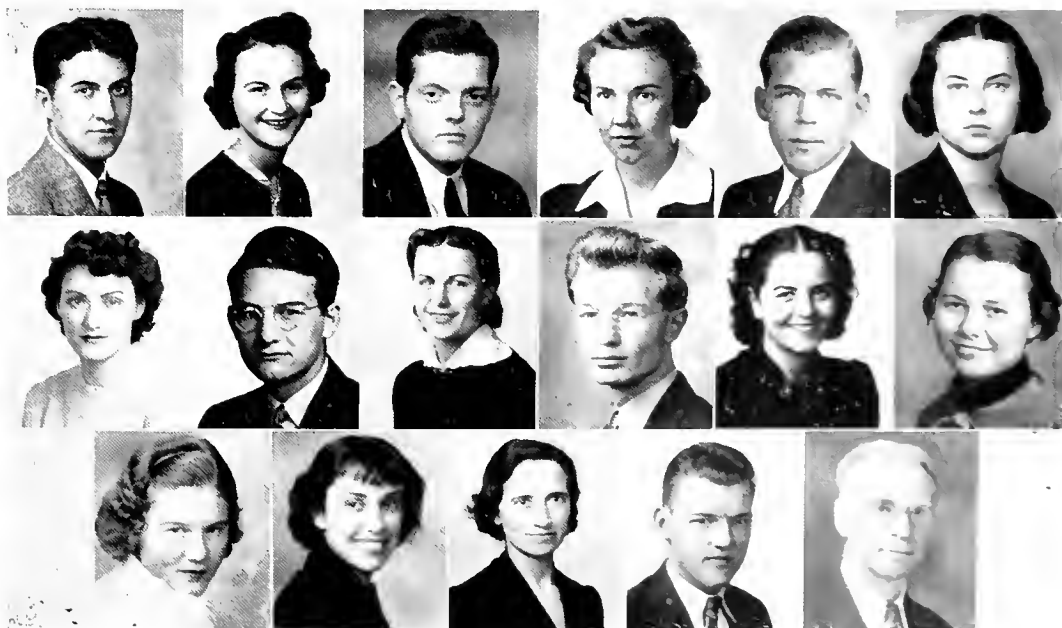
THE CHASTENING

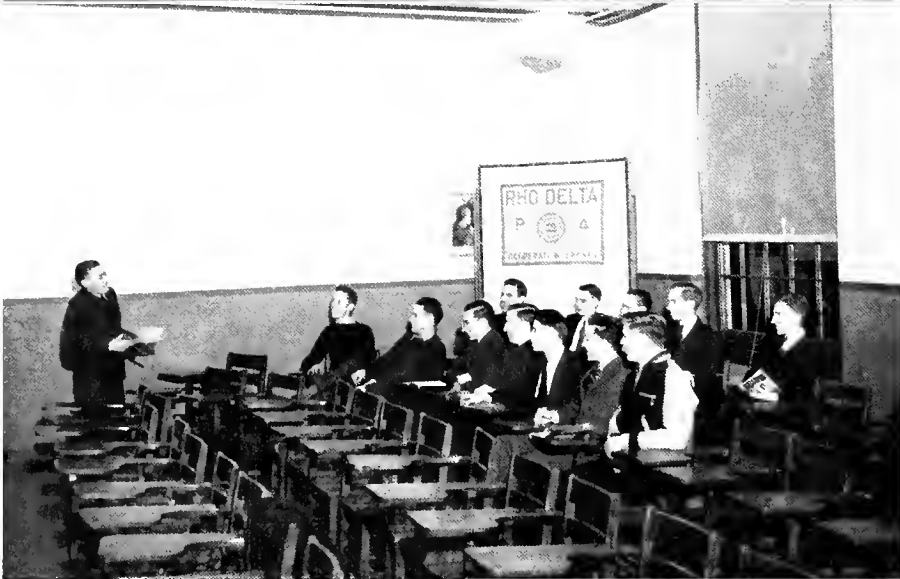

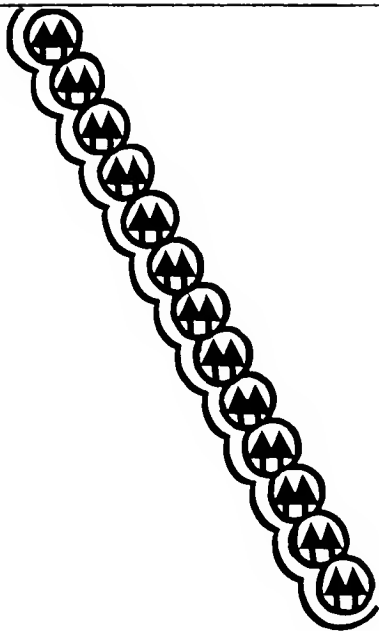

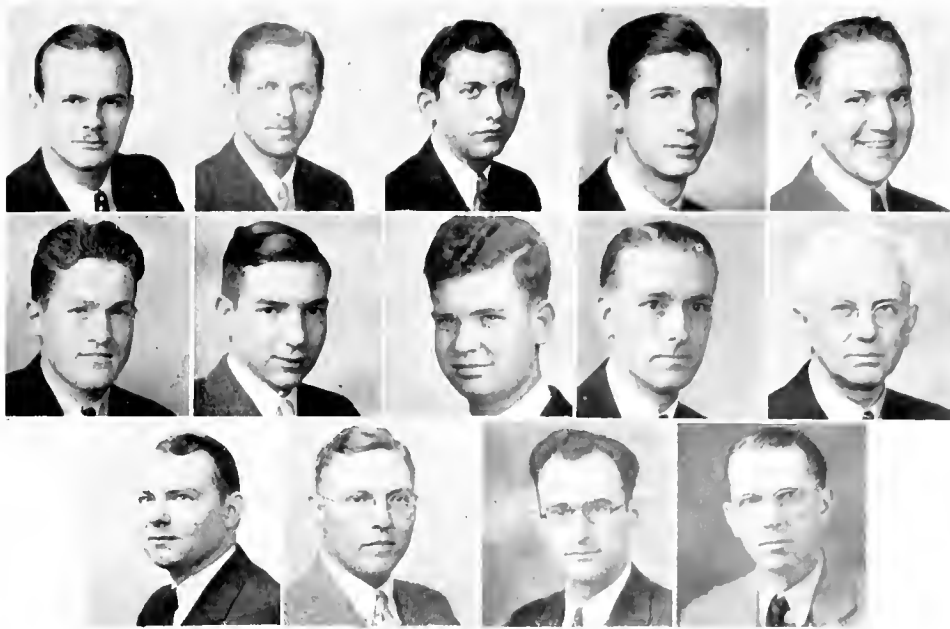

Members of the team will be: Brashear, Davis, Boyce, Lav, Jones, Williams, Brooks, Hale, Prater. Six of these men are to be graduated.

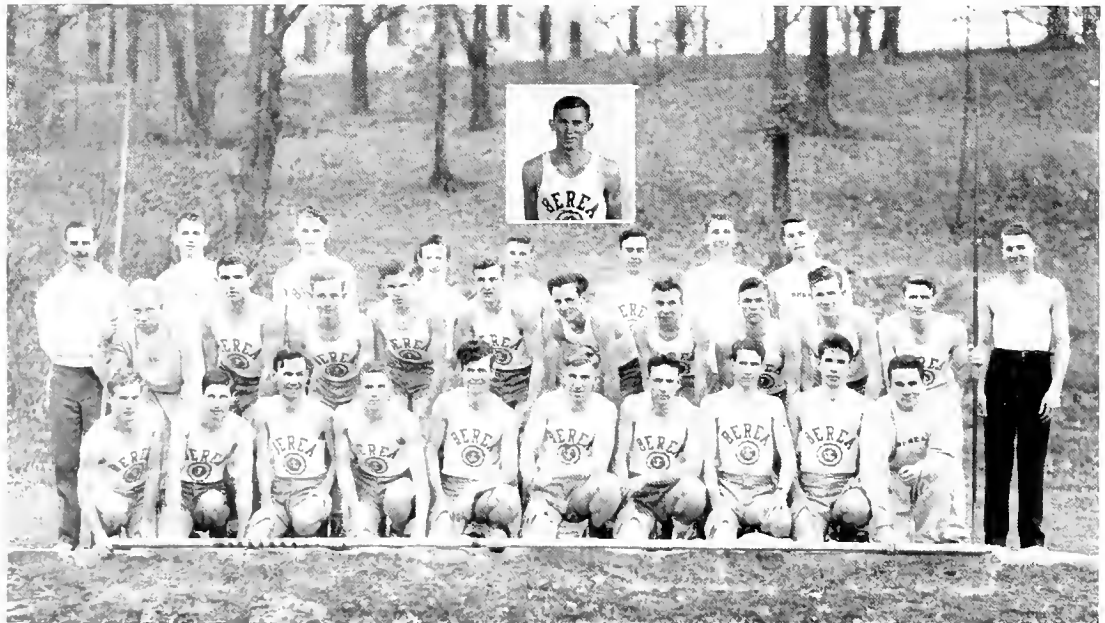
