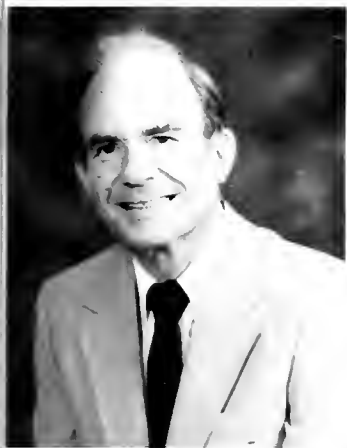

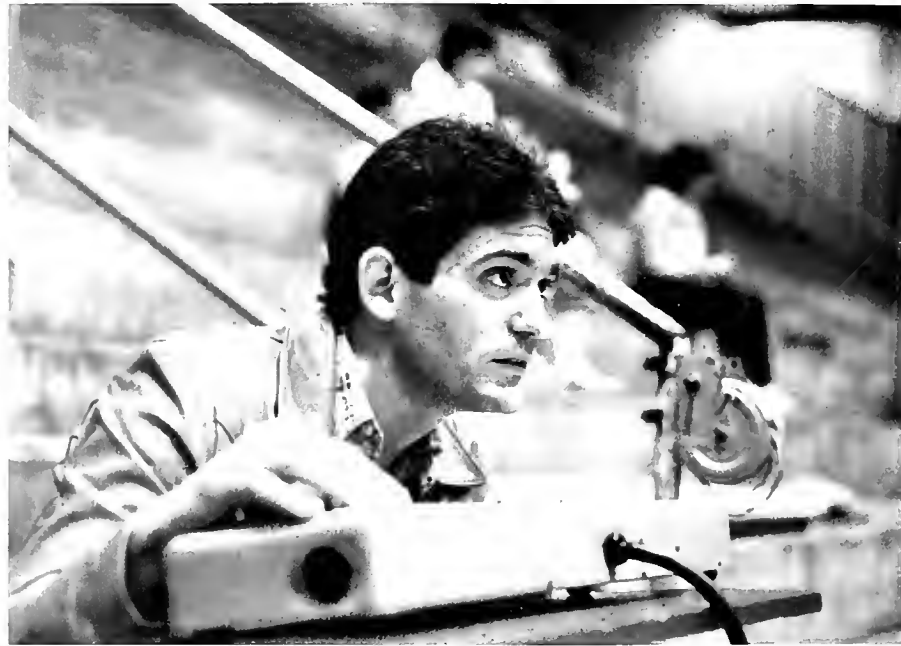

The Lady Lions held a slim 12-point advantage at the half against Georgia Baptist, but erupted for 71 seconds if marked to coast to their most lop-sided victory ever.

Carol Cummings dropped in 22 points to support, and the trio of Candace Tullous, Karee Misty Chambers bucketed 14, 13 and 10. Tullous led demon on the boards with 11 caroms.

Exciting freshman Kim Wells was on top of her game with 28 game-high points, 7 steals and 5 assists to lead their second straight win. Cummings again notched 11 for Br.

Billy White poured in 23 points and Steve Parker tacked on 18 to lead the Covenant Scots to a 79-69 win over Bryan College last Saturday night at Covenant.

The victory upped the Scots record to 16-14 on the year, while Bryan fell to 6-22.

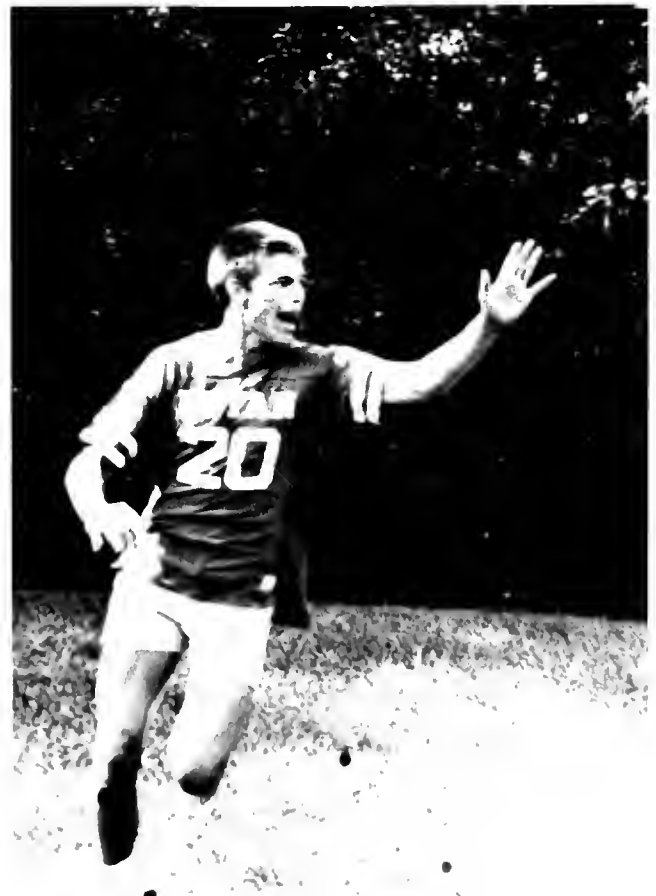

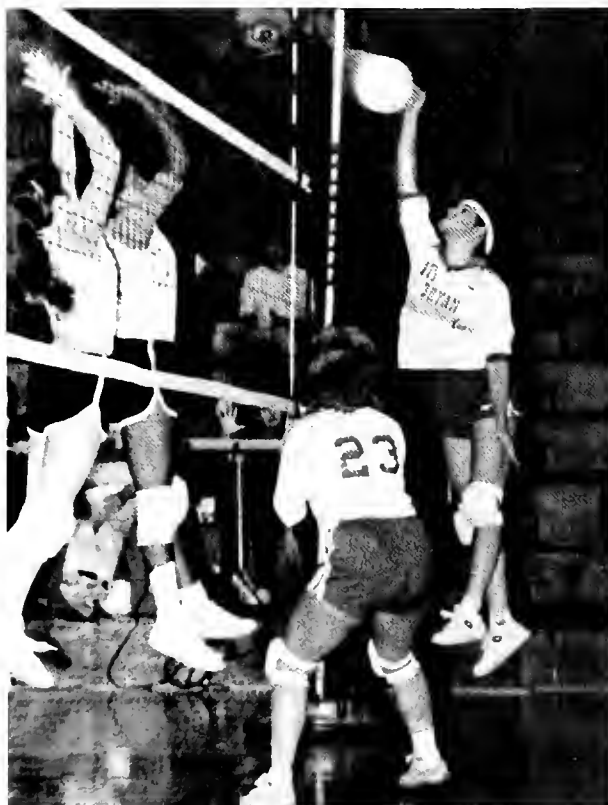
