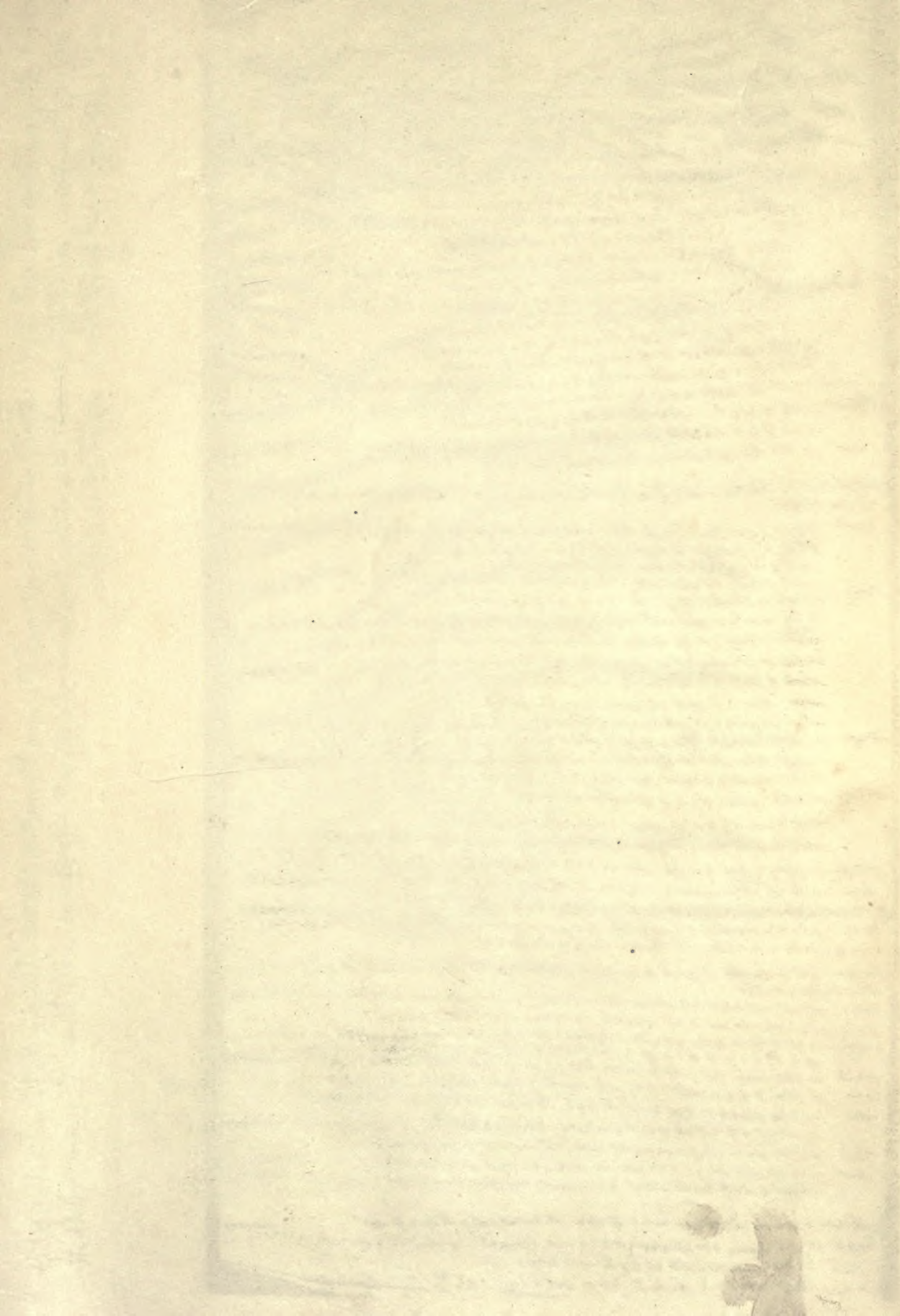


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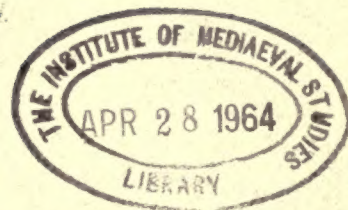

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PREFACE.

A VERY few remarks seem to be required to supplement the Introductions furnished by the Editors to the several pieces included in this collection.

I. The Charters from St. Swithun's form a valuable addition to the "Original Charters relating to the City of Worcester," edited by Mr. Harvey Bloom in 1909.

II. The photographic reproduction of the MS. of the "Ruridecanal Court, 1300," which appears as the frontispiece of this Volume, will give some idea of the difficulties encountered by Mr. Pearson in its transcription. An examination of the places mentioned in the record shews plainly that the Chapter, whose sittings are recorded, is that of a single Deanery, that of Wich, which, it must be remembered, included in the year 1300 the two modern Deaneries of Droitwich and Bromsgrove. It will be seen, for example, that the Chapter of Wich have no jurisdiction over Alice of Hartlebury (p. 78); in the same diocese, but in the Deanery of Kidderminster. When this is realized, the identification of some places mentioned becomes easier. Thus "Norton" can be neither Norton, near Evesham, nor Norton by Kempsey, nor yet Bredon's Norton, since these places were in the Deaneries of the Vale, of Worcester, and of Pershore respectively. It must therefore be King's Norton. In like manner the "Opton" of our record is necessarily Upton Warren, perhaps the least well known of the three Uptons in the County, but the only one in the Deanery of Wich.

III. It seems highly probable from Mr. Gordon's description that the volume containing the Rental which he has edited once belonged to the Monastic Library of Worcester. Nothing is more common than to find fragments of rentals and accounts as fly leaves of the MS. volumes still remaining in the Library.

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If so, we have here an instance of a volume which had found its way out of the Library a century (perhaps) before the dissolution of the Monastery.

In the Rental itself the names of persons and places, though disguised by their spelling, are generally intelligible, but there remain some puzzles. Who or what can be meant by "leireis" (p. 89) and "Algratit eschal" (p. 90)?

IV, V. The catalogues of the extant Rolls of the Collectors and Prepositi of the Chapter estates and of the Manorial Courts are valuable chiefly as shewing the nature and amount of the still unexplored material to be found in the Cathedral Archives. There is a further interest in the number of rolls which are out of their proper place at Worcester. Most of these seem to belong to Winchester. The rolls under the heading of *Bishopstone* (Nos. 531—537) unquestionably belong to Winchester, yet there is no Bishopstone in Winchester Diocese. *Great Chart* (572, 573) is in Canterbury, *Ide* (639 foll.) in Exeter. *Sparkford* (789) is not in Hampshire, but in Somerset, but the item following (790) is most probably a Winchester roll, perhaps of Bishop's Sutton in Hants, or Sutton in Surrey. *Woldeham* again is most likely Woldingham in Surrey, and therefore in Winchester Diocese, and there can be no doubt about *Chilbolton* (866, 867). Bishopstone occurs again among the Manor Rolls on p. 134.

In compiling the Index I have not thought it necessary to include the names of the Collectors and others who furnished accounts to the Chapter, nor the names of the offenders who appeared before the Ruridecanal Courts.

CHARTERS FROM ST. SWITHUN'S, WORCESTER.

INTRODUCTION.

THE documents and papers calendared in the following pages are contained in an ancient oak chest in the ringing chamber of St. Swithun's Church. The chest is of massive slabs of oak with a domed lid, banded with iron and fitted for three locks. It dates from the 13th century, and has probably been used from the first as a muniment chest.

The charters and papers were, when found, roughly wrapped in newspapers in bundles, and had never apparently been sorted into any kind of sequence, though there is some evidence to show that the indefatigable antiquary, Mr. Noakes, had looked through them; indeed, little in Worcester seems to have escaped his survey.

In the same chamber is a second and much more modern chest, containing what at first sight looked like an unpromising pile of crumpled papers, torn prayer and hymn books, and all the usual litter of a Church chest long used as a receptacle for rubbish; but some of the earliest and most interesting documents were recovered from this chest after considerable expenditure of care in examining the débris.

At the request of the Rector and Churchwardens the contents of both chests were sorted, arranged, smoothed and cleaned;

those of no special interest were then tied up in neat bundles and returned to the chest, while the remainder are the subject of the present Calendar.

The Calendar is arranged in sections, bringing together documents of the same nature, or those relating to a single locality, as serving best the interests of local topographers. In this way deeds relating to messuages in High Street will be found in chronological order in one section, those of Eport, Merch Street or Wullinhall Street in another.

It has been usually thought that the documents related to those early charities of St. Swithun's parish which escaped the plunder of the Reformers. This may be the case with some of the deeds when names of feoffees are given, but, if so, it is not definitely stated. The bulk of the collection is of a private character, and it may be suggested that most of the documents belonged to private persons who placed them for safety in the chest of their parish Church.

Whatever their origin, these deeds throw no inconsiderable light on the trade and topography of the city from the 13th to the 15th centuries. They mention by name some streets that do not appear in the more numerous collection of Worcester deeds in possession of the Dean and Chapter, such as Gosethrott Lane, Merh or Merche Street and Wullinhale or Wylenhale Street, while they confirm the names of many others, such as Bochers Strete and Neldare Street. Numerous are the trades mentioned: among them occur barbers, barkers, bellmakers, bochers, bowyers, cardmakers, carters, colermakers, drapers, dyers, goldsmiths, mercers, sheremen, skimmers, sompnours, taverners and weavers. Some of these were men of mark in their day; one le Careter used an armorial seal with three catharine wheels and a squirrel for crest, while many of them held office as bailiffs of the city.

These deeds help to fill many blanks in the long list of bailiffs, and also contain more than one official record of the decrees of the Court of the ballivate sealed with its handsome seal. One of

these records from this collection is now in Worcester Museum. (See Appendix.)

It is also of interest as showing the connection of Worcester with Wales that the names of several Welsh men occur among the witnesses. Among them are Lewis ap David ap Phelippe, Lewis Caint ap Phylp, and John app Rice. Other names suggest the close proximity to the forest beyond the north gate, such as John le Venur, Philip le Venur.

The thanks of the society are due to the Rector and Churchwardens of St. Swithun's for permission to print the calendar.

Record of a plea heard in the Court of the Bailiwick of Worcester, Monday after Epiphany 9 Richard II., Richard Meysmore and John Bredon being bailiffs.

Citing the Writ of the Crown ordering a grand assize of a plea brought by John Taillour, citizen of Worcester, and Alice his wife, against Nicolas Pepere and Johan his wife, respecting a

certain messuage with its appurtenance, of which John and Alice declared John and Johane had disseised them. The enquiry was heard at Westminster 20 Oct. 9 Rich. II., when William Barbour and Richard atte Heye appeared against William Brugge and John Wryxham for the said parties, and the suit was adjourned until Monday in the Feast of SS. Fabian and Sebastian, when it was transferred to the local Court. The Jury sworn were Robert Hayle, Robert Stephans, William Pycard, John Coupere, Hugh Stephens, Walter Haye, William Barbour, William Danalis, John Chepeley, John Russendene, barbour, Richard atte Balle and David Draper, who found that Alice had no right to the messuage. The Record was then sealed with the seal of the bailiffs, in the presence of Richard Cowerne and Vincent Botyler, aldermen.

INTRODUCTION.

This Roll, No. C. 885^A in the Records of the Diocese of Worcester, is of interest for three reasons : firstly, on account of its very early date (1300) ; secondly, on account of the extraordinarily abbreviated character of the script, as appears from the photograph of the Roll ; and thirdly, from the rarity of such records. The only similar documents I have been able to trace are a Roll at Lincoln beginning about 1337 and one at Rochester beginning about 1436 (British Museum Add. MS. 11,821). The Lincoln document often gives the commutation of the penance, and the Rochester extracts give some details of the "fustigationes."

A short account of the nature and origin of these Ruridecanal Chapters, of whose proceedings this Roll is an early record, may be of further interest.

The Rural Dean or Archpriest had the right to convene local Chapters, consisting of the parochial incumbents of each deanery or their curates or proxies, the Rural Dean being president.

These Rural Chapters do not seem to have generally existed outside England ; but in England they appear to have existed as early as the time of Edward the Confessor (see the 3rd and 31st Canons of his Laws Ecclesiastical). The Chapter appears to have been held every three weeks for the disposal of ordinary business, quarterly for more serious matters. It has been suggested that the ordinary Chapters corresponded to the Manorial Court, and the Quarterly Chapter to the Hundred Court. The Rural Dean selected the place of meeting, and the

Priest of the selected parish had to provide substantial entertainment. This obligation, to quote the learned author of "Horæ Decanicæ Rurales,"* to whom I must express my obligations, "imposed such a grievous charge upon a poorly endowed incumbency harassed with the difficulty of providing needful entertainment (often required at short notice, in places, at the best but scantily furnished with necessary esculents) that the poor and more sequestered village clergy gladly availed themselves of the protection afforded to their larders by Archbishop Stratford's memorable decree—That all Chapters should be celebrated in the future in the more eminent place in the deanery, and that officials and other ministers should perform what concerned them at the expense of their principals."

When duly convened the Decanal Chapters were protected from violation, and all persons maliciously obstructing or interfering with them were *ipso facto* excommunicated.

Gradually these Ruridecanal Chapters decayed. In 1660 a fruitless attempt was made to revive them by His Majesty's Declaration concerning Ecclesiastical Affairs, but until the revival of our own day the office of Rural Dean and the importance of his Chapter seems to have decayed even more than was the case abroad.

In their prime the object of the Chapter was the advancement of religion and the interests of the Church and the detection and suppression of vice within their jurisdiction. Among other offences peculiarly under the surveillance of the Rural Deans according to the Canons and Constitutions of the Church of England were adultery, whoredom, incest, drunkenness,

swearing, ribaldry, usury, and other uncleanness and wickedness of life. These they dealt with in their judicial capacity by the punishments of monition, purgation, penance, suspension "ab ingressu ecclesiæ," suspension "ab officio et beneficio," excommunication, and, as it would appear, by the more forcible punishment of whipping also. These punishments were sometimes commuted by the Dean for a fine to be applied "in pios usus," and considerable complaint was made of the view taken by some Deans of what were "pious uses." These punishments were inflicted by the Dean sitting in his Ruridecanal Chapter.

I must in conclusion express my obligation to Canon J. M. Wilson, to Mr. D. T. B. Wood of the British Museum, and to our Editor, Mr. S. G. Hamilton, for the assistance they have given me in transcribing this rare and curious document.

It appears that a meeting of the clergy of the whole Archdeaconry was summoned to discuss some questions relating to the vacancy of two benefices, Hadsor and Oddingley, and that certain persons attending the meeting formed themselves into a committee to do what was necessary. This meeting was not a ruridecanal chapter, though the Dean of Wych is prominently mentioned, either as the convener of the meeting, or because it concerned his deanery.

INTRODUCTION.

The Rental of the Priory of Worcester here reprinted is now in the University Library, Cambridge. It occupies two leaves of vellum, bound as the first two of six fly-leaves before a manuscript volume containing the sermons of Petrus Comestor, and other tracts in various hands of the twelfth and early thirteenth centuries. On the first page a fifteenth-century owner has written untidily, *Iste liber constat Thome Schelvysley*.

The Rental is written in a neat upright hand of the first part of the thirteenth century, not difficult to read. In some places the writing has been erased, but it is nowhere illegible.

The tenants of the Rental are often found surviving in the *Registrum*; in many cases they are represented by their widows or other heirs; in others, again, their names only remain attached to their holdings, which have passed into other hands.

INTRODUCTION.

THE Archives of the Dean and Chapter of Worcester are divided into five classes. The Rolls dealt with in the present list are arranged under Class C., a class which also contains the Rolls of Accounts of the obedientiaries of the Priory. These, forming Section 1, have been already dealt with by the Society in three separate treatises. The present list contains the Rolls in Section 2 ; it includes : (1) Rentals of the manors entered upon rolls under the name of the Cellarer for that particular year. This official acquired his information on oath of a jury of the freeholders of the manor. (2) The yearly accounts of the provosts and bailiffs of the various manors, occasionally produced in collaboration with an official styled Collector of rents. (3) The estimates of the amount of corn in possession of the Bailiff at Michelmas. (4) Stallage Rolls of those holding Market stalls. (5) Miscellaneous Rolls, some of which are of high interest. They include part of the Roll of Parliament of 1312, a Subsidy Roll temp. Edw. I. entitled *Rotulus Bonorum Temporalium in Episcopatu Wygorn'*. This Roll is obviously part of the Episcopal series. A Roll of Acts of the chapter general of the Benedictine Order in various places, 1253-1255. A Roll of causes brought before the Hundred Courts 21-22 Edward I., and other matters of interest. The full text of one of these rolls, No. 885A, will be found in the present volume.

It is curious that a number of Winchester rolls occur among those of Worcester, and several of these have been returned to their proper place of preservation, through the generosity of the Dean and Chapter, among them No. 884, a Roll of Charters of St. Swithun's, Winchester. Others will be found under the heading Bishopton.

CATALOGUE OF ROLLS, ETC.

THE CORN ESTIMATES.

THE computation of the corn supplies for the year is usually written upon the dorse of the bailiff's accounts, but a series of rolls are extant which concern the corn supplies only. In these rolls the corn is accounted for under each species: Barley, oats, wheat, peas, beans and siligo. The form of the entries can be seen from a single example :—

Hallowe, Saturday after the Feast of Saint Michael.

Corn in the grange 1 stack (meya) 11 feet high, reckoned at 24 quarters.

Beans.—A stack 16 feet high, reckoned at 30 quarters.

Oats.—A stack 21 feet high, reckoned at 100 quarters, and of barley 6 quarters.

Tithe Corn in another grange, a heap (cantellum) 14 feet long, 13 feet wide, and 7 feet high, reckoned at 7 quarters.

Pulse.—A heap 23 feet long, 14 feet wide and 12 feet high, reckoned at $4\frac{1}{2}$ quarters.

Oats.—A heap 17 feet wide, 14 feet wide and 16 feet high, reckoned at 16 quarters.

The same from the demesne.—1 stack of pulse 25 feet long, 14 feet wide and 10 feet high, reckoned at 6 quarters.

In another case the items are more varied, and the descriptions more exact :—

Clyve (Cleeve Prior).—In the middle barn a stack of corn beyond the lower beam, reckoned at 4 feet, estimated at 60 quarters.

In the same barn a stack of demesne corn, new tithe corn and old corn beyond the upper beam, the tithe corn in the middle of the building, and the old demesne corn in the midst of the

building in height 3 feet, also part at the lower beam. The rest of the new demesne corn is computed at 60 quarters; of tithe corn 23 quarters, old demesne corn 20 quarters, and of the new demesne corn 16 quarters. Item at the south end of the same barn a stack of horse fodder (dragium), reckoned for the demesne horse team. At the lower beam 48 quarters. Item in the Barton, 1 stack of pulse 30 feet long, 11 wide and 16 high, reckoned at 16 quarters, with one waggon load of pulse in the stable, and another in the byre.

ROLLS OF THE MANOR COURTS, EDWARD I.—
CHARLES II.

THE Series of Manor Rolls* belonging to the ancient Priory of Worcester fall naturally under three heads : those of the Manors allotted to the Cellarer for the general upkeep of the Monastery ; those of the Almoner, viz., Ancredam, Broadwas, Shirnake, and Icombe, this obedientary receiving the profits of these manors and of various other properties which were ear-marked to provide money for his alms and other outgoings ; and lastly, the important Manor of Stoke, assigned to the Prior to support the dignity of his office, together with Bromsgrove Rectory Manor and Bradicote.

The Cellarer, apparently, acted as Seneschal, and made a progress to hold the various manorial courts, which seem usually to have been held half-yearly. Thus, on the first Roll of the series : he was at Crowle and Broadwas on the Feast of St. Luke ; at Hallow on the morrow ; at Newenham on the Eve of St. Wolstan ; at More, Hallow, Grimley, and Cropthorn on the Feast itself. He was at Overbury the Tuesday after ; Sedgeberrow the following day ; Cleeve and Blackwell on the Thursday ; Alveston on the morrow of St. Paul ; Harvington the Saturday after ; Wolverley the following Tuesday. Himbleton Court was held on Thursday after St. Scholastica ; Tyberton the same day ; Crowle the Friday following. He was at Cropthorn again on the Monday before St. Oswald, and so forth. Another series of visits to hold Courts took place about Hokeday.

As is not unusual in such a collection, a few stray rolls from places outside their jurisdiction have come, by some accident, into the possession of the Dean and Chapter ; on the other hand, hundreds must have been lost. Of these extraneous rolls, one (No. 190) belongs to Winchester, and should be returned to its proper place of custody. The Chapter have already done this in the case of certain other Winchester Rolls and Charters—

a kindly and a generous act, which deserves to be widely copied. Of the others, that of Eastleach (No. 187) deserves notice from its age, 1300-1, and from the fact that it belongs to the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The two Composite Rolls in the series are more than usually interesting, composed as they are of a medley of documents. No. 4 contains, amongst others, the oldest Account Roll of a Bailiff of one of the Priory Manors. Probably there are few, if any, older Account Rolls extant than that of the Granger of Hardwick, 1262-3. Both rolls deserve editing.
