The few meritorious collections of real children's songs, for real children, can be counted on the fingers of one hand. This hook of fifteen little songs by Mrs. Terhune is, therefore, a veritable boon to those who will only be satistied with the best of the music of the child-world. As to the texts, Mrs. Terhune's poems might have been culled from the same "Child's Garden of Verses" in which grew Robert Louis Stevenson's, so natural and unaffected is their charm. The little melodies all have their touches of local colorthey sing of ducks, wind-mills, fog-horns, dachshunds, and tulip beds, in music, that despite its simple and direct character and lack of all pretension, is aglow with the joyous and healthy interest of happy childhood. An important feature of the collection is the set of fifteen delightful illustrations, in color, of little Dutch lads and lassies—explanatory notes to the songs in picture form, the kind the children love best.
