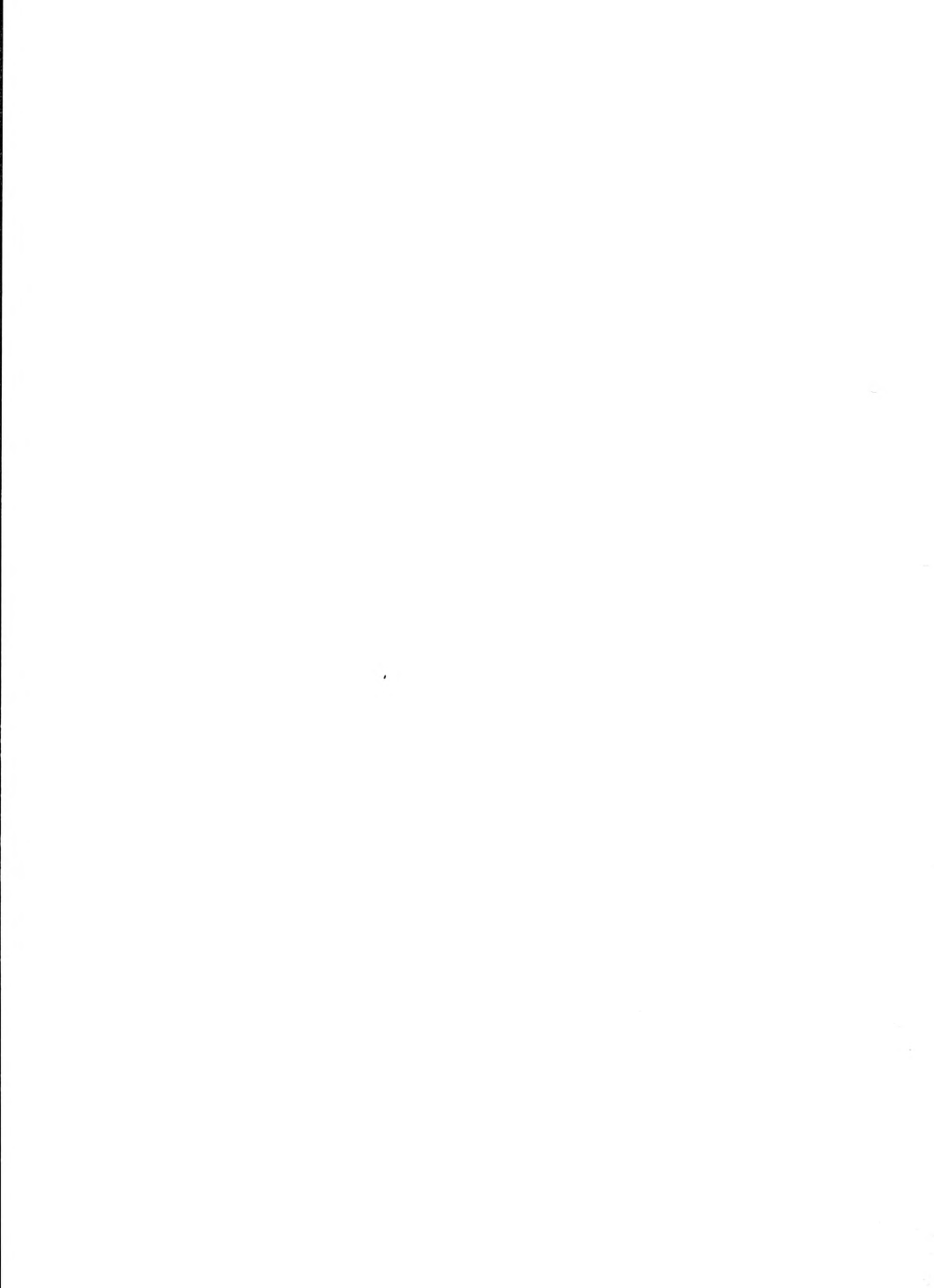

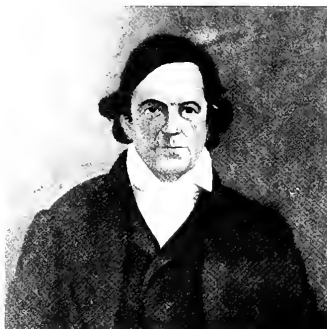

Dedication

The dedication of Humphrey's Court marked the beginning of Maryville College's 175th anniversary. Humphrey's Court is the landscaped area between Anderson Hall, Fayerweather Hall, and the CCM that was refurbished and replanted, providing beauty for students and other passers by to enjoy. Funding for this project was donated by Diane Humphreys-Barlow, a 1970 MC graduate and current member of the Board of Directors, in honor of her parents.

Diane's parents, Bernice and Edward Humphreys Sr. were actively involved with Maryville College. Bernice was a member of the Board of Directors and was involved in other statewide educational organizations. Edward actively supported the College but dedicated his life to a flower business that he began. For this reason Diane thought a flower garden would be appropriate and fitting for the memory of parents who so loved flowers. Because the Humphreys gave of themselves in many ways to the College, a charitable trust was established that eventually lead to helping with the renovation of the library.

Speakers at the dedication including Diane Humphreys-Barlow, Ellie Morrow, Jenny Cummings, Dr. Harry Howard, and Richard E. Ragsdale spoke of the contributions of this family, as well as of the importance of giving to the College. Upon the dedication of the area, Dr. Gibson declared the start of the 175th year, and the anniversary celebration had begun.

Preface

This covenant was developed and is maintained by the student body. Our community has an obligation and responsibility involving relationships and mutual understanding, appreciation, and respect. With this in mind, I, entering into a covenant with all other members of the Maryville College community, vow:

- to pursue lifelong goals of education and scholarship;
- to encourage and support my fellow students as they aspire to be honest in their academic endeavors, as well as their personal relationships;
- to respect each member of our community for his/her individuality regardless of race, gender, religion, national or ethnic origin, socio-economic background, philosophy, or affectional preference;
- to act with integrity in all interactions-academic, personal, and beyond;
- to respect the rights of others be they property, privacy, opinion, or expression;
- to perpetuate sound moral and ethical values in my dealings with the Maryville College community and the global community.

Upholding these standards is vital to my continued growth as a person. I realize that nothing is produced by those from whom nothing is expected and recognize that constantly challenging myself to become a better person is the only way to achieve that end.

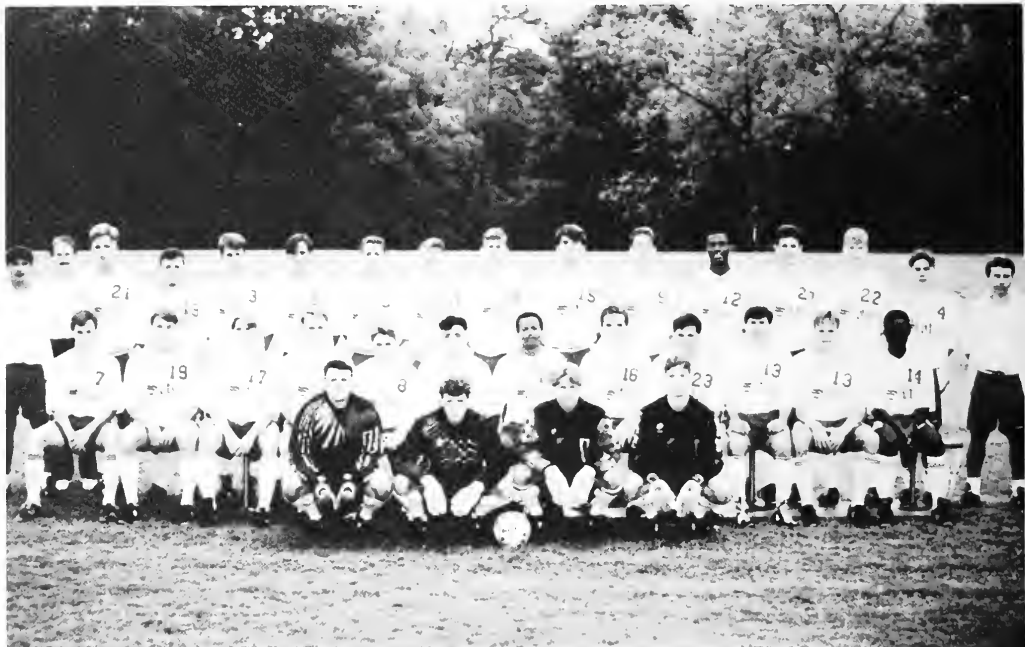

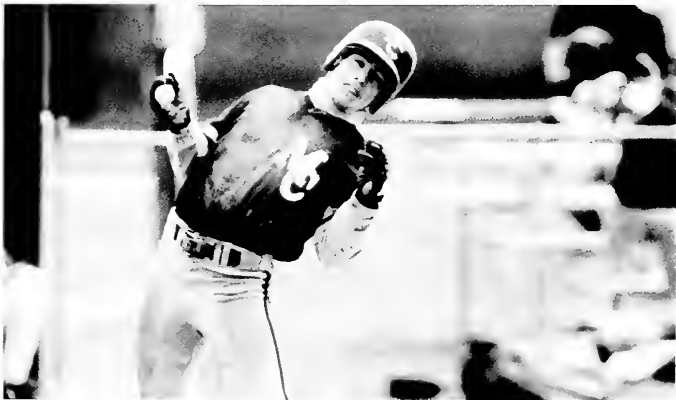
