Sopfiomore, Roy Howelf, a member of Circte $K$ and a participant in the event, said, "the event was an ombrous reminder of the possible effects that drunk driving can fiave on its victims."

The college provided its students witfi a cuftural symposium entitled "The Political Eartfiquake of 1989" in whicf many noted scfwlars from foreign countries participated. Panel discussions about the events that rocked our world were fued to inform students and faculty of the momentous changes affecting sucf nations as Czachoslovakia, Great Britain, Poland, Yugoslavia, and Germany. Spirits felf twice more this spring with the deaths of fifteen-year Senate member Jofin Heinz and ten-year Goard of trustee cfuairman, V. Lester Sfireiber (April 4 and 5, respectively). It was indeed an exciting, eventful, and educational Spring Semester '9I.

## SPRING STMPOSIUM

Symposium 1991 was aptly titled "The Poditical Eartfiquake of 1989: The Aftermath and Future," for it dealt with the sweeping political changes taking place in Eastern Europe during and since the faff of 1989.

The purpose of the Symposium was to encourage discussion and analysis of the political and economic impact of the events of that autumin on the "new Europe", specifically the countries of Czechoslovakia, Poland, Hungary, and the recently unified Germany. Guests from those countries as welf as from Great Britain and Yugosfavia conducted public forums during the three-day event.
The Symposium sesstons also dealt with what the US rote is and should be in Eastern Europe. Niget Asfiford, an associate professor of political sctence at Staffordsfire Polytechnic, in Great Britain, said that the United States' Cong term participation in NATO fuas caused a decline in us economic growth, and that the purpose of that military presence sfiould not be to defeat Communism, Gut rather to support representative democracies. The danger of this though, fie warned, is that the US becomes policeman for the world.
Asfiford noted that the US is as interdependent on the rest of the world as the rest of the world is on it, considering the ghobal communications net work and ecomomy. He said that the causes of peace and prosperity could best be served by promoting trade, and economic and social excfiange.
The reunification of Germany was a major part of many of the discusstons that took place. Horste Ropke, of what was East Germany, said that the main reason Communism felf was Gecause of the United State's presence in Europe since World War II. Ropke commented that the reunification process is a gradual one. Stepfian Eisel, the deputy director of the private office of Chancellor Hetmut Kofh, satd, "Germany is our fatfierfand, 6 ut Europe is our community."
