MARY CATHERINE BAUCOM

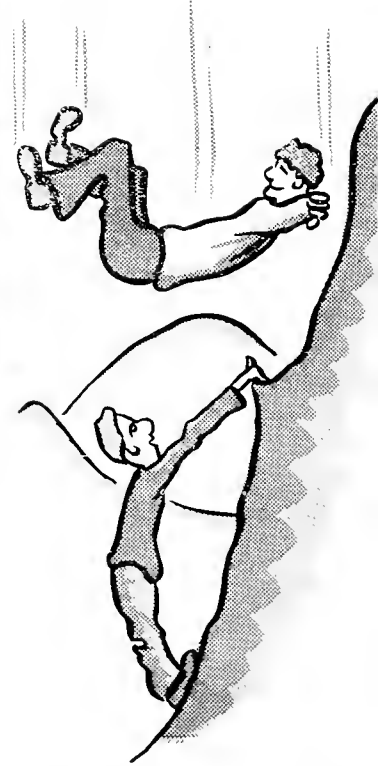

The sports year - - - Basketball was the sport that had students and faculty filling Seabury every Saturday night, or cramming busses and cars for a trip to a neighboring school - - - Basketball was crowned "king" for a few weeks.
