



Preface.

THIS little work is offered to the Trade, Librarians, and the Public for use as a supplementary volume to Lowndes's "Bibliographer's Manual." Having had fifteen years' LONDON experience as a Professional Cataloguer, to such firms as Messrs. J. & M. L. TREGASKIS, of the "Caxton Head"; Mr. E. MENKEN; Messis. A. I. Myers & Co.; Mr. Alfred Cooper; Messis. J. BAMBER & Co., etc., I have, during that time, had opportunities of handling some of the best stocks on the London Market, and have, naturally, met with many curious anonymous and pseudonymous works needing elucidation, to say nothing of hundreds of interesting items to which the author's name is appended, but of which no notice can be found either in Lowndes or Allibone. My original intention, when I began this work some twelve years ago, was to form a fresh Manual for Bibliographers, brought up to date, most of the matter given in Lowndes having long been obsolete, whilst, of course, no mention of Books published within the last twenty-five years can be found there at all. To that effect, particulars of every work which came under my notice whilst cataloguing, to which no reference could be found in above Bibliographical works, were carefully noted, also all anonymous and pseudonymous Literature. Nor must the London Sale Rooms be omitted. Having attended most of the principal London auctions at Messrs. Sotheby's, Christie's, and PUTTICK's for many years, a fair picking has resulted from these quarters. Of the existence of Messrs. Halkett & Laing's work on Anonymous Literature, etc., I am quite aware, and shall always regard it as the standard work on the subject, and not likely to be superseded. The amount of labour involved in its compilation I can

somewhat gauge from the time spent in the construction of this small volume. But alas! it has one inevitable fault, if one may be allowed to use such a word in connection with so splendid a work-its price precludes many persons from adding it to their collections; particularly the Bookseller, who, as a business man, cannot afford to let so much capital lie idle for "Works of Reference." That much, if not all, of the matter contained in this small book may be found in the four thick volumes of the above is highly probable, but I cannot express an opinion on the subject, not having had the good fortune to be able to afford myself a copy, though it is a work I should dearly like to possess, and my advice to all who can afford it is get it by all means. In compiling this volume I have had to rely mainly on works which have come under my own observation, either as a Cataloguer or in the Sale Room. There is an admirable list in the older edition of Clegg's "Directory of Booksellers," and I have been able to reduce the bulk of the present work a great deal by excluding much matter which, though it has actually passed through my hands, may readily be found by referring to that useful little volume which is, doubtless, in the possession of most Booksellers to-day. My chief aim has been, not competition with anything at present on the market (indeed as far as Halkett and Laing's work is concerned, in my opinion this would not be possible), but rather to supply, as far as in my power, information not readily to be found in Lowndes, Allibone, or Brunet; and in attempting the same, to study accuracy in detail. To ensure this I have spared neither time nor trouble. As may be supposed some errors have, doubtless, crept in, and with regard to these I shall be glad to receive notices and corrections from the reader, with a view to possible amendment in any future edition. The compilation of the work has been to me more of a pleasure than labour, and was not primarily executed as a means of making money. Should the little volume meet any present trade requirements, I shall consider myself more than repaid for my labour; and in putting it on the Market I do so with a hope that Booksellers, Librarians, and even Private Collectors, into whose hands the work may come, will find in its pages some information with which they were previously unacquainted.

The arrangement adopted has been alphabetical, under author's real name (the usual brackets use I being excluded), with references in the Text to Pseudonymns and Initials, besides full and complete Index of Titles to anonymous works noticed. Immediate reference to any desired book is thus rendered most simple. I may mention, with regard to the PRIVATELY PRINTED items noticed, that whilst the majority are anonymous, still a few are not. However, I have allowed them to remain, the number being very small. Respecting the prices affixed, they are only approximate, and in most instances where no price is mentioned the value is under 5s., though this is not always the case.

Should this small volume meet with sufficient encouragement, and my business engagements permit, I may be tempted to issue another volume containing similar accounts of works which, though not anonymous or pseudonymous, cannot be found either in Lowndes, Brunet, or Allibone.

Adolphus (J. L.) Letters to Richard Heber on the Series of Novels beginning with "Waverley," and an attempt to ascertain their author, post 8vo. 1822. The Waverley Novels were either Anonymous or Pseudonymous, and their author-ship excited much controversy, many celebrated Writers (including Byron) having been suspected. The real Author at the time denied their paternity.

He was of opinion that it was probably the only copy in existence.

Allen (Jos.) Memoir of the Life and Services of Admiral Sir W. Hargood, portrait, roy. 8vo, 1841. Privately Printed.

Allen (W.) Mystery of the Temple and City in Ezekiel, 12mo, 1677. This author was Vicar of Bridgewater.

Allen (William) Discourse of Divine Assistance and the method thereof, fcp. 8vo, 1693. Praised by Bishops Williams and Kidder.

Alt (George) The Nuremberg Chronicle, by Hartman Schedel, German Text nearly 2500 woodcuts by Wolgemut (Master of Albert Durer) and Pleydenwurff, folio, *Nurem. Ant. Koberger*, 1493. Rare and valuable. A good and perfect copy is worth £10 to £12.

Amherst (Nicholas) Terræ Filius, or Secret History of Oxford University, etc., frontispiece by Hogarth, post 8vo, 1726. Further particulars may be gleaned from the *Gent's Mag*, 1837, p. 373, and the third vol. of Hallam's Constitutional History. Present market value about 10s. 6d.

Amours and Gallantry, History of Noble and Polite Persons at Home and Abroad, with Curious Observations, trans. from the French, 2 vols., 1728. The author of these Scandalous Memoirs still remains anonymous. Their style reminds one forcibly of Mrs. Manley's "Atlantis." A good copy is now worth a guinea.

Amyot (Jacques) Longus. Amours de Daphnis et Chloé, with reproductions of the figures of the Regent Phillippe (without Letters), including "Les Petits Pieds," fcp. 8vo, Londres, 1779. A rare edition. Sells readily at 21s.

Anandria, ou Confession de Mademoiselle Sapho, avec la clef, 12mo, 1778—1866. Contains 4 plates. The Key gives the names of Mme. De Fleury, The Duchess of Villeroy, The Marchionesses of Villeroy, Senecterre, and De Luchet. About 15s.

Anburey (T.) Travels through the Interior Parts of America, by An Officer, map and plates, 2 vols., 8vo. London, 1789.

Anderson (H.) The Court Convert (Poetry), sm. 12mo., For the Author s.d.

Anderson (J.) Sketches of Edinburgh Clergy, 6 ports., 8vo, 1832.
About 5s.

Anderson (J. L.) Life of Bp. Ken, by a Layman, Svo, pubd. by Pickering, 1851. There is also another edn. in 2 vols., pubd. by Murray, 1854. Neither is worth more than 5s.

Anderton (John, a Lancashire Friest) The Protestant Apologie for the Roman Church, by J. Brereley, fcp. 8vo, 1608. Very rare, £1.

Angler (An).—See Davy (Sir H.).

Annual Anthology, Two Series, 2 vols., fcp. 8vo, Bristol, 1799—1800. Contains some of the very earliest pieces by Chas. Lamb, and his Friend Charles Lloyd, S. T. Coleridge, etc., etc.

Anser Pen Drag-on. - See Ireland (W. H.).

Anthologia Hibernica, plates, 4 vols., 8vo, Dublin, 1793-4. Contains the earliest Literary effort of the Celebrated Tom Moore.

Anti-Gallican (The), or Standard of British Loyalty, etc., folding and other caricature plates (Gillray's style), 8vo, 1804. 7s. 6d. An amusing "Buonaparte" item. The plates are sometimes coloured.

Apperley (J. C.) Horse and Hound; with plates and woodcuts, cr. 8vo, 1842, first edition. Most of the plates are by Henry Alken. Sells at about 10s. 6d.—Nimrod's Memoirs of the Life of John Mytton, Esq., 18 colonred plates by H. Alken and T. J. Rawlins, roy. 8vo, 1837. £6 or more. The second edition, issued the same year, is really the best, contains 6 plates not in the first; a good copy, £10. The third edition, with all the 18 plates, roy. 8vo, 1851, is also rare.—The Chase, The Turf, and The Road, by "Nimrod," first edn., 8vo, Murray, 1837, portrait by Maclise, and illusts by H. Alken, about £2—Sporting, edited by "Nimrod," 38 beautiful plates by Landseer, Gainsborough, Cooper, etc., folio, Baily, 1838, first edn., 3os.—The Chase, by "Nimrod," feap. 8vo, sewed, illustrated, 1852.—Nimrod's Remarks on the Conditions of Hunters, etc., 8vo, Pilmann, 1834, 7s. 6d. Another edn., 8vo, 1837.—Nimrod's Hunting Tours, with Letters on Riding to Hounds, 8vo, 1835, first edn., 15s.

Appleyard (E. G.) Principles of Protestantism considered with a View to Unity, post 8vo, 1849. The Greek Church, a Sketch, 1851.

Arbuthnot (F. F.) and Burton (R. F.) The Kama Sutra of Vatsyayna; Ananga Ranga, or Hindu Art of Love; and Perfumed Garden of the Sheik Nefzaoui, 3 vols, sm. 8vo. All printed for Private Circulation only by the Kama Shastra Soc., 1883-6. These 3 vols, all highly *erotic*, are worth together £6.

Armstrong (Dr.) The Œconomy of Love, a Poetical Essay, 8vo, 1749, 7s. 6d. Rare.

Arnold (Matthew) The Strayed Reveller, and other Poems by "A," sm. post 8vo, Fellowes. 1849. Of great rarity in the original cloth and uncut. Only 100 copies were printed, and it was withdrawn from publication by the author. £5 to £6. Has sold at auction within the last few years for £10. The companion volume, "Empedocles on Etna," same size and publisher, 1852, was suppressed before 50 copies were sold. It is of similar value.

Ashbee (H. S.) Frani. A complete set of his work comprises: Vol. I., Index Librorum, etc., 1877. Vol. II., Centuria Librorum, etc., 1879. Vol. III., Catena Librorum, etc., 1885. All thk. impl. 8vo. The three together are worth £18; and if there is any choice, the first volume is slightly more valuable than the others.

Ashe (T.) The Spirit of "The Book," or Memoirs of Caroline, Princess of Hapsburgh (a Political and Amatory Romance), 3 vols., post 8vo, 1811. Ten or twelve shillings.

Ashmore (J.) Certain Selected Odes of Horace Englished, with Lat. and Eng. Epigrammes, etc., 4to, R. Moore, 1621. Griffith prices this at £4.4s. There is also a notice in Censura Literaria.

- Asserino (L.) Almerinde, sm. 8vo, 1646. Has large woodcut device by Augustin Courbe on title.
- **Astruc** (Jean) Conjectures sur les Mémoires Originaux dont il paroit que Moyse s'est servi pour composer le Livre de la Genèse, 8vo, *Bruxelles*, 1753.
- Atkinson (A.) Roll of a Tennis Ball through the World, by a Solitary Traveller, 8vo, Dublin, 1812. Contains curious Articles on Chastity, Mrs. Woolstonecraft's Rights of Woman, and Account of the Mennonists.

- Aytoun (W. E.) and Martin (Sir T.) Bon Gaultier's Book of Ballads, illust. by Alf. Crowquill, 12mo, Orr & Co., 1845. This, the first, issue is very rare, and worth to-day at least 30s.
- Aytoun (Prof.) Firmillien, the Student of Badajoz, by T. Percy Jones, i.e., Prof. Aytoun, post 8vo, 1855.
- Bacon (J.) Festerum Metropolis: The Metropolitan Feast on the Birth Day of Our Saviour Jesus Christ, annually to be kept Holy, 77 pp., 4to, 1652. Contains an exceedingly curious old Christmas Carol at pp. 23-6. Attributed to J. Bacon, of Sheirborne, Gloucester.
- **Baddeley** (R.) The Boy of Bilson: the pretended expulsion of the Devil out of a young Boy in the County of Stafford, sm. 4to, 1622. Curious and rare.
- Badeslade (T.) Hist. of the Ancient and Present State of the Port of King's Lynn, Cambridge, etc., engravings, plans, etc. (some coloured), folio, 1766. About 15s.
- Bailey (S., of Sheffield) Essays on the Formation, etc., of Opinious, 8vo, 1826. Rationale of Political Sentiments, 8vo, 1826. The latter item is scarce.

- Earker (M. H.) Jem Bunt, with 23 illusts by R. Cruikshank, 8vo, N.D. About 12s, if unfoxed, which it seldom is, and slightly more in parts.—Land and Sea Tales by "The Old Sailor," cr. 8vo, 2 illusts by G. Cruikshank E. Wilson, 1836. About 10s., cleau in cloth.—Tough Yarns, by "The Old Sailor," of similar value.—The Old Sailor's Jolly-Boat, etchings by R. Cruikshank, 8vo, 1844, first edition, 12s. to 15s.—Nights at Sea, by "The Old Sailor," illustrated by G. Cruikshank. This originally appeared in Bentley's Miscellany.
- Barkham (J., of Bocking.—Guillim (J.) A Display of Heraldry, etc., folio, 1638-40. Best edition, with additions by R. St. John Clarenceux, the subsequent editions were spoilt by R. Blome and other ignorant editors.
- Barrett (E. S.) The Rising Sun, 3 vols., and the Setting Sun, 3 vols, both by Cervantes Hogg. These facetious works, issued early this Century, should have folding satirical frontispieces, in colours (Rowlandson's style), to each volume. Rarely found perfect market value when so, 10s. each set.—The Tarantula, or Dance of Fools, a Satirical Work, by Cervantes Hogg, 2 extraordinary folding frontispieces, 2 vols., post 8vo, 1809. Rare, 10s.

- Barrow (Isaac) Discourse against Transubstantiation, 1684. Discourse against Purgatory, 1685. Both 4to size.

- Basire (Dr. Isaac) History of the English and Scottish Presbytery; wherein is discovered their Designs and Practices for Subversion of Government in Church and State, frontispiece, 12mo, Villa Franca, 1659. Contains the XXXIX. Articles in black letter, etc., Declaration of K Charles in Latin, English, and French, prepared by J. Howel.—Another edn., 1660, both should have frontispieces. There is also a French translation, 1660.
- Baxter (Andrew) Enquiry into the Nature of the Human Soul, 2 vols., 8vo, 1737.—Matho, or the Cosmotheria Puerilis, 2 vols., 12mo, 1765. There is an earlier edn. than this, which I have not seen, it is however of no importance.
- Baxter (Nathaniel) Sir Philip Sidney's Ourania, i.e., Endimion's Song and Tragedie, containing all Philosophie, by N. B., 4to, E. Alde, for E. White, 1606. First edition, and very rare. Four or Five Pounds. Has also been attributed to Nicholas Breton.
- Bayley (F. W. N.) Four Years' Residence in the West Indies, with Narrative of Hurricanes and Earthquakes, plates, thk. 8vo, 1833. Pub. at 24s.
- Bayly (Lewis, Bp. of Bangor) The Practice of Pietie, 24mo (Delf), N.D., circa 1636.
- Beach (J., of Wrexham) Eugenio: or Virtuous and Happy Life, a Poem inscribed to Pope (with woodcut view of his grotto), 4to, 1737.
- Beauchamp (De) Les Amours d'Ismene et d'Ismenias, vignette, coloured title, and 4 coloured plates 4to. Paris, 1797. Large Paper. No small paper copy has come under my notice. Cohen does not know the work at all.

Ordinary copies worth about 35s., and Large Paper £3 10s.—Vathek, ed. by (Sir) R. Garnett, LL.D., Notes by S. Henley, etchings by Herbert Nye, 8vo, 1893. Only 450 copies for England, 1893. The most beautiful edn. extant. Memoirs of W. Beckford (by Cyrus Redding), portrait, 2 vols., cr. 8vo, 1859. He also pubd. Biographical Memoirs of Extraordinary Painters, fcp. 8vo, 1834, which is of nominal value.

Beddoes (Thos., M.D., of Clifton) Alexander's Expedition down the Hydaspes and the Indus to the Indian Ocean, a Poem, with copious notes, curious woodcuts, 4to, Madeley, Privately Printed, 1792. Only a few copies done, and the work was NOT PUBLISHED. It was printed at the expense of W. Reynolds, Esq., and the types were set by a woman, whilst the engravings were done by the CLERK OF THE PARISH. For full accounts see Bibliotheca Parriana, and Stock's Memoirs of Thos. Beddoes, 1811, p. 68. Worth three guineas.

Bede (Cuthbert).—See "Bradley."

Bedford (H.) Hereditary Right of the Crown of England Asserted, History of the Succession since the Conquest cleared, etc., by a Gentleman, folio, 1713, 7s. 6d. H. Bedford, a Clergyman, the assumed Author of this book, was sentenced to a term of imprisonment and a heavy fine for writing the same.

Beresford (J.) Bibliosophia, or Book Wisdom, 1810. This gent. also wrote and published, anonymously, "Miseries of Human Life," 2 vols, 12mo, 1826, and "More Miseries."

Berkeley (Bp.) Adventures of Sig. Gaudentio di Lucca, being his Examination before the Fathers of the Inquisition, Bologne, etc., post 8vo, 1774. This curious work is generally attributed to above gentleman, but the authorship is doubtful.

Berridge (Rev. J.) Justification by Faith Alone, 12mo, 1762.




