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### RECOMMENDATION.



THE Bible is a book of fuch transcendent worth, and so happily suited to all the parts and purposes of the Christian life, that it can never be too much recommended to the world: Every thing that allures the world to peruse it, is a blessing to mankind, And though it is hard for our narrow capacities to grasp, and take in the several distinguishing excellencies of it at one view, yet if we take a separate survey of the doctrines and duties, the promises and threatenings, the prophecies and histories, which are contained therein, each of them will afford us an awful or a delightful prospect, with lessons for special improvement.

THE worthy author of this Collection, whom I have long known with efteem and honour, has chosen to reduce all the most useful and important Promises of the word of God into order, and set them before us here. These are the most powerful motives

to duty; these are the constant food of a living Christian, as well as his highest cordials in a fainting hour. And in such a world as this, where duties perpetually demand our practice, and difficulties and trials are ever surrounding us, what can we do better than to treasure up the Promises in our hearts, which are the most effectual persuasives to fulfil the one, and sustain the other? Here are laid up the true riches of a Christian, and his highest hopes on this side heaven.

The materials which are collected here are all divine, and the disposition of them is elegant and regular; so that it is an easy matter to find something suited to the frame of our souls, or our present wants on every occation: And that soul who knows what a suitable promise is worth in an hour of darkness or temptation, will never think such a work as this, and such a various treasure, can have sufficient value set upon it.

This is fuch a piece as I dare put into the hands of every Christian, among all their divided fects and parties in the world. Here is no danger of error or mistake in point of orthodoxy, if the English be but truly translated from the facred originals. The noify controversies of the age, which eat out the vitals.

vitals of true religion, have no room nor place here; for these sentences are the pure word of God, without any mixtures of the wit or reasonings of man.

It is the leaft thing that I can do to shew my gratitude to the pious Author of this Collection, to tell the world how much I esteem it, how often it has given me consolation and support in the midst of my long infirmities and consinements in former years, when I was not capable of reading a whole page together in any writing: And there are multitudes of Christians that can bear the same testimony, to the value of this Collection of Promises, who have found it an effectual spur to duty, and a divine relief under surrounding sorrows.

In order to a better improvement of these Promises, it may be very proper to read the Introduction sirst, which will teach even Christians of the lower rank, how to understand and apply all these discoveries of divine mercy. Those who have little leisure for reading, may find their account in keeping this book always near them, and with the glance of an eye, they may take in the riches of grace and glory, and derive many a sweet refreshment from hence, amidst their labours and travels through this wilderness. It is of

excellent use to lie on the table in a chamber of sickness, and now and then to take a sip of the river of life, which runs through it in a thousand little rills of peace and joy.

MAY this 2d edition, which brings it again into the world, be attended with still greater fuccess: And I shall be glad to see such an evidence of growing Christianity and living religion among us, that fuch an affemblage of divine mercies which have been showered down from heaven in different ages, upon this wretched world, ever fince the fall of man, comes into the relish and taste of mankind, fo far as to be perused and prized by them. May the Holy Spirit of God who indited all these Promises, and our blessed Mediator, who by his ministry and by his blood, has fealed and confirmed them all, render them every day more and more powerful and prevalent, to draw the hearts of men towards God, and to fit them for the enjoyment of these words of grace in their complete accomplishment in glory. ### INTRODUCTION:

CONTAINING

Some Observations upon the Excellency and Use of the Promises, and Directions for the right Application of them.

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BESIDES the many other evidences the holy fcripture carries in it, of a Divine original, there are especially remarkable the fublimity, excellency and reasonableness of the doctrines it teaches; the wisdom, holiness, and perfection of the rules of life it lays down; and the strength and efficacy of those sanctions, with which it enforces its precepts. As the Threatenings have the greatest tendency to strike an awe upon the mind, and to lay a powerful restraint upon every irregular inclination; fo the Promifes are of fuch a nature, as most strongly to excite to, and give the greatest encouragement in a course of piety and universal holiness. It is therefore with the highest reason the apostle says of them, That there are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises, that by these we might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through luft, 2 Pet. i. 4. They are great and excellent; whether we confider the nature and variety of the bleffings contained in them, the manner in which they are expressed, the certainty with which we may depend upon them, or their happy influence upon the mind.

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They contain bleffings of all forts, of the most excellent nature, and fuited to every circumstance. As man is made up of body, as well as spirit, and the necessities of this present life must be provided for, as well as his happiness secured in the next; in the Promises abundant care is taken of both, and provifion is made for the peace, comfort, and welfare of the Christian, both in this, and in the other world. He is assured of the several necessaries and conveniences of this life, in fuch a measure, as Infinite Wisdom sees best for him. And fince we are exposed to various troubles and calamities, there are many Promises made with relation to them; either that we shall be preserved from those afflictions, or, if it be necessary we should be exercised with them, that we shall be powerfully supported under them, and in the best time and way, delivered from them, after that they have been made to answer the most excellent ends upon us. Nor is it easy to say, what a vast variety of consolations are provided for our relief in those trials. But, however valuable, considering the circumstances of our present state, the Promises relating to temporal enjoyments and afflictions, may be, they are not to be compared with the excellency and glory of those spiritual and eternal bleffings, with which we are bleffed in Christ Jesus, and of which we have the most clear, full, and express Promises in the gospel. Therein, how great, how particular a regard is had to the condition of fallen, sinful man! What care is taken to ease the conscience under the burden of guilt, and the apprehensions of Divine wrath, by the most gracious promises of pardon and mercy! What affurances given of reconciliation and acceptance with God, through the blood and intercef-fion of the Redeemer! To what glorious privileges and high honours is the Christian advanced! Such as, the adoption of children, a kind regard to all his prayers,

prayers, the ministry of angels, and an interest in the grace, love and fellowship of God the Father, and of his eternal Son and Spirit. In the *Promises* is contained all that grace which is requisite to refine and ennoble our natures, to enlighten our understandings, to regulate our wills, and purify our affections; to preserve us from sin, and all the contrivances and snares of the devil and the world, and to exalt us to the highest perfection of holiness and happiness.

The manner, in which these bleffings are promised, fill further adds to their value. They are not expreffed in general or ambiguous terms, but with greatest clearness and perspicuity. God would not leave his people at an uncertainty, concerning his kind intentions towards them. If the meaning of the promife feem doubtful in one place, it is abundantly cleared up in feveral others. Nor is it only here and there in some few passages, or in a cold and reserved manner, that God has fignified his good will; but, upon the account of our dullness and slowness to believe what God has promifed, he has both made use of the strongest words and phrases that language could furnish out, and has over and over, in great variety of expression, often repeated the assurances of his favour. He has contrived his Promifes so, as to meet with all our objections, and remove all our doubts and fears: And herein he has been pleased to shew an affection, tenderness, and condescension, which could not be expected from an earthly prince to his subjects; much less from the great and glorious majesty of heaven and earth, to finful dust and ashes.

But what doth in the highest degree enhance the worth and excellency of the *Promises*, is, The evidences we have, that they shall certainly be made good; since, as the apostle argues, Heb. vi. 17. 18. we have for them both the word and oath of that God that cannot lie, that so we might have strong confoliation.

folation, who have fled for refuge, to lay hold upon the hope set before us. And of the covenant thus confirmed, Christ the Son of God is made the Surety, Heb. vii. 22. having ratified it by his own blood. And that all the ever-blessed Trinity might concur in establishing our faith upon the strongest foundation, the Holy Spirit of God witnesses to the truth of the Promises, by his miraculous operations, when first poured forth upon the apostles, and by his sanctifying influences upon the hearts of all true Christians, both then, and ever since. Hereby he inspires into them a lively hope, and surnishes them with well-grounded evidences of their interest in the promises; and their hope makes them not assumed, because the love of God is shed abroad in their hearts by the Holy Ghost, which

is given unto them, Rom. v. 5.

The Promises therefore of the gospel being of so excellent a nature, and confirmed to us by fuch authority and evidence, cannot but have very great and happy influences upon the mind, when feriously attended to, and applied with faith; especially as they are the means by which the Spirit of God carries on his work upon the foul. They are the strongest arguments to persuade the finner to turn to God, the greatest encouragements to a humble, believing dependance upon the grace of Christ in the gospel, and the most powerful motives to fincere and universal obedience: Since by them we are affured, that every penitent finner shall find the most gracious acceptance; that from the grace of Christ we shall derive fufficient strength and capacity for every duty; and that in keeping God's commands there is great reward. So that would we but duly confider the feveral Promifes made to every exercise of grace, and every performance of duty, what a spur would this be to quicken our flow pace in the ways of holiness ! What an encouragement to be stedfast and immoveable, always

always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as we know that our labour is not in vain in the Lord, 1 Cor. xv. 58.

A FIXED, constant attention to the *Promises*, and a firm belief of them, would prevent solicitude and anxiety about the concerns of this life. It would keep the mind quiet and composed in every change, and support and keep up our finking spirits under the several troubles of life. In the multitude of my thoughts within me, thy comforts delight my soul, Ps. xciv. 19. Christians deprive themselves of their most solid comforts by their unbelief, and forgetfulness of God's *Promises*. For there is no extremity so great, but there are *Promises* suitable to it, and abundantly sufficient for our relief in it.

A thorough acquaintance with the *Promises* would be of the greatest advantage in prayer. With what comfort may the Christian address himself to God in Christ, when he considers the repeated affurances that his prayers shall be heard? With how much fatisfaction may he offer up the several desires of his heart, when he reslects upon the texts wherein those very mercies are promised? And with what servour of spirit, and strength-of faith, may he enforce his prayers, by pleading the several gracious *Promises*, which are expressly to his case?

Further: Great affistance and encouragement may the Christian derive in his spiritual warfare, when he takes a view of the many Promises of grace and strength, to mortify sin, and to resist the devil; of success, and a sinal victory in his conslicts with the enemies of his salvation; and of an incorruptible crown of glory, to be given him as the reward of his sirmness, constancy and perseverance. A great deal more may be said, but that I would not too much enlarge this Introduction, to shew of what excellent use

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the *Promifes* would be, if duly attended to, to promote all the exercises of the divine life, and to inspire into a good man comfort and joy in every state of life.

That the Christian might have before him, in one view, the many great and precious Promifes scattered up and down in scripture, and in such a method, as eafily to find what is fuitable to his case, I have drawn up the following Collection. The occasion indeed, of my first entering upon it, was to assist some young perfons, who very commendably, and to their great advantage, are employed in improving themselves, and one another, in the knowledge of the scriptures; one of their exercises being to treasure up in their memories, and question one another upon the Promises, under their several heads. At first, I intended to put together a fmall number, upon some principal fubjects; but, upon fearching the fcripture, more and more texts still offering themselves, which I thought equally to my purpose, the Collection at length grew fo large, that the taking fo many copies as were wanted, would have been a tedious work: for which reason, and in hopes it might serve the same useful end to others, I at last gave way to its being made public. Since I completed it, I have examined fome other Collections I have met with, and have added out of them those few texts, which I had not before observed; fo that, I believe, this is the fullest collection of the kind of any extant, at least that I have

I have endeavoured to put them together in such a method, as might be easiest and sittest for common use. I have not increased the heads to so great a variety of particulars, as some may expect; both because too many divisions rather consound, than assist the memory, and also the applying of the Promises to cases too particular, would have too much confined

their.

their use, when capable of a more extensive application. If any therefore want the Promises for some case they do not find here mentioned, they may meet with them under fome more general head, within which that case is comprehended. And for the same reason, some of the Promises may seem not so properly to belong to the head under which they are ranged; but as they are near a-kin to it, I chose rather to put them together, than to multiply heads. There are also other texts, which some may think should have been placed elsewhere. For instance, fome of the Promises under the head of Temporal Eleffings are by some understood in a figurative sense of spiritual, and so on the contrary. I have taken them in the fense that appeared to me most agreeable to the defign of the Spirit of God; though sometimes, where I thought the words were capable of both fenfes, I have written them in both places. Many other texts also might be ranged under different heads; for example, either in the First Part, among the Bleffings promifed; or in the Second, containing the Graces and Duties to which Promises are made; and fometimes under either of those heads, which being nearly related, follow one the other; as the heads of Sanctifying Grace in general, and Converting Grace. If, therefore, what you look for be not in one place, you may expect to find it in the other. For which purpose the references in the Table of Contents will be useful; for I have generally endeavoured to avoid repetitions. Sometimes, indeed, the fame text may be met with in different places, but then it is applied to different purposes; as when several bleffings or duties are comprized in one text, as Prov. xxii. 4.

Though all the scriptures here collected under the name of *Promises*, are useful for the comfort and encouragement of Christians, in the cases specified; yet

they

they are expressed in different forms. Some contain direct Promises and Assurances of such and such blessings. Of these some are made to all in general, according to the rules and limitations of the gospel, as Pfal. lxxxiv. 11. p. 37. and Pfal. xxxiv. 9, 10. p. 39. But others are addressed to particular good men in scripture, which yet every Christian may take contfort in. So that Promise made to Joshua, chap. i. 5. I will not fail thee, nor for fake thee, is by the apostle, applied to Christians in general, Heb. xiii. 6. In the same manner, Promises made to particular churches, are applicable to the church of God in general; as those in the Old Testament to the Jewish Church, Isa. xxvii. 3. and Zech. ii. 5. and those to the churches in the New Testament, Phil. iv. 19. p. 39. Rom. xvi. 20. and many more. The rulein both these cases is, that whatsoever Promises are made in scripture to particular persons, in cases, and for reasons, that equally concern other good men, they are applicable to the comfort of all, and may be pleaded with faith in prayer. The words of the apostle afford a sufficient foundation for this observation, Rom. xv. 4. Whatsoever things were written aforetime, were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have

The Promises also made in particular cases to persons in scripture, may be applied to the encouragement of others, so far as the case and circumstances agree, though not absolutely, and in their whole extent. Thus the Promises made to Solomon, (2 Chron. i. 11, 12.) of wisdom, and also of riches and honour, beyond all that were before him, because he asked of God wisdom rather than riches, &c. is applicable to Solomon only, in its whole extent; but yet gives encouragement to every good man to hope, that if he seek of God wisdom above all other things, he shall

obtain:

obtain a large meafure of it, according to what his station requires, and also much of other worldly advantages as God fees best for him, according to those more general Promises, Prov. viii. 17, 18. In the same manner the Promises made by Christ to his apostles, of the Holy Spirit, to teach them all things, and bring all the things he had faid to them to remembrance, John xiv. 26. and to guide them into all truth, chap. xvi. 13. though they are not to be applied to others in the fame degree as to the apostles, who were by the Spirit extraordinarily inspired, and instructed in the whole revelation of the gospel, and infallibly fecured from error, this being peculiar to their character as apostles; yet they encourage all other Christians to expect from the Spirit all that illumination, instruction, and guidance, which is necessary for them in their several circumstances, upon the diligent use of all appointed means, so that they shall be preserved from all dangerous and fatal mistakes and errors, according to those Promises, I John ii. 20, 27. Pfal. xxv. 12. and others made to good men in general.

Besides those scriptures, that run in the form of Promises, there are others, which are observations or declarations of the blessings that generally attend the several exercises of piety and holiness; as Psal. cxi. 5. in p. 39. and Prov. xviii. 10. in p. 41. and most of those collected out of the Proverbs and Ecclessates. But as these are observations made under the inspiration of the Spirit of God, they give the same encouragement to expect the blessings mentioned in them, as if

they were in the form of Promises.

Some of the texts do only express the experiences of good men in scripture, or their expectations from God; as Pfal. xvi. 6. in p. 37. Pfal. xxiii. throughout, p. 38. and Pfal. lxxi. 20. Of which scriptures the same may be said as of those above that as holy

holy men therein spake under the direction of the Spirit of God, and what they say of themselves is recorded for our instruction and comfort, consequently other good men may affure themselves, in like circumstances, of the like favour and mercy. Thus whereas the Psalmist expresses his considence in God's help, against all his enemies, Psal. cxviii. 6. the apostle applies it to all Christians, Heb. xiii. 6. So that we may boldly fay, The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man can do unto me.

Some of the texts are petitions put up by Christ for his church; as those taken out of John xvii. These give the fame encouragement as the Promifes do; for we are affured, that whatever Christ asks for his

people, is certainly granted.

The fame may be faid, in some degree, of the prayers put up by other faints in scripture, for themselves and others; especially the prophetical prayers, Gen. xlix. Deut. xxxiii. and in other places. Since those prayers were delivered under the inspiration of the Spirit, we know they were agreeable to the will of God; and fo far as circumstances are the same, all other good men may hope to be heard in asking the same bleffings of God. But of this fort I have taken but few, both because it is more difficult rightly and with judgment to apply them, and lest I should too much swell this collection.

THE Bleffings promised, are either of a temporal, or of a spiritual and eternal nature: It may be necessary to lay down fome rules, to direct the ferious Chriftian in the right application of these different forts of

Promifes.

As to the Promifes of temporal bleffings, and those that relate to temporal evils, it is acknowledged by all, they are not to be understood absolutely or univerfally, but with the limitation, as far as may be for God's glory, and our good; both which are, in

effect,

effect, one. Nor will these limitations lessen their value, with any thinking ferious person. For all outward things are of fuch a nature, as to be capable of being either good or evil to us, as circumstances vary. Riches, though in fome circumstances they may be very useful and valuable, in which case God will bestow them according to the tenor of his Promises; yet in others they may be, and often prove, very pernicious: No wife man in that case, would defire them. Thus afflictions in fome instances, may be of the greatest advantage to us. Then they are mercies; the inflicting them is a token of favour, and the preventing them would be a judgment, instead of fulfilling a promise. Now it must be allowed that of all these circumstances, the infinitely wise and good God is the best judge; fince he has before him in one view, the whole compass of every case, in all its circumstances, and is more concerned and watchful for our good, than we can be ourselves. The Promises therefore relating to these things, should not lie by neglected; but we should fix our faith upon them for the mercies we want, with a firm dependance upon the power and faithfulness of God, though with an entire submission to his superior wisdom, to choose what is best for us. I verily believe, Christians often deprive themselves even of temporal favours from God, for want of a more frequent stedfast exercise of faith upon the Promises, relating to these things. They either ask not, or not in faith, and therefore receive nothing from God, Jam. i. 6, 7. Or, they defire and ask, but not for right ends (to take notice of another limitation hinted at by the same apostle, Jam. iv. 3.) not for God's honour, but to consume it . upon their lusts; and so they ask amis, and therefore receive not. This collection therefore will give great affistance to the faith of Christians, when they obferve how full and express the Promises are, and how fuitable

fuitable to their feveral exigencies, even in things con-

cerning this life.

It may be objected to many of the texts, that they are taken out of the Old Testament, and were *Promises* made to the Jews under a dispensation wherein a greater stress is laid upon temporal blessings, than under the gospel; and consequently, that Christians

cannot expect fo much from those Promises.

I answer, That it is true, the gospel has a much greater tendency to draw our affections from, and leffen our regard to our outward felicity and prosperity, than the law; fince it has brought in a better hope, and gives more clear discoveries, and more full affurances of spiritual and eternal blessings, and recommends these as our main concern; and therefore our defires and expectations of temporal bleffings, ought to be very moderate, and bear no proportion with our concern for spiritual. But yet that Christians may take comfort in, and apply to themselves the Promifes of the Old Testament, and in things relating to this life, is evident from that declaration of the apostle, I Tim. iv. 8. Godliness is profitable unto all things, having promife of the life that now is, and of that which is to come. Where the apostle affirms, not only that godliness is profitable to this, as well as another life, but that it has Promifes relating to both ; by which it is probable he meant those of the Old Testament, a great part of the New being not then committed to writing, or not published among the churches. Befides, as was observed before, the Promifes made in the Old Testament, the apostle applies to Christians, and that upon the principle above mentioned, Rom. xv. 4. an instance of which we have, among others, in his pressing obedience to parents on Christians, Eph. vi. 2, 3. from the temporal Promise annexed to the fifth commandment, delivered to the Jews. To which may be added, that there are many Promifes

Promises of temporal bleffings to be found in the gospel, as full and as expressive as those in the Old Testament, as will appear upon the perusal of this Collection.

Nor do I think the cafe of good men under the law so different from that of Christians, with relation to outward bleflings, as some may apprehend. It is plain, those *Promises* were not to them absolute or universal, but to be understood with the same limitations as now; and that in those times, as well as fince, the righteous were frequently exercifed with fevere afflictions, and the wicked had many times a greater share of outward prosperity than even the best of men: the want of a due attention to which, was the reason of the heavy censures Job met with from his friends. The fentences therefore, which in Job, in the Proverbs, and other places, express the earthly advantages attending righteousness in its several branches, and the ill consequences of vice, are not to be looked upon as universal positions, but rather as observations of the proper tendency of virtue and vice, and their natural connection with fuch, and fuch benefits and mischiefs, though liable to some exceptions in particular cases, as most general observations and maxims are. And there is now the same connection established by God, in the course of things between moral good and evil; and feveral advantages and mischiefs, though subject to such variations as God in his wife providence fees fit to make from his more fettled rules.

As to the *Promifes* of fpiritual and eternal bleffings, they are to be applied according to the tenor of the gospel. It is to faith, repentance, love and fincere obedience, that the *Promifes* in general, are made of pardon, grace, and glory; as appears from a great multitude of texts here collected. And indeed with-

out these dispositions, none can justly lay claim to any of the temporal Promises. But because in many cases, a serious person may be doubtful whether he is converted or not, whether there be in him that faith, repentance, and holiness, which may be a proof that he is in a state of favour with God, and so entitled to the Promises; I observe, that as there is a difference between grace begun, in its first exercises, and when it is arrived to a confirmed habit; fo many of the Promifes are made to the first beginnings and exercises of grace, in praying and seeking after God, in the use of appointed means, in turning from sin, and coming to Christ. Thus the Promises of a new heart are made to those who enquire after God, Ezek. xxxvi. 26, 37. of wisdom to them that search for it, Prov. ii. 4, 5. of the Spirit to them that ask it, Luke xi. 13. and of rest in Christ to them that being weary and heavy laden, come to him, Matth. xi. 28. Which therefore every one who finds in himself those beginnings of grace, may apply to himself, as an encouragement to go on.

It is also to be observed, that the other *Promises* of divine influences, of the increase of grace, of preservation from sin, of grace to persevere to the end, &c. and so of everlasting life and glory, though every sincere Christian may apply them, and depend upon them, yet they all suppose the diligent use of all the means of grace, watchfulness, a constant application to, and dependance upon, the strength of Christ, and the grace of his Holy Spirit, and a sincere regard to all the other duties of the gospel; as appears from John xv. 4, 10. and many other passages to be found in this Collection, especially in the latter

part.

To obtain the comfort of the Promifes in the fecond part, every one must see that they be in a good degree degree possessed of the graces, and that they diligently perform the duties, to which the Promises are made; and that from a principle of faith in Christ, and love to God, expressed in an habitual care and endeavour to please him. For whatever duty we do, without a real regard to God therein, depending upon Christ for acceptance, in whom all the Promises are yea and amen, we can expect no reward from him. God may justly reject such a claim, with, Did ye it at all to me, even to me? And for the same reason, the observing of some duties, while we knowingly allow ourselves in acts of disobedience to other commands, will not support our claim to the Promises; because if we acted with a sincere respect to God, we should shew the same regard to all his known laws, Jam. ii. 10, 11.

As a Christian ought to be concerned not only for himself, but for the whole church of God, and the interest of Christ's kingdom here on earth, I thought it very necessary to lay before him what the scripture affords for the raising of his hopes, and encouraging his prayers upon those important subjects. And this is the defign of that Collection of texts, in the Appendix. But this I found more difficult than any other part whatfoever; for in fearching the scripture upon those subjects, I met with so many passages that had a relation to the state of the church, that a complete collection of them was inconfistent with my intended brevity; and many of the prophecies were fo difficult to be understood, that it could not be expected, that the generality of Christians should know how to make use of them. I have, however, endeavoured to avoid both these inconveniences, by selecting those texts which are most full to my purpose, and most easy to be apprehended by an attentive reader; hoping that those scriptures being here laid together, which treat of the same subject, they would

mutually illustrate and explain one another.

I am fensible that many of the texts I have brought, which foretel the enlargement and glory of the church, have already had, in some degree, their accomplishment in the conversion of the Gentiles to the Christian faith; but upon a thorough consideration of several of the prophecies, concerning the spreading of the gospel throughout all nations, the subjection of all kings to the authority of Christ, and the glorious state of the church in the latter days, as Psal. lxxxvi. 9. Ifa. lxvi. 18. Dan. vii. 27. Zech. xiv. 9, &c. it appears to me, there is still to be expected a fuller accomplishment of them, than has yet been. But which have been already subsilied, and which still remain to be so, I leave to every one's judgment, upon considering and comparing the texts.

Some of the texts I have applied to the church in general, are by some interpreters understood of the church of the Jews, when converted to Christ in the latter ages of the world: as Isa. iv. 3. and xxvii. 6. and lx. and lxii. Nor do I deny but it is probable, that people is more immediately pointed at in those prophecies. But as the Gentile and Jewish church will then be one, there will be a communication of privileges and glory; and consequently in whatever measures the Spirit of God is poured out, and the glory of God manifested among the Jews when converted, the Gentile church will enjoy their share of the benefit: for, if the fall of them be the riches of the world, and the diminishing of them the riches of the Gentiles, how much more their fulness? Rom. xi. 12.

As to the conversion of the Jews, it has indeed been the opinion of many learned men, that nothing more is to be expected, than what has already been done in the several, but especially the first ages of Christianity; but I do not see what sense can be made

of the eleventh chapter to the Romans, but upon the fupposition of a further and more general conversion of the Jews, even of that part of the Jewish nation, which were then cut off from the true church for their infidelity; and as the apostle applies to this purpose a passage quoted out of one of the prophets, it feems to me to serve as a key for the right understanding a great number of places in the prophets concerning the state of the Jews in the latter days; a great part of which I have therefore collected, or referred to in the last section. I know indeed, those prophecies are supposed by Grotius and other learned commentators, to have been fulfilled by the return. of the Jews from the Babylonish captivity, the favour they obtained from feveral princes, and the victories gained by the Maccabees over the enemies of the Jews. And perhaps, the foretelling of those remarkable events, was in part the defign of at least some of those prophecies. But they must be allowed also to have had a further view, if we consider the low, afflicted, and persecuted state of the Jewish nation, most part of the time after their return to their own land, under the Persian, Grecian, and at length the Roman empire, and the corruptions and diforders that crept into, and at last quite over-run their church; of which Dr. Prideaux has given a very full account in his excellent history. Now this no ways agrees with those sublime and lively descriptions of the peace, prosperity, holiness, and flourishing condition, both of their church and state, foretold in those prophecies; as particularly in Jer. xxx. 9, 16. Ezek. xxxiv. 28. and xxxvi. 11. Joel iii. 17, 20, &c. Besides that, in many of those prophecies the latter days, or the days of the Messiah, are expressly pointed at, as the time of their accomplishment. has therefore led many to apply all those passages to the Gentile church, which they suppose to be spoken C 2.

of, under names and characters proper to the Jewish church, as being typisied by it. But whoever will carefully observe the connection of the several parts of those prophecies, must acknowledge that the Jewish nation is in some of the verses plainly spoken of, and that in other verses of the same context, the *Promises* of conversion and restoration to their own land, are made to the very same persons; of which see instances in the chapters above mentioned, and in Hos. ii. and iii.

There are many indeed of those who expect a more general conversion of the Jews, that yet will not admit of their restoration to their own land, but supposethey shall be, upon their conversion, embodied with the feveral nations among which they live. But in those prophecies concerning them, which evidently refer to the gospel times, there are several passages which speak so fully and positively of their return to their own country, and that Jerusalem shall be rebuilt and re-inhabited by them, that it feems to me impossible to understand them in any other than the literal fenfe, without doing them great violence; as Jer. xxxii. 41. and xxxiii. 16. Ezek. xxxvi. 11, 24, 28. and xxxvii. 25. Zech. xii. 6. and xiv. 11, &c. It is beyond my present design, and the compass of this Introduction, to give all the reasons that incline me to these sentiments; they that please to search further into the matter, may confult Dr. Whitby, and other learned writers. I shall conclude what I have to fay upon this head, with recommending it to Chriftians, to make use of these texts to raise their hopes and expectations of those future happy times, when the gospel shall be preached more universally throughout the world, the Christian church receives a vast accession by the calling of the Jews, and the coming in of the fulness of the Gentiles; and holiness, peace, and love, shall flourish probably in a greater measure

than ever, at least fince the apostles' times. Let this be the subject of their daily and most fervent prayers, and these *Promises* be made use of, as pleas to enforce their petitions, and support their faith.

Though this Collection has cost me not a little time and pains, I think it very well bestowed not only upon the account of the advantage I have myself received from the study of the Promises, and the assistance I still expect from this book, for my private thoughts and composures for the pulpit, by having it continually before me; but also in hopes it may be useful to others in several respects, for promoting the holiness and comfort of Christians. Here they have before them, in one view, the riches of the covenant of grace; here are all the strongest arguments to perfuade to real religion, to recommend every duty, and to support in every afflicted and perplexed case. This book may be very useful to assist in prayer, both for the reasons before mentioned, and also because from hence, one may be furnished with variety of proper matter and expression upon all the cases we are concerned to represent to God. And as the study of these Promises would be to the advantage of all forts of persons, it might be a very useful and easy exercise for children to be employed in learning fome of the plainest texts under those heads which are most proper for them, and to question one another upon them, being instructed by their teachers in their fense and use. In this way the directors of the education of children in the charity schools, may make this book serve good purposes, for the instruction and improvement of their children in the knowledge of the fcriptures. And I know no better way of enriching the minds of children with useful and solid knowledge, than by making them well acquainted with the scriptures themselves, those pure unmixed

ed fountains of excellent and divine wisdom, and treafuring up in their memories a great number of select scriptures most suited to their capacity and use. For this end, I have frequently thought of making some proper Collections, particularly for the benefit of the charity school at St. Alban's, and of all other children whose parents or teachers shall think sit to make use of them; which perhaps\*, I may hereafter sinish, if this meet with acceptance.

IF we would reap the comfort and benefit of these Promises, it is not enough that we have them by us, or now and then look into them: but we must thoroughly acquaint ourselves with them, store them up in our memories, and be often meditating upon them, that they may be ready for use, when we most want them. And whatever pains we may be at on this account, the pleafure and advantage we shall receive will be a fufficient recompense; for these are pleasant. words, that are as a honey comb; sweet to the foul, and health to the bones, Prov. xvi. 24. and therefore well deserve to be bound upon our fingers, and written upon the table of our hearts, Prov. vii. 3. and would ferious Christians make the Promises the frequent subject of their conversation together, and at the same time take notice of the feveral instances wherein they have been made good to themselves and others, within their observation, it would both impress them upon their memories, and very much increase their force and influence upon their hearts.

But care must be taken to understand them in their true

true fenfe, and rightly to employ them. Mistaken apprehensions of scripture, have often been the cause of peoples deceiving themselves with ungrounded comforts and expectations; or, at least they have not built their comforts upon proper texts, though they may have had sufficient foundation for them in other places. The comparing one scripture with another, as they lie here together, will be, in many cases, of great use to affist in the right understanding of them. And in most instances, it will be still a further advantage to turn to the place quoted, and consider the circumstances of the text, and its connection with the context. This will shew how far there is an agreement of your case with that referred to in the text; and, consequently, how far the Promise is to be applied, whether absolutely and in its whole extent, or only in some degree, and with limitations.

In particular cases, we may draw comfort, not only from the *Promises* peculiar to that case, but also from those that are of a more general nature. As under sickness, we may have relief, not only from those scriptures which expressly relate to that circumstance, but also from the *Promises* relating to trouble in general, and the assurances of God's Love, Care, and Readiness to help his people, &c. which the Table of

Contents will eafily direct to.

That we may have the comfort of the *Promifes*, a fleady exercise of faith, is, above all things, necessary. For this purpose, we must impress upon our minds the power, goodness, and faithfulness of God, and the experience of good men in every age; and by this means, and by an attentive consideration of the *Promises*, suck at those breasts of consolation till we are satisfied, Isa. Ixvi. 11. But at the same time our eyes must be fixed upon the Lord Jesus Christ, as the only foundation of our hopes, in and through whom

whom alone all the *Promifes* are made good to us; and upon the Holy Spirit the Comforter, that through his powerful influences we may rightly understand and apply, firmly believe, and clearly discover the excellency of the *Promifes*, and so taste that the Lord is

gracious.

Constantly plead the *Promises* with God in prayer. He has thereby bound himself to his people, as with a note under his hand. Go with it therefore to God, firmly depending upon his faithfulness; he will acknowledge his own hand-writing, and answer your demands accordingly. Rest yourself therefore upon God, and wait patiently for him, being assured he will not be unmindful of his promise; but leave it to his infinite wisdom to fulfil it, in that way, and at that time, he sees best.

But remember the *Promifes* of God do not discharge from, but encourage and oblige to, the diligent use of all proper and lawful means. Christ has promised food and raiment; but the slothful and careless must not expect the benefit of that *Promise*. The same may be said of the spiritual blessings promised. The soul of the slothful desireth, and hathnothing; but the soul of the diligent shall be made fat,

Prov. xiii. 4.

To conclude: Let the Christian live a life of faith upon the *Promises*. A great part of the riches of the nation at this day, consists in the credit that is given to notes, bonds, assignments, &c. I am sure the riches of the Christian lie chiefly in the assignments he has under God's hand, of the most valuable blessings both of this and a better life. Let him then know how to value these as the truest riches, and to make use of them upon all occasions; he will find no want of any good thing. If he has it not in hand, he has it in the promise ready whenever he needs it. So that he may live entirely free from solicitude and anxious.

anxious care, committing himself, and all his concerns to that God who careth for him.

I am willing to take this opportunity of recommending it to those young persons, for whose benefit this Collection was first undertaken, to persevere in their endeavours to improve themselves, and one another, in the knowledge of the Promises, and other parts of scripture, which may be most useful to them, that the word of Christ may dwell in them richly in all wisdom; and to others, especially of their age, to imitate their example in the same commendable way of employing their time. To how much better account will this turn, than the vanities that ordinarily fill up the conversation of youth, or those wrangling disputes and controversies, which eat out the heart of ferious practical religion! The advantage which those who have tried this course have reaped from it, fufficiently encourages their perseverance in it. May they, and all others who with them delight in, and fearch after, the treasures of divine wisdom in the fcriptures, not only have their minds beautified and enriched with it, but feel its influence in their hearts and lives. May they be filled with the knowledge of the will of God, in all wisdom and spiritual understand-ing, that they may walk worthy of the Lord, unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God.

Rev. iii. 9. Behold I will make them of the fynagogue of Satan, (who fay they are Jews, and are not, but do lie) to come and worship before thy feet, and to know that I have loved thee.

#### IX. Success and Prosperity.

Ps. i. 3. He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his feafon: His leaf also shall not wither, and whatsoever he doth shall prosper.

Ps. xxxviii. 5. Commit thy way unto the LORD;

trust also in him, and he shall bring it to pass.

Pf. cxxviii. 2. Thou shalt eat the labour of thine hands: Happy shalt thou be, and it shall be well with thee.

Pf. lvii. 2. I will cry unto GOD most high; unto

GOD, that performeth all things for me.

If. lxv. 21. And they shall build houses, and inhabit them: and they shall plant vineyards, and eat the fruit of them.

Ver. 22. They shall not build, and another inhabit; they shall not plant, and another eat: For as the days of a tree are the days of my people, and mine elect shall long enjoy the work of their hands.

Ver. 23. They shall not labour in vain, nor bring

forth for trouble. For they are the feed of the bleffed of the LORD, and their offspring with them.

Job xi. 15. Thou shalt be stedfast, and shalt not sear. Ver. 17. And thine age shall be clearer than the noon-day: Thou shalt shine forth, thou shalt be as the morning.

Job xxii. 28. Thou shalt also decree a thing, and it shall be established unto thee: And the light shall

shine upon thy ways.

### X. PLENTY and RICHES.

Deut. xi. 14. I will give you the rain of your land in his due feafon, the first rain and the latter rain; that thou mayest gather in thy corn, and thy wine, and thine oil. Ver. 15. And I will fend grafs in thy fields for thy cattle, that thou mayest eat and be full.

Deut. xxviii. 12. The LORD shall open unto thee his good treasure, the heaven to give the rain unto thy land in his feafon, and to blefs all the work of thine hand; and thou shalt lend unto many na-

tions, and thou shalt not borrow.

Deut. xxx. 9. And the LORD thy GOD will make thee plenteous in every work of thine hand, in the fruit of thy body, and in the fruit of thy cattle, and in the fruit of thy land for good; for the LORD will again rejoice over thee for good, as he rejoiced over thy fathers, Deut. xxviii. 11.

Job xxii. 24. Thou shalt lay up gold as dust, and

the gold of Ophir as the stones of the brooks.

Ver. 25. And thou shalt have plenty of silver.

Ps. cvii. 38. He bleffeth them also, so that they are multiplied greatly, and suffereth not their cattle to decrease.

· Ps. cxii. 3. Wealth and riches shall be in his house,

and his righteousness endureth forever.

Prov. iii. 16. In her [i. e. Wifdom's] left hand are riches and honour.

Prov. viii. 18. Riches and honour are with me; yea, durable riches and righteousness.

Ver. 19. My fruit is better than gold, and my re-

venue than choice filver.

*Prov.* xv. 6. In the house of the righteous is much treasure.

If. xxx. 13. Then shall he give the rain of thy feed, that thou shalt sow the ground withal, and bread of the increase of the earth, and it shall be fat and plenteous; In that day shall thy cattle feed in large pastures.

## XI. Of CHILDREN.

Deut. vii. 13. He will love thee, and bless thee, and multiply thee: He will also bless the fruit of thy womb.

Deut. xxx. 9. And the LORD thy GOD will

make thee plenteous—in the fruit of thy body.

Job v. 25. Thou shalt know that thy feed shall be great, and thine offspring as the grass of the earth.

Ps. cxxvii. 3. Lo, children are an heritage of the LORD, and the fruit of the womb is his reward.

Ver. 4. As arrows in the hands of a mighty man,

fo are children of the youth.

Ver. 5. Happy is the man that hath his quiver full of them: They shall not be ashamed, but they shall speak with the enemies in the gate.

Pf. cxvi. 14. The LORD shall increase you more

and more, you and your children.

# XII. A BLESSING upon all a good Man has.

Ex. xxiii. 25. And ye shall serve the LORD your GOD, and he shall bless thy bread and thy water.

Deut. xxvi. 11. And thou shalt rejoice in every good thing, which the LORD thy GOD hath given unto thee, and unto thine house.

Deut. xxviii. 3. Blessed shalt thou be in the city,

and blessed shalt thou be in the field.

Ver. 4. Blessed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy ground, and the fruit of thy cattle; the increase of thy kine, and the slocks of thy sheep.

Ver. 5. Bleffed shall be thy basket and thy store. Ver. 6. Bleffed shall thou be when thou comest in

and bleffed shalt thou be when thou goest out.

Ver. 8. The LORD shall command a bleffing upon thee in thy store-houses, and in all that thou settest thine hand unto: And he shall bless thee in the land, which the LORD thy GOD giveth thee.

P/. xxxvii. 16. A little that a righteous man hath,

is better than the riches of many wicked.

Prov. x. 22. The bleffing of the LORD, it maketh rich, and he addeth no forrow with it.

Prov. xv. 16. Better is a little with the fear of the

LORD, than great treasure and trouble therewith.

Eccl. ii. 26. GOD doth give to a man that is good in his fight, wifdom, and knowledge, and joy: But to the finner he giveth travel, to gather and to heap up, that he may give to him that is good before GOD.

Eccl. iii. 13. Also that every man should eat and drink, and enjoy the good of his labour, it is the

gift of GOD.

Eccl. v. 19. Every man, to whom GOD hath given riches and wealth, and hath given him power to eat thereof, and to take his portion, and to rejoice in his labour; this is the gift of GOD.

Ver. 20. For he shall not much remember the days of his life; because GOD answereth him in the joy

of his heart.

## XIII. A BLESSING upon the CHILDREN of the Good.

Deut. iv. 40. Thou shalt keep his statutes—that it may go well with thee, and thy children after thee, Deut. v. 29.

Prov. xiii. 22. A good man leaveth an inheritance unto his children's children; and the wealth of the

finner is laid up for the just.

Prov. xiv. 26. In the fear of the LORD is strong considence; and his children shall have a place of refuge.

Prov. xi. 21. The feed of the righteous shall be

delivered.

Prov. xx. 7. The just man walketh in his integ-

rity: His children are bleffed after him.

Ps. cii. 28. The children of thy fervants shall continue, and their feed shall be established before thee.

Pf. cxii. 2. His feed shall be mighty upon earth: The generation of the upright shall be blessed.

Pf. xxv. 13. His feed shall inherit the earth.

Pf. xxxvii. 25. I have been young and now am old, yet have I not feen the righteous forfaken, nor his feed begging bread.

Ver. 26. He is ever merciful and lendeth: And

his feed is bleffed.

Pf. cxlvii. 13. He hath bleffed thy children within thee.

Fer. xxxii. 39. I will give them one heart and one way, that they may fear me for ever, for the good of them, and of their children after them.

## XIV. A BLESSING upon the Families of the Good.

Job v. 24. Thou shalt know also that thy tabernacle shall be in peace; and thou shalt visit thy habitation, and shalt not sin.

Job viii. 6. If thou wert pure and upright, furely

now he would awake for thee, and make the habitation of thy righteoufness prosperous.

Ver. 7. Though thy beginning were small, yet thy

latter end should greatly increase.

P/. cxxviii. 3. Thy wife shall be as a fruitful vine by the fides of thine house; thy children like oliveplants round about thy table.

Ver. 4. Behold, thus shall the man be blessed, that

feareth the LORD.

Ver. 5. The Lord shall bless thee out of Zion; and thou shalt see the good of Jerusalem all the days of thy life.

Ver. 6. Yea, thou shalt see thy children's children,

and peace upon Ifrael.

Prov. iii. 33. He bleffeth the habitation of the just.

Prov. xii. 7. The house of the righteous shall Stand.

Prov. xiv. 11. The tabernacle of the upright shall flourish.

#### CHAP. II.

Promises relating to the Troubles of Life.

## I. In general.

Of Preservation JOB v. 19. He shall deliver thee from Trouble. Jin six troubles; yea, in seven, there shall no evil touch thee.

Ps. xxxi. 13. The LORD preserveth the faithful. Ps. xxxii. 6. For this shall every one that is godly pray unto thee, in a time when thou mayest be found: Surely in the floods of great waters they shall not come nigh unto him.

Ver. 7. Thou art my hiding place, thou shalt pre-

ferve

ferve me from trouble: Thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance.

Ps. xci. 10. There shall no evil befal thee, neither

shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling.

Prov. xii. 21. There shall no evil happen to the

just.

Prov. xvi. 19. The way of the flothful man is an hedge of thorns: But the way of the righteous is made plain.

Deliverance out of Trouble.

Job viii. 20. Behold, GOD will not cast away a perfect man, neither will he help the evil doers.

Ver. 21. Till he fill thy mouth with laughing, and

thy lips with rejoicing.

Job xi. 16. Thou shalt forget thy misery, and re-

member it as waters that pass away.

Job xxxvi. 16. Even so would he have removed thee out of the strait into a broad place, where there is no straitness; and that which should be set on thy table, should be full of fatness.

Pf. xxx. 5. His anger endureth but a moment: In his favour is life: Weeping may endure for a

night, but joy cometh in the morning.

Ps. xxxiv. 19. Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the LORD delivereth him out of them

Pf. xlii. 11. Why art thou cast down, O my soul? And why art thou disquieted within me? Hope thou in God, for I shall yet praise him, who is the health of my countenance, and my God.

Pf. lxxviii. 13. Though ye have lien among the pots, yet shall ye be as the wings of a dove covered

with filver, and her feathers with yellow gold.

Ps. lxxi. 20. Thou which halt shewed me great and fore troubles, shalt quicken me again, and shalt bring me up again from the depths of the earth.

Pf. xviii. 27. Thou wilt fave the afflicted people, but will bring down high looks.

Ver. 28. For thou wilt light my candle: The

LORD my GOD will enlighten my darknefs.

Pf. cxlvi. 8. The LORD openeth the eyes of the blind, the LORD raifeth them that are bowed down.

Ps. cvii. 19. They cry unto the LORD in their trouble: He delivereth them out of their distresses.

Ps. cxxvi. 5. They that fow in tears, shall reap in

joy.

Ver. 6. He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious feed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him.

Prov. xxi. 8. The righteous is delivered out of

trouble, and the wicked cometh in his stead.

Prov. xii. 13. The wicked is fnared by the tranfgression of his lips: but the just shall come out of trouble.

Prov. xxiv. 16. A just man falleth seven times,

and rifeth up again.

Jer. xxix. 11. I know the thoughts that I think towards you, faith the LORD; thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end.

Fer. xxxi. 12. Their foul shall be as a watered gar-

den, and they shall not forrow any more.

Ver. 13. I will turn their mourning into joy, and will comfort them, and make them rejoice from their forrow.

Hof. iv. 1. Come and let us return unto the LORD, for he hath torn, and he will heal us; he hath fmitten, and he will bind us up.

Support under Ps. ix. 9. The LORD will be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge

in times of trouble.

Pf. xxii. 24. He hath not despised nor abhorred the affliction of the afflicted; neither hath he hid his face from him: But when he cried unto him, he heard.

Ps. xxvii. 14. Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: Wait, I fay, on the LORD.

Ver. 12. When my father and my mother forfake

me, then the LORD will take me up.

Ps. xxxvii. 24. Though he fall, he shall not be utterly cast down: For the LORD upholdeth him with his hand.

Ver. 39. The falvation of the righteous is of the LORD: He is their strength in the time of trouble.

Pf. xviii. 2. The LORD is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer: My GOD, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my falvation, and my high tower.

Pf. xlvi. 1. GOD is our refuge and strength, a

very present help in trouble.

Ver. 2. Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea.

Ver. 3. Though the waters thereof roar, and be troubled; though the mountains shake with the swelling thereof. Selah.

Pf. lv. 22. Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall fustain thee: He shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.

Pf. xxxi. 7. I will be glad and rejoice in thy mercy: For thou hast considered my trouble; thou hast

known my foul in adverfities.

Exod. iii. 7. I have furely feen the affliction of my people which are in Egypt, and have heard their cry by reason of their task-masters: For I know their forrows.

Pf. xli. Bleffed is he that confidereth the poor;

the Lord will deliver him in time of trouble.

Ps. Ixxi. 3. Thou hast given commandment to fave me, for thou art my rock and my fortrefs.

Pf. cxii, 4. Unto the upright, there ariseth light in the darkness.

Ps. cxxxvi. 23. Who remembereth us in our low

estate: For his mercy endureth for ever.

Pf. cxxxviii. 7. Though I walk in the midst of trouble, thou wilt revive me: Thou shalt stretch forth thine hand against the wrath of thine enemies, and thy right hand shall save me.

Ps. Ixxiii. 26. My flesh and my heart faileth; but

GOD is the strength of my heart.

Ps. cxlv. 14. The LORD upholdeth all that fall,

and raifeth up all that are bowed down.

Isa. xxv. 4. Thou hast been a strength to the poor, a strength to the needy in his distress, a refuge from the storm, a shadow from the heat, when the blast of the terrible ones is as a storm against the wall.

Isa. xxvii. 8. In measure, when it shooteth forth, thou wilt debate with it: He stayeth his rough wind

in the day of the east wind.

Job xxxiv. 23. He will not lay upon man more than is right, that he should enter into judgment with GOD.

Isa. 1. 10. Who is among you that feareth the LORD, that obeyeth the voice of his fervant, that walketh in darkness and hath no light, let him trust in the name of the LORD, and stay upon his GOD.

Lam. iii. 31. The LORD will not cast off for

ever.

Ver. 32. But though he cause grief, yet will he have compassion, according to the multitude of his mercies.

Ver. 33. For he doth not afflict willingly, nor

grieve the children of men.

Jer. xxx. 11. I am with thee, faith the LORD, to fave thee: I will correct thee in measure, and will not leave thee altogether unpunished.

Fer. xvi. 19. O LORD, my refuge and my fortress; and my refuge in the day of my affliction.

Mic. vii. 8. Rejoice not against me, O mine enemy: When I fall, I shall arise; when I sit in dark-

ness, the LORD shall be a light unto me.

Ver. 9. I will bear the indignation of the LORD, because I have sinned against him, until he plead my cause, and execute judgment for me: He will bring me forth to the light, and I shall behold his righteousness.

Nah. i. 7. The LORD is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble, and he knoweth them that trust in him.

Mat. xi. 28. Come unto me, all ye that labour,

and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

John xvi. 33. These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace: In the world ye shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.

2 Cor. i. 5. For as the fufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ.

2 Cor. iv. 8: We are troubled on every fide, yet not diffressed; we are perplexed, but not in despair.

Ver. 9. Persecuted, but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed.

## II. Promises relating to SICKNESS, OLD AGE, &c.

Of Deliverance the LORD your GOD, and I will take away fickness from the midst of thee.

Exod. xv. 26. If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the LORD thy GOD, and wilt do that which is right in his fight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes; I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon

upon the Egyptians; For I am the LORD that healeth thee.

Job xxxiv. 24. He is gracious unto him, and faith, Deliver him from going down to the pit, I have found a ransom.

Ver. 25. His flesh shall be fresher than a child's:

He shall return to the days of his youth.

Ver. 26. He shall pray unto God, and he will be favourable unto him, and he shall see his face with joy: For he will render unto man his righteousness.

Ver. 28. He will deliver his foul from going into

the pit, and his life shall see the light.

Pf. xci. 3. Surely he shall deliver thee from the snare of the fowler, and from the noisome pestilence.

Ver. 5. Thou shalt not be afraid for the terror by

night, nor for the arrow that flieth by day.

Ver. 6. Nor for the pestilence that walketh in darkness; nor for the destruction that wasteth at noon-day.

Ps. ciii. 3. Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who

healeth all thy difeafes.

Deut. vii. 15. The LORD will take away from thee all fickness, and will put none of the evil diseases of Egypt upon thee.

Fer. xxxiii. 6. Behold, I will bring health and cure; and I will cure them, and will reveal unto them the

abundance of peace and truth.

Support under Sickness.

Ps. xli. 3. The LORD will ftrengthen him upon the bed of languishing; thou wilt make all his bed in his fickness.

Pf. cxvi. 6. The LORD preserveth the simple; I

was brought low, and he helped me.

In Child-bear-ing.

I Tim. ii. 15. Notwithstanding, she shall be faved in child bearing, if they continue in faith and charity, and holiness with sobriety.

Deut. vii. 13. He will bless the fruit of thy womb. Gen. xlix. 25. Even by the GOD of thy father, who shall help thee: and by the Almighty, who shall bless thee with blessings of heaven above, blessings of the deep that lieth under, blessings of the breasts, and of the womb.

Pf. lxxi. 9. Cast me not off in the time In old Age. of old age, forsake me not when my

strength faileth.

If. xlvi. 4. And even to your old age I am he, And even to hoary hairs will I carry you: I have made, and I will bear: even I will carry and will deliver you.

Prov. xvi. 31. The hoary head is a crown of glory,

if it be found in the way of righteousness.

III. Of Deliverance from FAMINE and WANT.

Job v. 20. In famine he shall redeem thee from death.

Ver. 22. At destruction and famine thou shalt

laugh.

Pf. xxxiii. 18. Behold the eye of the LORD is upon them that fear him; upon them that hope in his mercy.

Ver. 19. To deliver their foul from death, and to

keep them alive in famine.

Pf. xxxvii. 19. They shall not be ashamed of the evil time; and in the days of samine they shall be satisfied.

Pf. cxlvi. 7. Which giveth food to the hungry.

If. xli. 17. When the poor and needy feek water and there is none, and their tongue faileth for thirst; I the LORD will hear them, I the GOD of Israel will not forsake them.

Ezek. xxxvi. 29. I will call for the corn, and will

increase it, and lay no famine upon you.

Ver. 30. And I will multiply the fruit of the tree,

and the increase of the field, that ye shall receive no

more reproach of famine among the heathen.

Zech. x. 1. Ask ye of the LORD rain, in the time of the latter rain, fo the LORD shall make bright clouds, and give them showers of rain, to every one grafs in the field.

Ps. cvii. 9. He fatisfieth the longing foul, and filleth the hungry foul with goodness.

Heb. iii. 17. Though the fig-tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there fhall be no herd in the stall;

Ver. 18. Yet will I rejoice in the LORD: I will

joy in the GOD of my falvation.

Matt. iv. 4. Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

# IV. Deliverance from WAR and ENEMIES.

Deut. xx. 4. The LORD your God Deliverance is he that goeth with you, to fight for from War. you against your enemies, to fave you, Deut. xxiii. 14.

Fob. v. 20. In war he shall redeem thee from the

power of the fword.

Pf. lx. 12. Through God we shall do valiantly: for he it is that shall tread down our enemies.

2 Chron. xiii. 12. Behold GOD himfelf is with us

for our captain.

Prov. iii. 25. Be not afraid of sudden fear, nor of the defolation of the wicked, when it cometh.

Ver. 26. For the LORD shall be thy confidence,

and shall keep thy foot from being taken.

If. xli. 11. Behold all they that were incenfed against thee, shall be ashamed and confounded: they shall be as nothing, and they that strive with thee

thall perish.

Ver. 12. Thou shall feek them, and shalt not find them, even them that contended with thee. They that war against thee shall be as nothing, and as a thing of nought.

Fer. xxxii. 17. I will deliver thee in that day, faith the Lord, and thou shalt not be given into the hand

of the men of whom thou art afraid.

Ver. 18. For I will furely deliver thee, and thou shalt not fall by the sword; but thy life shall be for a prey unto thee, because thou hast put thy trust in me, faith the LORD.

2 Kings vi. 16. Fear not, for they Deliverance that be with us are more than they

from Enemies. that be with them.

2 Chron. xiv. II. LORD, it is nothing with thee to help, whether with many, or with them that have no power.

2 Kings xvii. 39. The LORD your GOD ye shall

fear, and he shall deliver you out of the hand of all

your enemies.

Pf. xvii. 7. Shew thy marvellous loving kindnefs, O thou that favest by thy right hand them which put their trust in thee, from those that rise up against them.

P/. xxvii. 5. In the time of trouble he shall hide me in his pavilion; in the fecret of his tabernacle shall he hide me; he shall fet me up upon a rock.

Ver. 6. And now shall mine head be lifted up above mine enemies round about me; therefore will I offer in his tabernacle facrifices of joy; I will fing, yea, I will fing praises unto the LORD.

Pf. xxxvii. 32. The wicked watcheth the righteous,

and feeketh to flay him.

Ver. 33. The LORD will not leave him in his hand, nor condemn him when he is judged.

Ver. 40. And the LORD shall help and deliver them: he shall deliver them from the wicked, and save them, because they trust in him.

Pf. xcvii. 10. He preserveth the souls of his saints:

he delivereth them out of the hand of the wicked.

Pf. cxii. 8. His heart is established, he shall not be afraid, until he see his desire upon his enemies.

Ps. cxviii. 7. The LORD taketh my part with them that help me: therefore shall I see my desire upon mine enemies.

Pf. cxxv. 3. The rod of the wicked shall not rest upon the lot of the righteous, lest the righteous put

forth their hands unto iniquity.

Job viii. 22. They that hate thee shall be clothed with shame, and the dwelling-place of the wicked shall come to nought.

Prov. xvi. 7. When a man's ways please the LORD, he maketh even his enemies to be at peace

with him.

If. xxv. 5. Thou shalt bring down the noise of strangers as the heat in a dry place; even the heat with the shadow of a cloud: the branch of the ter-

rible ones shall be brought low.

If. liv. 17. No weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper; and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment, thou shalt condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD, and their righteousness is of me, saith the LORD.

Ver. 15. Whofoever shall gather together against

thee, shall fall for thy fake.

Deut. xxviii. 7. The LORD shall cause thine enemies, that rise up against thee, to be smitten before thy face: they shall come out against thee, one way, and slee before thee seven ways.

Luke xviii. 7, 8. Shall not God avenge his own elect, that cry day and night unto him, though he bear

long

long with them? I tell you he will avenge them fpeedily.

Alls xviii. 10. I am with thee: and no man shall

fet on thee, to hurt thee.

Heb. xiii. 6. So that we may boldly fay, the LORD is my helper, I will not fear what man shall do unto me, Ps. cxviii. 6.

Luke i. 71. That we shall be faved from our

enemies, and from the hand of all that hate us.

Ver. 74. That he would grant unto us that we being delivered out of the hands of our enemies, might ferve him without fear.

Ver. 75. In holiness and righteousness before him,

all the days of our life.

## V. From Oppression and Injustice.

Exod. xxii. 26. If thou at all take thy neighbour's raiment to pledge, thou shalt deliver it to him

by that the fun goeth down.

Ver. 27. For that is his covering only, it is his raiment for his skin: Wherein shall he sleep? And it shall come to pass, when he crieth unto me, that I will hear; for I am gracious.

Ps. xii. 5. For the oppression of the poor, for the sighing of the needy, now will I arise, saith the LORD: I will set him in safety from him that pus-

feth at him.

Pf. xxxv. 10. All my bones shall fay, LORD, who is like unto thee? which deliverest the poor from him who is too strong for him; yea, the poor and the needy, from him that spoileth him.

Pf. lxxii. 4. He shall judge the poor of the people, he shall fave the children of the needy, and shall

break in pieces the oppressor.

Ver. 14. He shall redeem their souls from deceit and violence; and precious shall their blood be in his sight.

Ps. cix. 31. He shall stand at the right hand of the poor, to save him from those that condemn his soul.

Pf. cxlvi. 7. Which executeth judgment for the

oppressed.

I Theff. i. 10. Jefus, which delivered us from the

wrath to come.

1 Theff. v. 9. GOD hath not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain falvation by our LORD Jefus Christ.

John iii. 15. That whofoever believeth in him

should not perish, but have eternal life.

John viii. 51. If a man keep my faying, he shall

never fee death.

Rev. xx. 9. Bleffed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power.

## II. Of Happiness immediately after Death.

Ps. lxxxiii. 24. Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory.

Job iii. 17. There the wicked cease from troubling,

and there the weary be at rest.

Ver. 18. There the prisoners rest together, they

hear not the voice of the oppressor.

Ija. lvii. 2. He shall enter into peace; they shall rest in their beds, each one walking in his uprightness.

Luke xvi. 25. Abraham faid, Son, remember, that thou in thy life-time, received thy good things, and likewife Lazarus evil things; but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented.

Luke xxiii. 43. Jefus faid unto him, Verily I fay unto thee, This day shalt thou be with me in para-

dife.

Phil. i. 21. For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.

Ver. 23. Having a defire to depart, and to be with Christ, which is far better.

2 Cor. v. 8. We are confident, I fay, and willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be present with the LORD.

Heb. xii. 23. And to the spirits of just men made

perfect.

Rev. xiv. 13. Bleffed are the dead which die in the LORD, from henceforth: yea, faith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours, and their works do follow them.

## III. A glorious RESURRECTION.

Ver. 52. In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye. at the last trump (for the trumpet shall found) and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

Ver. 53. For this corruptible must put on incor-

ruption, and this mortal must put on immortality.

Ver. 54. So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality: then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is fwallowed up in victory.

I Cor. vi. 2. Do not you know, that the faints

shall judge the world?

Ver. 3. Know ye not that we shall judge angels? 2 Cor. v. I. We know, that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were diffolved, we have a building of GOD, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

Ver. 2. For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven :

Ver. 3. If so be, that being clothed, we shall not

be found naked.

Ver. 4. For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened; not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be fwallowed up of life.

2 Cor. iv. 14. Knowing, that he which hath raised up the Lord Jesus, shall raise up us also by Jesus,

and shall present us with you.

Phil. iii. 21. Who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body, according to the working, whereby he is able even to fubdue all things to himself.

I Thess. iv. 14. If we believe that Jesus died, and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus, will

GOD bring with him.

Ver. 15. For this we fay unto you by the word of

the

the LORD, that we which are alive, and remain unto the coming of the LORD, shall not prevent

them which are afleep.

Ver. 16. For the LORD himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of GOD: and the dead in Christ shall rife first.

Ver. 17. Then we which are alive and remain, shall be caught up together with them in the clouds,

to meet the LORD in the air.

2 Tim. i. 10. Jesus Christ hath abolished death, and hath brought life and immortality to light thro' the gospel.

## IV. Of Everlasting Happiness in Heaven.

Pf. xlix. 14. The upright shall have dominion

over them in the morning.

I Cor. ii. 9. Eye hath not feen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which GOD hath prepared for them that love him.

Rom. ii. 7. To them who by patient continuance in well-doing, feek for glory, and honour, and im-

Ver. 12. That the name of our LORD Jesus Christ may be glorified in you, and ye in him, according to the grace of our GOD, and the LORD Jesus Christ.

Heb. xi. 9. By faith he fojourned in the land of promise as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernaeles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise.

Ver. 10. For he looked for a city which hath

foundations, whose Builder and Maker is GOD.

Ver. 16. They defire a better country, that is, an heavenly: Wherefore GOD is not ashamed to be called their GOD, for he hath prepared for them a city.

Freedom from all sorrow in Heaven.

# XIX. To the KEEPING of the SABBATH.

Exod. xx. 11. The LORD bleffed the Sabbath-

day, and hallowed it.

If. Ivi. 2. Bleffed is the man that doth this, and the fon of man that layeth hold on it; that keepeth the Sabbath from polluting it, and keepeth his hand

from doing any evil.

Ver. 6. The fons of the stranger that join themfelves to the LORD, to ferve him, and to love the name of the LORD, to be his fervants; every one that keepeth the Sabbath from polluting it, and taketh hold of my covenant:

Ver. 7. Even them will I bring to my holy mountain, and make them joyful in my house of prayer; their burnt-offerings and their facrifices shall be accepted upon mine altar: For mine house shall be cal-

led a house of prayer unto all people.

If. lviii. 13. If thou turn away thy foot from the Sabbath, from doing thy pleasure on my holy day, and call the Sabbath a delight, the holy of the LORD, honourable, and shalt honour him, not doing thine own ways, nor finding thine own pleafure, nor speaking thine own words;

Ver. 14. Then shalt thou delight thyself in the LORD, and I will cause thee to ride upon the high places of the earth, and feed thee with the heritage of Jacob thy father: For the mouth of the LORD hath

spoken it.

### CHAP. II.

# I. To OBEDIENCE to PARENTS.

PH. vi. 1. Children, obey your parents in the LORD; for this is right.

Ver. 2. Honour thy father and thy mother (which

is the first commandment, with promise.)

Ver. 3. That it may be well with thee, and that thou mayest live long on the earth.

Col. iii. 20. Children, obey your parents in all

things: for this is well pleafing unto the LORD.

1 Tim. v. 4. But if any widow have children, or nephews, [grand children] let them learn first to shew piety at home, and to requite their parents; for that is good and acceptable before GOD.

Prov. i. 8. My fon, hear the instruction of thy fa-

ther; and forfake not the law of thy mother.

Ver. 9. For they shall be an ornament of grace unto thy head, and chains about thy neck.

Prov. vi. 20. My fon, keep thy father's command-

ment, and forfake not the law of thy mother.

Ver. 21. Bind them continually upon thine heart,

and tie them about thy neck.

Ver. 22. When thou goeft, it shall lead thee; when thou sleepest, it shall keep thee; and when

thou wakest, it shall talk with thee.

Jer. xxxv. 18. Thus faith the LORD of hosts, the GOD of Israel, because ye have obeyed the commandment of Jonadab your father, and kept all his precepts, and done according to all that he hath commanded you:

Ver. 19. Therefore thus faith the LORD of hofts,

the GOD of Ifrael, Jonadab shall not want a man to stand before me for ever.

## II. To GOOD EDUCATION.

Deut. xi. 19. And ye shall teach them your chil. dren, speaking of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way; when thou liest down and when thou risest up.

Ver. 20. And thou shalt write them upon the door

posts of thine house, and upon thy gates:

Ver. 21. That your days may be multiplied, and the days of your children, in the land which the LORD fware unto your fathers to give them, as the

days of heaven, upon the earth.

Gen. xviii. 19. For I know him [Abraham] that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment, that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him.

Prov. xxii. 6. Train up a child in the way he should go; and when he is old, he will not depart

from it.

Prov. xxii. 15. Foolishness is To Correcting of bound in the heart of a child; but Children. the rod of correction shall drive it far from him.

Prov. xxiii. 13. Withhold not correction from the child; for if thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die.

Ver. 14. Thou shalt beat him with the rod, and fhalt deliver his foul from hell.

Prov. xxix. 15. The rod and reproof give wifdom; but a child left to himself, bringeth his mother to shame.

Ver. 17. Correct thy fon, and he shall give thee rest: yea, he shall give delight unto thy foul.

### III. To a GOOD WIFE.

Prov. xi. 16. A gracious woman retaineth honour,

and a strong man riches.

Prov. xii. 4. A virtuous woman is a crown to her husband; but she that maketh ashamed, is as rottenness in his bones.

Prov. xiv. 1. Every wife woman buildeth her

house.

Prov. xxxi. 10. Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies.

Ver. 25. Strength and honour are her clothing,

and she shall rejoice in time to come.

Ver. 28. Her children arife up, and call her bleffed ;

her husband also, and he praiseth her.

Ver. 30. Favour is deceitful, and beauty is vain: but a woman that feareth the LORD, she shall be praised.

Ver. 31. Give her of the fruit of her hands, and

let her own works praise her in the gates.

### IV. To FAITHFUL SERVANTS.

Prov. xvii. 2. A wife fervant shall have rule over a fon that causeth shame; and shall have a part of the inheritance among the brethren.

Prov. xiv. 35. The king's favour is toward a wife-

fervant.

Prov. xxvii. 18. Whoso keepeth the fig-tree, shall eat the fruit thereof; So he that waiteth on his master, shall be honoured.

Eph. vi. 5. Servants, be obedient to them that are your masters according to the slesh, with fear and trembling, in singleness of your heart, as unto Christ:

Ver. 6. Not with eye fervice, as men-pleasers; but

as the fervants of Christ, doing the will of GOD from the heart.

Ver. 7. With good-will doing fervice, as to the

LORD, and not unto men;

Ver. 8. Knowing that whatsoever good thing any man doth, the same shall he receive of the LORD, whether he be bond or free.

Col. iii. 22. Servants, obey in all things your maf-

ters according to the flesh, &c.

Ver. 24. Knowing, that of the LORD ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: For ye serve the LORD Christ.

### V. To GOOD KINGS and MAGISTRATES.

Deut. xvii. 18. And it shall be, when he sitteth upon the throne of his kingdom, that he shall write him a copy of this law in a book out of that which is before the priests the Levites.

Ver. 19. And it shall be with him, and he shall read therein all the days of his life; that he may learn to fear the LORD his GOD, to keep all the words of

this law, and thefe statutes, to do them:

Ver. 20. That his heart be not lifted up above his brethren, and that he turn not afide from the commandment, to the right hand, nor to the left; to the end that he may prolong his days in his kingdom, he and his children, in the midst of Ifrael.

Prov. xvi. 12. The throne is established by righte-

oufness.

Prov. xx. 28. Mercy and truth preferve the king, and his throne is upholden by mercy.

Prov. xxix. 14. The king that faithfully judges the

poor, his throne shall be established forever.

Is. xxviii. 6. In that day shall the LORD of hosts be for a Spirit of judgment to them that sit in judg-

ment,

ment, and for strength to them that turn the battle to the gate.

# VI. To OBEDIENT SUBJECTS.

2 Pet. ii. 13. Submit yourselves to every ordinance of men for the LORD's sake; whether it be to the king, as supreme:

Ver. 14. Or unto governors, as unto them that are fent by him for the punishment of evil doers, and for

the praise of them that do well.

Ver. 15. For fo is the will of GOD, that with well doing you may put to filence the ignorance of foolishmen.

Eccl. viii. 5. Whoso keepeth the commandment [the king's] shall feel no evil thing; and a wise man's heart discerneth both time and judgment.

#### VII. To FAITHFUL MINISTERS.

Luke xii. 42. Who is that faithful and wife steward whom his lord should make ruler over his house. hold, to give them their portion of meat in due sea-son?

Ver. 43. Bleffed is that fervant whom his lord, when he cometh, shall find so doing.

Ver. 44. Of a truth, I fay unto you, that he will

make him ruler over all that he hath.

Matt. xxviii. 20. Teaching them to observe all things, whatsoever I have commanded you: And lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world.

1 Tim. iv. 16. Take heed unto thyself, and to thy dostrine; continue in them: For in doing this, thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

1 Pet. v. 2. The elders which are among you, I exhort, Feed the flock of GOD which is among you,

taking

taking the overfight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind:

Ver. 3. Neither as being lords over GOD's heri-

tage, but being ensamples to the flock :

Ver. 4. And when the chief shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not

away.

Dan. xii. 3. And they that be wife, shall shine as the brightness of the sirmament; and they that turn many to righteousness, as the stars, for ever and ever.

If. xxxii. 20. Bleffed are ye that fow befide all waters, that fend forth thither the feet of the ox and

the ass.

If. xlix. 4. Then I faid, I have laboured in vain, I have fpent my ftrength for nought, and in vain; yet furely my judgment is with the LORD, and my work with my GOD.

John iv. 16. And he that reapeth, receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both he that foweth, and he that reapeth may rejoice to-

gether.

Rev. ii. 1. These things, saith he that holdeth the seven stars in his right hand.

Ps. cxxxii. 16. I will clothe her priests with falva-

tion, and her faints shall shout aloud for joy.

Fer. xxxi. 14. And I will fatiate the foul of the priests with fatness, and my people shall be fatisfied with my goodness, faith the LORD.

Jer. i. 7. The LORD faid unto me, Say not, I am a child; for thou shalt go to all that I fend thee; and

whatfoever I command thee, thou shalt speak.

Ver. 8. Be not afraid of their faces, for I am with

thee to deliver thee, faith the LORD.

Ver. 19. They shall fight against thee, but shall not prevail against thee; for I am with thee, faith the LORD, to deliver thee.

Ezek. iii. 8. Behold I have made thy face strong against their faces, and thy forehead strong against

their foreheads.

Ver. 9. As an adamant, harder than flint, have I made thy forehead: fear them not, neither be difmayed at their looks, though they be a rebellious house.

Matt. x. 19. And when they shall deliver you up, take no thought how or what you shall speak; for it shall be given you in that same hour what you shall speak.

Ver. 20. For it is not ye that speak, but the Spirit

of your Father which speaketh in you.

2 Chron. xx. 22. Believe in the LORD your GOD, fo shall you be established; believe his prophets, so shall you prosper.

## IX. To LOVE and UNITY.

Pf. cxxxiii. 1. Behold, how good and how pleafant is it for brethren to dwell together in unity!

Ver. 2. It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard, that went down to the skirts of his garments.

Ver. 3. As the dew of Hermon, and as the dew that descended upon the mountains of Zion; for there the LORD commanded the bleffing, even life for evermore.

1 John ii. 10. He that loveth his brother, abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him.

John xiii. 35. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.

2 Cor. xiii. 11. Be perfect, be of good comfort, be

of

of one mind, live in peace; and the GOD of love and peace shall be with you.

To the Peacemakers; for they shall be called the children of GOD.

Prov. xii. 20. To the counfellors

of peace and joy.

1 Pet. iii. 10. He that will love life, and fee good days—

Ver. 11.—Let him feek peace, and enfue it.

Love to God's we have passed from death to life, because we love the brethren: he that loveth not his brother, abideth in death.

Ver. 18. My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue, but in deed and in truth.

Ver. 19. And hereby we know that we are of the

truth, and shall assure our hearts before him.

1 John iv. 12. If we love one another, GOD dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us.

Pf. xv. 1. LORD, who shall abide in thy taber-

nacle? Who shall dwell in thy holy hill?

Ver. 4. He in whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but he honoureth them that fear the LORD.

Pf. cxxii. 6. Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: they

shall prosper that love thee.

Heb. vi. 10. GOD is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed towards his name, in that ye have ministred to the faints, and do minister.

Num. xxiv. 9. Blessed is he that blesseth thee;

and curfed is he that curfeth thee.

X. To the CHARITABLE, the MERCIFUL, and the LIBERAL to GOD's MINISTERS.

Deut. xv. 10. Thou shalt furely give him [thy

poor brother:] and thine heart shall not be grived, when thou givest unto him; because that for this thing the LORD thy GOD shall bless thee in all thy works, and in all that thou puttest thine hand unto.

P/. xli. 1. Blessed is he that considereth the poor;

the LORD will deliver him in time of trouble.

Ver. 2. The LORD will preferve him, and keep him alive, and he shall be blessed upon the earth; and thou wilt not deliver him into the will of his enemies.

Ver. 3. The LORD will strengthen him upon the bed of languishing; thou wilt make all his bed in his sickness.

Pf. cxii. 9. He hath dispersed, he hath given to the poor; his righteousness endureth for ever; his horn shall be exalted with honour.

Ver. 5. A good man sheweth favour, and lendeth;

of the LORD shall be thy reward.

Matt. x. 42. And whofoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones, a cup of cold water only, in the name of a disciple; verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward.

Matt. xxv. 34. Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come ye blessed of my Father, in-

herit

herit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

Ver. 35. For I was an hungred, and ye gave me meat; I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink; I was a stranger, and ye took me in;

Ver. 36. Naked, and ye clothed me: I was fick, and ye visited me; I was in prison, and ye came unto

Mal. iii. 10. Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in my house, and prove me now herewith, faith the LORD of hosts, if I will not open to you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a bleffing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.



If. xxiii. 18. And her [Tyre's] merchandise and her hire, shall be holiness unto the LORD: It shall not be treasured nor laid up; for her merchandise shall be to them that dwell before the LORD, to eat sufficiently, and for durable cloathing.

If. xxvii. 6. He shall cause them that come of Jacob, to take root; Israel shall blossom and bud, and

fill the face of the world with fruit.

If. xl. 3. The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our GOD.

Ver. 4. Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill shall be brought low; and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough places plain;

Ver. 5. And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: For the

mouth of the LORD hath spoken it.

If. xlii. 1. Behold, my fervant, whom I uphold; mine elect, in whom my foul delighteth; I have put my Spirit upon him; he shall bring forth judgment to the Gentiles.

Ver. 4. He shall not fail, nor be discouraged, till he

he have fet judgment in the earth; and the ifles shall wait for his law.

Ver. 6. I the LORD have called thee in righteoufness, and will hold thine hand, and will keep thee, and give thee for a covenant of the people, for a light of the Gentiles.

Ver. 7. To open the blind eyes, to bring out the prisoners from the prison, and them that sit in dark-

ness out of the prison-house.

If. xlv. 23. I have fworn myself, the word is gone forth out of my mouth in righteousness, and shall not return, that unto me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear.

Ver. 24. Surely, shall one fay, in the LORD have I righteousness and strength: Even to him shall men come, and all that are incensed against him shall be

ashamed. See ver. 14.

If. xlix. 6. And he faid, It is a light thing that thou shouldest be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and to restore the preserved of Israel: I will also give thee for a light to the Gentiles, that thou mayest be my salvation unto the ends of the earth.

Ver. 12. Behold, these shall come from far; and lo, these from the north, and from the west, and these

from the land of Sinim.

Ver. 20. Lift up thine eyes round about, and behold, all these gather themselves together, and come to thee: As I live, faith the LORD, thou shalt surely clothe thee with them all, as with an ornament, and bind them on thee as a bride doth.

Ver. 18. The children which thou shalt have, after thou hast lost the other, shall say again in thine ears, The place is too strait for me; give place to me that I may dwell. See ver. 8, 9, 11, 19, 21, 22. And chap. lx. 4.

If. li. 4. Hearken unto me, my people, and give ear unto me, O my nation; for a law shall proceed

from

from me, and I will make my judgment to rest for a

light of the people.

Ver. 5. My righteousness is near, my falvation is gone forth, and mine arms shall judge the people: The isles shall wait upon me, and on mine arm shall they trust.

Ver. 16. I have put my words in thy mouth, and have covered thee in the shadow of mine hand, that I may plant the heavens, and lay the foundations of the earth, and say to Zion, Thou art my people.

If. lii. 10. The LORD hath made bare his holy arm in the eyes of all nations, and all the ends of the

earth shall see the salvation of our GOD.

If. liii. 10. When thou shalt make his foul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.

Ver. 11. He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied; by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many, for he shall bear their iniquities.

Ver. 12. Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the

strong.

If. liv. 1. Sing, O barren, thou that didft not bear; break forth into finging, and cry aloud, thou that didft not travail with child; for more are the children of the defolate, than the children of the married wife, faith the LORD.

Ver. 2. Enlarge the place of thy tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of thine habitations; spare not, lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes.

Ver. 3. For thou shalt break forth on the right hand and on the left, and thy feed shall inherit the Gentiles, and make the desolate cities to be inhabited.

If. lv. 4. Behold I have given him for a witness to the people; a Leader and Commander to the people.

Ver. 5. Behold, thou shalt call a nation that thou knowest not; and nations that knew not thee, shall run unto thee, because of the LORD thy GOD, and for the Holy One of Israel, for he hath gloristed thee.

If. lix. 19. So shall they fear the name of the LORD from the west, and his glory from the rising of the sun: when the enemy shall come in like a flood, the Spirit of the LORD shall lift up a standard against him.

Ver. 20. And the Redeemer shall come to Zion, and unto them that turn from transgression in Jacob,

faith the LORD.

If. 1x. 3. The Gentiles shall come to thy light, and kings to the brightness of thy rising.

Ver. 8. Who are these that fly as a cloud, and as

the doves to their windows?

Ver. 9. Surely the isles shall wait for me, and the ships of Tarshish first, to bring thy sons form far, their filver and their gold with them, unto the name of the LORD thy GOD; and to the Holy One of Israel, because he hath glorified thee.

Ver. 10. And the fons of strangers shall build thy

walls, &c. See ver. 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 16.

If. lxv. 17. Behold, I create new heavens and a new earth, and the former shall not be remembered, nor come into mind.

Ifa. lxvi. 8. Who hath heard fuch a thing? Who hath feen fuch things? Shall the earth be made to bring forth in one day? Or shall a nation be born at once? for as soon as Zion travailed, she brought forth her children.

Ver. 9. Shall I bring to the birth, and not cause to bring forth? faith the LORD: Shall I cause to bring forth, and shut the womb? faith thy GOD.

Ver. 18. It shall come, that I will gather all na-

tions and tongues, and they shall fee my glory.

Ver. 19. And I will fet a fign among them, and I will fend those that escape of them unto the nations, to Tarshish, Pul, and Lud, that draw the bow, to Tubal, and Javan, to the isles afar off, that have no heard my fame, neither have seen my glory; and they shall declare my glory among the Gentiles.

Ver. 20. And they shall bring all your brethren for

an offering unto the LORD out of all nations-

Ver. 21. And I will also take of them for priests

and for Levites, faith the LORD.

Ver. 23. And it shall come to pass, that from one new moon to another, and from one Sabbath to another, shall all slesh come to worship before me, saith the LORD.

Dan. ii. 44. And in the days of these kings shall the GOD of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people; but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever.

Dan. vii. 13. And I faw in the night visions, and behold, one like the Son of Man, came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of Days, and they brought him near before him.

Ver. 14. And there was given him dominion and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and

languages, should serve him.

Ver. 27. And the kingdom, and dominion, and the greatness of the kingdom under the whole heaven, shall be given to the people of the saints of the Most High, whose kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey him.

Amos ix. 11. In that day will I raife up the tabernacle of David that is fallen, and close up the breaches thereof; and I will raife up his ruins, and I will

build it as in the days of old;

Ver. 12. That they may possess the remnant of Edom

Edom [or, That the residue of men might seek after the LORD, Acts xv. 17.] and of all the heathen which are called by my name, saith the LORD that doth this.

Zech. ii. 10. Sing and rejoice, O daughter of Zion; for lo, I come, and I will dwell in the midst of thee,

faith the LORD.

Ver. 11. And many nations shall be joined to the LORD in that day, and shall be my people; and I will dwell in the midst of thee, and thou shalt know that the LORD of hosts hath sent me unto thee.

Zech. vi. 15. And they that are afar off shall come

and build in the temple of the LORD.

Zech. viii. 21. And the inhabitants of one city shall go to another, saying, Let us go speedily to pray before the LORD, and to seek the LORD of hosts: I will go also.

Ver. 22. Yea, many people and strong nations shall come to feek the LORD of hosts in Jerusalem, and

to pray before the LORD.

Ver. 23. Thus faith the LORD of hofts, In those days it shall come to pass, that ten men shall take hold out of all languages of the nations, even shall take hold of the skirt of him that is a Jew, saying, We will go with you, for we have heard that GOD is with you.

Zech. xiv. 9. And the LORD shall be King over all the earth; in that day shall there be one LORD,

and his name one.

Mal. i. 11. From the rifing of the fun, even to the going down of the fame, my name shall be great among the Gentiles, and in every place incense shall be offered unto my name, and a pure offering; for my name shall be great among the heathen, faith the LORD of hosts.

Matth. viii. 11. I fay unto you, that many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with

Abraham

Abraham, and Ifaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom heaven.

Matt. xxiv. 14. This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world, for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come.

John xii. 32. And I, if I be lifted up, will draw

all men after me.

Rev. xi. 15. And the seventh angel sounded, and there were great voices in heaven, saying, The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our LORD, and of his Christ; and he shall reign for ever and ever. See Rev. vii. 9, 10. Rev. xii. 10.

# II. The GLORY of the Church.

Pf. xlv. 13. The King's daughter is all glorious

within; her clothing is of wrought gold.

Pf. xlviii. 2. Beautiful for fituation, the joy of the whole earth is mount Zion, on the fides of the north, the city of the Great King.

Ver. 12. Walk about Zion, and go round about

her: tell the towers thereof:

Ver. 13. Mark ye well her bulwarks, confider her palaces, that ye may tell it to the generation following.

Pf. lxxxvii. 3. Glorious things are fpoken of thee,

O city of GOD.

If. xlvi. 13. I will bring near my righteoufness: it shall not be far off, and my salvation shall not tarry; and I will place salvation in Zion for Israel my glory.

If. liv. 11. O thou afflicted, toffed with tempest, and not comforted, behold, I will lay thy stones with fair colours, and lay thy soundations with sapphires.

Ver. 12. And I will make thy windows of agates, and thy gates of carbuncles, and all thy borders of pleasant stones.

If. lx. 1. Arise, shine, for thy light is come, and

the glory of the LORD is rifen upon thee.

Ver. 2. For behold darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people; but the LORD shall arise upon thee, and his glory shall be seen upon thee.

Ver. 13. The glory of Lebanon shall come unto thee, the fir-tree, the pine-tree, and the box together, to beautify the place of my fanctuary; and I will

make the place of my feet glorious.

Ver. 14. Whereas thou hast been forfaken and hated, fo that no man went through thee; I will make thee an eternal excellency, a joy of many generations.

Ver. 19. The fun shall be no more thy light by day, neither for brightness shall the moon give light unto thee; but the LORD shall be unto thee an everlasting light, and thy GOD thy glory.

Ver. 20. Thy fun shall no more go down, neither shall the moon withdraw herself; for the LORD shall be thine everlasting light, and the days of thy mourn-

ing shall be ended.

If. lxii. 2. The Gentiles shall see thy righteousness, and all kings thy glory; and thou shalt be called by a new name, which the mouth of the LORD shall name.

Ver. 3. Thou shalt also be a crown of glory in the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand

of thy GOD.

Rev. xxi. 10. And he carried me away in the Spirit, to a great and high mountain, and shewed me that great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from GOD;

Ver. 11. Having the glory of GOD: and her light was like unto a frone most precious; even like a

jasper-stone, clear as crystal. See ver. 18, 21.

Ver. 22. And I saw no temple therein; for the LORD

LORD GOD Almighty, and the Lamb, are the tem-

ple of it.

Ver. 23. And the city had no need of the fun, neither of the moon, to shine in it; for the glory of GOD did lighten it, and the Lamb is the light thereof.

Ver. 24. And the nations of them which are faved, fhall walk in the light of it; and the kings of the earth do bring their glory and honour into it.

Ver. 25. And the gates of it shall not be shut at all

by day; for there shall be no light there.

Ver. 26. And they shall bring the glory and honour of the nations into it.

III. Promifes of the Increase of LIGHT and KNOW-LEDGE, and of the MEANS of GRACE.

If. xi. 4. The earth shall be full of the knowledge

of the LORD, as the waters cover the sea.

If. xxv. 6. And in this mountain shall the LORD of hosts make unto all people, a feast of fat things, a feast of wines on the lees, of fat things full of marrow, of wines on the lees, well refined.

Ver. 7. And he will destroy in this mountain the face of the covering cast over all people, and the veil

that is spread over all nations.

If. xxix. 18. In that day shall the deaf hear the words of the book, and the eyes of the blind shall see out of obscurity, and out of darkness.

Ver. 24. They also that erred in spirit, shall come to understanding; and they that murmured, shall

learn doctrine.

If. xli. 18. I will open rivers in high places, and fountains in the midst of the vallies; I will make the wilderness a pool of water, and the dry land springs of water.

Ver. 19. I will plant in the wilderness the cedar,

the

the shittah-tree, and the myrtle, and the oil-tree; will set in the desart the fir-tree, and the pine, and the box-tree together. See chap. xxxv. 6, 7, 8.

Is. lii. 7. How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace, that bringeth good tidings of good, that publisheth falvation, that faith unto Zion, Thy GOD reigneth.

Ver. 8. Thy watchmen shall lift up the voice; with the voice together shall they sing; for they shall see eye to eye, when the LORD shall bring

again Zion.

If. liv. 13. And all thy children shall be taught of the LORD.

Dan. xii. 4. Many shall run to and fro, and know-ledge shall be increased.

#### IV. Promises of Purity, Holiness, and Right-EOUSNESS in the Church.

If. iv. 3. And it shall come to pass, that he that is left in Zion, and he that remaineth in Jerusalem, shall be called holy; even every one that is written

among the living in Jerusalem:

Ver. 4. When the LORD shall have washed away the filth of the daughters of Zion, and shall have purged the blood of Jerusalem from the midst thereof, by the Spirit of judgment, and by the Spirit of burning.

If. xxxii. 15. Until the Spirit be poured upon us from on high, and the wilderness be a fruitful field,

and the fruitful field be counted for a forest:

Ver. 16. Then judgment shall dwell in the wilderness, and righteousness remain in the fruitful field.

If. xxxiii. 5. The LORD is exalted, for he dwelleth on high: he hath filled Zion with judgment and righteoufness.

Ver. 6. And wisdom and knowledge shall be the

stability.

flability of thy times, and strength of falvation: the

fear of the LORD is his treasure.

If. xlv. 8. Drop down ye heavens from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness; let the earth open, and let them bring forth salvation, and let righteousness spring up together: I the LORD have created it.

Ps. lxxxv. 10. Mercy and truth are met together:

righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

Ver. 11. Truth shall spring out of the earth; and righteousness shall look down from heaven.

Ver. 13. Righteousness shall go before him, and

shall set us in the way of his steps.

If. lx. 21. Thy people shall be all righteous; they shall inherit the land for ever, the branch of my planting, the work of my hands, that I may be glorified.

If. lxvi. 11. As the earth bringeth forth her bud, and as the garden caufeth the things that are fown in it, to fpring forth; fo the LORD GOD will caufe righteousness and praise to spring forth before all the nations.

Mal. iii. 43. He shall sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer unto the LORD, an offering in righteousness.

Ver. 4. Then shall the offering of Judah and Jerufalem be pleasant unto the LORD, as in the days of

old, and as in former years.

Pf. lxxii. 5. They shall fear thee as long as the

fun and moon endure, throughout all generations.

Zech. xiv. 20. In that day shall there be upon the bells of the horses, HOLINESS UNTO THE LORD; and the pots in the LORD's house shall be like the bowls before the altar.

Ver. 21. Yea, every pot in Jerusalem, and in Judah, shall be holiness unto the LORD of hosts; and

all they that facrifice, shall come and take of them, and seethe therein: and in that day there shall be no more the Canaanite in the house of the LORD of hosts.

Rev. xix. 8. And to her [the Lamb's wife] was granted, that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white; for the fine linen is the righteousness of the saints.

### V. Promises of Peace, Love, and Unity.

If. ii. 4. And they shall beat their swords into plow-shares, and their spears into pruning-hooks: nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

Ifa. xi. 6. The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf, and the young lion, and the fatling to-

gether, and a little child shall lead them.

Ver. 7. And the cow and the bear shall feed; their young ones shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

Ver. 8. And the fucking child shall play on the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put his

hand on the cockatrice den.

Ver. 9. They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my

holy mountain.

Ver. 13. The envy also of Ephraim shall depart, and the adversaries of Judah shall be cut off; Ephraim shall not envy Judah, and Judah shall not vex Ephraim.

Ps. lxxii. 3. The mountains shall bring peace to

the people, and the little hills by righteousness.

Ver. 7. In his days shall the righteous flourish; and abundance of peace so long as the moon endureth.

John xvii. 20. Neither pray I for these alone, but

for them also which shall believe on me through their word:

Ver. 21. That they all may be one, as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee; that they also may be one in us, that the world may believe thou half fent me.

Ver. 22. And the glory which thou gavest me, I have given them, that they may be one, even as we are one.

Ver. 23. I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that thou hast fent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me.

Eph. iv. 15. From whom [Christ] the whole body fitly joined together, and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body, unto the edifying of itself in love.

## VI. Promises of the Submission and Destruction of the Enemies of the Church.

Pf. cx. 2. The LORD shall fend the rod of thy strength out of Zion; Rule thou in the midst of thine enemies.

Ver. 5. The LORD at thy right hand shall strike

through kings, in the day of his wrath.

Ver. 6. He shall judge among the heathen: he shall fill the places with dead bodies; he shall wound the heads over many countries.

If. xi. 4. He shall smite the earth with the rod of his mouth; and with the breath of his lips shall he

flay the wicked.

If. xxvii. 1. In that day the LORD with his fore and great and strong sword shall punish Leviathan, the piercing serpent; even Leviathan, that

crooked

crooked ferpent: and he shall flay the dragon that is in the sea.

If. xli. 11. Behold all they that were incenfed against thee, shall be ashamed and confounded: they shall be as nothing; and they that strive with thee,

shall perish.

Ver. 12. Thou shalt feek them, and shalt not find them, even them that contended with thee: they that war against thee shall be as nothing, and as a thing of nought. See ver. 15, 16.

If. xlix. 24. Shall the prey be taken from the

mighty, or the lawful captive delivered ?

Ver. 25. But thus faith the LORD, Even the captives of the mighty shall be taken away, and the prey of the terrible shall be delivered; for I will contend with him that contendeth with thee, and I will save thy children.

Ver. 26. And I will feed them that oppress thee with their own flesh, and they shall be drunken with their own blood, as with sweet wine; and all flesh shall know that I the LORD am thy Saviour, and

thy Redeemer the mighty One of Jacob.

If. lix. 19. When the enemy shall come in like a flood, the Spirit of the LORD shall lift up a standard

against him.

If. 1x. 14. The fons also of them that afflicted thee, shall come bending unto thee; and all they that despised thee, shall bow themselves down at the soles of thy seet; and they shall call thee, The city of the LORD, the Zion of the Holy One of Israel.

The destruction of ANTICHRIST and of BABY-LON, &c.

2 Theff. ii. 8. Then shall that wicked be revealed, whom the LORD shall consume with the Spirit of his mouth, and destroy with the brightness of his coming. See Dan. vii. 24, 25, 26.

Rev. xiv. 9. If any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand:

Ver. 10. The fame shall drink of the wine of the wrath of GOD, which is poured out without mixture

into the cup of his indignation.

Rev. xvii. 1. Come hither, I will shew thee the judgment of the great whore, that sitteth upon many waters, &c.

Ver. 16. And the ten horns which thou fawest upon the beast, these shall hate the whore, and shall make her desolate and naked, and shall eat her slesh, and burn her with fire.

Rev. xviii. 2. Babylon the Great is fallen, is fallen, and is become the habitation of devils, and the hold of every foul fpirit, and the cage of every unclean and hateful bird. See to the end of the chapter.

Rev. xix. 19. And I faw the beaft, and the kings of the earth, and their armies gathered together, to make war against him that fat on the horse, and against

his army.

Ver. 20. And the beast was taken, and with him the false prophet that wrought miracles before him, with which he deceived them that had received the mark of the beast, and them that worshipped his image: these both were cast alive into a lake of fire burning with brimstone.

Rev. xx. 7. And when the thousand years are ex-

pired, Satan shall be loofed out of prison.

Ver. 8. And shall go out to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle; the number of whom is as the sand of the sea.

Ver. 9. And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the faints about, and the beloved city; and fire came down from GOD

out of heaven, and devoured them. See Ezek. xxxviii. and xxxix.

VII. Promises of the FAVOUR and SUBMISSION of KINGS to the KINGDOM of CHRIST.

Ifa. xlix. 7. Thus faith the LORD, the Redeemer of Israel, and his Holy One, to him whom man despiseth, to him whom the nation abhorreth, to a servant of rulers, kings shall see and arise, princes also shall worship, because of the LORD that is faithful, and the Holy One of Israel, and he shall choose thee.

Ver. 23. And kings shall be thy nursing fathers, and their queens thy nursing mothers: they shall bow down to thee with their face towards the earth, and lick up the dust of thy feet, and thou shalt know that I am the LORD; for they shall not be assumed that wait for me.

Ifa. lii. 15. So shall he sprinkle many nations; the kings shall shut their mouths at him; for that which had not been told them, shall they see; and that which they had not heard, shall they consider.

Ifa. lx. 3. And the Gentiles shall come to thy light,

and kings to the brightness of thy rising.

Ver. 10. And the fons of strangers shall build up thy walls, and their kings shall minister unto thee; for in my wrath I smote thee, but in my savour have I had mercy on thee.

Ver. II. Therefore thy gates shall be open continually; they shall not be shut day nor night, that men may bring unto thee the forces of the Gentiles, and

that their kings may be brought.

Ver. 16. Thou shalt suck the milk of the Gentiles, and shalt suck the breast of kings, and shalt know, that I the LORD am thy Saviour and thy Redeemer, the Mighty One of Iacob.

VIII. Promises of the SECURITY, TRANQUILLITY, and PROSPERITY of the Church.

Ifa. iv. 5. And the LORD will create upon every dwelling-place of Mount Zion, and upon her affemblies, a cloud, and fmoke by day, and the fhining of a flaming fire by night; for upon all the glory shall be a defence.

Ver. 6. And there shall be a tabernacle for a shadow in the day-time from the heat, and for a place of refuge, and for a covert from storm and from

rain.

Is. xxvii. 2. In that day fing ye unto her a vine-

yard of red wine.

Ver. 3. I the LORD do keep it; I will water it every moment; lest any hurt it, I will keep it night

and day.

If. xxxiii. 20. Look upon Zion, the city of our folemnities; thine eyes shall see Jerusalem a quiet habitation, a tabernacle that shall not be taken down; not one of the stakes thereof shall ever be removed, neither shall any of the cords thereof be broken.

Ver. 21. For there the glorious LORD will be unto us a place of broad rivers and ftreams, wherein shall go no galley with oars, neither shall gallant ship

pass thereby:

Ver. 22. For the LORD is our Judge, the LORD is our Lawgiver; the LORD is our King; he will

fave us.

If. liv. 14. In righteousness shalt thou be established: thou shalt be far from oppression, for thou shalt not fear; and from terror, for it shall not come near thee.

Ver. 15. Behold, they shall surely gather together, but not by me: whosoever shall gather together against thee, shall fall for thy sake.

Ver. 17. No weapon that is formed against thee,

fhall

fhall profper; and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment, thou shalt condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD, and their righteousness is of me, faith the LORD.

Is. Is. Be you glad, and rejoice forever in that which I create; for, behold, I create Jerusalem,

a rejoicing, and her people a joy.

Ver. 19. And I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and joy in my people; and the voice of weeping shall be no

more heard in her, nor the voice of crying.

Isa. li. 3. The LORD will comfort Zion; he will comfort all her waste places, and he will make her wilderness like Eden, and her desart like the garden of the LORD; joy and gladness shall be found therein, thanksgiving, and the voice of melody.

Ps. cii. 13. Thou shalt arise, and have mercy upon Zion; for the time to favour her, yea, the set time is

come:

Ver. 14. For thy fervants take pleafure in her stones, and favour the dust thereof.

Ver. 16. When the Lord shall build up Zion, he

shall appear in his glory.

Isa. lxvi. 10. Rejoice ye with Jerusalem, and be glad with her, all ye that love her; rejoice for joy

with her, all ye that mourn for her.

Ver. 11. That ye may fuck and be fatisfied with the breafts of her confolations; that ye may milk out and be delighted with the abundance of her

glory.

Ver. 12. For thus faith the LORD, Behold, I will extend peace to her like a river, and the glory of the Gentiles like a flowing stream: then shall ye suck, ye shall be borne upon her sides, and be dandled upon her knees. See ver. 13, 14.

Jer. xxxiii. 6. In his days Judah shall be saved, and

Ifrael shall dwell fafely.

Matth. xvi. 18. Upon this rock will I build my

church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

Dan. vii. 27. And the kingdom and dominion, and the greatness of the kingdom under the whole heaven, shall be given to the people of the saints of the Most High, whose kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey him.

## IX. Promises of the Perpetual Continuance of the Church.

Ifa. lix. 21. As for me, this is my covenant with them, faith the LORD, My Spirit that is upon thee, and my words which I have put into thy mouth, shall not depart out of thy mouth, nor out of the mouth of thy seed, nor out of the mouth of thy seed, faith the LORD, from henceforth and for ever.

Ifa. lxvi. 22. For as the new heavens and the new earth which I will make, shall remain before me, saith the LORD, so shall your feed and your name remain.

Jer. xxxi. 35. Thus faith the LORD, which giveth the fun for a light by day, and the ordinances of the moon and of the stars for a light by night, which divideth the sea when the waves thereof roar; the LORD of hosts is his name:

Ver. 36. If those ordinances depart from before me, faith the LORD, then the feed of Israel also shall cease

from being a nation before me for ever.

Ver. 37. Thus faith the LORD, if heaven above can be measured, and the foundations of the earth fearched out beneath; I will also cast off all the feed of Israel, for all that they have done, faith the LORD. See also chap. xxxiii. 20, 21, 25, 26.

Dan. vii. 14. His dominion is an everlatting dominion.

minion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed.

Matth. xxviii. 20. Lo, I am with you alway, even

unto the end of the world.

# X. Promifes of the Conversion and Restoration of the Jews.

Jer. xxx. 9. They shall serve the LORD their GOD, and David their king, whom I will raise up unto them.

Ver. 10. Therefore fear not thou, O my fervant Jacob, faith the LORD, neither be thou difmayed, O Ifrael; for lo, I will fave thee from afar, and thy feed from the land of their captivity; and Jacob shall return, and shall be in rest and quiet, and none shall make him afraid. See to the end of the Chapter.

Fer. xxxi. 1. At the fame time, faith the LORD, will I be the GOD of all the families of Ifrael, and

they shall be my people.

Ver. 4. Again I will build thee, and thou shalt be built, O virgin of Israel; thou shalt again be adorned with thy tabrets, and shalt go forth in the dances of them that make merry.

Ver. 10. Hear the word of the LORD, O nations, and declare it in the isles afar off, and fay, He that scattered Israel will gather him, and keep him, as a

shepherd doth his flock.

Ver. 17. There is hope in thine end, that thy chil-

dren shall come again to their own border.

Ver. 31. Behold, the days come, faith the LORD, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah:

Ver. 32. Not according to the covenant that I

made with their fathers, &c.

Ver. 33. But this shall be the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel: After those days, faith

faith the LORD, I will put my law in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts: and I will be their

GOD, and they shall be my people.

Ver. 38. Behold the days come, faith the LORD, that the city shall be built to the LORD, from the tower of Hananiel, unto the gate of the corner. See the whole chapter.

Jer. xxxii. 41. Yea, I will rejoice over them, to do them good, and I will plant them in this land affuredly, with my whole heart, and with my whole

foul. See from ver. 37. to the end.

Jer. xxxiii. 7. And I will cause the captivity of Judah and the captivity of Israel to return, and will build them as at the first.

Ver. 8. And I will cleanse them from all their

iniquities, &c.

Ver. 9. And it shall be to me a name of joy, a praise and an honour before all the nations of the earth which shall hear of all the good I do unto them, &c.

Ver. 15. In those days, and at that time, will I cause the Branch of righteousness to grow up unto David, and he shall execute judgment and justice in the land.

Ver. 16. In those days shall Judah be faved, and Jerusalem shall dwell safely: and this is the name wherewith she shall be called, The LORD our right-eousness.

Ver. 24. Confiderest thou not, what this people have spoken, saying, The two samilies which the LORD hath chosen, he will cast them off; &c.

Ver. 25. Thus faith the LORD, If my covenant be not with day and night, and if I have not appointed

the ordinances of heaven and earth:

Ver. 26. Then will I cast away the seed of Jacob and David my servant, so that I will not take any of his seed to be rulers over the seed of Abraham, Isaac,

and

and Jacob; for I will cause their captivity to return, and have mercy upon them. To the same purpose see the whole chapter. See also chap. 1. 4, 5, 19, 20.

Ezek. xvi. 60. Nevertheless I will remember my covenant with thee in the days of thy youth, and I will

establish unto thee an everlasting covenant.

Ver. 61. Thou shalt remember thy ways, and be ashamed, when thou shalt receive thy sisters, thine elder and thy younger (Sodom and Samaria, ver. 55.) and I will give them unto thee for daughters, but not by thy covenant. Ver. 62, 63.

Ezek. xx. 34. I will bring you out from the people, and will gather you out of the countries wherein ye

are scattered, with a mighty hand-

Ver. 35. And I will bring you into the wilderness of the people, and there will I plead with you face to face.

Ver. 37. And I will cause you to pass under the rod, and I will bring you into the bond of the covenant.

Ver. 38. And will purge out from among you the

rebels, and them that transgress against me.

Ver. 40. In my holy mountain, in the mountain of the height of Ifrael, faith the LORD GOD, there shall all the house of Ifrael, all of them in the land, serve me; there will I accept them, and there will I require your offerings, and the first-fruits of your oblations, with all your holy things. See also ver.

Ezek. xxxiv. 23. And I will fet one shepherd over them, and he shall feed them, even my servant David;

he shall feed them, and be their shepherd.

Ver. 24. And I the LORD will be their GOD, and my fervant David a prince among them. I the LORD have spoken it.

Ver. 28. And they shall no more be a prey among the heathen, neither shall the beasts of the land devour

them

them; but they shall dwell fafely, and none shall make them afraid.

Ver. 29. And I will raise up for them a plant of renown. See also ver. 11, 16. and from ver. 22. to

the end of the chapter.

Ezek. xxxvi. 11. I will multiply upon you [the mountains of Ifrael] man and beast, and they shall encrease, and bring fruit; and I will settle you after your old estates, and I will do better unto you than at your beginnings, and ye shall know that I am the LORD.

Ver. 24. I will take you from among the heathen, and gather you out of all countries, and will bring you into your own land.

Ver. 26. Then will-I fprinkle clean water upon you, and ye shall be clean; from all your filthiness,

and from all your idols will I cleanse you.

Ver. 27. A new heart also will I give you, &c.

Ver. 33. In the day that I shall have cleansed you from all your iniquities, I will also cause you to dwell in the cities, and the wastes shall be builded. See the

whole chapter; as also chap. xxxvii.

Exek. xxxvii. 25. And they shall dwell in the land that I have given unto Jacob my servant, wherein your fathers have dwelt; and they shall dwell therein, even they, and their children, and their children's children, for ever, and my servant David shall be their prince for ever.

Hos. i. 10. Yet the number of the children of Israel shall be as the sand of the sea, which cannot be measured nor numbered; and it shall come to pass, that in the place where it was said unto them, Ye are not my people, there it shall be said unto them,

Ye are the fons of the living GOD.

Ver. 11. Then shall the children of Judah, and the children of Israel, be gathered together, and appoint themselves

themselves one head, and they shall come up out of

the land; for great shall be the day of Jezreel.

Host. ii. 14. Behold, I will allure her, and bring her into the wilderness, and speak comfortably unto her.

Ver. 15. And I will give her vineyards from thence, and the valley of Achor for a door of hope; and the shall fing there, as in the days of her youth, and as in the day when she came up out of the land of Egypt.

Ver. 19. And I will betroth thee unto me for ever,

&c. See from ver. 16, to the end.

Hof. iii. 4. The children of Ifrael shall abide many days without a king, and without a prince, and without an image, and without an

ephod, and without teraphim.

Ver. 5. Afterward shall the children of Israel return, and feek the LORD their GOD, and David their king, and shall fear the LORD and his goodness in the latter days. See also chap. xiv.

Joel iii. 1. Behold, in those days, and in that time, when I shall bring again the captivity of Judah, and

of Jerusalem:

Ver. 2. I will also gather all nations, and will bring them down into the valley of Jehoshaphat, and

will plead with them for my people, &c.

Ver. 17. So shall ye know that I am the LORD your GOD, dwelling in Zion, my holy mountain: Then shall Jerusalem be holy, and there shall no more strangers pass through her any more.

Ver. 20. Judah shall dwell for ever, and Jerusalem, from generation to generation. See also ver. 7, 14,

16, 18, 21.

Amos ix. 14. And I will bring again the captivity of my people Ifrael, and they shall build the waste cities, and inhabit them—

Ver. 15. And I will plant them upon their land,

and

and they shall be no more pulled up out of their land, which I have given them, faith the LORD thy

Obad. ver. 17. Upon mount Zion shall be deliverance, and there shall be holiness, and the house of

Jacob shall possess their possessions.

Ver. 21. And faviours shall come upon mount Zion to judge the mount of Esau, and the kingdom shall be the LORD's.

Mic. ii. 12. I will furely affemble, O Jacob, all of thee; I will furely gather the remnant of Ifrael, I will put them together as the sheep of Bozrah, as the flock in the midst of their fold; they shall make great noise by reason of the multitude of men.

Ver. 13. The breaker is come up before them; they have broken up, and have passed through the gate, and are gone out by it; and their king shall pass before them, and the LORD on the head of them.

Mic. v. 3. Therefore will he give them up, until the time that the that travaileth, hath brought forth; then the remnant of his brethren shall return unto the children of Ifrael.

Ver. 4. And he shall stand and feed in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his GOD, and they shall abide, for now shall he be great unto the ends of the earth.

Ver. 7. And the remnant of Jacob shall be in the midst of many people, as a dew from the LORD, as the showers upon the grass, that tarrieth not for man,

nor waiteth for the fons of men.

Ver. 13. The graven images also will I cut off, and thy standing images out of the midst of thee, and thou shalt no more worship the work of thine hands. See the whole chapter; and chap. iv. and chap. vii. 14, 17. See also Zeph. iii. 9, to the end.

Zech. ii. 10. Sing and rejoice, O daughter of Zion;

for lo, I come, and I will dwell in the midst of thee, faith the LORD.

Ver. 12. And the LORD shall inherit Judah, his portion in the holy land, and shall choose Jerusalem

again.

Zech. x. 6. And I will strengthen the house of Judah, and I will save the house of Joseph, and I will bring them again to place them; for I have mercy upon them, and they shall be as though I had not cast them off; for I am the LORD their GOD, and will hear them.

Ver. 7. I will his for them, and gather them, for I have redeemed them; and they shall increase as they have increased.

Ver. 9. And I will fow them among the people, and they shall remember me in far countries, and they shall live with their children, and turn again. See the

whole chapter.

Zech. xii. 6. In that day will I make the governors of Judah like a hearth of fire among the wood, and like a torch of fire in a sheaf; and they shall devour all the people round about, on the right hand and on the left; and Jerusalem shall be inhabited again, in her own place, even in Jerusalem.

Ver. 10. And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the Spirit of grace and supplications; and they shall look upon me, whom they have pierced, &c. See the whole

chapter.

Zech. xiv. 11. And men shall dwell in it, [i. e. all the land] and there shall be no more utter destruction; but Jerusalem shall be safely inhabited. See the whole chapter.

Luke xxi. 24. Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, UNTIL the times of the Gentiles be

fulfilled.

2 Cor. iii. 15. Even unto this day, when Moses is read, the veil is upon their heart.

Ver. 16. Nevertheless, when it shall turn unto the

LORD, the veil shall be taken away.

Rom. xi. 2. GOD hath not cast away his people,

which he foreknew.

Ver. 12. If the fall of them be the riches of the world, and the diminishing of them the riches of the Gentiles; how much more their fulness?

Ver. 15. For if the casting away of them be the reconciling of the world, what shall the receiving of

them be, but life from the dead?

Ver. 23. And they also, if they abide not still in unbelief, shall be graffed in: for GOD is able to graff them in again.

Ver. 24.—How much more shall these, which be the natural branches, be graffed in their own olive-

tree?

Ver. 25. For I would not, brethren, that ye should be ignorant of this mystery (less ye should be wise in your own conceit) that blindness in part is happened unto Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in.

Ver. 26. Then all Ifrael shall be faved; as it is written, There shall come out of Zion the deliverer, and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob.

Ver. 27. For this is my covenant unto them, when

I shall take away their fins.

Ver. 28. As concerning the gospel, they are enemies for your fakes; but as touching the election, they are beloved for the father's sake.

Ver. 29. For the gifts and calling of GOD are

without repentance. See also ver. 30, 31.

Ver. 32. GOD hath concluded them all in unbelief,

that he might have mercy upon all.

Ver. 33. O the depth of the riches both of the wifdom and knowledge of GOD! How unsearchable are his judgments, and his ways past finding out!

If. xlvi. 11. I have fpoken it, I will also bring it to pass: I have purposed it, I will also do it.

If: Iv. 10. As the rain cometh down, and the fnow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give feed to the fower, and bread to the eater:

Ver. 11. So shall my word be, that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please; and it shall prosper in the thing whereunto I send it.

Heb. x. 23. He is faithful that promised.
