







Important Scores in Sports

- -The Chicago Bulls, with Michael Jordan back from baseball, Scottie Pippen, and tattoo-clad bad boy Dennis Rodman, set the NBA single season record with 72 wins (previously held by the '71-'72 Los Angeles Lakers at 69 wins).
- -On their third try in five years, the Atlanta Braves beat the Cleveland Indians in six games to win the World Series. Tom Glavine was voted Most Valuable Player of the World Series.
- -Cal Ripkin Jr. broke Lou Gehrig's consecutive games played at 2,130 on September 6.
- -Atlanta Braves pitcher Greg Maddux wins the Cy Young Award, his fourth straight, which no other pitcher has ever won more than two years in a row.
- -After serving a jail term for rape, Mike Tyson re-emerged as one of the top boxers in the world.
- -The Kentucky Wildcats beat Syracuse 76-67 to win the school's sixth National Championship.
- -Pat Summitt and her Lady Volunteers drilled SEC rival Georgia to win their fourth title under Summitt. Guard Michelle Marciniak was named Most Valuable Player.
- -USC beat Cinderella Northwestern 41-32 in the Rose Bowl. The loss ended a season for Northwestern that saw them go from 23 straight losing seasons to 10-1, the Big Ten Championship, and a place in the Rose Bowl after a 47 year absence from bowl contention.
- -The Nebraska Cornhuskers, led by quarterback Tommy Frazier and running back Lawrence Philips, humiliated the Florida Gators 62-24 in the Fiesta Bowl to win their second consecutive National Championship.
- -MVP cornerback Larry Brown had two key interceptions as the Dallas Cowboys defeated the Pittsburgh Steelers 27-17 in Super Bowl XXX.
- -Two time Olympic gold medalist and four time World Champion ice skater Sergei Grinkov died of a sudden heart attack on November 20.
- -Ohio State's Eddie George wins the Heisman Trophy for the best player in college football.
















