number of establishments and total receipts. Some kinds of business were not completely canvassed by the enumerators and it was not thought advisable to show data for these separately. The following are some of the more important kinds of business included in "Other Personal Services":

BUSINESS SERVICES

ADJUSTMENT AND CREDIT BUREAUS, AND COLLECTION AGENCIES.---Mercantile and consumer credit reporting bureaus and privately operated collection agencies are included in this classification. This classification does not include cooperative organizations operating on a non-profit basis, nor organizations operated by trade associations. Receipts, as a rule, represent only charges for services, but in some cases the individual reports may include total collections.

ADVERTISING AGENCIES AND BILLBOARD ADVERTISING AGENCIES.---Establishments operated as separate businesses and commonly known as advertising agencies and billboard advertising agencies are included in this group. Advertising departments of newspapers, magazines, job printing establishments and other business enterprises are not included. Receipts of some advertising agencies include charges for space in newspapers and periodicals for advertisements carried for their clients, whereas in other cases the receipts represent only charges for services, the clients paying the charges of the advertising medium direct. Inasmuch as both business procedures are employed by advertising agencies, it was impossible to secure reports of receipts on a uniform basis. Billboard advertising agencies are chiefly engaged in presenting poster displays (principally outdoor) on their own or rented sign boards. The receipts of these agencies include rentals for space on display boards and revenues from other services.

BLUEPRINTING AND PHOTOSTAT LABORATORIES.---Laboratories engaged principally in the reproduction of plans and maps and other copy by blueprinting or photostating are included in this classification.

BROADCASTING STATIONS.---Commercial broadcasting stations engaged principally in the transmission of programs for public entertainment, usually for purposes of advertising are the only stations included. Employees of broadcasting stations do not include artists paid by sponsors of programs. Receipts of stations include income derived from the sale of time of artists carried on the station's payroll. Coverage of this kind of business is not entirely complete in some States; in those States and in the United States Summary tables it has not been shown separately.

CARTAGE AND TRUCKING ESTABLISHMENTS.---Local cartage and trucking operators with established offices or places of business engaged principally in local hauling for hire are included in this classification. Frequently a truck owner engaged in the cartage and trucking business from his residence; operators of this kind are not included as the census was confined to enterprises with established places of business which could be identified readily by the enumerator when canvassing. The so-called long-distance truck transportation companies are not included in the census. Establishments engaged primarily in warehousing and storage frequently do considerable trucking; they are classified, however, as "Storage Warehouses". Freight forwarders and custom house brokers are included in the classification "Other Business Services".

DELIVERY SERVICE.---Establishments primarily engaged in the local delivery of parcels for retail stores which maintain no such service of their own are included in this classification. It also includes local messenger services.

DENTAL LABORATORIES.---The classification includes all laboratories engaged in the manufacture of plates, bridges, inlays, etc., for the dental profession.

DUPLICATING, ADDRESSING AND MAILING SERVICE.---Establishments engaged principally in mimeograph, multigraph, rotaprint, multilith, planograph work, addressograph, stenographic, typewriting and mailing services are included. Job printing plants which frequently do the same classes of work are not included but are covered by the biennial census of manufactures.

LINEN SUPPLY SERVICE.---Establishments in this classification supply uniforms, aprons, table-cloths, towels, etc., to restaurants, barber and beauty shops, offices and other establishments, and collect, launder and deliver these at regular intervals. When the service is conducted as a separate business, it is included in this classification. The same class of service is frequently carried on by commercial laundries, the data for which are included in the reports of the biennial census of manufactures.

PHOTO FINISHING LABORATORIES.---These laboratories are engaged primarily in the developing of films and in photoprinting and enlarging for commercial and amateur photographers. Stores which sell photographic apparatus and materials and also act as agencies for photo finishing laboratories are included in the retail census. Photographic studios are included in a separate classification.

SIGN PAINTING SHOPS.---This classification includes only shops engaged primarily in sign painting. Stores selling signs, paints, painters' supplies, etc., but which may also paint signs are included in the retail census. Employees of sign painting shops include also those engaged in delivering and placing those signs in proper position.

STORAGE WAREHOUSES.---Both the commercial warehouse employed for the storage of merchandise and the establishment engaged in storing household effects for the individual are included. Some warehouse companies are engaged in buying and selling merchandise on their own account. Warehouses of this kind are considered wholesale establishments and are included in reports of the census of wholesale distribution. Cold storage plants or warehouses are not included. The coverage of this kind of business is incomplete in some States.

OTHER BUSINESS SERVICES.---The following are some of the more important kinds of business included in this classification:

MECHANICAL REPAIR SERVICES

ARMATURE REWINDING SHOPS.---Shops included in this classification are engaged primarily in the rewinding of armatures and repair of motors. Some establishments doing armature rewinding are primarily engaged in the wholesaling or retailing of electrical goods and are accordingly included in the wholesale or retail census. Coverage of this kind of business is not entirely complete in some States; in those States and in the United States Summary tables it has not been shown separately.

AUTOMOBILE BRAKE REPAIR, RELINING AND ADJUSTMENT SHOPS

AUTOMOBILE PAINT SHOPS

AUTOMOBILE RADIATOR SHOPS

AUTOMOBILE TOP AND BODY REPAIR SHOPS.---The establishments covered by each of these four classifications are engaged chiefly in the particular service under which they are classified. Establishments rendering any of the above specialized services in connection with general automobile repairs are classified as automobile repair shops and are included in the retail census. Some of the establishments in these classifications were included as retail stores in the 1929 census of distribution.

BICYCLE REPAIR SHOPS.---Establishments reporting sales of merchandise amounting to one-third or more of their total receipts are included in the retail census. This classification is unimportant in both number of establishments and total receipts in most States and, for this reason, is usually included as "Other Business Services".

BLACKSMITH SHOPS.---Blacksmith shops frequently reported small amounts of sales of farm equipment and gasoline. If the major part of their receipts were from such sales, they were classified as retail establishments. Shops operated as departments of manufacturing establishments are not included in this classification.

CABINETMAKER AND CARPENTER REPAIR SHOPS.---Only those establishments primarily engaged in repair work are included.

ELECTRICAL REPAIR SHOPS.---This classification includes in the main, small shops engaged in repairing electrical appliances in which the sale of electrical equipment and supplies represent a minor part of total receipts. It does not cover electrical contractors nor Neon sign repair service. Electrical repair shops that reported merchandise sales amounting to one-third or more of their total receipts are included in the retail census.

ELEVATOR SERVICE (REPAIR).---Establishments engaged in the maintenance and repair of elevators in office buildings, apartment houses and other buildings are included in this classification.

HARNESS, LEATHER AND SHOE REPAIR SHOPS.---Establishments engaged in such repairs whose retail sales amount to one-third or more of their total receipts are included in the retail census.

LOCKSMITH AND GUNSMITH SHOPS.---This classification includes all locksmith and gunsmith shops with service receipts in excess of sales of merchandise. Shops with merchandise receipts in excess of service receipts are treated as retail stores.

MACHINE SHOPS (Under \$5,000 annual receipts).---This classification covers small machine shops with annual receipts of less than \$5,000 in 1933. Machine shops with receipts of more than \$5,000 are covered by the biennial census of manufactures. The classification is not shown separately in some States and in the United States Summary tables on account of incomplete coverage.

MATTRESS RENOVATING AND REPAIR SHOPS.---This service is frequently rendered by retail dealers in mattresses who are included in the retail census, and by mattress manufacturers who are covered by the biennial census of manufactures. This classification includes only the small shop which is almost exclusively engaged in renovating and repairing.

PLUMBING AND HEATING REPAIR SHOPS

RADIO REPAIR SHOPS

REFRIGERATOR SERVICE AND REPAIR SHOPS

STOVE, FURNACE AND BOILER REPAIR SERVICE.---These four classifications include the small shop engaged almost exclusively in the designated kind of service or repair work. Merchandise sales represent a small part of the total receipts of some of these shops; if merchandise sales amounted to one-third or more of the total receipts, the report was included in the retail census. Some of the establishments in these classifications were included as retail stores in the 1929 census of distribution.

SAW AND TOOL SHARPENING SERVICES.---Establishments engaged primarily in sharpening saws and tools are included in this classification. This classification is shown separately for the United States, but is included in "Other Mechanical Repair" services in State tables.

TINSMITH, SHEET METAL AND ROOFING REPAIR SHOPS.---This classification includes the small shop engaged in sheet-metal work. It does not include sheet-metal shops which manufactured, from tin and sheet-metal, articles with an aggregate value of \$5,000 or more during the calendar year 1933. Shops with manufactured products to this amount are considered manufacturing establishments and are included in the biennial census of manufactures.

UPHOLSTERY AND FURNITURE REPAIR SHOPS

WATCH, CLOCK AND JEWELRY REPAIR SHOPS.---These five classifications include chiefly small shops engaged almost wholly in repair work of the kind indicated. If a repair shop reported sales of merchandise to the amount of one-third of its total receipts, the shop was treated as a retail store and included in the retail census. Some of the establishments in these classifications were canvassed as retail stores in the 1929 census of distribution.

WELDING SHOPS.---This classification covers small welding shops usually having receipts of less than \$5,000. The larger welding shops are considered manufacturing plants and are included in the biennial census of manufactures. Machine shops equipped to do welding are not included in this classification.

OTHER MECHANICAL REPAIR SERVICES.---Under this classification have been grouped a large number of classes of specialized repair shops for which separate totals could not be published. As a rule, the shops are small and are engaged almost exclusively in the repair of a special class of equipment. Shops doing repair work of this kind frequently sell, without installing, parts and other merchandise. Shops with merchandise sales amounting to one-third

of total receipts were treated as retail stores and are included in the retail census. The following are the principal kinds of business grouped under this classification:

GARAGES (STORAGE)

PARKING LOTS.---The establishments covered by each of the above four classifications are engaged primarily in the particular service under which they are classified. Establishments rendering any of the above specialized services in connection with general automobile repair work are classified as repair garages and are included in the retail census. Parking lots and storage garages were included in the 1929 retail census in the classification "Parking Stations; Parking Lots; and Lots". Warehouses used for the dead storage of automobiles are not included in the 1933 census.

AVIATION FIELD SERVICE (Not including air lines).---Air transport lines are not included in this classification, nor are municipal airports. The classification covers only privately operated airports and flying fields supplying the services which are necessary to the airplane pilot and the maintenance and operation of his plane. Plane servicing, storage and rentals, charter flying and flying instruction are the more important services performed by the establishments in this classification. Retail concessions at airports are included in the retail census. The coverage of this kind of business is not complete in all States; in those States and in the United States Summary tables it has not been shown separately.

DISINFECTANT AND EXTERMINATING SERVICE.---Establishments engaged in the extermination of insects, rodents, germs and parasites, from buildings, bedding, furniture and clothing are covered by this group.

EMPLOYMENT AGENCIES.---Government operated agencies are not included in this classification, nor are agencies operated in connection with schools, welfare institutions, professional associations or trade unions.

GRIST MILLS.---This classification includes the small custom mill usually grinding grain on toll for local consumption; such mills are not covered in the biennial census of manufactures. The classification is not shown separately for all States or in the United States Summary tables, as in some sections the coverage was not complete.

HEMSTITCHING, EMBROIDERING AND BUTTONHOLING SHOPS.---The classification includes only shops specializing in this kind of work on a custom basis. Hemstitching, embroidering and buttonholding departments of retail stores are not included in this classification.

TOURIST CAMPS.---This classification includes only camps at which the greater part of the receipts are derived from service charges for camping or lodging privileges. Many tourist camps are operated by filling stations, automobile repair shops and other establishments selling merchandise. In cases where the greater part of the total receipts is derived from the sale of merchandise, the reports were included in the retail census.

WINDOW CLEANING SERVICE.---Establishments in this classification are engaged in cleaning windows in office buildings, apartment houses and other classes of buildings.

OTHER MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES.---The following are the principal kinds of business grouped under the classification "Other Miscellaneous Services":

PLACES OF AMUSEMENT

AMUSEMENT PARKS.---Amusement parks providing amusement devices for use of the general public upon payment of an admission fee are included, but the classification does not include parks or picnic grounds maintained by governmental bodies and available for occasional rental. The canvass of amusement parks was not complete as the parks were frequently not in operation at the time of the enumerator's visit. For this reason, the classification is not shown separately in all States and in the United States Summary tables.

AMUSEMENT SERVICE CONCESSIONS.---Individual amusement enterprises operated on a concession basis in commercial or public amusement parks, beaches, playgrounds, etc., are included under this classification. It does not include merchandising concessions or restaurants in such parks; these are covered by the retail census. On account of incomplete coverage, the classification is not shown separately in all States and in the United States Summary tables.

ATHLETIC FIELDS (Ball parks, stadiums, etc.).---The classification includes only fields or stadiums operated on a commercial basis as amusement enterprises by the individuals or corporations submitting the reports. Fields or stadiums customarily rented on a fixed fee or rental basis to promoters of football games, baseball games, wrestling or boxing matches, etc., are not included, as such enterprises are considered to be in the field of real estate rental. The report of the amusement promoter, however, is included under its respective classification or under "Other Amusements". On account of the seasonal character of many of these enterprises the canvass of athletic fields or stadiums was not complete and the classification is shown separately in only a few States.

BATHING BEACHES.---Bathing beaches owned and operated on a commercial basis are included. The classification does not include municipal beaches. The receipts include admissions, bathing suit rentals and all other income.

BILLIARD AND POOL PARLORS, AND BOWLING ALLEYS.---This classification includes all billiard and pool parlors, and bowling alleys when the major part of the receipts of the establishment is derived from these amusements. Frequently billiard and pool parlors, and bowling alleys are operated in conjunction with cigar stores, soft drink establishments, and other kinds of retail stores. Such establishments are included in this classification when merchandise sales aggregate less than 50 per cent of total receipts and are included in the retail census when merchandise sales are in excess of 50 per cent of total receipts.

DANCE HALLS.---This classification includes public dance halls operated on a commercial basis as amusement enterprises. Halls which are rented for occasional dances by fraternal and other organizations and for private dances are not included, nor does the classification include dancing academies and schools.

SKATING RINKS.---This classification includes all commercially operated ice and roller skating rinks.

THEATRES, LEGITIMATE AND OPERA.---This classification does not include theatre buildings, customarily rented for amusement purposes, but only those theatres whether owned or leased, which actually receive revenues from admissions to legitimate or opera productions. Ownership of theatre buildings and their rental to theatrical producers is treated as a real estate activity. Road productions, operated from their own established offices, are included under "Other Amusements".

THEATRES, MOTION PICTURE AND MOTION PICTURE, AND VAUDEVILLE.---These classifications include commercially operated motion picture theatres and combined motion picture and vaudeville theatres. Motion pictures are frequently shown in club, hotel, fraternal, and municipal halls and auditoriums. Activities of this kind are not included in the census. Theatres which were not used for motion picture exhibition purposes in 1933 are not, of course, included, the census being confined to active theatres.

OTHER AMUSEMENTS.---Under this classification have been grouped a number of amusement enterprises either unimportant in number and total receipts or incompletely canvassed by the enumerators, due to the seasonal character of the business, or to misunderstanding of instructions. Some of the more important of these are shown separately in the tables for certain States where the canvass appeared to be complete. The principal kinds of amusement enterprises included under the classification "Other Amusements" are as follows:

HOTELS

The census includes in the main establishments designated under the law of the several States as hotels. It does not cover boarding houses, lodging houses, tourist homes, Y.M.-C.A.'s, Y.W.C.A.'s, dude ranches, club dormitories and similar establishments which furnish lodging and meals to guests. So-called apartment hotels are included, provided a substantial part of their receipts are from transient guests. The coverage of seasonal hotels was probably incomplete, as many of these hotels were closed at the time of the enumeration, although they may have been open during some part of 1933. The data for hotels are shown for the following classifications:

YEAR ROUND HOTELS.---All hotels which were in operation at least nine months in 1933 are included in this classification.

SEASONAL HOTELS.---Hotels which normally operate less than nine months of the year are considered seasonal hotels.

AMERICAN PLAN HOTELS.---Hotels charging a combined fixed rate for rooms and meals are covered by this classification.

EUROPEAN PLAN HOTELS.---This classification includes hotels which make separate charges for rooms and meals.

MIXED PLAN HOTELS (AMERICAN AND EUROPEAN).---Some hotels operate on both the American and European plans and these are classified as "Mixed Plan Hotels".

GENERAL ANALYSIS

The total number of establishments included in the tabulations for service establishments, places of amusement and hotels is 502,416 of which 443,217 are classified as service establishments, 29,737 as places of amusement and 29,462 as hotels. These establishments gave employment to a total of 1,406,444 persons of whom 546,444 are proprietors, 657,481 full time employees, and 202,519 part-time employees. The total receipts aggregate \$2,760-881,000 for the year 1933, and total payroll amounts to \$701,594,000, of which \$81,803,000 was paid to part-time employees.

Service establishments, which number 443,217, gave employment to 988,478 persons, of whom 482,463 were proprietors, 356,190 full-time employees, and 149,825 part-time employees. The total receipts of these establishments amount to \$1,725,114,000 and total payroll is \$482,463,000, of which ~~\$64,459~~ ^{\$44,459} was paid to part-time employees.

The total number of amusement places for which reports were received is 29,737, and these establishments were operated by 30,297 proprietors with the aid of 87,372 full-time employees and 30,787 part-time employees. Total receipts aggregate \$520,218,000 and total payroll for both full-time and part-time employees amounts to \$117,397,000, of which \$10,-829,000 was paid to part-time employees.

Hotels, numbering 29,462, gave employment to 269,511 persons, of whom 33,684 are proprietors, 213,919 full-time employees, and 21,908 part-time employees. Their total receipts for the year 1933 are \$515,549,000 and total payroll \$146,280,000, of which \$6,521,-000 was paid to part-time employees.

KINDS OF BUSINESS.---The United States Summary tables present data for 62 specific kinds of business classifications. In addition, under five miscellaneous classifications, there are grouped a few of the less important kinds of service establishments and places of amusement not uniformly canvassed by the enumerators and for which, therefore, it is not considered advisable to present separate data.

Of the 443,217 service establishments enumerated, 117,832, or more than one-fourth, are barber shops. Cleaning and pressing shops are second in importance in number of establishments with 55,459; shoe repair shops are third with 50,425; beauty parlors, fourth, with 42,073; cartage and trucking establishments engaged primarily in local hauling, fifth, with 23,102; and blacksmith shops, sixth, with 20,257. These six kinds of business represent about 70 per cent of the total number of service establishments (not including amusement places and hotels); they gave employment to 52 per cent of the employees; paid 45 per cent of the salaries and wages; and accounted for 43 per cent of the total receipts.

From the standpoint of total employment (including proprietors), barber shops rank first, employing 218,179 persons; cleaning and pressing shops, second, with 100,325; beauty parlors, third, with 97,495 employees; cartage and trucking establishments, fourth, with 84,965; shoe repair shops, fifth, with 70,396; and funeral directors and embalmers, sixth, with 41,245. Of the 988,478 persons employed in service industries in 1933, 612,605, or 62.0 per cent were employed in the six above-mentioned kinds of business.

GEOGRAPHIC CONCENTRATION OF SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS, PLACES OF AMUSEMENT AND HOTELS.---Considering these three groups of establishments as a whole, it is of interest to note that more than 50 per cent of the total volume of business is concentrated in the five States of

New York, Illinois, California, Pennsylvania, and Ohio. While these same five States lead in the volume of retail trade (although ranking differently) they account for less than 43 per cent of the total retail business. The five States mentioned and five others (Massachusetts, New Jersey, Michigan, Texas and Missouri) account for more than two-thirds of the total receipts, yet the population of these States in April, 1930, represented only about one-half of the total population of the country. These same ten States account for 70.8 per cent of the receipts of service establishments; 70.3 per cent of the amusement receipts and 64.0 per cent of hotel receipts.

New York alone reported 24.6 per cent of the total business of service establishments, 21.0 per cent of the amusement business, and 17.7 per cent of the hotel business. In contrast to these percentages, New York's population, according to the 1930 census, was only slightly more than 10 per cent of the total for the United States.

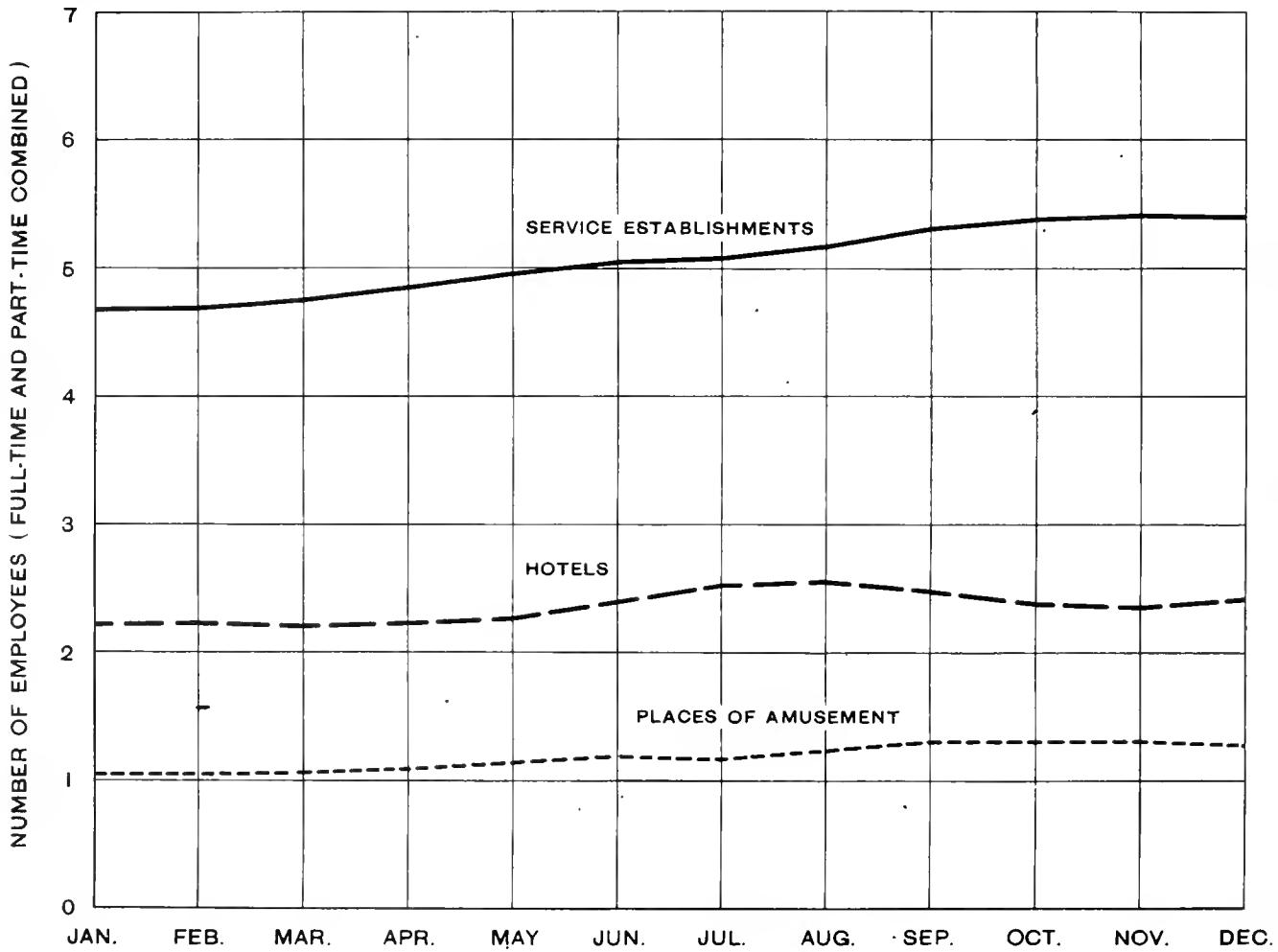
PER CAPITA EXPENDITURES.---When the receipts of service establishments, places of amusement, and hotels are analyzed geographically, it becomes apparent that these activities are primarily of an urban character. Per capita expenditures for services, amusements, and hotel accommodations are largest in those States which have a preponderance of urban population, particularly in the States in which the larger cities are located. Thus, the annual per capita expenditures for 48 States and the District of Columbia range from less than \$5 in Mississippi to more than \$65 in the District of Columbia which is coextensive with the city of Washington. In the South, the annual per capita expenditures are consistently lower than the average for the nation, with the exception of the States of Maryland and Florida, both of which approximate the United States average of \$22.49. The following table, based on the population reported in the 1930 census, shows per capita receipts by geographic divisions and States:

Based on the total receipts as reported by service establishments and the 1930 population census, the per capita expenditures for services range from \$2.81 in Mississippi to a maximum of \$33.89 in the State of New York, as compared with the United States average of \$14.05. Only eleven States and the District of Columbia show per capita expenditures in excess of the average for the nation. Four of these States, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New York and New Jersey are on the Atlantic Coast; three, California, Oregon and Washington, are on the Pacific Coast; and the other four, Michigan, Illinois, Iowa and Missouri, are North Central States.

The per capita expenditure for amusements for the nation is \$4.24, the minimum being only \$.73 in Mississippi and the maximum \$11.39 in the District of Columbia. Per capita expenditures for only thirteen States and the District of Columbia are in excess of the national average.

Per capita expenditure for hotel accommodations is \$4.24 for the nation. Necessarily, per capita expenditures for States are influenced to a great extent by transient and tourist business of an interstate character. Nevertheless, it is of interest to note that sixteen States and the District of Columbia show per capita expenditures in excess of the national average. Seven of these States are the resort States of Maine, Vermont, Florida, Minnesota, Arizona, Colorado and Montana; they are not represented in the high average States in either expenditure for services or amusements.

EMPLOYMENT BY MONTHS.---The total number of full-time employees in service establishments, places of amusement, and hotels ranged from a minimum of 615,158 in January to a maximum of 690,416 in September. For service establishments the minimum (334,794) was in January and the maximum (376,747) was in December. In amusement places, the minimum employment was in January, and the maximum in November; while, in hotels, March was the month of minimum employment and August the maximum.

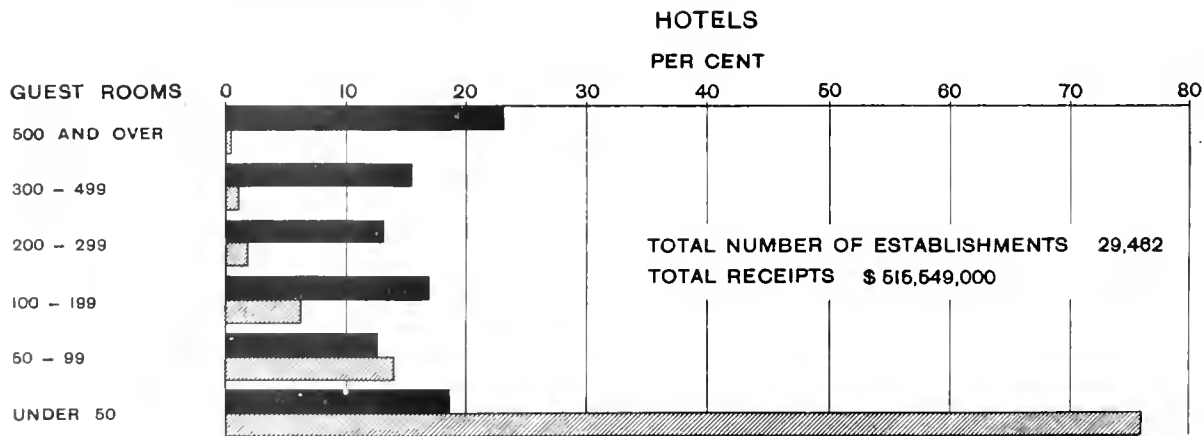
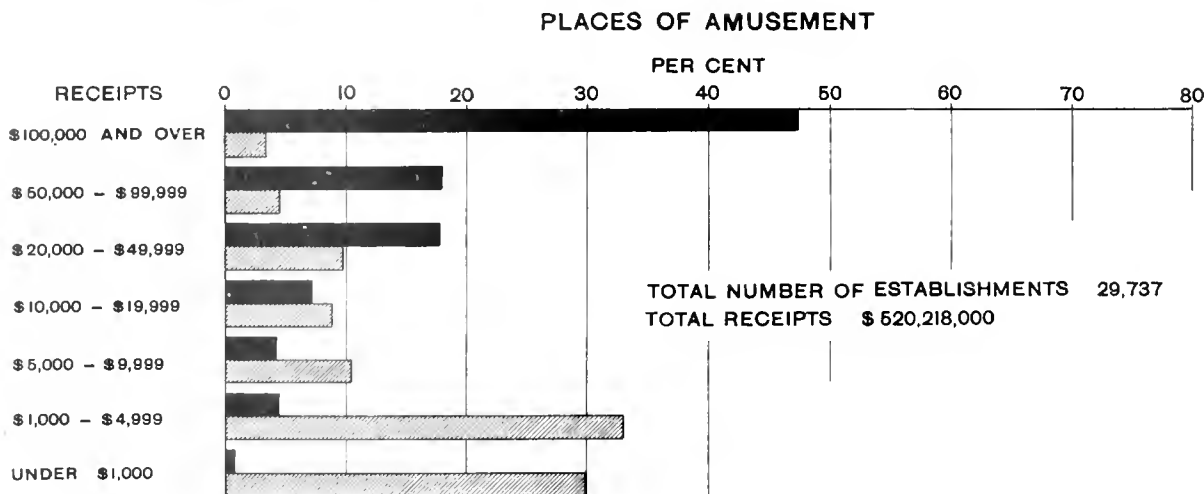
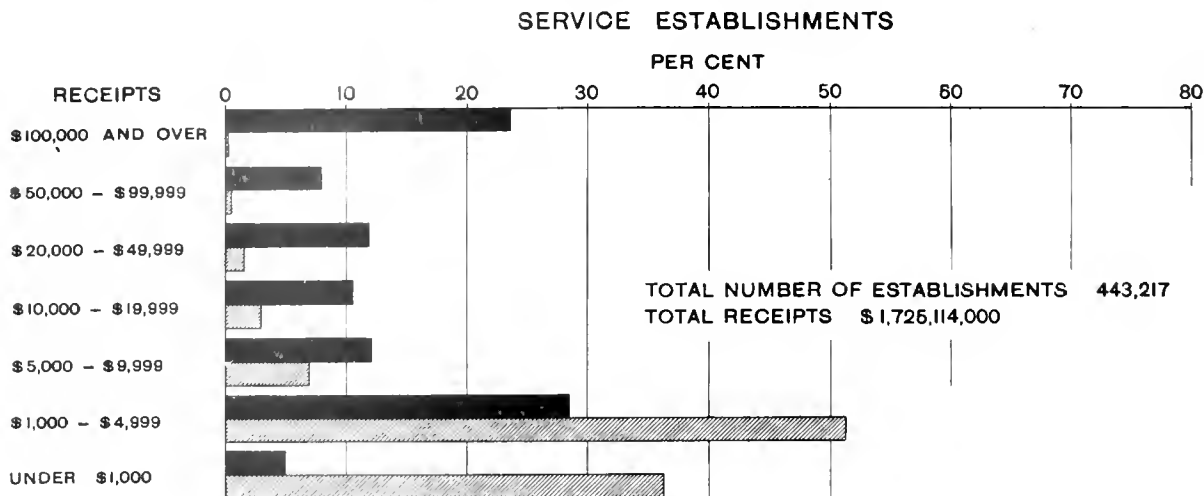
The months of minimum and maximum full-time employment varied considerably for the individual kinds of business, but in practically all cases the minimum was in either January, February or March. December was most frequently the month of maximum employment, although in some kinds of business the maximum number of persons were employed in August, September, October or November.

For part-time employees, January was the month of minimum employment with 180,205 persons employed in service establishments, place of amusement and hotels; and December, with 221,754, was the month of maximum employment. January was the month of minimum employment for each of the three major groups of establishments (services, amusements, and hotels) but the maximum month was November for service establishments, October for amusement places, and September for hotels.

In drawing conclusions from the above figures, it must be remembered that the coverage of seasonal establishments was less complete than for others and that those establishments which operated during the whole or a part of 1933 but had gone out of business before the canvass was made were not enumerated.

DATA BY SEX.---Classified according to sex, 72 per cent of all employees (full-time and part-time) are men and 28 per cent, women. Men predominate in all kinds of business with the exception of six classifications of which beauty parlors is the most important. No separate data by sex for full-time and part-time employees are available.

SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS CLASSIFIED BY SIZE.---Service establishments are for the most part small businesses conducted solely by the proprietor and his family, or with possibly one paid employee. The census shows that 88 percent of the 443,217 establishments reporting did an annual business of less than \$5,000 each, their total receipts amounting to \$579,578,000 for 1933, or a third of the total receipts of all service establishments. In contrast, establishments with sales of \$50,000 or more, although numbering less than one percent (3,235) of the total, actually account for nearly one third of the total receipts. The establishments in the latter group are chiefly cartage and trucking concerns, storage warehouses, advertising agencies and funeral directors.

The following is a summary of receipts and establishments classified according to seven size-groups:

The largest number of establishments in each kind of business classification, with the exception of the classification "Linen Supply Service", is in the two groups having receipts of less than \$5,000 (see Table 4). Of the 54 kind of business classifications, 29 indicate that over 80 percent of the establishments reported receipts of less than \$5,000; in 10 instances, 70 to 80 percent of the establishments are in these size-groups; in 6 cases, 50 to 70 percent; and in only 9 kinds of business are there less than 50 percent of the establishments in the two lowest brackets.

Size of business data, by geographic divisions and States, further emphasize the fact that the great majority of service establishments are small businesses operated by the proprietor with or without paid employees. In each State at least 80 percent of the establishments reported receipts of less than \$5,000. Washington, D.C., which is coextensive with the District of Columbia, is the only city for which tabulations have been made by size-groups. In this city, 73 percent of all service establishments reported receipts of less than \$5,000.

In 36 States and the District of Columbia, the largest number of establishments was in the \$1,000 to \$4,999 group, and in 12 States the largest number was in the "Less than \$1,000" group.

Data previously published for cities indicate that, as the size of the city increases, the number of establishments and the receipts consistently increase more than in proportion to the increase in population. The increase in receipts may be attributed partly to the presence of certain types of business service establishments such as advertising agencies, cartage and trucking establishments, storage warehouses, etc., in the largest cities of the

country. Of the 3,235 establishments having receipts of \$50,000 or more, 2,221 are in the nine States in which the eleven largest cities of the country are located. These 2,221 establishments account for more than 80 percent of the receipts of all establishments in the two size-groups over \$50,000. The more important cause of greater per capita receipts of service establishments in the larger cities is probably the greater demand for services and to higher charges resulting from increased operating costs.

Tables presenting size data by States for five kinds of service establishments are included in the following pages. These kinds of business are of two types, the type which is represented almost entirely by the small establishment (barber shops, beauty parlors and shoe repair shops), and the type in which establishments having a large average volume of receipts play an important part (cartage and trucking, and funeral directors). In the case of the former group, establishments doing a business of more than \$50,000 occur so infrequently that the data have been presented for only five class intervals, while cartage and trucking establishments and funeral directors are classified into seven standard size-groups, by States.

PLACES OF AMUSEMENT CLASSIFIED BY SIZE.—Inasmuch as theatres comprise such a large part of the total amusement business (more than one third of the establishments and 80 percent of the receipts), places of amusement are divided, for purposes of analysis, into two groups, i. e., "theatres", and "places of amusement other than theatres."

Reports were secured from 10,265 theatres which reported total receipts of \$415,153,000 for 1933. Slightly less than 9 percent of these theatres reported receipts in excess of \$100,000, but their aggregate receipts represented practically 50 percent of the receipts of all theatres for the year. About 37 percent of the theatres fall in the two size-groups ranging from \$20,000 to \$100,000 and their aggregate receipts represent about 40 percent of the total. The theatres falling in the "Under \$20,000" size-groups, although numbering about 54 percent of all theatres, reported in the aggregate only slightly more than one tenth of the receipts of all theatres.

Table 4-I shows the distribution of motion picture and motion picture-vaudeville theatres by states and size classifications. One or more of the larger motion picture and motion picture-vaudeville theatres with receipts in excess of \$100,000 were reported for all but nine States, but the seven States of California, Illinois, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, and Pennsylvania reported nearly three fourths of the motion picture theatres in this size-group and their receipts represented 76 percent of total receipts of all theatres in this class interval.

The following table shows the distribution of theatres and their receipts among the seven size-groups:

Places of amusement other than theatres are essentially small establishments, more than 84 percent of the total number reporting receipts of less than \$5,000 each for the year 1933 and 43 percent reporting receipts of less than \$1,000. Of a total of 19,472 establishments, less than one-sixth reported receipts for the year in excess of \$5,000 and of these only 225 or 1.1 percent reported receipts in excess of \$50,000. This 1.1 percent, however, account for more than 47 percent of the total receipts of all amusement places other than theatres.

The distribution of the number of amusement places other than theatres and the receipts of these establishments, by seven size-groups, are presented in the following table:

HOTELS CLASSIFIED BY SIZE.---The hotel business is concentrated, to a high degree, in the larger hotels, particularly those having more than 200 guest rooms. Hotels of this size represent only 3.6 percent of all hotels, but reported 51.9 percent of the total hotel receipts for the United States; hotels with 50 to 199 guest rooms, representing 20.4 percent of all hotels, did 29.5 percent of the total business; while hotels with less than 50 rooms, which account for 76.0 percent of the total number, reported 18.6 percent of total hotel receipts.

The following table summarizes the number of hotels and their receipts, by number of guest rooms:

ANALYSIS OF RECEIPTS.---Receipts are analyzed by source in Tables 5-a and 5-b by geographic divisions and States for service establishments, places of amusement and hotels combined, and separately for each of these three groups.

Receipts from sale of services necessarily include the value of supplies used by the establishments to perform the particular service rendered. Establishments engaged in making mechanical repairs include the cost of repair parts and materials used in making repairs as receipts from service sales, and do not report the value of such repair parts and materials as sales of merchandise.

Merchandise sales represent the receipts from the sale of merchandise not used as replacement parts, supplies or materials, by the reporting establishments.

Receipts of billiard parlors, bowling alleys and similar amusement activities for the use of their facilities were in all cases treated as admissions, even though no actual admission was charged.

American and mixed American and European plan hotels were not always able to report receipts from the sale of meals separately from room rentals. Room rentals are, therefore, overstated and sales of meals are, to some extent, understated.

The following table shows the percentage of receipts by source, for each of the three major groups:

Many retail stores and some wholesale establishments are engaged in service activities incidental to their primary business of selling merchandise. Such service activities consist of parking, storage, repairs, cartage, cleaning, etc. Their receipts from such sources are presented by kinds of business and by States in Tables VIII and IX. They amount to \$567,767,000, as reported by retail stores and \$62,047,000, by wholesale establishments.

Following is a summarization for the United States, of receipts from sales of service as reported by service, retail and wholesale establishments.

Of the total receipts of service establishments, places of amusement, and hotels, \$51,-601,000, or only 1.9 per cent were derived from the sale of merchandise in contrast to the service sales of retail establishments (\$567,767,000), which represent 24.6 per cent of the total receipts from service sales (\$2,310,531,000). Wholesale establishments contributed only 2.7 per cent of the total receipts from service sales.

CHAINS AND INDEPENDENTS.---Although relatively unimportant from the standpoint of number (2 percent of the total), units operated by chains account for 18 percent of the volume of business of service establishments, places of amusement and hotels. The term "chain" as used in this report applies to all organizations owning and operating four or more units or establishments in the same kind of business. Establishments operated by organizations with less than four units are classified as independents.

Of the 443,217 service establishments, 6,772 or 1 1/2 percent are units of chains and account for 13 percent of service receipts. Of a total of 29,737 places of amusement, 2,815, or 9 percent, are units of chains, and these account for 41 percent of amusement receipts. In hotels, chains represent only 2 percent of the total number of establishments, but their volume of business amounts to 10 percent of the total hotel business.

Data for individual kinds of business are not tabulated by type of operation for the reason that chains are not a significant factor in the majority of kinds of service and amusement enterprises. The chain units in the service field are for the most part cleaning and pressing shops, beauty parlors, photographic studios, adjustment and credit bureaus, shoe repair shops, storage warehouses, barber shops, and advertising agencies and billboard advertising agencies. In the amusement field, chain units in the motion picture group account for practically the entire chain representation and, likewise, the volume of business of amusement chains is represented, for the most part, by the receipts of motion picture theatres.

The ratio of operating expenses to total receipts for chain units is 82.8 for all service establishments, places of amusement, and hotels. The corresponding ratio for independents is 72.1. These percentages are not comparable, however, as chain enterprises are usually corporate organizations and, as such, properly include in their operating expenses the salaries of corporate officers and hired executives; while independent establishments, which are generally operated by a single proprietor or partnership, did not include in their operating expenses an allowance for compensation of proprietors. In fact, a large number of independent establishments reported no employees (all work being done by the proprietor), and consequently no salaries and wages. Central office expenses of chains have as a rule been prorated to the individual units.

DATE OF ESTABLISHMENT.---In Table 7, the 502,416 service establishments, places of amusement and hotel, have been classified by date of establishment into three major groups, and establishments which opened in 1933 are divided further to show the number which opened in each quarter of the year.

Of the total number of establishments, 10 percent began business in 1933, 24 percent were established in 1930, 1931, or 1932, and 66 percent were in business in 1929. The new establishments in 1933 numbered 48,803, of which 12 percent opened in the first quarter of the year, 26 percent in the second, 33 percent in the third, and 29 percent in the fourth quarter.

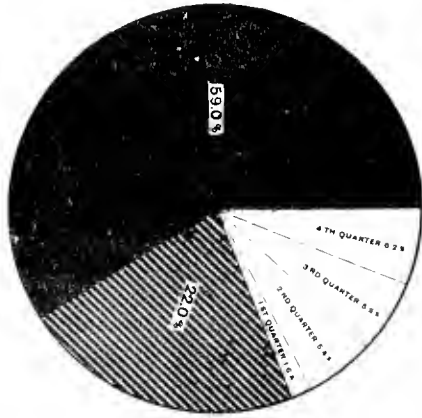
No data are available showing the number of establishments which started in business during the years 1930 to 1933, inclusive, but which were not in existence at the time of the enumeration which took place in the first four months of 1934. It is impossible, therefore, to draw any definite conclusions as to mortality of establishments in the various kinds of business.

CHART X-- NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS AND RECEIPTS, BY DATE OF ESTABLISHMENT

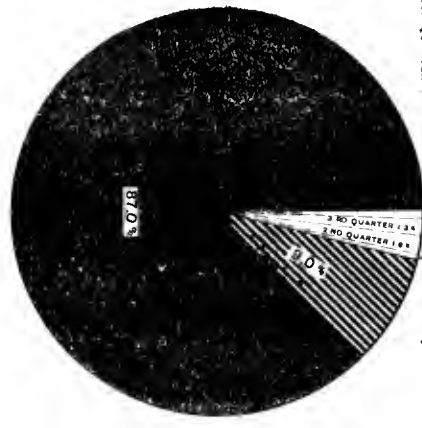

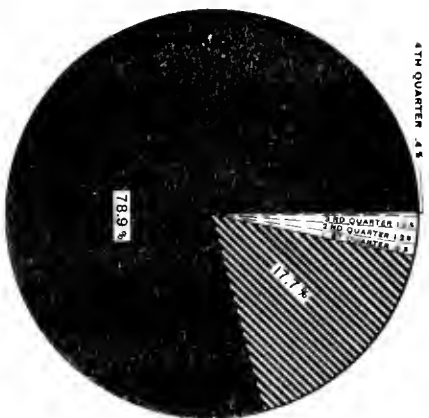
NUMBER OF PLACES OF AMUSEMENT

TOTAL 29,492



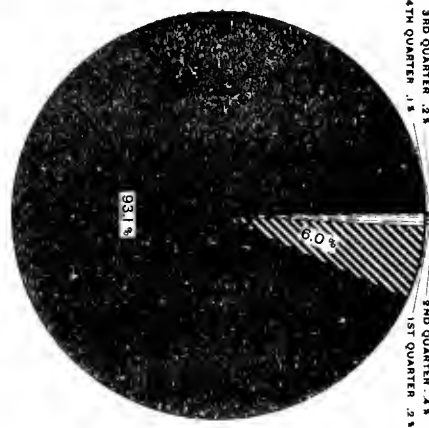

The average receipts per establishment for 1933 for those establishments in operation both in 1929 and 1933 are slightly more than \$6,700 as compared with \$3,500 for establishments which opened in 1930, 1931, or 1932, and \$2,200 for establishments which opened in 1933. The low average receipts per establishment for businesses which opened since 1929 would indicate that the great majority of these are very small businesses.

The following table shows the distribution of establishments and receipts for businesses which were in operation in 1929 and 1933, those which began business in 1930, 1931 or 1932, and those which opened in 1933:

The fact that more than one third of the establishments in operation in 1933 came into existence after 1929 and that the majority of these are small may suggest that many persons unable to secure employment elsewhere started new service or amusement enterprises, requiring small investment, in the hope of earning a livelihood. On the other hand, it is quite possible that the normal life of many establishments in the service and amusement fields is limited to a few years and that the same high proportion of new establishments would have been observed in years of prosperity. In the absence of data on new establishments in the years prior to 1930, no definite conclusions of this character can be drawn.

For the individual kind of business classifications, considerable divergence from the United States percentages is indicated. Stability of operation is greatest in hotels, with 87.0 percent of the establishments in operation both in 1929 and 1933; 9.0 percent opening in the years 1930, 1931 or 1932, and only 4.0 percent opening in 1933. The percentage of establishments which opened after 1929 ranges from the minimum indicated for hotels to a maximum in the case of radio repair shops, in which classification only 30.6 percent of all establishments reporting were in operation both in 1929 and 1933; 46.3 percent opened in the years 1930, 1931 or 1932; and 23.1 percent opened in 1933. In other words, over two thirds of the establishments in the latter classification were not in operation in 1929.

The following table presents, by kinds of business, the percentage distribution of the number of establishments in operation both in 1929 and 1933; those which opened in 1930, 1931, or 1932; and those which opened in 1933:

RECEIPTS AND NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS BY STATES

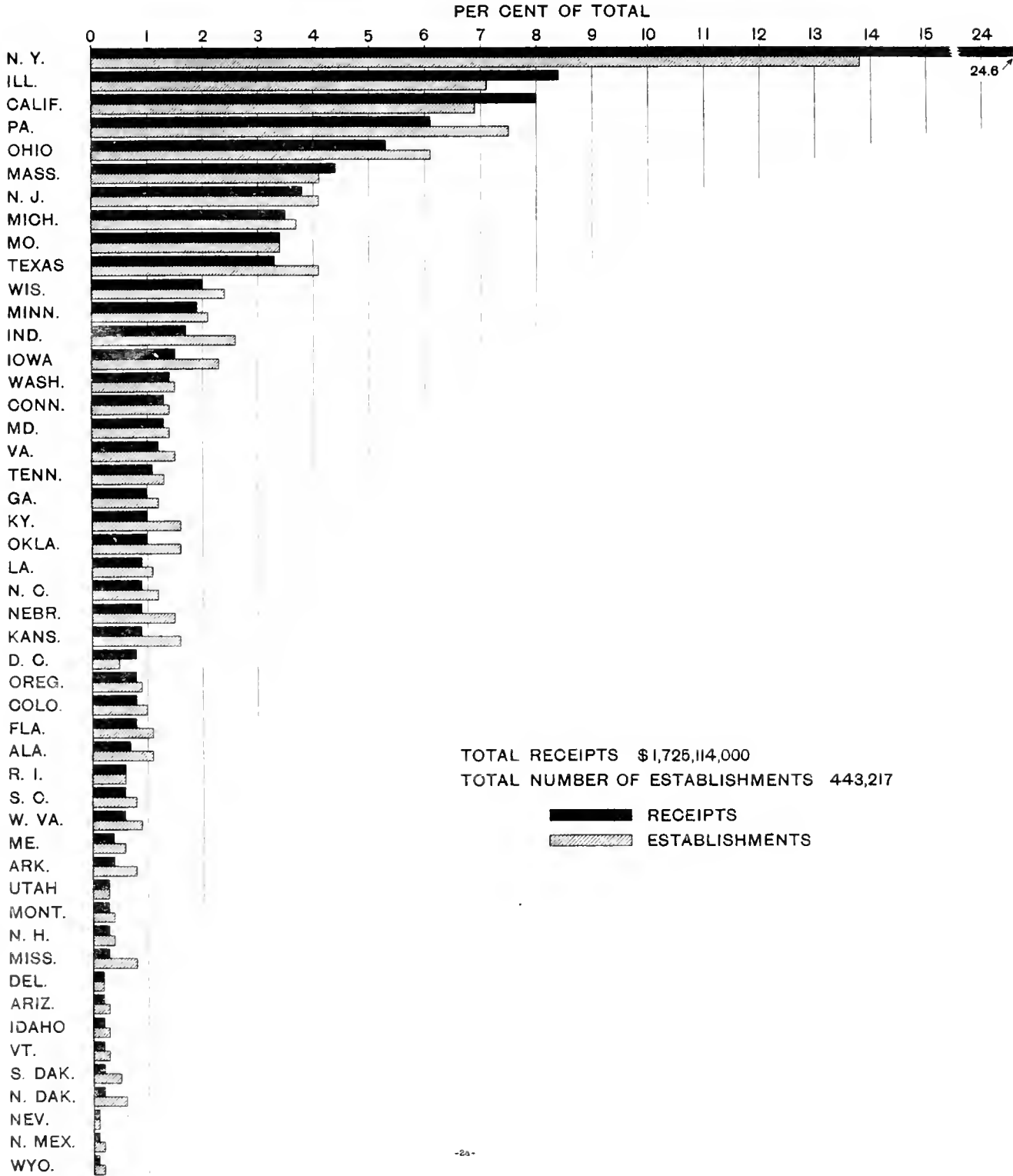
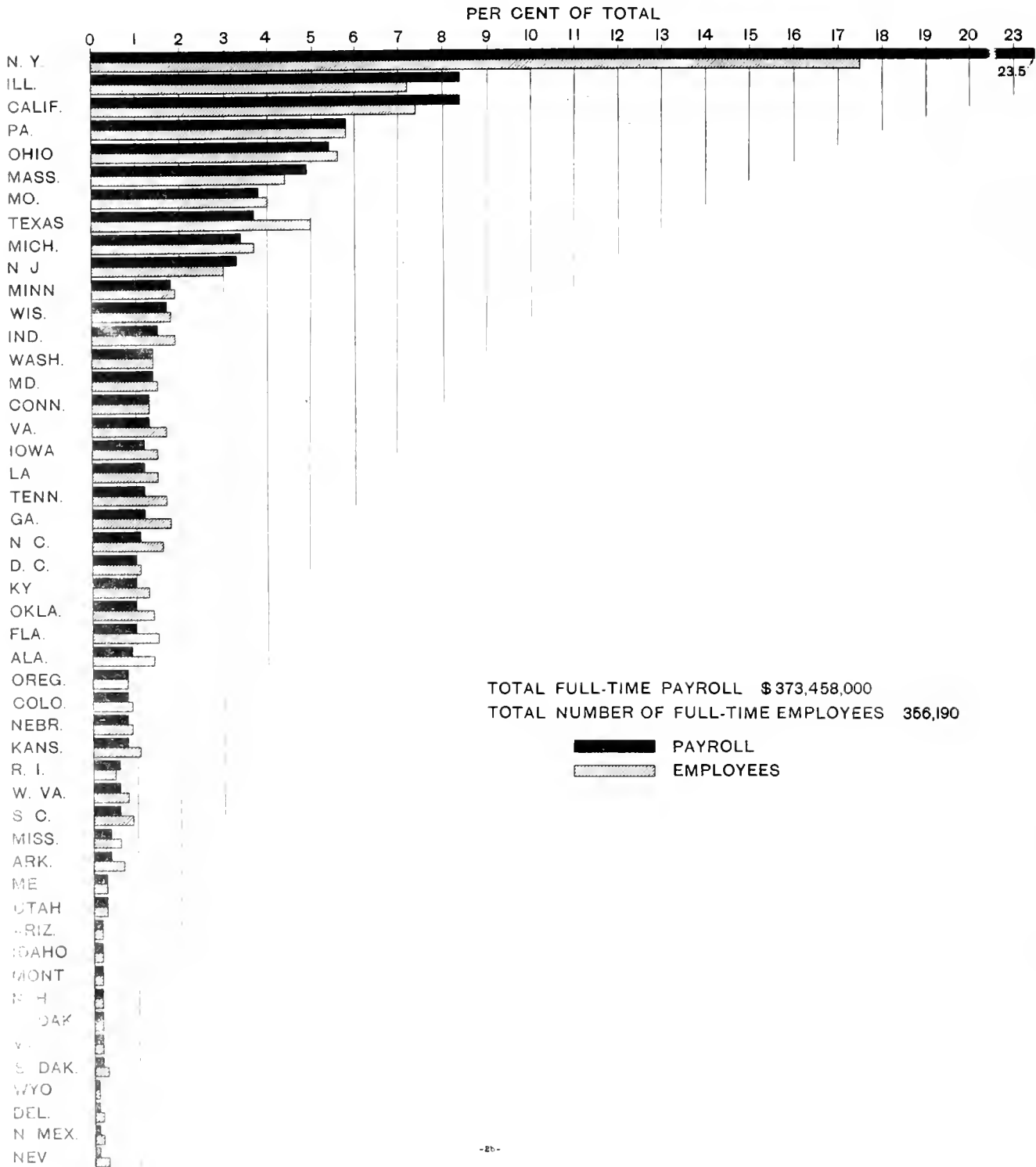


CHART III.—SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS

RECEIPTS AND NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS BY STATES

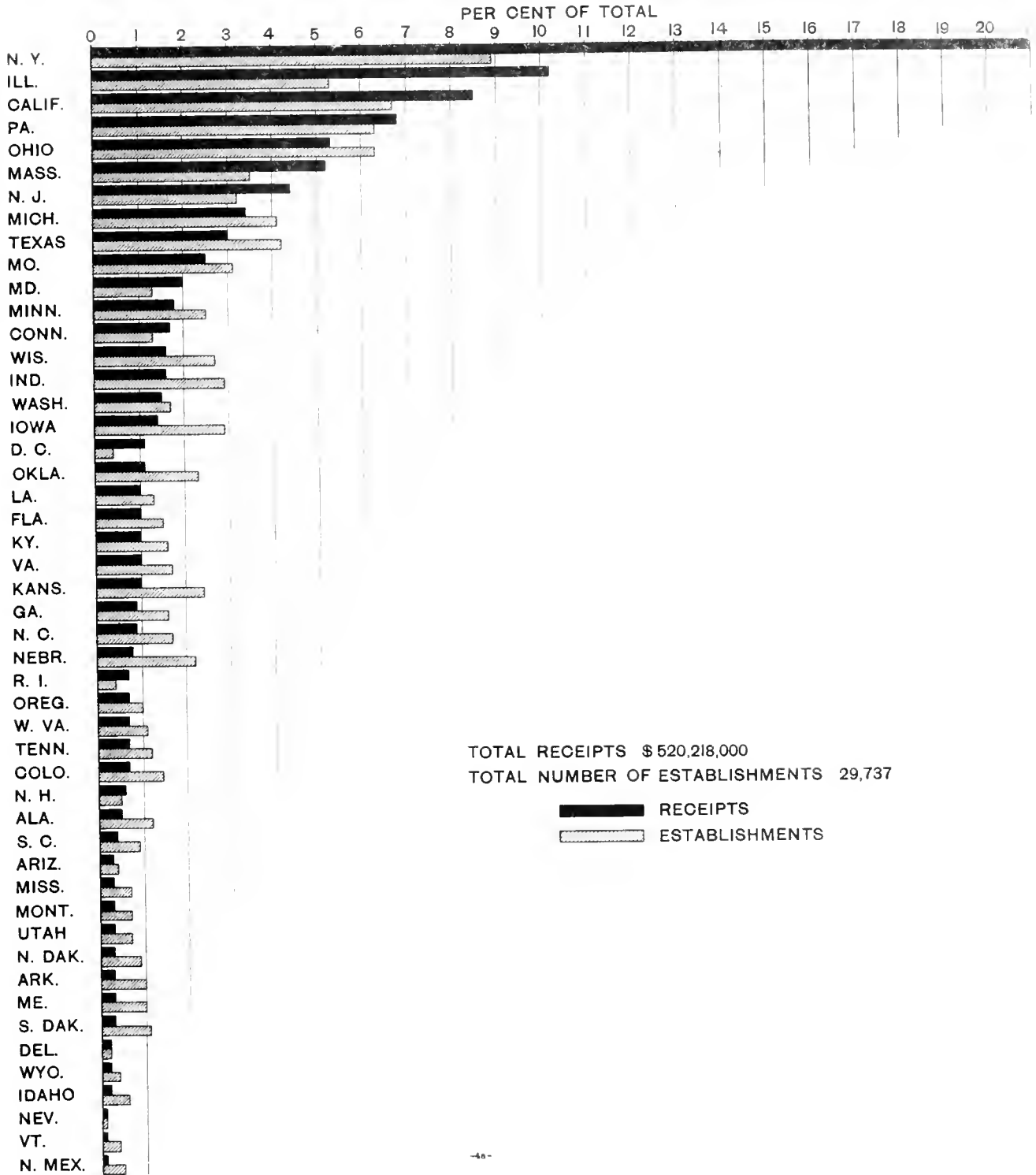


CHART V.—PLACES OF AMUSEMENT
FULL-TIME PAYROLL AND NUMBER OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES BY STATES

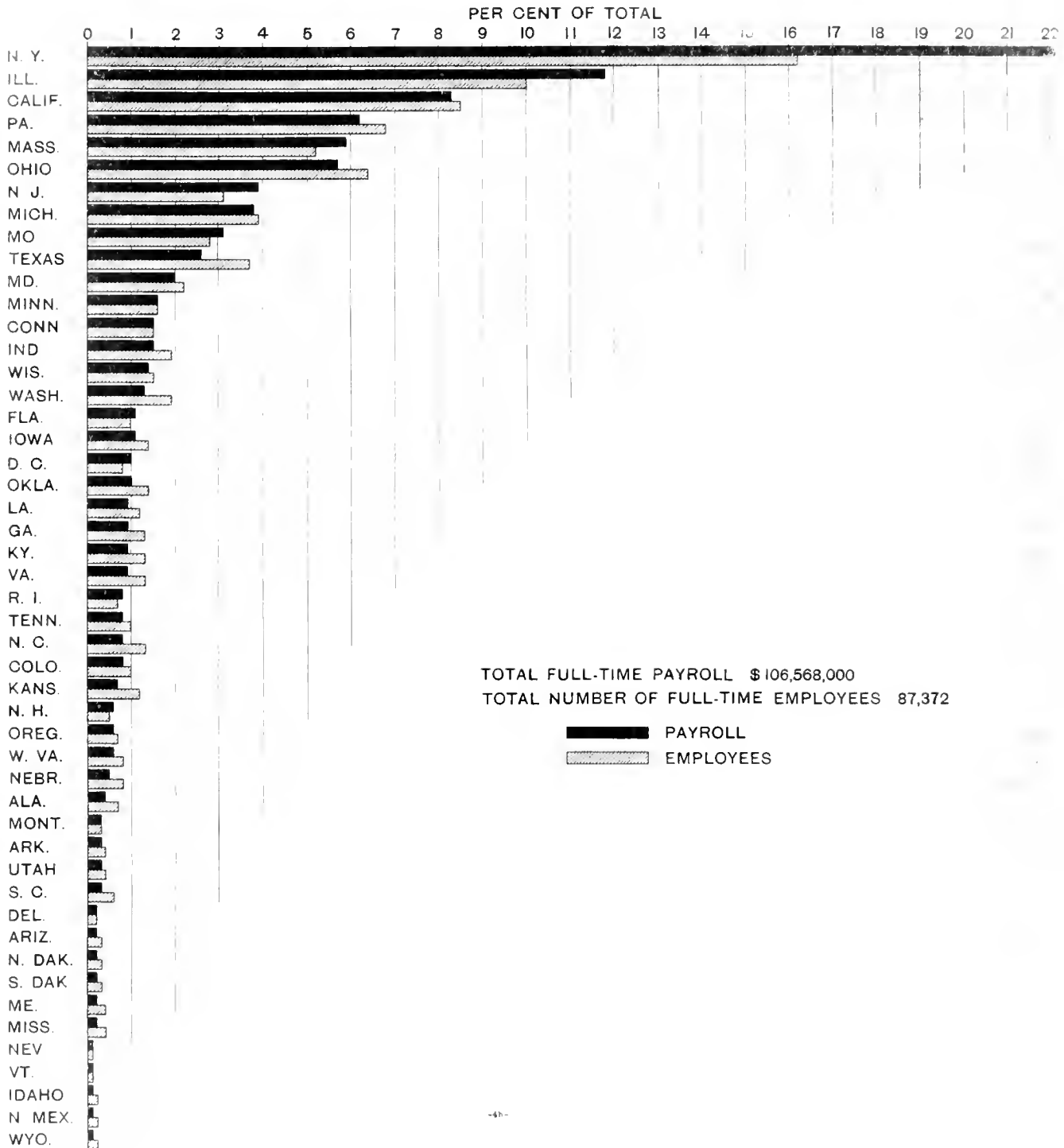


CHART VI.- HOTELS
RECEIPTS AND NUMBER OF ESTABLISHMENTS BY STATES

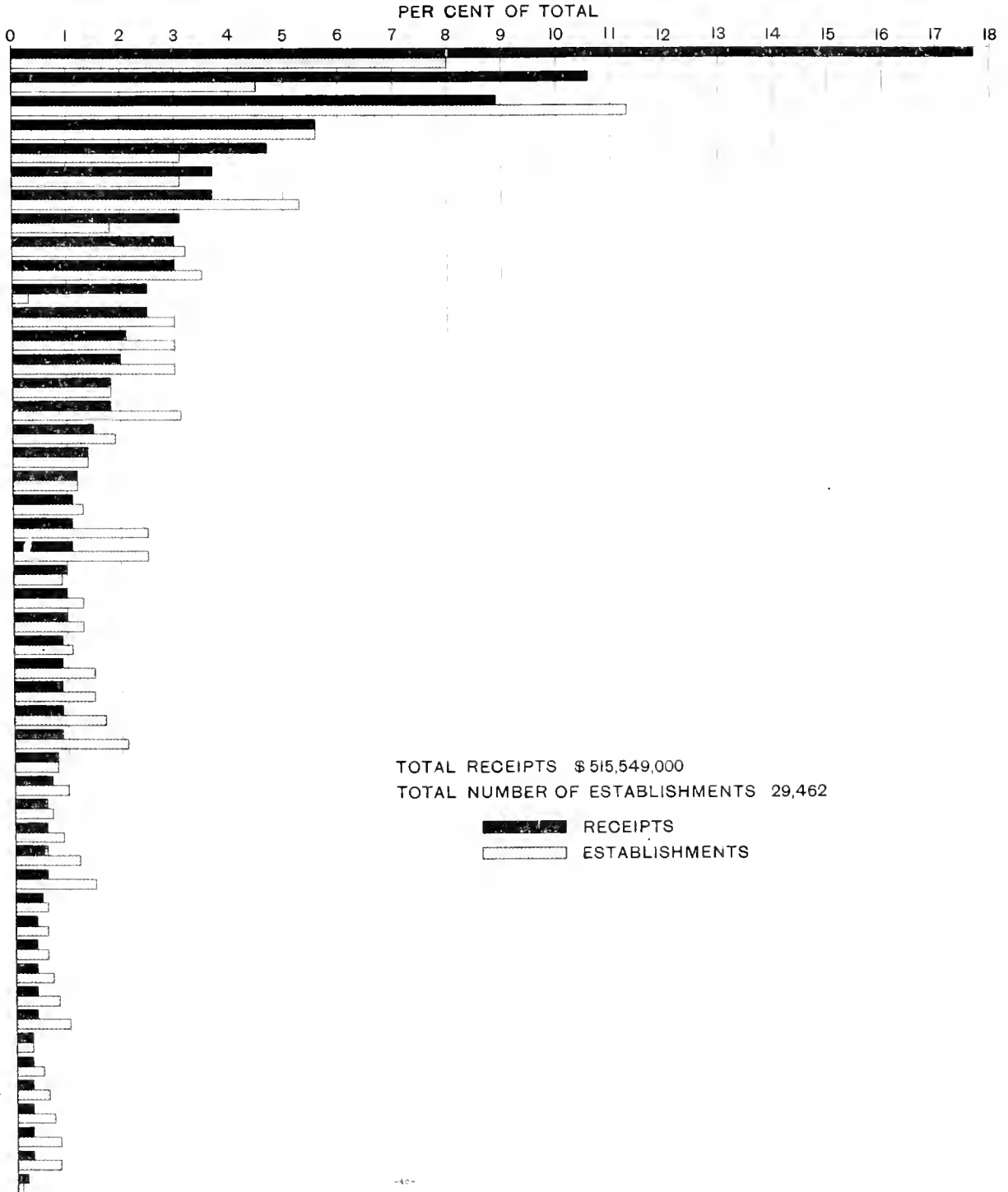
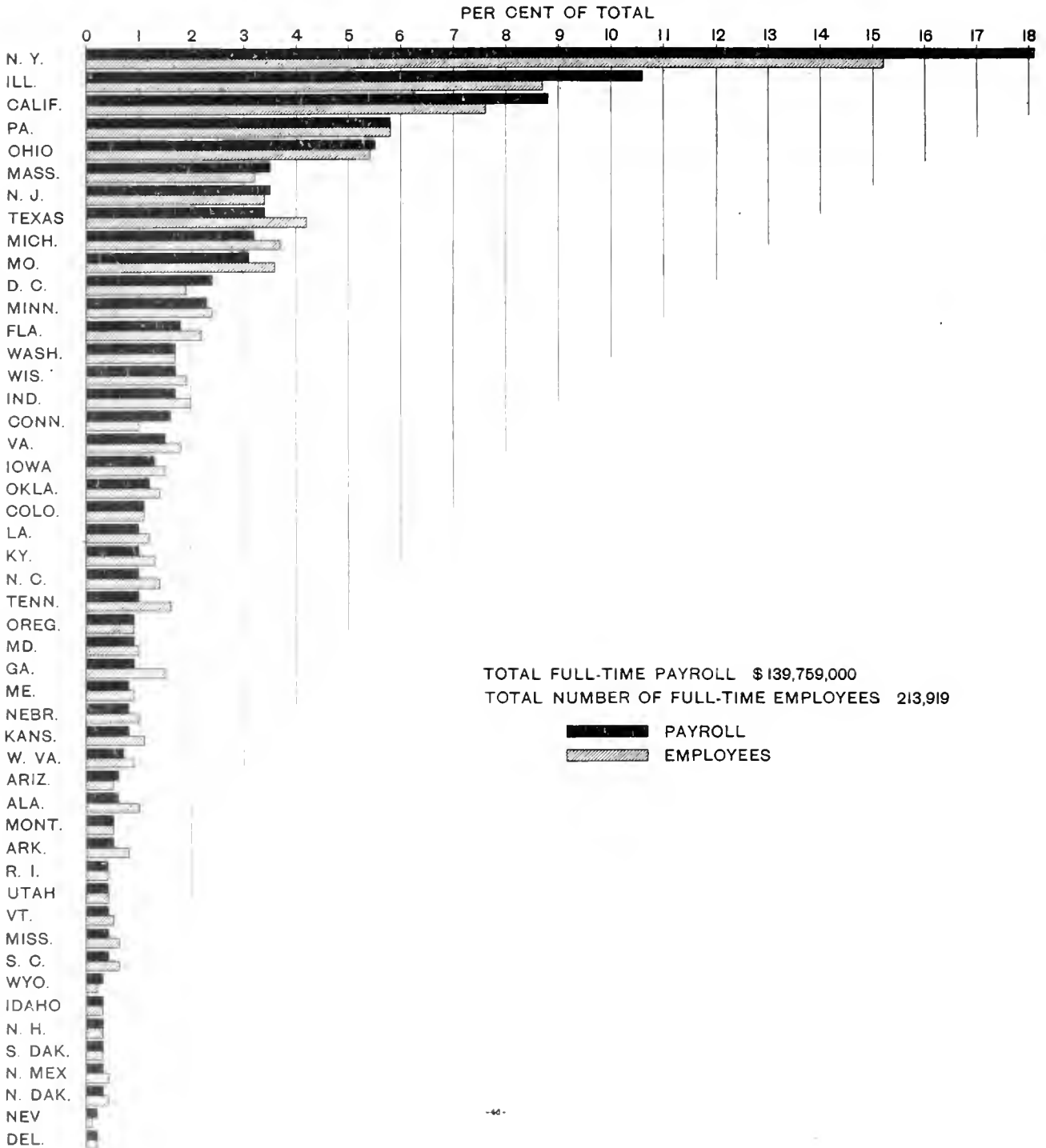


CHART VII.—HOTELS

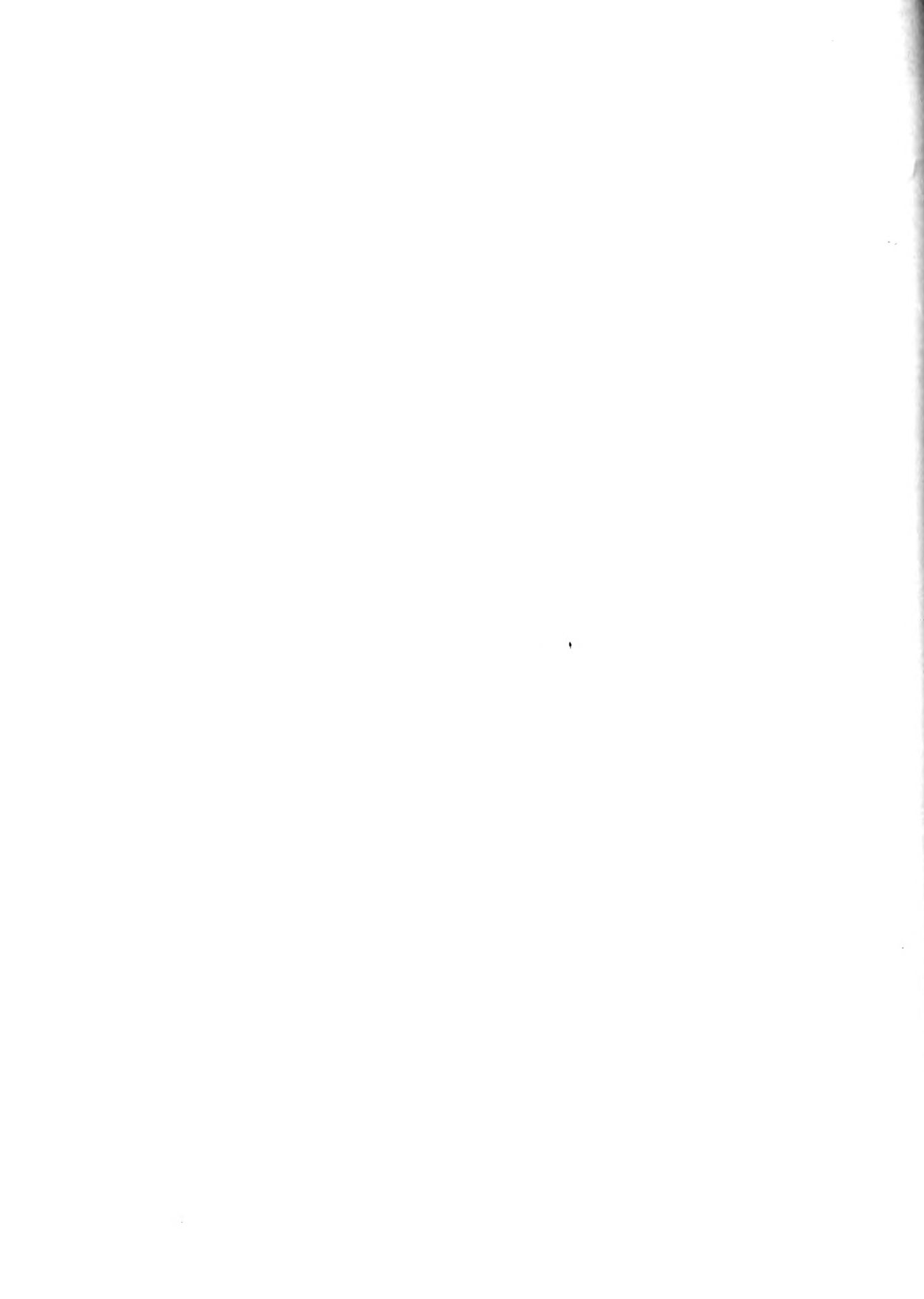

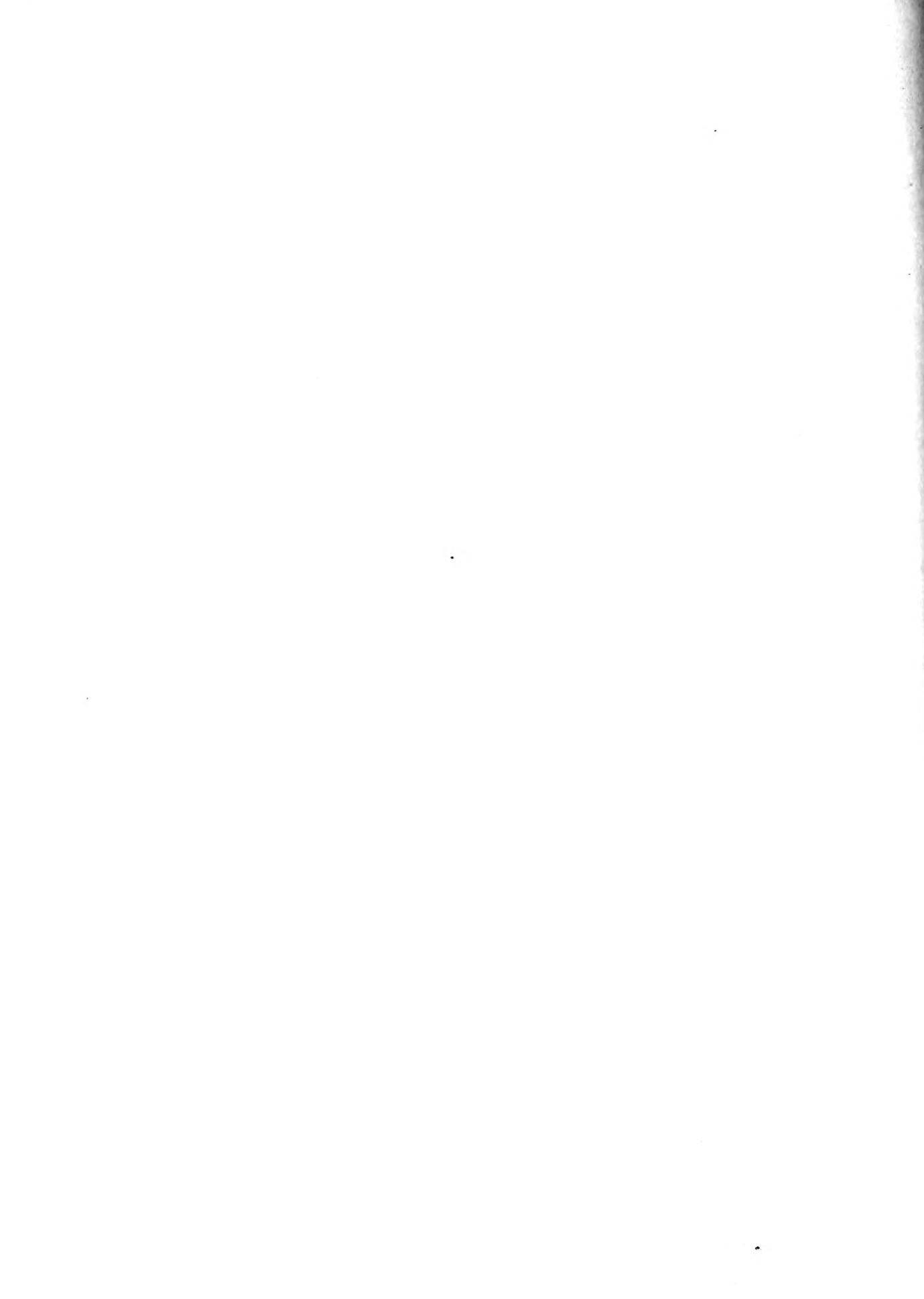
