## PREAMBLE.

Whereas it was deemed expedient be us, Farmers and others of British Columbia, that a society should be formed for friendly in. terrourse and mutual improvement in Agricoultural Science and Art ; and a meeting: having been calied of Farmers and others for this purpose, an Association was formed, when the following Constitution and ByLatrs were adopted.

## CONSTITUTION.

article I.-mame.
This Society shall be known by the name. of the "British Columbia Agricultural and ILorticultural Society."

## article it-—ODJECTS.

The olyjects of this Society shall be to advance the general interests of Agriculture and Stock-raisiag in this Province, by holling meetings for discussion, by importing samples of Seeds and Agricnltnral Implements, by importing Live Stock for breading purposes, and by holding Exhbitions, Plowing Matches, ete., and to disseminate mfor-
mation among its members by corresponding with similar Societies both at home and abroad, and by providing a Reading-Room, Library and Museum for the use of the Society.

## ARTICLE IIT.-MEMBERSHIP.

Any person can become a member of this Bociety by subscribing his name to the Constitution and By-Laws and paying the entrance fee of five dollars annually in advan'e. Any person can become a life-member by subscribing his name to the Constitution and By-Laws and paying into the treasury the sum of one hundred dollars. Honorary members can only become such by being elected by a two-thirls vote of the nembers present at any meeting. Any person whose subncription is more than three months in arrears shall thereby forfeit all right to membership.

> ARTICLE IV.-OFFICERS.

The Officers of this Society shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, Treasurer, and a Board of Directors, which shall consist of nine clected members, together with the President, Vice-Presidents and Treastirer, who shail be ex officio menbers of the Board.

ARTICLE V.-FLECTION OF OFFICERS.
The President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary,

Treasurer, and Board of Directors shall be elected anmually on the first Saturdiy in December, and shall take office on the first Saturday in January, and the rote of the inembers for the election of such Officers shall be taken by ballot.

ARTICLE PI.-MEETINGS.
The regular meetings of this Society shall be held on the first Siturday of each month, and the annual meeting on the first Saturday in December of each year, at such time and place as may be designated.
article vif.-hlteration of constitution.
No alteration shall be marle to the Constitution unless a notice of motion shall havo been given to the Secretary in writing at least one month previous; and such motion shall be carried by a two thinds m jori y of the members present.

## BY-LAWS.

1. Officers--It shall be the disty of the J'esident, or in his absence the Vire-Presiwent, to preside at all mectings of the Society and of the Board of Directors: to preverve order, wire the casting vote, call special meetings of the society amd Board of Directors, and to attend generally to the interests of the Society.
2. Treasurer.-It shall be the daty of the Treasure to receive all monies due or donatted to the Society and deposit them in a Bank, to pay all orders drawn on himself by the Secretary ad comitersigned ly the President. It shall also he his duty to keep a correct aceonnt of all the cash received and expended hy him, and to present to the Society a monthly and ammal report at the regular monthly and ammal meetings.
3. Secretary. - It shall be the daty of the Secretary to keep the minutes of the meetings of the Society and of the Board of Directors, to record the mames and receive the entrance tees of all members and pay the mame to the Treasurer ; to correspond with other similar Societies, and keep eopies of all correspondence; to keep a labor list; to firnish such information to the members of this society as may be required; and to make a
report to the Society at the end of each year, which shall be read at the ar:nual meeting.
4. Board of Directors.-Five membere shall enrstitute a quorm for the transaction of business, and it shall be their duty to manage the general aftairs of the Society and to jrescribe such rules and regulations for holding exhibitions, plowing matches, etc., as they may deem necemary.

## OTDER OF DUSINEAS.

1. Seren members of this Society shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
2. Reading minutes of previous meeting.
3. Reading correspondence.
4. New business. No new business can be brought before any meeting of this Society unless notice thereof has been sent to each member by circular, and a similar notice posted in the Secretary's room at least one month previous.
