COMMUNICATION FROM ATTORNEY GENERAL.

Department of Justice, Richmond, Dec. 15, 1863.

To the PRESIDENT:

Sir: I have the honor to submit the following additional estimates for the expenditures of this Department for the period ending 30th June next:

- 1. For printing, ruling, and binding for the several Executive Departments, twenty-five thousand dollars, \$25,000
- 2. For printing, ruling, and binding, for both Houses of Congress, including the printing of the laws in the authorized form, ten thousand dollars, \$10,000
- 3. For the purchase of paper for the several Executive Departments and Congress, twenty thousand dollars, \$20,000

I enclose a copy of the letter from the Superintendent of Public Printing, giving a reason why the original estimates did not include the several amounts now asked.

LETTER FROM THE SUPT PUBLIC PRINTING.
