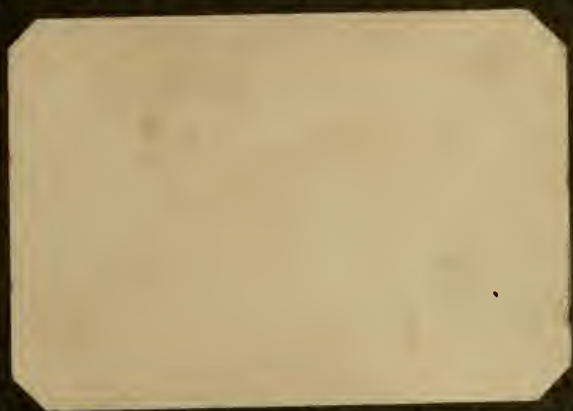

NEW-YORK, Wednesday, April 17, 1889.

8.30 O'CLOCK P. M. Formal opening of the Loan Exhibition of Historical Portraits and Relics. at the Assembly Rooms of the Metropolitan Opera House, corner Broadway and Thirty-ninth Street.

Monday, April 29.

The President of the United States, Benjamin Harrison, under the escort of the Committee on Navy, leaves Elizabethport at 11 a. m. in the U. S. Steamer *Dispatch*, and, arriving at the foot of Wall Street, is received by the Committee on States.

2 to 4 O'CLOCK P. M. Lunch and reception at the Equitable Building to the President of the United States and the Commissioners from all the States and Territories.

4 to 6 O'CLOCK P. M. Public Reception given to the President in the Governor's Room of the City Hall.

In the evening the Ball given in honor of the President and the other guests of the General Committee at the Metropolitan Opera House.

- 12 O'CLOCK M. The Military Parade, Major-General John M. Schofield, U. S. A., Grand Marshal, starts from the corner of Broadway and Wall Street, marching over the following route : up Broadway to Waverley Place, through Waverley Place to Fifth Avenue, up Fifth Avenue to Fifty-ninth Street.
- 7 O'CLOCK P. M. Reception of the President of the United States by the Committee on Art and Exhibition at the Loan Exhibition of Historical Portraits and Relics.
- 8 O'CLOCK P. M. Banquet given to the President of the United States and the invited guests at the Metropolitan Opera House.

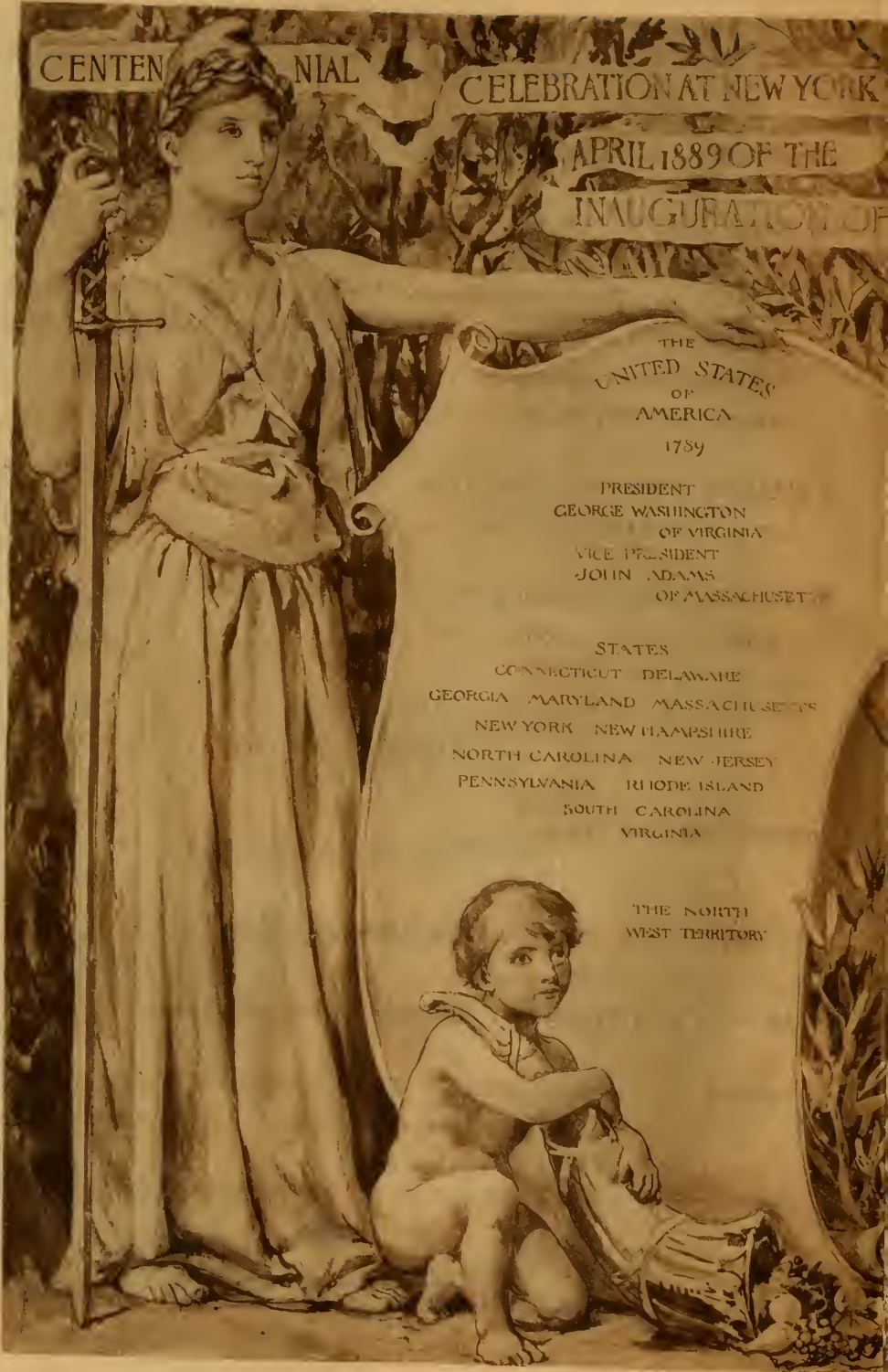
