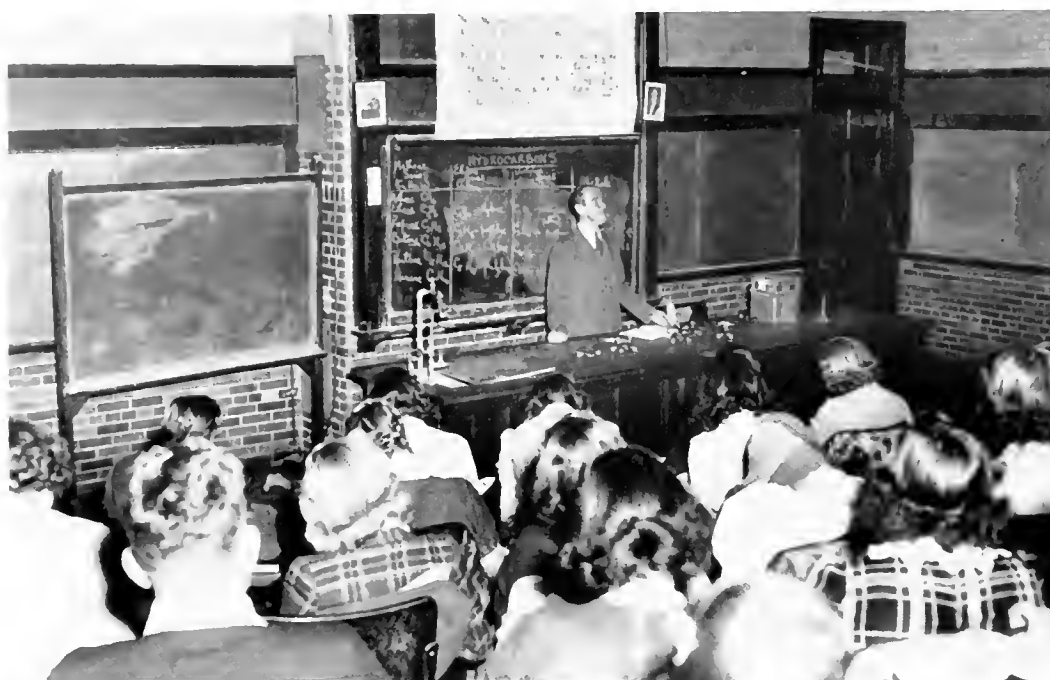

Football Resume

By winning the State Championship in the second year as Head Coach of Football at William and Mary, Carl Voyles has achieved in two years what no other Indian mentor has ever done. After successive seasons of resting near the bottom of the Mythical Big Six League, Voyles, and his aides, sent football on the upswing in Williamsburg by winning games no one expected him to win in 1939, and coming back after two straight losses this fall to earn the first State Championship in the history of the college. Voyles' record showed six wins against two losses and one tie for 1940, identical with the teams' 1939 showing.

Headed by Captain Charles Gondak, four William and Mary players were given positions on the Associated Press All-State Team. Gondak retained the end position that he earned in 1939, while three sophomores, Garrard Ramsey, at guard; Marvin Bass, at tackle, and Harvey Johnson in a half-back post, were the remaining Indians so honored.

A resume of the season's play:

NORTH CAROLINA STATE, 16; WILLIAM AND MARY, 0

North Carolina State's Wolfpack outplayed and outscored a heavily-favored William and Mary football team when it handed the Indians a 16 to 0 setback before 17,000 fans at Norfolk's Foreman Field.

Capitalizing on a fumble and two pass interceptions the Wolfpack held an advantage over the Tribesmen during the first, second and final quarters. Only in the third period did the Indians outplay the Carolinians. Jimmy Howard provided the running thrill of the game with a 58-yard runback after a State kickoff in the second period.

After holding a 7 to 6 lead for more than three-quarters of the game a tiring William and Mary team yielded two touchdowns to powerful Navy reserves in bowing 19 to 7 before 18,000 at Annapolis.

WILLIAM AND MARY, 42; APPRENTICE SCHOOL, 0

With twenty-one points in the first quarter William and Mary rolled up an additional twenty-one to rout Apprentice School 42 to 0 before 2,500 sun-baked spectators in the Tribe's first home appearance of the year, on October 5.

Sparked by Jim Hickey and Howard Hollingsworth, the Tribe had no difficulty in winning their first game of the 1940 season.

Two touchdowns by Korczowski and one by Captain Chuck Gondak enabled the Indians to pound out a 20 to 13 win over a strong V. P. I. eleven at Richmond City Stadium before 9,000 people in a Columbus Day game. It was the sixteenth meeting of the two teams.

WILLIAM AND MARY, 41; HAMPDEN-SYDNEY, 0

Held to a single touchdown in the first half, William and Mary's Indians came back in the second stanza with a burst of power that netted 34 points and an easy win over a scrappy Tiger eleven at Cary Field on October 19. Harvey Johnson led the scoring parade with three touchdowns; Jim Hickey accounting for two others, and Hollingsworth for the sixth score.

WILLIAM AND MARY, 13; VIRGINIA, 6

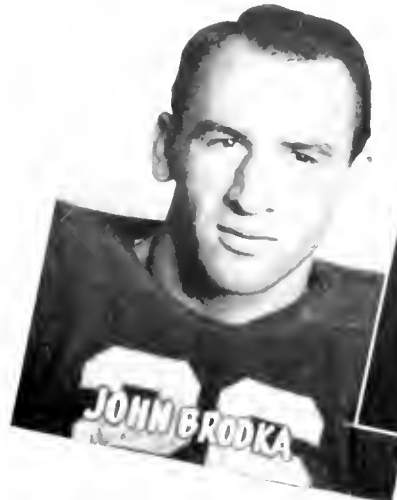
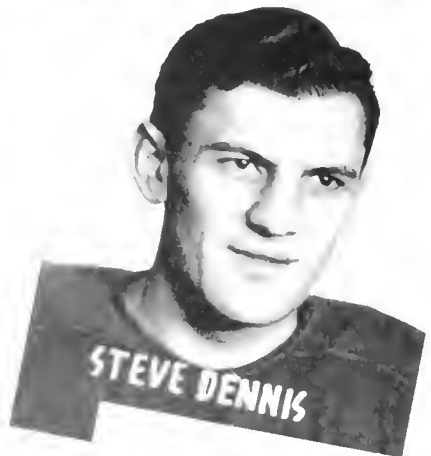
After sustaining eleven consecutive losses at the hands of Virginia's powerful Cavaliers, the William and Mary football team ground out a decisive 13 to 6 win over the visitors before a capacity Home-Coming Day crowd of 10,000 on November 26, and by this win moved into first place in the State Championship race.

Scorers on Virginia only once, that in the fall of 1939, and underdogs in this game, the Indians showed devastating power, both offensively and defensively in crushing the Cavaliers, and harnessing youthful Bill Dudley and Eddie Bryant, Virginia's outstanding backs.

A scoreless tie at the intermission, the Tribe, led by Harvey Johnson, struck quickly in the third period to score their only two touchdowns. Dudley, in the last period, sent a 25-yard pass to end Jim White who crossed the Braves' goal for the lone Cavalier score. The game ended with the ball in the Indian's possession on Virginia's three-yard line.

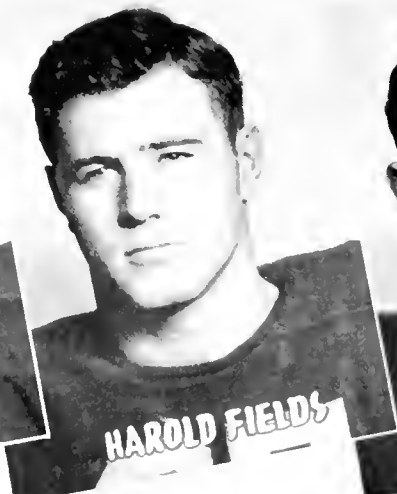

WILLIAM AND MARY, 16; RICHMOND, 0

Winning the State Football Championship for the first time in William and Mary history, the Indians smashed a highly publicized Spider football team 16 to 0 before a record crowd of 18,000 at Richmond's City Stadium in a Thanksgiving Day classic that concluded the most successful football season ever experienced by an Indian team. It was the fifty-first meeting of squads.

Forcing Richmond's great Arthur Jones to lose a total of minus 37 yards and stopping the entire Spider Richmond offensive by handling them a minus two yards for their total gain from scrimmage, the Tribe pounded their traditional rivals for a full sixty minutes in gaining their second triumph in as many years over Richmond. Mentioned for All-American: Jones, and Dick Humbert, and tackle Andy Fronczek were unable to stem the Indian marchers, with the exception of a magnificent goal-line stand in the first period



Freshman Football

William and Mary's 1940 Freshman Football Team, although not as colorful as the "fabulous freshmen" of '39, played hard and well to win three of their five contests. This team of huskies used power plays to a greater extent than they used deceptive plays. They played straight, hard, clean and good football.

In their first game with the Apprentice School frosh, they lost 6-0. The game was still a scoreless deadlock, with only a minute to go, when a pass by the Apprentice elicited and gave them the winning score. So many of the boys were used that it is difficult to mention outstanding players.

The Fork Union game was a different story. On October 4, in Williamsburg, the frosh hit full stride and rode over the strong prep team 14-0. In this game, Watson, Pryor, and Shriner were outstanding in the backfield, as were Ditto, Weaver, and Bearoff in the line. This game showed the power of the freshmen on the offensive.

Their next game was with V. M. I. The Baby Cadets played well, but with the overwhelming power of Jack Ross, tackle, and the fine work of Holloway and Pryor, the Papooses won by 7-0. The Cadets were never able to overtake this lead and the little Indians added the second scalp to their collection.

The Wake Forest frosh ended the freshmen's winning ways and dropped our men 13-7. The frosh had a 7-6 advantage until the final seconds of the game.



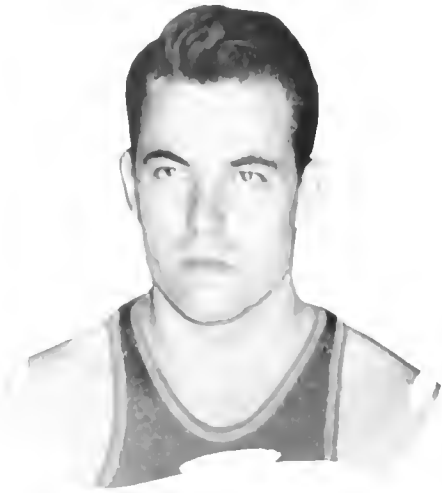

VARSITY BASKET BALL

The 1940 basket ball team pre-season prospects were the best in a decade with six lettermen, Vince Taffee, Morgan Mackey, Tom and Virg Andrews, "Chuck" Gondak, and Syd Brooks, returning for their fourth year of play. After a week of practice, the prospects were even brighter with the appearance of a newcomer, Glenn Knox, who was later to be chosen on the mythical "All-State" team, and rumor ran wild that William and Mary would win the state championship. Resume

On their first road trip of the year, their victory string was broken at the hands of Xavier in Ohio in spite of the 22 points scored by Knox. The next two nights the Indians fared no better, and the powerful teams of Bradley Tech and Miami University handed our boys decisive lickings. Returning to Virginia, after the Christmas holidays, the basketballers found the competition more to their liking and quickly polished off Randolph-Macon, V. M. I., and V. P. I.

In the first game of the season which was to prove a deciding factor in the state race, the Generals turned the tide on the Indians by a score of 35-29. It was a hard fought contest which featured the guarding of a newcomer to the line-up, Waldo Matthews, who soon became a regular starter. The game at Charlottesville with the University of Virginia was unsuccessful and the Indian Quintet had to be satisfied with the short end of a 48-32 score.

Dissatisfied with the team's showing thus far, Coach Stuessey made some changes in the starting line-up by adding two sophomores, Lester Hooker and Hal King. The experiment proved unsuccessful in the first game which was with V. M. I., but after



the newcomers overcame their stage fright, they bowled over Randolph-Macon, University of Richmond, Furman University, and V. P. I. In the return contest with the University of Virginia it looked as though the Indian eagles were going to avenge the early season defeat as they led up until the final seconds of the game, only to lose by a one-point margin.

Going North for the second time, they handed the University of Maryland its seventeenth straight defeat, but lost to a powerful Navy outfit by a score of 51-32. Hampden-Sydney proved a set-up but our ancient rivals from Richmond were different, and in spite of the brilliant shooting of Knox, who scored 22 points, the Spiders taught the Indians a basket ball lesson. In the last game of the scheduled season, the Washington and Lee Generals returned to Lexington on the short end of a 34-32 score after the game went into an overtime period.

The Indians received a bid to the Conference tournament, and though they were able to overcome their first rival, Wake Forest, the strong Duke Blue Devils eliminated them in the semi-final round.

Before he could find a capable replacement, the Baby Indians were defeated by Newport News and Thomas Jefferson. At this point, Eddie Motley took over the coaching duties and before the boys could become adjusted to the new system, they were defeated by the Richmond Frosh on two occasions, and also by Fork Union. Again led by Weaver, the Frosh won a hard fought decision over Augusta Military Academy by 39-37. In their final game of the season, the Baby Indians were defeated by Massanutten Military Academy.

Though the record for the season was poor, the team did show many players who are certain to see action with the varsity in the future. The most prominent were Weaver and Fleming, who were excellent shots. The floor work of Gooden and Grembourtz, gave definite proof of two other outstanding players.

The Chandlermen opened their season on March 30th, with a loss to V. M. I. at Lexington on a rain-soaked track. Waldo Matthews was outstanding for the Indians scoring firsts in the discus and high jump and a second in the broad jump. V. M. I.'s superior strength in the running events was the deciding factor of this meet.

On the following week the track stars, on their home field, chalked up their first victory of the season; the Apprentice School being the underling of the 95-31 score. Matthews, Kelley, and Maisch turned in stellar performances, each scoring ten or more points.

Again on April 20th, the cindermen met the Apprentice School. This time the Apprentice team showed better form and the Indian's margin was less. The score this time being 80-38.

The University of Virginia was host to the Indians on April 29th and handed them a 91-35 shellacking for their second loss of the year. Mathews, with a first in the discus, and Cason, with a first in the 880-yard run, were the only trackmen to score firsts against the strong Virginia team.

On May 4th, our traditional rivals, the University of Richmond, handed the Indians their third loss. The Indians were much better in the running events, but the Richmonders took all places in the shot, javelin, high jump, and broad jump, and won the meet by their superiority in the field events. The final score was 75-51.

In the annual State Meet, William and Mary scored 16 points to take a fifth place. Captain Bob Rawls won the pole vault, and Matthews won the discus throw. The remaining points were scored by Griffin Callahan with a third in the high hurdles, and by Masters with a third in the 100-yard dash.

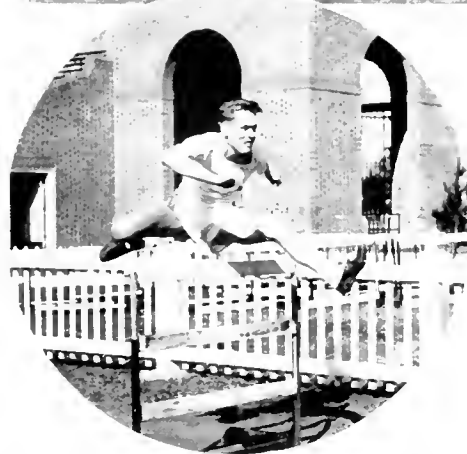
Southern Conference Track Meet

William and Mary was host to the 18th Annual Southern Conference Track and Field championships for the first time since they were inaugurated. This meet was held in Williamsburg on May 17-18. As for many years past, the ever strong University of North Carolina team, the speedy Maryland team, and a scrappy Duke team dominated the meet.

Since the University of North Carolina and the University of Maryland were both particularly strong in the 880, the mile, and the two-mile runs, these were perhaps the featured events of the meet. The spectators were not disappointed for they saw Fields of Maryland spike the cinders for a new record of 9:38.6 for the two-mile run. Kehoe and Chronister of Maryland and Morrison of University of North Carolina highlighted the 880 yard run: Kehoe, the winner, had the excellent time of 1:54 for the event. In the mile run, Maryland's big three, Kehoe, Chronister, and Fields led the field and took the first three places in the order mentioned.

William and Mary did well for the material she had for such competition. Captain Bob Rawls won the pole vault with a leap of 13 feet. Waldo Mathews picked up points with his fourth place heave in the discus event. The remainder of the points scored by William and Mary were taken by the timber topping abilities of Grillin Callahan and Harry Maisch. Callahan took second place in the 220 yard low hurdles and third place in 120-yard high hurdles. Maisch placed fifth in the latter event.

Officials and coaches from the other schools were so well pleased with the track and the manner in which the meet was handled, that they designated William and Mary a host for next year's games. The efforts of Coaches Voyles and Chandler, in particular, were responsible for this honor.





FRESHMAN TRACK

By winning all five of their scheduled meets, the William and Mary freshman track team had a more successful season than their brothers. V. M. I. (Frosh), Newport News High, Thomas Jefferson High, John Marshall High, and the University of Richmond (Frosh) fell before the winning ways of the freshman team.

Outstanding performances were turned in by Philip Thomas, Mat Crawford, Jack Warner, Scotty Cunningham and Bill Lugar.

On March 30, in Lexington, they bowled over the baby Cadets with plenty to spare. The final score was W. & M. 74, V. M. I., 43.

The next week the frosh had a hard time turning back the strong Newport News teams by a one point margin, the score being 59-58.

John Marshall High of Richmond was taken much easier in the next meet. The frosh trounced their rivals 76-41.

Thomas Jefferson found the little Indians tough going and came out on the low end of a 66-50 score.

The freshmen once more showed their superiority when they trounced Richmond's frosh team by the score of 86-30. This was the last scheduled dual meet of 1940. Their only other appearance was in the State Meet on May 11, in which they placed fourth with 233 1/2 points.

Starting the season with one of the smallest squads in years, the William and Mary baseball team consisted of only two lettermen and an inexperienced pitching staff.

After two weeks practice, the opening game with Washington and Lee found a starting line-up which consisted of six Sophomores and three Juniors. With Tom Crane, Sophomore southpaw, hurling seven hit balls and Dick Sills, Tom Andrews and Clyde Haley contributing two hits apiece, the Indians scored in the opening stanza and were never headed as they easily won 7-5.

The very next day, Jimmy Howard, third baseman, had a field day at bat and led the team to a 3-2 victory over a strong University of Vermont outfit. The same University of Vermont team came back on the following day to collect fifteen hits and a 15-1 victory over the Indians.

Playing away from home for the first time, defeat was met at the hands of V. P. I. The Gobblers collected eleven hits off the pitching of Crane and Purill, and though Captain Virgil Andrews got three hits, the score remained 8-5.

Between the effective six hit pitching of Nickols, the slugging of McCann, the University of Virginia downed William and Mary 8-1. Dick Sills, Sophomore first baseman, starred for the Indians as he gained two hits in four appearances at the plate.

Washington and Lee got revenge at Lexington as they hit Merritt and Crane hard in a loosely played contest which ended with them on the long end of a 9-7 score.

Wake Forest pitching held the Indians to three scattered hits and combined timely hitting to easily score a 9-4 win.

Tom Crane let the University of Maryland down with seven scattered hits, and Captain Andrews collected two hits to assure the Indians a 2-1 victory.

Making it two in a row over Southern Conference opponents, the Indians led by Tom Andrews, second baseman, handed the strong Wake Forest team a 4-3 upset.

The ancient rivals from Richmond broke the winning streak by handing the William and Mary men a 8-3 setback.

Ray Merritt of William and Mary, and Petigo of Randolph-Macon hooked up in a mound duel for seventeen innings, only to have the game end in a 3-3 tie.

Richmond made it two in a row over the Indians, as they belted the William and Mary pitching staff for thirteen hits and eleven runs, while the Indians were able to collect only six. Although out-hit, the University of Virginia Cavaliers were able to subdue a late Indian uprising and defeat them 13-11.

Next the Indians took a northern road trip which proved anything but a success. Beset by injuries and a small squad the ailing Indians defeated the University of Vermont one game; tied the University of Vermont once, and lost to Maryland, Navy, Yale, Amherst, and Norwich.

In the final game, Roy Merritt gave a masterful pitching exhibition which landed the Indians on the long end of a score with V. M. I.



FRESHMAN BASEBALL

Probably the best record for all sports during 1940 was that of freshman baseball. It was Pop Werner's second year as coach and though he did not have a large quantity of material, a winning combination was worked out that was never stopped.

In the opening game against Hopewell High School, who had a better than average team, the freshman demonstrated the potential power of the squad as they collected a total of 14 hits. Leading the hitting in this game and continuing throughout the season were John Korczowski and Harvey Johnson, both outfielders, whose reputations as football players had already been made.

The next three games were with McGuire, Benedictine and Crewe, and though the teams of these schools boasted of excellent records they were no match for our powerful frosh. The first real competition of the season was furnished by the University of Richmond as the two teams battled to a 4-4 tie for nine innings. In the tenth inning there were two men on base and the Richmond strategy walked Johnson purposely only to have Korczowski follow him with a home run. Two victories were registered over Thomas Jefferson of Richmond on consecutive days and the season was successfully closed against the Spider Frosh.

The team not only had an undefeated record, but what is more important furnishes many players who will be of valuable aid to Rube McCray's varsity in the future. Johnson and Korczowski are the two most likely to find a starting berth on this year's varsity, but Lane Philips may be heard from because of his excellent defensive work behind the plate.

Beginning its second season under the tutelage of Scrap Chandler, the swimming team looked forward to a none too successful season as most of last year's stars had been lost through graduation. There were only ten men answering the call for the opening practice, and though they were all capable, the quantity was much too small.

In the first meet the tankmen fell victim to a powerful University of North Carolina foe by a score of 45-23. The only encouraging feature of the meet was the excellent showing made by the medley team composed of Edwards, Almond and Merritt.

The next opponent, Norfolk Division, was little more than a set-up, and the Indians took first place in every event as they completely out-classed the boys from Norfolk. Running their consecutive victories to two straight the Indian mermen, led by Captain Tom Brennan, defeated the University of Virginia by a count of 42-33. The medley team again took first, as did Tom Brennan in the 220-yard free style and in the 150-yard back stroke. Vince Wooley and Tom Brennan finished first and second, respectively, in the grueling 440-yard free style which was the actual difference between a win and a loss.

The trip to Lexington to meet the V. M. J. Keydets was an unsuccessful one, and our boys were unable to gain more than three out of nine firsts and consequently finished on the short end of a 45-24 score. North Carolina State's powerful team came to Williamsburg and went away with a 47-28 victory and a new Blow pool record for the 150-yard backstroke.

The season closed at Blacksburg with the Southern Conference Meet. Though none of the Indians took any firsts, the total team record was good enough to earn a fourth place. The faithful medley team took a fourth; the relay team placed third; Almond placed third in the 200-yard breast-stroke, and Captain Brennan took fifth in the 150-yard backstroke.

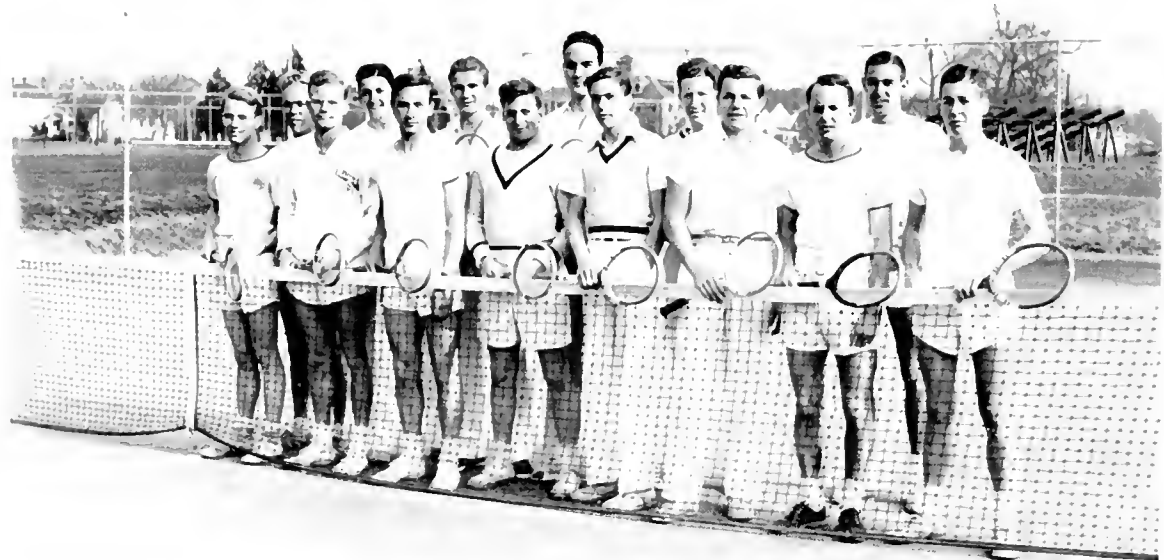

The 1940 Golf Team had a discouraging season—winning four and losing eight matches. The strongest team William and Mary could muster was composed of Bruce Simmons, Bob Hornsby, McKie Trotter, and "Pineky" Newton.

Boston College's traveling team were the first to hand the Indians a defeat. When the scores were added, Boston College had a $10\frac{1}{2}$ to $7\frac{1}{2}$ victory. Bruce Simmons, playing number two, gave William and Mary its only victory of the day.

Ohio State did not help any by trouncing the golfers 8-4 the next day. On the next week-end the Indians dropped two more to Fordham and Penn. The scores of both being 6-3.

Finally the team got on the winning side by defeating the Norfolk Division 16-2 and the Apprentice School 10-8.

But a week after these victories the teams won one and lost three on a four-day trip. On April 17, they dropped the match to Washington and Lee by $16\frac{1}{2}$ $1\frac{1}{2}$; the next day University of Virginia shut them out 6-0; then Hampden-Sydney, headed by Captain Bennett Barnes and George Fulton, gave them a 16-2 drubbing. On the following day the Indians swung their way to a 13-5 victory over V. M. I.

On May 9 the team nicely reversed an earlier decision and beat Hampden-Sydney $8\frac{1}{2}$ to $3\frac{1}{2}$. Two days later, in the last meet of the year, Navy defeated the huckless Indians $7\frac{1}{2}$ $1\frac{1}{2}$. Three days of round robin matches were played. On the last afternoon of play, an All American First Team and an All American Reserve Team composed of best players from all over the United States played an exhibition match. The Reserves edged out the Firsts 2-1 to win the game.
