The sports year - - - Basketball was the sport that had students and faculty filling Seabury every Saturday night, or cramming busses and cars for a trip to a neighboring school - - - Basketball was crowned "king" for a few weeks. What happened? - - - The Mountaineers played twenty games - - - winning eleven and losing nine. They scored a total of 1113 points and their apponents netted 1063.

The basketball story - - - - when Coach C. H. Wyat? called for basketball men, a total of sixty candidates reported for the first practice. 
