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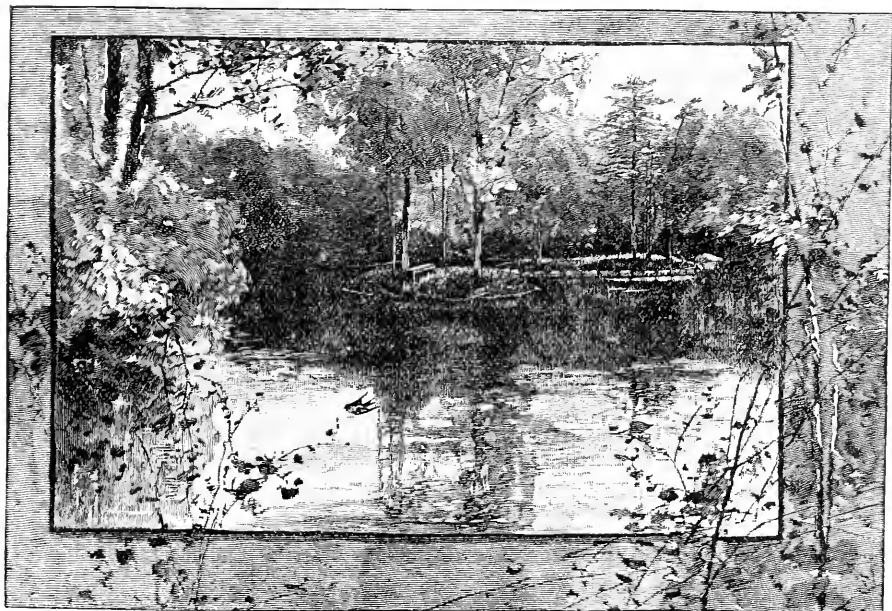

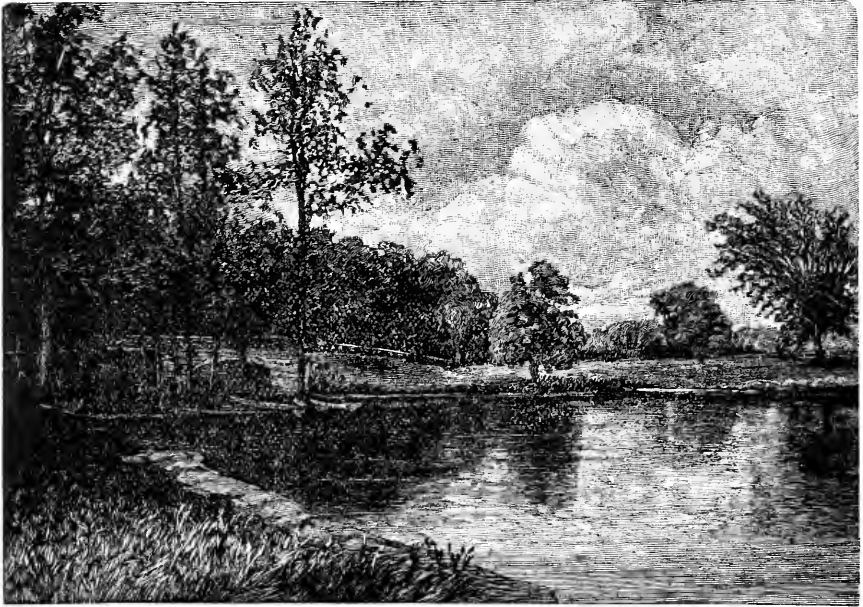
TUPELO LAKE (FROM THE BRIDGE).

BRADFORD ACADEMY is the oldest Seminary for Young Ladies in the country, founded in 1803, and incorporated in 1804. The school edifice, including the boarding and school departments under the same roof, is located near the centre of an area of twenty-five acres, twelve of which are covered with a fine growth of oaks, and are laid out with paths for exercise and recreation. The other portions of the grounds are adorned with walks, shrubs, and trees. The situation is elevated, overlooking the city of Haverhill, across the Merrimack River, and commanding broad views on every side. The air is fresh and invigorating, and the healthfulness of the location has been abundantly proved during the past years. The building is of brick, four stories high, in the form of a cross, wide corridors extending from east to west, affording healthful promenades in inclement weather. A parlor and two bedrooms constitute a suite of rooms for four pupils. These rooms are eleven and twelve feet high, and receive a full supply of air and sunlight. The school-hall, recitation and music rooms, library, reading-rooms, parlors, dining-room, rooms for business, bathing-rooms, gymnasium, bowling-alley, laboratory, art-room, music rooms and closets are ordered on a generous scale. The entire building is heated by steam and lighted by gas, and supplied with an abundance of pure water. Finely constructed stairways at the end of each corridor furnish ample fire-escapes.

The course of study has been recently revised and enlarged to meet the demands of the present day, and secure a thorough and broad mental development. The course is comprehensive, embracing both the solid and ornamental branches. Three full studies for each term are assigned to each pupil, and are considered sufficient, as the multiplication of subjects leads to superficial knowledge, rather than true growth of mind. Care has been taken to secure the best instruction in the various branches of study. Besides the regular teachers, lecturers of eminence in various departments are employed.

Rev. JOHN LORD, LL. D., has been for many years connected with the school as a lecturer on history.

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The Library has had large additions made to it recently, selected with great care from all departments of literature, furnishing works of the highest authority; and in the department of Art, works of great cost and beauty. The reading-room is well supplied with current literature.

The natural history room is furnished with a valuable cabinet of minerals, a collection of shells and curiosities, and a physiological cabinet.

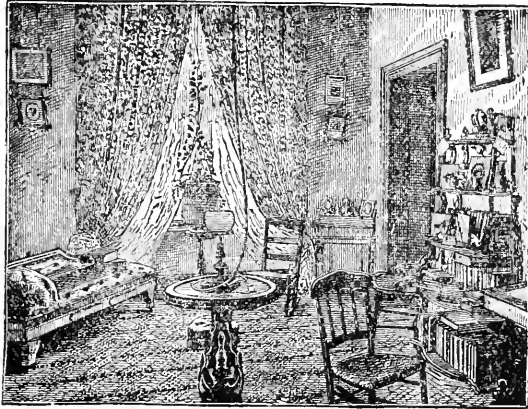
Neatness and simplicity of dress, and the maintenance of a sound physical condition, are enjoined upon all. Daily exercise in the open air is required when the weather permits, and a room has been recently fitted up with gymnastic apparatus adapted to the wants of the pupils in that regard.

There is also an opportunity for boating and skating upon Tupelo Lake, in "Academic Grove," connected with the institution.

The table is always supplied with the best that can be found in the market. The object of the school is not to gather money, but to furnish in quality and variety what shall be most pleasing and satisfactory to parents and pupils. Any surplus of funds is used for the aid of needy scholars.

The pupils are under the constant care of teachers whose earnest effort is to form their characters on the basis of Christian principle. The Bible is read daily, and made a study in the school, and all are required to attend public worship on the Sabbath.

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This Academy enjoys many incidental advantages through the other literary institutions in the same village, while easy access to Boston and Cambridge brings within its reach fine Music, Art Galleries, Museums, Cabinets, and the Botanical Garden, to all of which, classes, with their teachers, have occasional access. The Academy has a fine Clark Telescope, good working cabinets, models, and apparatus of its own.

The domestic arrangements are peculiarly homelike. The school is divided into three separate families in separate houses, each under its own matron and teachers. One of these families is made up wholly of pupils in French, in which language the daily table-talk is carried on under the direction of the French teacher. Another family is occupied with German in like manner. The grounds are spacious and tasteful, forming an attractive part of the quiet and pleasant village.

The school has been successfully conducted for more than twenty-five years by the same principal teacher, whose constant endeavor is to so educate girls that they may mature into healthful, cultivated, earnest, Christian womanhood.

The total expenses for board, including fuel, lights and washing, and for tuition, except music and drawing, is \$300 per annum.

Students have been recently prepared for Harvard, Yale, Dartmouth, Bowdoin, Wesleyan, Oberlin, Boston University, Williams, Amherst, Columbia, Princeton, Colby, Hamilton, University of Michigan, Brown, Lafayette, Middlebury, University of Vermont, Trinity, University of the City of New York, Rutgers, Sheffield Scientific School, Lawrence Scientific School, Columbia School of Mines, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, several Medical Colleges and Law Schools, and for numerous business pursuits. 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DEPARTMENTS.—It has three departments,—the Preparatory, Intermediate, and Senior. Thoroughness in character and methods of instruction characterizes each. The Senior Department embraces a four-years' course, which includes the Higher Mathematics, History, Philosophy, the Sciences, Ancient and Modern Languages, Art Studies, and the various Literatures.

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DIPLOMAS are awarded to those who shall have honorably completed the prescribed course.

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The design of the school is to impart an accurate, thorough and practical education. It especially aims, as it has done from the beginning, to base such education upon a hearty faith in the Bible, and a conscientious Christian life; and it is the endeavor that a pervasive Christian influence be constantly felt throughout the school.

The regular course of study for graduation covers four years, but pupils can join temporarily such classes as they are prepared to enter, without pursuing the full course.

## NOTE.

This YEAR-BOOK is issued by the direction and authority of the National Council of the Congregational churches, assembled at Chicago in 1886.

"Every church and minister, upon the rolls of the denomination," is entitled to share in the distribution of the Year-Book, by direction of the Council of 1877, under whose auspices it was first issued. It will be obvious, that for the very practical purpose of this distribution, "the rolls of the denomination" must be assumed to be the tables and list of the Year-Book. The claim of any church or minister to receive the Year-Book does not arise until they are reported by local authority by the Secretary of the Council. Errors excepted, no claim can be recognized, outside of these lists.

The list of the officers and committees of the National Council will be found on page 249, and those of the various State organizations on those immediately following. Record of the various benevolent societies, with the addresses of their officers, may be found on pages 45-57; and of the theological seminaries, with their professors, on pages 58-77.

The next session of the National Council will be held in 1889, with the Plymouth church in Worcester, Mass., beginning Wednesday, October 9.

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## INTRODUCTORY.

DELAY in the issue of this YEAR-BOOK has been unavoidable. The Wisconsin tables were not in hand until Christmas, and the Minutes of the National Council, a volume of almost 400 pages, has concurrently taxed the editor and printers. They have done the best they could, but two such volumes cannot be carefully prepared and carried through the press in the time which *one* must take. As the demand for each was equally pressing, nothing could be gained by sacrificing one to the other.

The new list of ministers without charge, pages 206-18, has cost much time and labor, and may account for, at least, a week of the delay.

The meeting of the statistical secretaries, in Chicago, in connection with the session of the Council, deserves recognition here for its spirit and success. Sixteen secretaries were present, representing 2,500 churches, and their conferences, as earnest as fraternal, very certainly gave all present a clearer understanding of the work they have to do and of the methods by which it may be successfully done. Some of the results reached were presented to the Council by its Secretary, in eight propositions, seven of which were adopted by the Council (see Minutes, page 49). The eighth was not negatived, but took different shape in the extended discussions of the Council on ministerial standing.

The importance of the action of the Council in regard to the future of the YEAR-BOOK and its statistics, and upon the subject of ministerial standing, makes it fit and convenient that the resolutions adopted have place here.

The Committee on the Secretary's Report, the Rev. A. H. Ross, D. D., chairman, included the following resolutions in their report, and they were adopted:—

*Resolved*, (1) That the statistical year of our YEAR-BOOK be the civil year.

*Resolved*, (2) That for and after the year 1888, the YEAR-BOOK be issued as soon after the first of January as is practicable, and that it contain the statistics of the preceding year.

*Resolved*, (3) That for and after the year 1888, the YEAR-BOOK contain the charities of the churches in detail, the charitable legacies paid during the year, and the statistics of the Sunday schools.

*Resolved*, (4) That the church clerks be asked to forward their statistics to the proper secretary as early as the fifteenth day of January of each year.

*Resolved*, (5) That we recommend that in the State Minutes the churches be arranged alphabetically, on the plan of the YEAR-BOOK.

*Resolved*, (6) That absent church members be considered such as have removed their residence beyond the natural limits of the parish in which the church is located; from which the following persons should be excepted: such as are away at school or college, such as are on extended journeys, and such as are otherwise temporarily absent.

*Resolved*, (7) That in the enrolment of families, all that recognize a minister as their pastor, or who naturally look to him in preference to any one else for ministerial services, should be included.

*Resolved*, (8) That we recommend to the churches to look up their absent members; to urge on them the duty of taking letters to other churches; to notify some church, where the absent are living, of their church standing, with the request that the said church watch over them; and, in case of continued neglect or refusal to transfer their membership, to deal with them as Christian wisdom and love may dictate.

The report of the Committee on the Pastorate and Ministerial Standing, Rev. R. P. Hutchins, D. D., chairman, embodied resolutions which were amended and adopted, as follows:—

*Resolved*, (1) That standing in the Congregational ministry is acquired by the fulfilment of these three conditions: namely, (1) membership in a Congregational

church; (2) ordination to the Christian ministry; and (3) reception as an ordained minister into the fellowship of the Congregational churches, in accordance with the usage of the State or territorial organization of churches in which the applicant may reside; and such standing is to be continued in accordance with these usages, it being understood that a *pro re nata* council is the ultimate resort in all cases in question.

*Resolved*, (2) That all Congregational ministers in good standing in their respective States, who have been installed by council, or who have been regularly called to the pastorate by the specific vote of some church, have formally accepted such position, and have been recognized as such by some definite act of the church, should be enrolled as pastors; and we advise that all our denominational statistics, and direct that, so far as possible, our YEAR-BOOK conform to this principle.

*Resolved*, (3) That this National Council commends to the churches, in accordance with our ancient usage, the importance of properly called ecclesiastical councils, ordinarily selected from the vicinage, and especially the great importance of the installation of ministers to the pastorate by councils, when it is practicable, as conducive to the purity of the ministry and the prosperity of the churches.

*Resolved*, (4) That the State organizations and local organizations of churches be recommended to consider such modification of their constitution as will enable them to become responsible for the ministerial standing of ministers within their bounds, in harmony with the principle that the churches of any locality decide upon their own fellowship.

*Resolved*, (5) That the YEAR-BOOK designate pastors who have been installed or recognized by council called to examine the pastor-elect and assist in inducting him into office, by the letters *p. c.*, and pastors otherwise inducted by the letter *p.*; it being understood that these changes shall be first made in the YEAR-BOOK for 1888.

The change proposed in the date of the annual statistics and issue of the YEAR-BOOK calls for very careful consideration on the part of the various States and their statistical secretaries. So important a transition will hardly be effected without some confusion and friction; but all concerned will do their best, it is safe to assume, to make it a success. The hope is, that the value of our statistics will be increased, by a uniform date and promptness in issue. How early in 1888 these statistics can be collected, tabulated, and published, will depend very much upon the promptness and diligence of the clerks of the churches and local registrars. A few points may be suggested.

*a.* The first report to be made 1888, Jan. 1, will be exceptional, as it must cover more than a year, a period extending back from that date to the date of the last report, as it appears in this YEAR-BOOK. For those States which have already adopted the calendar year as the statistical, this will call for a report including two full years in the single table and summary. Other States will need to include 21, 19, or 16 months, as the case may be, and if injustice is not to be done to the published and historic record of the churches, it will be necessary that this be done with exactness, and that a single year or other period be not substituted, as some may be tempted to do, to save trouble.

*b.* A second table, to include fuller Sunday-school and benevolent statistics, with legacies, is proposed in the new arrangement. The exact items which will be called for in this new table cannot be named yet; but the Publishing Committee will issue, in due time, a revised blank for the new reports, which they will furnish to any States which find them sufficient for their own use, and which may serve as a guide to those who wish to add different questions of their own to those of the committee.

And, will all concerned suffer a word of exhortation at this point? See to it, brethren, that the YEAR-BOOK'S items, and their *exact order*, are followed in your own questions and tables. If you want other items let them be added to, but not interspersed among, those for the YEAR-BOOK, and let your summaries embrace each and every item of the YEAR-BOOK'S summaries. Convenient blanks, for that purpose, will be furnished, if you desire and will use them.

c. Another practical question is suggested in the report to the Council of the Publishing Committee (see *Minutes*, page 83). Will the States wait to print their own tables before sending them to the Secretary, or will they save time, as New York and some other States have done, by furnishing them in manuscript? The delay for twice printing the same tables would seem not necessary; and, added to this, is the consideration that the printer of the YEAR-BOOK could furnish each State with as many separate copies of its own tables as it might wish for free distribution among the churches, or binding up with its *Minutes*. These would cost only the price of paper and press-work; and, as tabular composition is expensive, the saving to all the States would aggregate a large sum. In any case, the Secretary will be glad to know, as early as may be, from each State, whether its tables will be furnished in print or manuscript. If desired, he will furnish a blank sheet for the use of secretaries in making out these tables, and it will be convenient if secretaries will accept and use such a uniform sheet.

d. The modified usage proposed of the term "pastor," and its abbreviated designation, will call for careful discrimination on the part of reporters. If a minister is to be enrolled as pastor without the action of a council, three things will be necessary: (1) He must "have been regularly called to the pastorate by the specific vote of" the church in question: no action by a society or congregation will be sufficient without this; (2) he must "have formally accepted such position"; and (3) he must "have been formally recognized" as pastor "by some definite act of the church."

A minister thus established as pastor is to be designated by the letter *p.* in the new tables. If beyond this a council has been called, by which he has been installed or recognized, the designation is to be *p. c.*, "pastor by council." In all other cases former usage is not changed.

In the YEAR-BOOK for 1886, some hints were given towards the improvements in the State Minutes. Various questions which come to the compiler suggest that others may be acceptable here.

a. Churches in the tables should always be arranged under the name of the town or city in which they are located. The prime column is a list of *places*, and special names of churches, like "Trinity" or "Redeemer," are never to stand in it, or fix the place of that church in the roll. To illustrate; this YEAR-BOOK has for the first time discovered that, in Pennsylvania, Hyde Park is not a town but a locality in Scranton; and not only so, but that the church in Providence is also in that city, which, with a new church organized last year, gives Scranton four Congregational churches.—a fact of too much interest to be concealed under the various local names, of which the larger public are ignorant. So this YEAR-BOOK has found out that Savannah has four Congregational churches instead of two only. Are there other towns or cities to which the same injustice is done, by scattering their churches, under different and less-known names?

b. Churches in the same city or town should be arranged, not alphabetically, but in the order of organization. In many cases secretaries forget this fact.

c. Last year's reports should never be *inserted* in the *table*. If a church makes no report, that fact should be patent to all in the *blank* against its name, for admonition, and in hope of better things. But—

d. The summary *totals* should include the membership of the church or Sunday school, as last reported, of these unreported churches. It is an injustice to the body of the churches if these items are not included. The real progress of the churches may be converted by their omission into apparent loss. Three churches, for example, have six hundred members. A revival may come and one hundred members be added to their roll. But one of them has a clerk who neglects his duty,

and the total as reported is, not the seven hundred members which it should be, but five hundred, implying a loss of one hundred members, notwithstanding the real gain. This point has been widely neglected, and the special attention of secretaries is invited to it. *Never put old reports into the table, but include the sum of them in your totals.*

*e.* And there is cause still to repeat and emphasize each point suggested last year. Will not all concerned consider with care the notes in YEAR-BOOK, 1806, page 5? Wisconsin still omits Genoa Junction, while it includes Illinois churches. Illinois includes Genoa Junction, but omits Olive and Ridge. Michigan omits East Gilead, and Ohio omits Pisgah, while it includes various churches in Kentucky, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. The point is not, of course, that these churches should be omitted, if it is convenient for them to be thus associated; but the *summaries* should be separate and specific. We look to the Minutes of each State to give us the number of churches, members, etc., in *that State*, and are not fairly treated if we must add a church here, and subtract two churches or a dozen there, from neighboring States, to come at the truth. New Hampshire includes four churches, which are associated with Maine, and gives an exact New Hampshire summary. New York has an association of Pennsylvania churches, but does not include them in its totals. By the same simple improvement, Illinois, Michigan, Ohio, and Wisconsin might do themselves exact justice and save much embarrassment to those who want the facts.

*f.* Give the Christian names of ministers. There should be some place where the respect due the name a man bears is not sacrificed to the haste or laziness of a mere initial; and the world has a right to look to such an official list to find the full name. Personal identity is often confused by the use of initial only. Some of our minutes are models in this respect, *some are not*, and the latter occasion no small uncertainty and trouble.

*g.* The ordination *date* should be insisted upon, as a testimony to the fact, and proof that the name has right to a place on the roll of ministers. Licentiates belong in a separate list and not in a list of ministers. And this list should include the name of every Congregational minister in the service of the churches as pastor, acting pastor, or supply. If the standing of any such minister is not vouched for by any conference or association, indicate the fact of his imperfect standing, as the YEAR-BOOK does, by a star; but do not omit his name or remit it to a separate list, where it is liable to the overlooked. Include no minister *not* a Congregationalist.

*h.* Finally, *summaries* — full and accurate, ordinations, installations, recognitions, dismissions, and all other items, given not separately by *local* conferences, but together and for the *State*. The YEAR-BOOK summaries may not be the end of wisdom, and nobody dreams of any such claim for them; but the convenience of all is concerned in uniformity, and until sufficient reason and authority are found for changing them, we may properly ask every secretary to furnish those precise items, which he can do so much better than any one else. Others, to the various content and pleasure of everybody, but these at least.

The Council has directed that the assessments be made upon the *whole number* of members given in the *Year-Book*. This has been done, and only three or four of the local bodies have ever questioned its wisdom and equity. If the nearly *sixty thousand*

absentees are to be deducted from the total membership, there must of necessity be a proportionate increase in the assessment of the remainder. But most, if not all, of these absentees are actually present within the limits of our territory as a whole, and each local body has about as many of the absentees of other local bodies within its limits as are absent from its territory, while often the members reported as absent from one church in a State are actually working with other churches in that State. Until the Council orders otherwise, therefore, the Treasurer has no option in keeping his accounts, but must adhere impartially to the rule of assessment upon the entire membership; and this is fair when universally applied. 15,024

The assessments for each year become due July 1 of that year. If promptly paid, the treasury will be in a condition creditable to the churches. Those local bodies which are most prompt in payment find the least difficulty in collecting, and most heartily approve the rule adopted by the Council. As a whole, the local bodies are steadily approaching prompt payment, and when once all have fallen into line, and arrearages are fully paid, our assessment of a cent and a half a member, where other denominations for a like purpose assess five cents per member or more, will seem to all to be very light. Will not all the local bodies strive to meet promptly their apportionment, and avoid a recurrence of that sad condition of things which embarrassed the treasury for so many years, and made it necessary for some to give much more than their share, because others gave less? A few resolute and faithful workers in each local body will bring the result so greatly desired.

The following schedule shows what has been paid by each local body up to Jan. 10, 1887, what is now due on past assessments, the date of the last payment, and the assessment which becomes due July 1, for 1887. — 150 C.

As the *Year-Book* gives its statistics by States, it is very important that when any treasurer of a local body forwards money received from churches outside of his own State, he give to the Treasurer of the Council an exact statement of the amount so received, that it may be set to the credit of the State from which it comes.

With \$5,727.79 due on past assessments, and \$6,279.02 coming due July 1, 1887, the treasury ought not to be embarrassed for lack of means to meet the expenses of the Council. Will not the local bodies see that their fair proportion is promptly paid, and so prevent future embarrassment?

The American Board, the oldest Foreign Missionary Society in the United States, was formed at Bradford, Mass., June 29, 1810, and held its first meeting at Farmington, Conn., Sept. 5 of the same year. Its mission fields now occupied are Northern and Western Mexico; the Hawaiian and Micronesian Islands of the Pacific; Northern and Southern Japan; Northern China; Shanse in Northwestern China; Foochow and Hong Kong in Southern China; Ceylon; Madura in Southern India; the Maratha field in Western India, including the important centres of Bombay and Ahmednagar; East Central Africa; the Zulus of Southern Africa; West Central Africa; Eastern Turkey, from Mosul to Erzurum, including Mardin, Bitlis, Van, and the educational centre, Harpoot; Central Turkey, including the important cities of Aintab, Adana, and Marash; Western Turkey, from Trebizond to Constantinople, including Marsovan, Sivas, Cesarea, Smyrna, Broosa, Nicomedia, and Adabazar; European Turkey, from Constantinople to Samokov in Bulgaria, including Monastir in Macedonia and Philippopolis in East Roumelia; Austria, emphasizing the Bohemian work in Prague; and Northern and Northwestern Spain, this work centring in San Sebastian, on the Bay of Biscay, and in Zaragoza, in the Province of Aragon.

This wide-extended work embraces direct evangelistic effort through missionaries and native helpers; an immense educational trust, extending from the primary school to the college and theological seminary; Sunday-school instruction; the preparation, publication, and circulation, in different languages, of books, tracts, and newspapers; assistance in the erection of buildings for churches and schools; grants in aid to feeble churches and to native home-missionary societies; the humane service of missionary physicians, sometimes in the care of large dispensaries and hospitals; also charitable ministry, continuous and varied, to the sick, the poor, and the oppressed.

Pastors, in presenting the foreign work to their churches, are desired to emphasize this fact, — that these several departments of labor on the foreign field are carried on under one administration, and that contributions, therefore, should be proportionately enlarged. If one half of the benevolent contributions of the churches should be given to this broad work of reaching the unevangelized millions of other lands, it would probably not be too large a proportion.

The Woman's Boards, which co-operate with the American Board, are doing a royal service, not only securing — mainly from the women of the churches — large contributions, — the annual average of which, during recent years, has been over \$130,000, — but also educating and training children and young people to an intelligent interest in missionary work. These Boards can be addressed at No. 1 Congregational House, Boston, at 53 Dearborn Street, Chicago, and at 901 Sutter Street, San Francisco.

The latest statistics of the American Board report 22 missions, 904 stations and out-stations, 434 missionaries and assistant missionaries, 1,964 native laborers, 310 churches, with over 26,000 members, — nearly 3,500 of these received on confession of faith during the past year, — 97 high schools and seminaries for young men and young women, with nearly 4,000 students, and a total of nearly 38,000 children and youth under Christian instruction. The appropriations for 1887 already amount to over \$600,000, and it is desirable that the receipts for this year should reach, if possible, \$760,000, — a thank-offering of \$10,000 for each of the 76 years of our history. An average advance in donations of about fifty per cent will secure this honorable record. Attention is called to the *Missionary Herald*, the *Mission Day-spring*, and *Life and Light*; also to the *American Board Almanac* and to the CHILDREN'S

MORNING STAR MISSION, a special for Sunday schools. Our main instrumental reliance is upon the pastors of churches, themselves full of missionary information and zeal.

The most urgent want instrumentally just now, upon the foreign field, is a reinforcement of at least fifty new missionaries, sound in health and sound in the faith. The laborers at the front are not only few, but are falling at their posts, overburdened. The harvest, which was never so white for the reapers as to-day, is perishing. The Master's call rings in our ears more imperatively than at any previous period of our history: "Pray ye the Lord of the harvest that He will send forth laborers into his harvest."

## AMERICAN COLLEGE AND EDUCATION SOCIETY.

FORMED by the Union, in 1874, of the "American Education Society," and the "Society for the Promotion of Collegiate and Theological Education." The American Education Society was organized and received its charter from Massachusetts in the year 1816. The College Society, as the other organization was popularly called, was formed in 1843. It was for years a voluntary association without a charter. In 1872 it received a charter also from the State of Massachusetts. These two organizations were brought together under a new charter from the same State in May, 1874.

Income for the year ending April 30, 1886, \$76,641.73. Of the whole income, \$52,529.15 was contributed for colleges and paid to them. The sum of \$18,299 was paid to students fitting for the ministry. The expenses were \$4,048.39, leaving a balance of debt of \$3,965.38.

In both departments the Society has had a large agency in the formation of society throughout the great West. The men who were pioneers in the work of preaching the gospel in the new settlements, and in the founding of churches and schools, were largely educated by this Society. The colleges which are now among the foremost in these Western fields were largely built up by the same agency.

The whole number of young men assisted by the Society in their studies for the ministry since 1816 is 7,170. The institutions at the West which have been assisted by the society since 1843 are the following, viz.: Western Reserve, Illinois, Wabash, and Marietta Colleges, and Lane Theological Seminary. These five are the institutions which the Society took under its care at the beginning, in 1843. Those which have since been received on the list are Knox, Beloit, Thayer, Wittenburg, Oberlin, and Berea Colleges, the College of California, Pacific University, Olivet, Ripon, Iowa, Carleton, Doane, Drury, Washburn, and Colorado Colleges, Pacific Theological Seminary, and Yankton College.

During the past year Carleton, Drury, and Ripon Colleges have passed off the list, and Rollins College, Winter Park, Fla., has been taken on.

The number of young men receiving assistance from the Society during the last financial year is 291.

At the time when the Education Society began its work of helping young men into the Christian ministry, in the year 1816, the condition of things in this country was very peculiar. The great movement of emigration toward the West was setting in with strength. The American Board had been organized a few years before, and the cause of foreign missions was taking strong hold upon the churches. But "the laborers were few." Ever since the close of the Revolutionary war, the churches had been in a confused and preoccupied state, and the number of men coming forward for the work of the ministry was alarmingly small. It was in such a state of things that this Society began its enterprise. Through the aid thus afforded, and through the impulses thus imparted, a host of living preachers was raised up to go with the moving colonies out into the fields of the West, or to go far hence to the Gentiles, to proclaim the Gospel of salvation through Jesus Christ. A work of inestimable importance for the Christianizing and civilizing of our own land was accomplished by this instrumentality. The ministers raised up by this Society became to a large extent the pioneers in the way of founding churches, schools, colleges, throughout all those Western fields, while in foreign lands half the missionaries laboring under the care of the American Board had been brought forward in the same way.

The object of this Association is to “establish and perpetuate the religious history

and literature of New England, and for the holding of a suitable building for the accommodation of the same, and for the use of charitable societies; also to do such acts as may promote the interest of Congregational churches," etc.

Its library is intended for reference, having as its specialities everything published by the Pilgrims and Puritans, and their predecessors, contemporaries, and successors, which states or illustrates the principles and polity of Congregationalism, its history, its doctrine, its influence, and indeed the same things in regard to every denomination; thus everything ecclesiastical, — theology, controversy, results of councils, sermons, church manuals, minutes of religious bodies, *every one*; Year-Books and all such like; also all local histories, county, State, and United States histories, genealogies, centennial, ordination, funeral, and all historical sermons, all commentaries on the Scriptures, every biography, national, State, and municipal statistics, printed reports of all kinds, catalogues, obituary records, and inaugurals of all our literary institutions, together with any manuscripts, autographs, or mementos which relate to the objects above named.

On the 25th of May, 1886, the library had 32,934 books — 7,179 of which were duplicates — and over 130,000 pamphlets, including duplicates, secured almost exclusively by gifts and exchanges. Duplicates furnish a basis for exchanges, for which the Librarian has large facilities, and of which he avails himself to the uttermost; and in this way he can assure all kindly disposed persons that they can send him no printed pamphlet or book that he cannot make useful here.

The library has now more of the early publications of our country, and of the mother country, which illustrate the principles and relate the deeds of our first settlers, than any other public library in the United States; but it is still lacking very much of this sort which is scattered here and there, essentially useless where it is, but would be invaluable here; also much more of the later and contemporaneous issues of the same general character found in every parish and town more or less. Now, let these be collected and sent here by some good friend in each church, as a few have already done.

The Congregational House is a four-story granite building, one hundred and three feet on Beacon Street, ninety-three feet on Somerset Street, with ample stores on the lower floor; the corner occupied by the Congregational Publishing and Sunday School Society; and on Somerset Street are the *Missionary Herald*, and packing rooms of the A. B. C. F. M., whose Treasurer, Secretaries, and the Woman's Board have rooms above; also the American College and Education Society, the *Congregationalist*, the American Peace Society, the New West Education Society, the American Missionary Association, Woman's Home Missionary Association, City Missionary Society, Massachusetts Home Missionary Society, etc. The fire-proof library room is in a connected building — accessible, light, pleasant, safe, and has capacity for more than 100,000 volumes.

The great WANT of this Association is the hearty sympathy and co-operation of every Congregationalist, expressed in "one fair contribution" from each of the more than 2,500 Congregational churches that have not made it; also gifts of tens, twenties, fifties, hundreds, and thousands from the more highly favored; testamentary gifts, if not earlier bestowed. Then this great property would be disencumbered, and all our strictly benevolent societies would be forever free from rent, thus insuring a good dividend to the cause of Christ upon every benefaction.

ENCOURAGEMENTS. — 1. That the Union has one hundred more houses of worship on its list than it had one year ago.

2. That it has thirty parsonages more than it could report last year.

3. That it received about \$1,000 more in the first six months of the current year, beginning May 1, than during the corresponding months of last year.

4. That one hundred of our churches are at present engaged in building houses for the worship of God, and twenty-nine are building parsonages.

5. That on the part of these churches there is a remarkable spirit of self-denial and energy in the prosecution of the work of building.

6. That the work of the Union is becoming more widely known and believed in.

7. That the subscription list of the *Church Building Quarterly* is increasing.

8. That the list of honorary and life members is increasing.

9. That a large number of pastors and others are calling for fresh facts, and that we have them to furnish.

10. That persons of wealth are sending us the means of putting up monuments to the memory of deceased friends, in the form of houses of worship, far dearer to God than the costliest marble monuments; and that funds so invested in work for God, by means of our Memorial Loan Fund, are made to aid in the building of a new house of worship every five years.

11. That the National Council so heartily indorsed the general and special work of the Union, and urged givers to a larger benevolence toward this branch of the Lord's work.

12. That a much larger number of the members of our churches are coming to see how handicapped and crippled our brethren at the front are, who have no place in which to worship, and no place to live.

13. That the receipts of the last four years have been \$140,846.82 larger than any other four consecutive years of the Union's existence; and that this furnishes ground for hope that the churches and individual friends of this work will furnish the funds for pressing on its money-saving, life-preserving, and soul-redeeming work.

INCENTIVES TO GREATER EFFORT. — 1. That last year's receipts were not as large as those of the year before, while the calls were larger.

2. That the receipts for this year have been very far below the absolute demands.

3. That forty-six churches, engaged in building for the worship of God, on Nov. 16, 1886, had applications for aid, in the hands of the officers of the Union, which could not be acted on for want of funds.

4. That the work in the case of several of these churches had been brought to a stop, accompanied with great discouragement, and in several cases an abandonment of plans to build, at present, if ever.

5. That there are hundreds of towns, west of the Mississippi River, to-day, that have no house in which to worship God, and no minister of any denomination living among them.

The HOME MISSIONARY, a monthly magazine, published by the Society, at sixty cents a year, including postage, gives a running account of the progress of the work in all parts of the country, largely from the pens of the superintendents and missionaries personally engaged in it. The monthly issue is 25,550 copies. An ANNUAL REPORT sums up the results of the year. Leaflets and Tracts for the times are published as occasion calls, designed to help pastors, Sunday-school officers, and friends of home missions generally, in awakening and keeping alive an intelligent, practical, growing interest in the work. These may be had, free of charge, at any time, by addressing the officers of the Society at the Bible House.

For more than sixty years the Society has been organizing churches in the West and South, and aiding in the support of their ministers till those churches are able to assume the whole expense. Its missionaries have from the first organized Sunday schools, provided proper teachers for them, and by watchful oversight have secured their permanence and highest usefulness.

In connection with the labor of its missionaries, 4,816 churches have been organized and 2,367 have come to self-support. It has collected and disbursed in cash \$11,103,712.60; and in clothing, books, and other supplies, largely the offerings of Christian women, nearly \$1,589,000; in all, \$12,692,712.60. The additions to the churches have been 335,942.

In 1883, a Woman's Department was opened, with Mrs. H. M. SHELTON as secretary. Its object is to interest the women of our churches all over the country, and through them the children, more directly in the work; not to the diminishing of their helpful labor in the way of home-missionary boxes (of clothing, etc.), but to secure also their gifts of money for the support of teachers in the Indian Territory and elsewhere, and for various special uses, as called for from time to time. Their aid in this line is steadily growing, but much more is needed. The Woman's Home Missionary Association, having its office in Boston, is rendering valuable assistance to the Society in its educational work.

The number of missionaries employed in its sixtieth year (1885-6) was 1,469, over 1,000 of them in States and Territories west and south of New York. They preached regularly in 3,005 stations, and at frequent intervals in many hundreds more. The number of Sunday-school and Bible-class scholars was 120,000. The additions to the

churches were 9,050; 5,642 of them on confession of Christ. Churches organized, 152; reached self-support, 66.

The sixtieth year's receipts were in cash, \$524,544.93; in supplies, \$57,000; in all, \$581,544.93.

At least \$530,000 *in cash* is needed this year properly to sustain the missionaries *now in the field*. To take up only such new work as the providence and Spirit of God manifestly call upon the Society to assume *at once*, \$100,000 more is imperatively required. The Society is doing much more work than ever before among the foreign-born in all parts of the country. At nearly every meeting of the Executive Committee chosen men are sent to new fields at the front, where they are most needed, but where their support involves heavy outlay by the Society. For securing the means essential to the carrying on of this great work the Society depends, under God, on the zealous co-operation of the pastors and members of the Congregational churches of the land.

S. and Pub. Society, for its missionary work.”

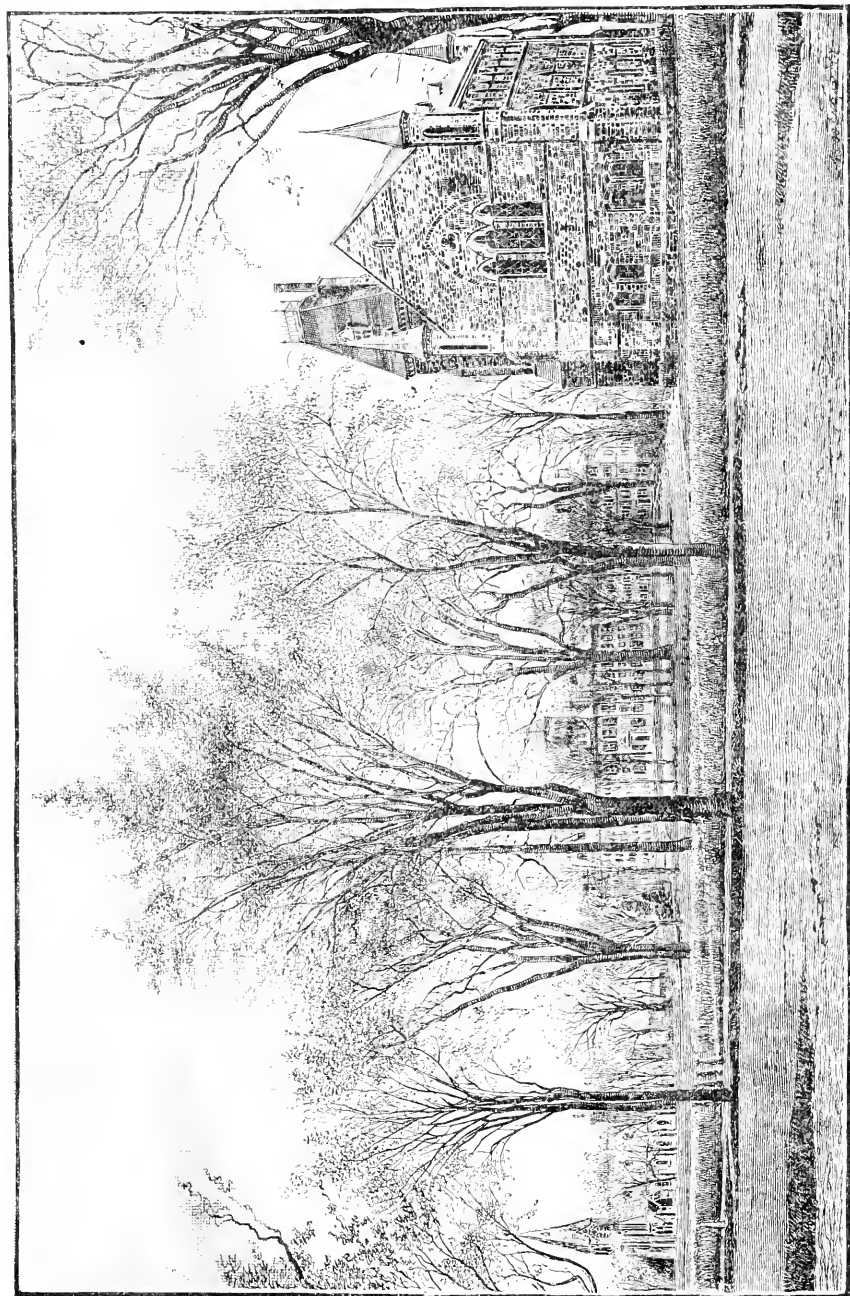

**CALENDAR.** — The annual period of study is divided into three Sessions. The last Session of the present Seminary year will commence on Monday, March 28, and continue till the Anniversary, Thursday, June 16. The next Seminary year will begin on Thursday, September 8.

**COURSE OF STUDY.** — The Junior year is devoted mainly to Biblical Exegesis and Introduction; the Middle year to Biblical and Systematic Theology; the Senior to Sacred Rhetoric, Pastoral Theology, and History of Christian Life and Doctrine. Systematic Theology is begun in the first year; also Biblical History, which is continued through the second. Lectures on Christianity and Science, the Scriptures, Elocution, with exercises in Rhetoric and vocal culture continue through the course. Opportunity is given for instruction in Syriac, Arabic, and other cognate Oriental languages.

**FOURTH YEAR** for advanced study. Each member of the Advanced Class chooses his studies, subject to approval by the Faculty, and receives from the professors in the departments chosen personal direction and assistance. Special facilities are afforded for private reading and research. Lectures are given to the whole class on topics pertaining to the higher and more difficult questions which are engaging the attention of Christian scholars and pastors. Ten scholarships (\$200.00 each) are available for members of this class.

**LIBRARY AND MUSEUM.** — The Library now numbers more than 44,000 volumes, is constantly increased, and is open every week-day for the examination and drawing of books. A full reference library has been opened on the ground floor of Brechin Hall. The Museum comprises objects relating to missionary life and work, a monumental slab from Nimroud, a relief model of Jerusalem, and a large and choice collection of Palestinian birds, animals, flowers, coins, inscriptions, photographs, etc.

A well-furnished Gymnasium is open to the use of the students.

**LOCATION.** — The Seminary was located with a view to the advantages of uninterrupted study. These advantages have been retained, and are accounted of increasing value. At the same time, through the rise and growth of cities in the immediate vicinity, the students of the Seminary have special opportunities for studying the various conditions of church work, and the different methods of preaching. Andover is within four miles of Lawrence, ten of Lowell and Haverhill, fifteen of Salem, and twenty of Cambridge and Boston. The situation is remarkably healthful.

Those whose age or circumstances forbid the pursuit of the complete course of study may, at the discretion of the Faculty, be admitted to the studies of the Middle year, and continue their course with the full privileges of the Seminary.

**COURSE OF STUDY.**—*Junior Year*, Hebrew Grammar, Principles of Interpretation, Exegesis of the Hebrew and Greek Scriptures; New Testament Greek; Introductory Philosophy, with text-books and lectures; Essays, and Lectures on Style and English Literature.

*Middle Year*, Systematic Theology; Ancient Church History; Exegetical studies continued; New Testament Greek continued; Vocal Culture and Oratory.

*Senior Year*, Mediæval and Modern Church History; Homiletics; Pastoral Theology and Church Polity; Exegetical studies continued; New Testament Greek continued.

THE DEPARTMENT OF NEW TESTAMENT GREEK has been added to the usual course in order to supplement the department of Exegesis by grammatical and lexical study of the language of the New Testament. It has been established not only for the benefit of those who have had a classical training, but also to provide instruction for those who enter the shorter course with only a rudimentary knowledge of the Greek. The instruction is at present given by the Exegetical professors.

**SPECIAL LECTURES.**—A course of practical addresses on pastoral subjects is given each year by pastors selected for that service.

**PREACHING.**—As it is believed to be conducive to the best professional training to combine practice with theory, students are encouraged during the Senior year to preach as opportunity offers, and so far as they may without interfering with their Seminary duties. They usually take a license to preach at the close of the Middle year; and during the vacation are employed as missionaries of the Main Missionary Society. Through the remainder of their course they are frequently called upon to supply vacant churches or missionary outposts.

**POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP.**—A scholarship has recently been established in Bowdoin College for the purpose of aiding any student who, after graduating at the Seminary, desires to take a post-graduate year at the College.

**EXPENSES.**—Each student is charged two dollars a year for incidental expenses. There is no other charge for tuition, rooms, furniture, library, or any privilege of the Seminary. The dormitory has been thoroughly repaired and refitted. The rooms are carpeted and furnished. The income of the Washburn fund and some other funds, given expressly to aid members of the Seminary, will be distributed to those who need, and will amount to about half the expense of board.

**LIBRARY.**—The Seminary has an excellent library, numbering sixteen thousand volumes, specially selected to meet the wants of the students. There is a permanent library fund, with the income of which constant additions are made of the latest and most valuable literature.

The next anniversary will occur on Wednesday, June 1, 1887.

The next seminary year will open on Thursday, Sept. 8, 1887.

ADMISSION. — The Seminary is open to students of all denominations. Candidates for admission to the regular course must be of good moral character, and must have received a collegiate education, or an equivalent preparation. Students from other seminaries may be admitted by certificate.

TERMS AND VACATIONS. — The next term will begin Wednesday, Sept. 14, 1887, and continue till the third Wednesday in April, when there will be a vacation of four months, for private study and remunerative Christian work.

SITUATION. — The Seminary Buildings front Union Park. The location is quiet, but the centre of the city may be reached in twenty minutes.

COURSE OF STUDY. — The Juniors have four exercises a week in Hebrew, four in Greek, and one each in Theology, History, Homiletics, and Elocution. The Middlers have four exercises a week in Theology, two each in History, Hebrew, and Greek, and one each in Homiletics, and Elocution. The Seniors have three exercises a week in Homiletics, two each in Hebrew, Greek, History, and Theology, and one in Pastoral Theology, besides private exercises in Elocution. The "Special Course" includes the full course in all the years except Hebrew and Greek, and has the following supplementary studies, which are limited to the first year: Rhetoric, Logic, Moral Philosophy, and daily exercises in English Composition and Bible Exposition.

THE GERMAN AND THE SCANDINAVIAN DEPARTMENTS. — Students in these departments, which are under competent instructors, take the regular or special course in the English language, according to their grade of preparation, that they may be able to preach also in English. They are, however, excused from some English studies, principally of a homiletical or practical kind, in place of which they pursue such exercises in their own native languages as are best adapted to prepare them to minister to our German or Scandinavian fellow citizens.

EXAMINATIONS. — In each year there are two public examinations, oral and written, of all the classes.

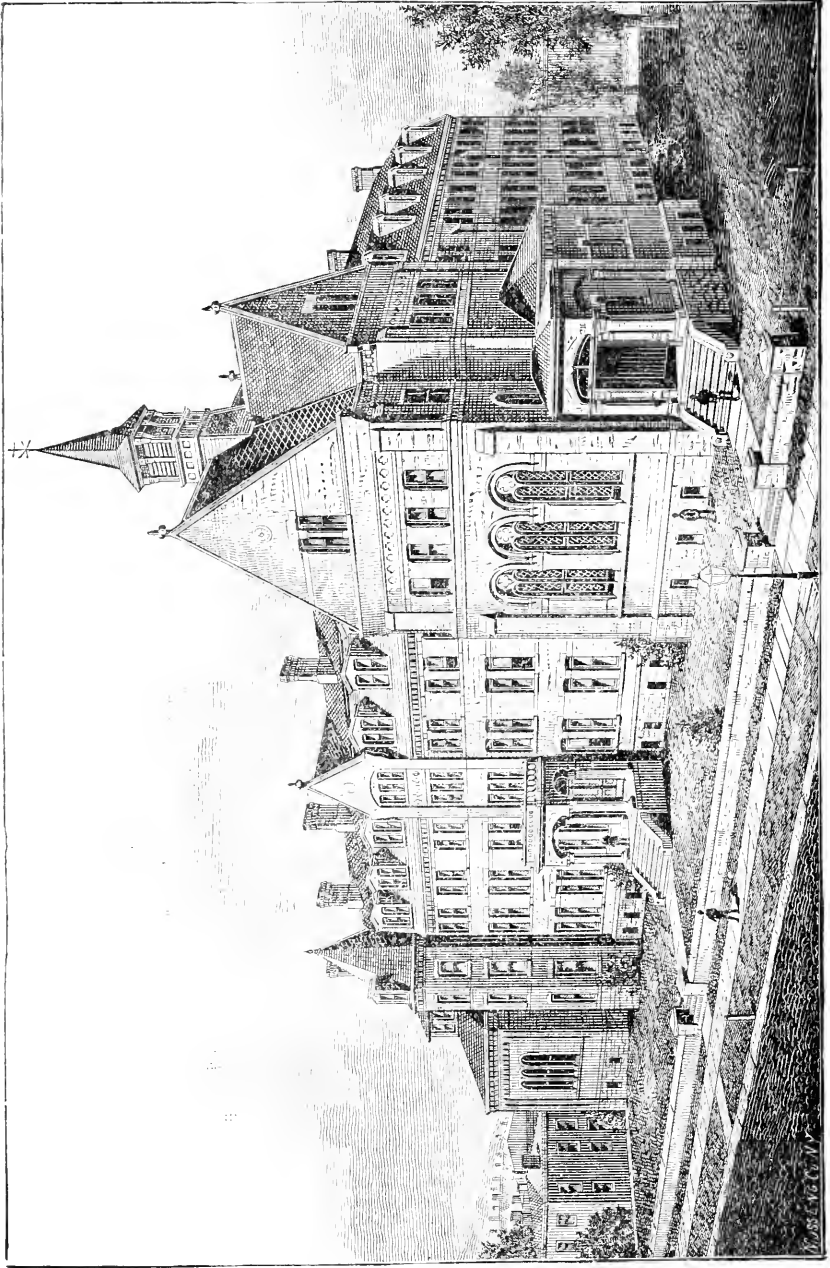
The Alumni Institute will be held this year on anniversary week, April 26.

HAMMOND LIBRARY. — This contains the GENERAL and the REFERENCE LIBRARY with over 7,000 volumes, and the READING ROOM. Both of the latter are furnished with the best helps for students, and are open daily. There is also a special arrangement for the use of the Chicago Public Library, which offers 110,000 volumes, many of which are rare and valuable sets of reviews and important works of reference.

EXPENSES. — No charges are made for instruction, the rent of rooms, or for the use of Hammond Library. Suites of rooms have been furnished by churches or individuals. The only necessary expenses of the student are for board, fuel, gas, textbooks, the care of rooms, washing, and for such special damages as the property of the Seminary may suffer at their hands. Good board can be had in private families in the neighborhood of the Seminary for \$2.50 or \$3.00 a week.

PECUNIARY AID. — From the American Education Society, supplemented by the Western Education Society and the Scholarship funds of the Seminary, a total of one hundred and fifty dollars a year for students in the regular course, and one hundred and twenty dollars for those in the special course, is furnished to those who cannot provide the means to pay their own expenses without undue delay in their studies, and who give promise of usefulness in the ministry. Students also receive medical attendance in case of illness without charge, and enjoy opportunities for earning money by teaching, mission work, and preaching.

A course of lectures on "Foreign Missions" will be given this year by Rev. A. C. THOMPSON, D. D. Dr. JOHN HALL will lecture on Romanism, and C. C. BRACE on the Evangelization of Cities.

By its organization the Seminary is closely allied to the churches through the Pastoral Union, which annually elects the trustees.

The plan of instruction is so arranged as to make the study of the Bible the chief feature of the entire course. The patrons, guardians, and teachers of the Institution are persuaded that an exegetical and experimental knowledge of the Divine Word should be sought first of all by candidates for the gospel ministry. They also believe that scholarly investigation, controlled and tempered by the spirit of truth, justifies unflinching adherence to the doctrinal system set forth in the creed of the Pastoral Union, to which the professors annually give their assent, and which is in accord with the historical belief of New England Congregationalism, as embodied in accredited formulas. The effort is made to bring the several departments into such relations as shall give both scientific and vital unity to the course of instruction.

It is the aim of each professor to strengthen, on the part of the students, the habit of personal investigation. Daily drills bring teachers and pupils into such close relations as favor mental activity and appropriate criticism, the purpose being to train as well as to teach, to illustrate correct methods while their results are presented.

TERMS OF ADMISSION. — Candidates for admission are expected to produce evidence that they are members of some Christian church, and that they have graduated at some college, or have made such literary acquisitions as, in the opinion of the Faculty, are an equivalent preparation for theological studies. They will be examined in reference to their personal piety and their motives in seeking the ministry.

Besides lectures on Congregationalism, moot councils are held from time to time, for the purpose of making the student familiar with the principles and usages of our church polity.

Instruction is provided for all the classes in ecclesiastical music throughout each year.

EXPENSES. — No charge is made for tuition, room rent, or the use of the library. The rooms are supplied with the necessary articles of furniture.

Arrangements for board, at a common table, are made by the trustees.

The average cost of board has been \$3.50 per week. To aid in meeting this expense, several scholarships have been endowed. Further assistance will be furnished, in proportion to the necessities of each student, at the discretion of the Faculty. Fuel and lights may be estimated at from \$10 to \$15 the year for each room. The American Education Society renders aid to the amount of from \$75 to \$100 annually. Students who are licensed have occasional opportunities to preach for compensation.

CALENDAR. — There is but one term of study in the year, which begins on the second Thursday of September, and closes on the second Thursday of May. Students have opportunity in the long vacation to engage in some form of Christian activity, from which they may derive religious advantages and practical knowledge, as well as pecuniary benefit.

Persons desiring to join the Seminary are invited to address the Dean of the Faculty, from whom they will receive any needed additional information.

The Department of Theology is open for the admission of students of every denomination. Applicants must furnish satisfactory evidence of Christian character. A full collegiate education is regarded as furnishing a normal preparation for the course in Theology. Those who are not graduates of reputable colleges are required to furnish evidence of culture in all essential points fully equivalent to that which is given by a college course, and are admitted only upon careful examination in the ordinary collegiate branches. Upon the satisfactory completion of the regular three years' course, the Academic Degree of Bachelor of Divinity (B. D.) is conferred.

**COURSE OF STUDY.** — This has recently been greatly enlarged and rearranged upon the elective system. Candidates for a degree are required to have completed work amounting to 1,050 hours of lectures and recitations (besides elocutionary and rhetorical work). Of this work 485 hours are required, including courses in Exegesis of the Greek New Testament, Natural and Revealed Theology, Church History, Homiletics, Relations of Science and Religion, and the Forms of Modern Scepticism.

In addition, 1,220 hours of elective work are offered, of which the student must elect at least 565 hours. The elective courses include Hebrew and Old Testament Exegesis, Old Testament Introduction and Theology, Aramaic, Septuagint Greek, New Testament Exegesis, Church History, History of Doctrine, Church Polity, Homiletics, and Pastoral Theology.

**SLAVIC DEPARTMENT.** — A department has been opened to train up evangelists and pastors for the Slavic immigrants (400,000 strong) in this country. A Principal, who teaches the English Bible, and a Bohemian-American teacher of the Slavic languages have been appointed. Four regular students are in attendance. The Seminary has no funds for the work, but depends upon current contributions. An endowment of \$50,000 was recommended by the National Council of 1886, and is urgently needed.

**LIBRARY.** — The libraries of the College contain over twenty thousand volumes.

**COUNCIL HALL,** the building devoted exclusively to the Department of Theology, provides fully furnished rooms for fifty students. No expense is incurred for instruction, or for the use of the libraries or public rooms; and the students in Theology enjoy, without charge, the privileges of all the other departments of the College. The price of board is from \$2.00 to \$2.50 per week, or from \$72.00 to \$90.00 for the thirty-six weeks of the theological year. Fuel and lights will not cost more than \$15.00. Add the charge of \$5.00 per term for the care of the building, and the entire necessary expenses of the year — not including clothing, travelling expenses, and books — need not exceed \$100.00.

Help is granted from scholarship funds contributed by friends of the Department and from the American Education Society. The amount ordinarily received from both these sources does not vary much from \$150.

The opportunities for students to aid in meeting their expenses are sufficiently numerous. Some are employed as teachers in the Preparatory School connected with the College, and the amount received for teaching an hour each day exceeds the cost of board. Many vacant pulpits in the vicinity are supplied by theological students, for which compensation is rendered. During the summer vacation of fifteen weeks, all members of the Department may supply vacant pulpits in home-missionary and other fields; and such opportunities are abundant.

The year of study in this Department consists of thirty-five weeks in three terms. The anniversary occurs Friday, June 3, 1887. The next year begins Tuesday, Sept. 13, 1887.

REGULAR STUDIES. — *First Year.* Greek; Hebrew; Sacred Geography and Antiquities. Origin, History, Authority, Inspiration, and Canon of the Bible; Interpretation of the Scriptures; Religions of the World, other than the Christian; Natural Science; Mental and Moral Science; Rhetorical Exercises.

*Second Year.* — Biblical Theology; Greek; Hebrew; Exercises in the Exposition of the Scriptures; Systematic Theology; History of Doctrines; Rhetorical Exercises continued.

*Third Year.* — Pastoral Theology; Church History; Church Polity; Homiletics; Rhetorical Exercises Continued; Connection of Natural Science with Religion. [An Exercise in Hebrew and Greek Exegesis twice each week during the second and third years.]

SPECIAL STUDIES. — In special cases, particular and modified courses of instruction will be given to those who cannot remain three years, or who, for other reasons, cannot take the full course of three years; and these courses of instruction will be adapted to the necessities of each person, it being understood that every one of this class will continue his studies as long as practicable.

PREPARATORY STUDIES. — Young men who have not had the advantage of a collegiate course, and who are, for good reasons, debarred from the prospect of such a course, are enabled to pursue literary and scientific studies under the direction of the professors in the Hopkins Academy, immediately associated with the Seminary. These preparatory studies will vary with the requirements of each student.

CALENDAR. — The year consists of but one term, and begins with the first of September and ends with the middle of May. There will be a recess during the Christmas holidays. Students should begin promptly with the term.

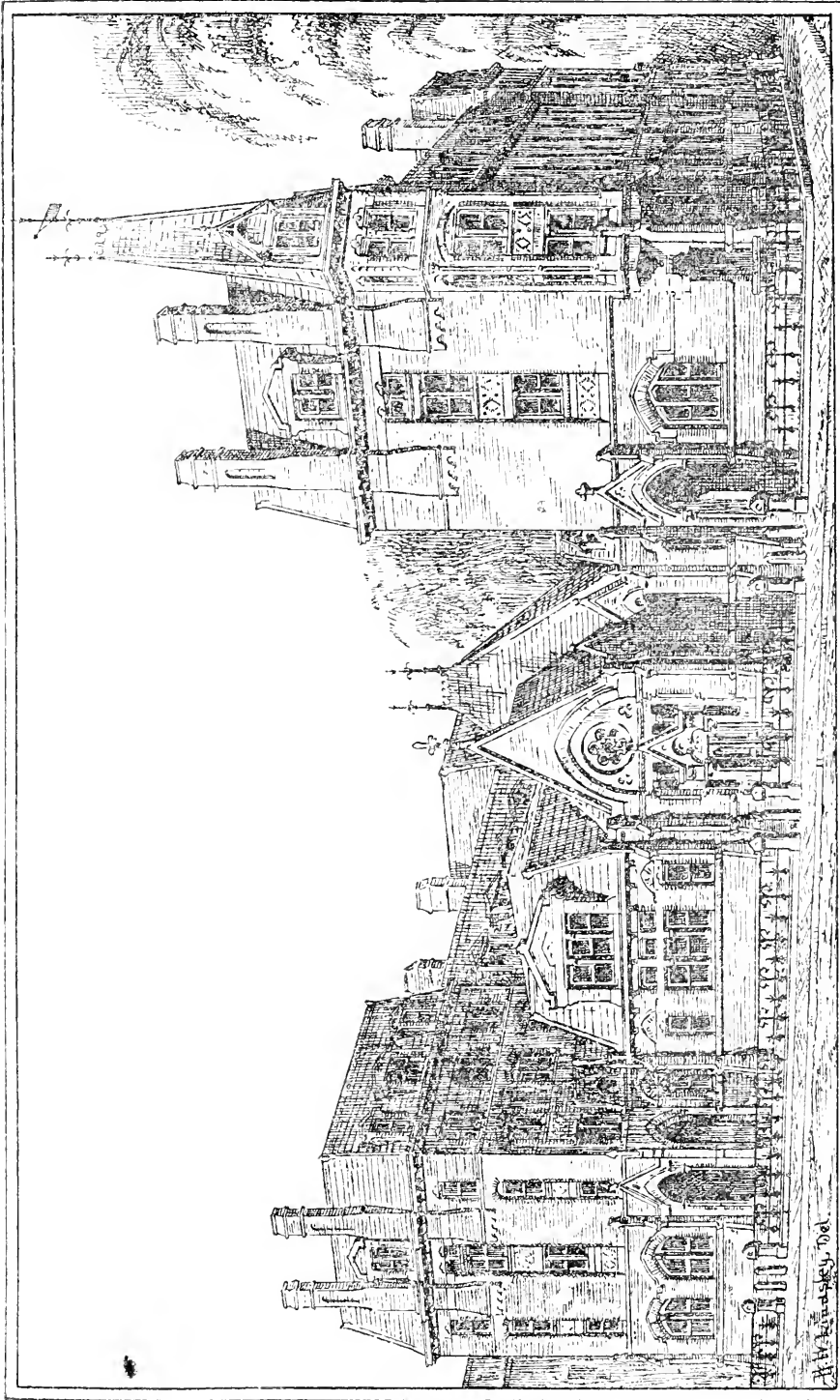
TERMS OF ADMISSION. — Credible evidence of piety, membership in some evangelical church, a collegiate education, or such other literary and scientific attainments as promise a fair degree of usefulness, will entitle all young men to the advantages of this Seminary. The benefits of the institution are accorded alike to students of all denominations of Christians.

EXPENSES. — There will be no charge for tuition, rent of rooms, or use of furniture. The trustees will, as far as practicable, furnish text-books free to those who are in need, themselves being the judges of the necessity. Those who desire it can board on the premises at the rate of \$3.00 per week. Fifty cents additional will be charged for washing.

PECUNIARY AID. — The American Education Society will render aid to the pupils of this Seminary who are needy, who are college graduates, and who take the full course of three years. The amount bestowed will be, when possible, \$100 a year to each beneficiary. Seven paying scholarships yield an average of about \$130 each per year to six beneficiaries.

An endeavor is continually made to provide for *all* the wants of every young man who wishes to take the full course of study, and every such person is urged to come to the Seminary, whether he has any means of his own or not. It is believed that the necessary expenses of a Theological School are less here than anywhere else in the Union.

No happier situation is known than the one occupied by this Seminary. The climate is unequalled for stimulating qualities, for mildness, and for general fineness. It is favorable to study every month in the year. It is a cure for many forms of invalidism. The scenery about the site is not inferior to that of the far-famed Bay of Naples itself. Both the beauties and the grandeurs of nature are within reach; and, to some extent, those of man, also.

RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY. — The Divinity School is one of the Departments of Yale University. Its members receive from the Corporation, on completing their three-years' course of study, the degree of B. D. They have access to the public collections of the University, such as the Library, the Peabody Museum, and the collection of paintings and statuary in the School of Fine Arts. They are permitted to attend free of expense, so far as will not conflict with their professional studies, the lectures and recitations in the College and the Sheffield Scientific School, and, if expecting to become foreign missionaries, those of the Medical Department.

COURSE OF STUDY. — The first year is devoted chiefly to Hebrew and the Exegesis of the Greek New Testament; the second year to Systematic Theology, Church History, Old Testament Biblical Theology, and Church Polity; the third year to Sacred Rhetoric, the History of Christian Doctrine, and New Testament Biblical Theology. Additional lectures on Preaching and other important subjects are delivered before all the classes by eminent ministers and scholars in this country and Europe. There are also optional classes conducted by the Professors in New Testament Introduction, German, Syriac, and Chaldee. Once a week there is a rhetorical exercise for all the classes. Instruction in vocal culture and elocution is continued through the entire course.

GRADUATE OR FOURTH-YEAR CLASS. — Students who have completed a three-years' course of theological study, here or elsewhere, are admitted to the Graduate Class, established seven years since, in which advanced studies in Theology are pursued under the direction of the Professors.

THE LIBRARIES of the University, to which the students have access, including the Reference Library of the Divinity School, contain about 170,000 volumes.

THE HOOKER FELLOWSHIP, for the encouragement of further theological study in this country or abroad, the income of which is \$700 a year for two years after graduation, is offered to the class entering in September, 1886.

EXPENSES. — There is no charge for instruction, use of libraries, or room rent. The rooms, which will accommodate one hundred and fifty students, are designed in general for only one occupant. Each room has a bedroom attached, and is carpeted and furnished with all needful furniture except bed-clothing. The chief expenses for the session are for board, \$3.25 to \$3.50 a week; fuel and light, \$25 to \$30; and \$10 a year for care of room and incidental expenses.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS AND OTHER AIDS. — Students whose circumstances require it are aided to the amount of \$100 a year, from the income of scholarship funds. Additional aid to the amount of \$75 is afforded by the American Education Society to its beneficiaries.

COMMENCEMENT OF THE TERM. — The present annual term of study began on Thursday, Sept. 23, 1886, and continues till the third Wednesday in May (anniversary), when the vacation of four months, in which the students have the opportunity to engage in some form of remunerative labor, will commence. The next annual term will begin on Thursday, Sept. 22, 1887.

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION. — The Seminary is open on equal terms to students of all Christian denominations. Applications for admission, or for the annual Catalogue containing further information, may be made to the Secretary, Prof. GEORGE E. DAY, *New Haven, Conn.*, or to any other member of the Faculty.

9. Alphabetical List of Licentiates.

### RULES OF COMPILATION.

1. To arrange in alphabetical order everything capable of it; except that the churches in any one town or city arranged, as they should be, under the name of that town or city, are placed according to age.

2. To make each State list to conform strictly to the *State boundaries*. Churches or ministers reported by the Association of a State other than their own are, therefore, transferred to their proper places; and the summaries are correspondingly corrected.

3. To make *new tables* each year. "Last year's report" (if known to be such) is always omitted. But, while old reports are not to be inserted in the table, the aggregate of such last reports from churches failing to report, in the items of church membership and Sunday Schools, should be included in the summaries. Justice to the churches which do report requires this, as their real progress may be apparently diminished or reversed, by lack of the figures from their less faithful neighbors. The special attention of State secretaries is called to this point, as it has often been disregarded. The list of churches of this year is compared, name by name, with that of last year, and all variations are specifically mentioned with the State summary, so that each church can be traced from year to year.

4. To examine carefully all the tables, with a view to *correction or addition* by correspondence, especially to correct "pastoral supply" to the latest moment. Proof-sheets have been sent to secretaries and some Home Mission superintendents who could be reached in season. But no such changes have been allowed to affect the summaries.

5. To *complete* the statistics by (1) giving in some form every statistical fact obtainable,—items given by some States, but not by all, being aggregated with the respective State summaries; and (2) putting into finished State and general summaries, with "totals" in all cases, everything capable of it; so that no person in search of any statistical fact shall be obliged to perform any arithmetical calculation to find it.

## MINOR EXPLANATIONS.

1. Any church given in brackets is one organized since the date of State report; not included in the summary, but inserted for information. A few churches temporarily not associated are inserted by their own wish.

2. Installed pastors are marked "p," or, in two or three States, "ins"; others in service are not marked, except in Wisconsin, where a special usage is explained. Blanks in the column of pastoral supply, meaning *no* regularly engaged minister, are left blank for the convenience of those who note pastoral changes.

3. Post-office addresses of ministers in pastoral service are not found in the tables of churches, but in the General Alphabetical List of Ministers.

4. The two columns following the names of ministers in the tables of churches denote (1) the year of ordination, (2) the year when the minister was installed, or commenced service with that church.

5. A star (\*) in the General Alphabetical List of Ministers denotes that the person designated is found in the original State alphabetical list, but is reported not to be a member of *any* such organization in the United States; or that he is found supplying some church, or did so last year, and may be presumed to be *in transitu*, but is not in the State alphabetical list.

6. Licentiatees are not reckoned as ministers. Churches supplied by such, or by ministers of other denominations, are reckoned as vacant; but the number of such churches is given in each State summary. No ministers of other denominations (if so known) are inserted in the General Alphabetical List. Some ministers belong to the two denominations at once.

7. The names of some Congregational ministers are, doubtless, missing; but it is solely because they are not reported by any organization of churches or ministers.

8. Under "Church Members," "Absent" are included in "Males," "Females," and "Total." "Additions," "Removals," and "Baptisms" cover the twelve months next preceding the date of report given with the name of each State. Under the head of "Removed," "Died," "Letter," and "Discipline" are represented by the abbreviations.

9. Blanks in any column of figures are such as were so left in the State Minutes. They ought always to signify "no report," but some States do not follow the proper rule of inserting a cipher where "none" is meant, and the examiner must conjecture, in any given case, whether "none" or "no report" is intended. In our General Summaries, a blank invariably signifies "no report."

10. A vigorous effort has been made this year to give, with the name of a church, its *post-office address* if it be different from the name of place given. The effort is greatly, but not entirely successful. It will be tried again next year.

ence are such as are reported (and added up) by the State organizations, and are below the facts. They are inserted as indicating proportions, but are not worth adding up. It should be noted that in some States the sums were amounts contributed to a particular society; in others, for causes represented by that society, — a distinction which we cannot preserve this year. Some States so group objects that some items cannot be distinguished.

4. It will be seen that the reports are very imperfect. Many churches make no report.

NOTES. — 1. The distinction is made between contributions for benevolent purposes and moneys raised for any home expenses. For instance, money given to the general Sabbath-school cause is benevolent; money expended by a church in supporting its own Sabbath school is a home expenditure, as much as a pastor's salary.

2. The amount of Home Expenditure does not mean all that is spent in a given place, but solely what is raised by a church itself, exclusive of all outside aid.

3. The amounts reported above for the *specific* objects of benev-

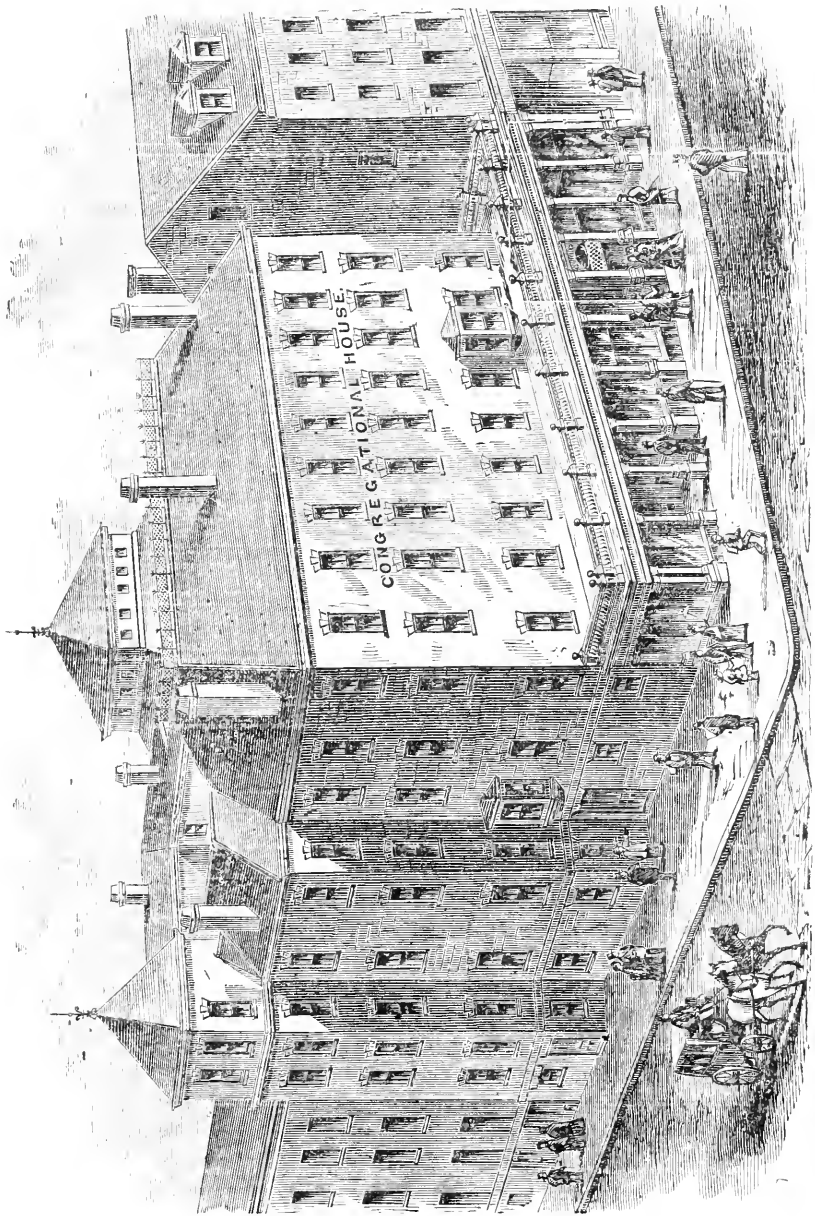

BEYOND all other churches in the world, our churches of the Puritan or New England type are shut up to the Holy Spirit; that we are shut up to it by our very polity itself: that that polity being founded on the Spirit, fashioned by it, and expressly fitted to it, has its whole explanation and efficiency in it, and can be nothing without it; that this, which is sometimes called our weakness, is in reality our strength; that our wisdom and safety consists in remembering and acting on this fundamental principle of our history; that the moment we lose our hold upon the Spirit we begin to lose confidence in our polity, and the moment we modify our polity, we begin to endanger our reliance on the Spirit; that thus in a pre-eminent sense our hope must be in God, and our help must come only from him; that our want is never of more organization, but always of more inspiration; that what we need is not more wheels, larger wheels, or different wheels, but the spirit of the living creature in the wheels; that what we must seek is not a new *kind* of power, but a new *inhalation* of power; that what we must obtain, as ministers, as churches, as Sabbath schools, as Christian families, and individuals, is not new methods, instruments or themes, but the Holy Ghost; that all progress for us must be in the line of the Spirit, whether it lead us forward or backward; and that in fact the only way to go forward till we reach the Millennium, is to go backward till we reach the Pentecost.

Our polity shuts us up to the Spirit thus absolutely, not that it may make us weak, but that it may make us strong; or rather it shuts us up to the Spirit, and so makes us weak, *in order* that it may thus make us strong.

If the weakness of other systems is in their strength, the strength of ours is in its weakness. If their strength turns them away from God, our weakness turns us to God.

The great thing which we need, then, the one thing which we need, the only thing which we need, is, not new methods, new measures, new themes, new sources of interest, power and popularity, but a new baptism of the Holy Ghost. Let a Church and ministry show itself to be a Church and ministry of the Holy Ghost, and it will not be long anywhere without power and attraction. Men will hear what is there; they will feel mysteriously and afar what is there; and they will come to see what these things mean. When the Spirit was poured out on the day of Pentecost, we are told significantly that "the multitude came together." It has always been so. It always will be so. The community cannot be found so sunk in indifference, in worldliness, or in sin, that the outpouring of the Spirit of God will not bring the multitude to the doors. Let the windows of heaven be opened over any place, and the gates of the world will begin to swarm in the direction of that light. The Spirit of God needs no new methods, measures, or themes. It makes the old methods, measures, and themes to be new. It makes everything new where it comes. Its very office is to re-new and regenerate everything upon which it falls. — LEONARD SWAIN, D. ## LIST OF CONGREGATIONAL MINISTERS IN THE UNITED STATES.

### REPORTED BY THE SEVERAL STATE ORGANIZATIONS

The following is a compilation of the alphabetical lists furnished by the State Associations and Conferences, corrected by correspondence with their secretaries to the latest possible date. The secretary of the Council in no case presumes to insert or omit a name upon his own responsibility. The State organizations (or later Councils) are alone responsible; but the secretary has used his utmost endeavors to obtain a complete and correct list. If any names are omitted, it is because they are not reported by any organization in any State.

The figures refer to pages where the name will be found in the tables in the Vital Statistics, in the service of the Benevolent Societies, of the Theological Seminaries, in the list of foreign missionaries, or in the list of ministers without pastoral charge. In some cases the page is left as in tables, when the post-office is changed since the tables were put to press.

Names starred (\*) are of persons who, although mentioned (usually as supplying churches), are not reported as members of any organization of Congregational churches or ministers. A few names are also retained with a \* of those who were in active service last year, and may be presumed to be *in transitu*. Such names are not continued a second year, without specific report.

Some post-office addresses are antiquate; but it is the best that could be done.

Licentiates are not included in this list, nor are ministers of other denominations.

A list of licentiates follows this list.

Names of persons in last year's list, deceased since the issue of 1886, are retained, and are indexed to the pages of the "Vital Statistics."

Some errors will be found in first names, initials, and spelling. No pains have been spared to secure accuracy; but, effort failing, the compiler has not ventured to follow even his own convictions, against the unmistakable testimony of the reports.

Names differing only in a single letter and pronounced alike are treated as one name, but spelled according to report. Browne, Clarke, Curtiss, Griffith, etc., and names beginning with Mac, or Mc, are among this number.

Letters for our missionaries will be addressed to the care of the society mentioned with the name, such societies (initials) being (as are all foreign addresses) in italics.

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Further. 1. This list does not agree with the number given in State Minutes, because all ordained since the lists were reported are here dropped. 2. The post-office addresses are often delusive, the place being that of temporary service only. 3. Names followed by State only are of person approved in the State mentioned, no residence being reported. 4. The list is incomplete, because some States make no full report of licentiates. 5. The contracted name of a State in brackets means that the name was reported by that State, although the person resides elsewhere.

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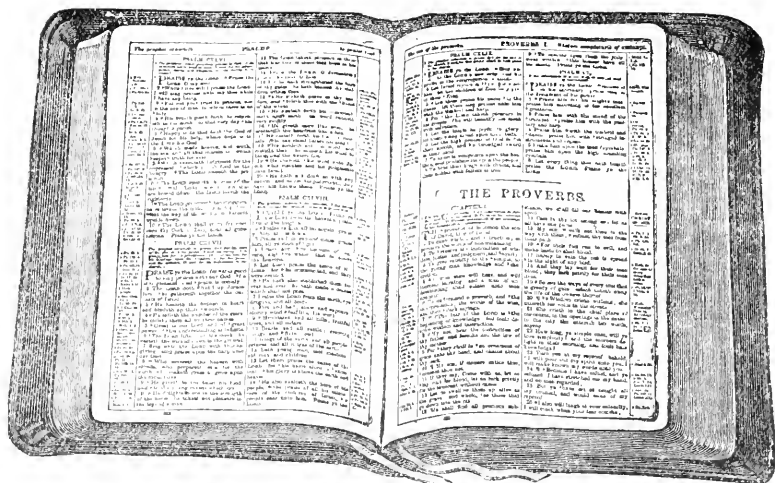
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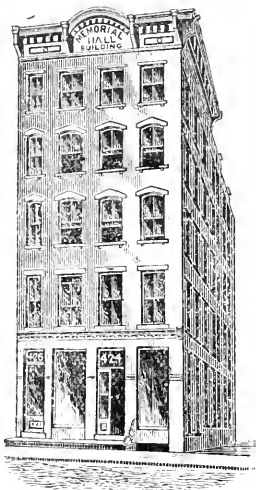
The NATIONAL COUNCIL, at its meetings in Chicago and Concord, passed unanimously the following votes:—

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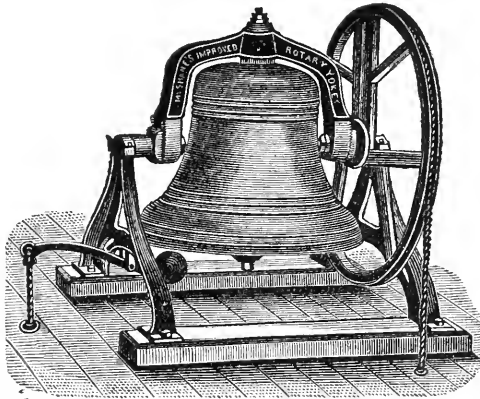
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
