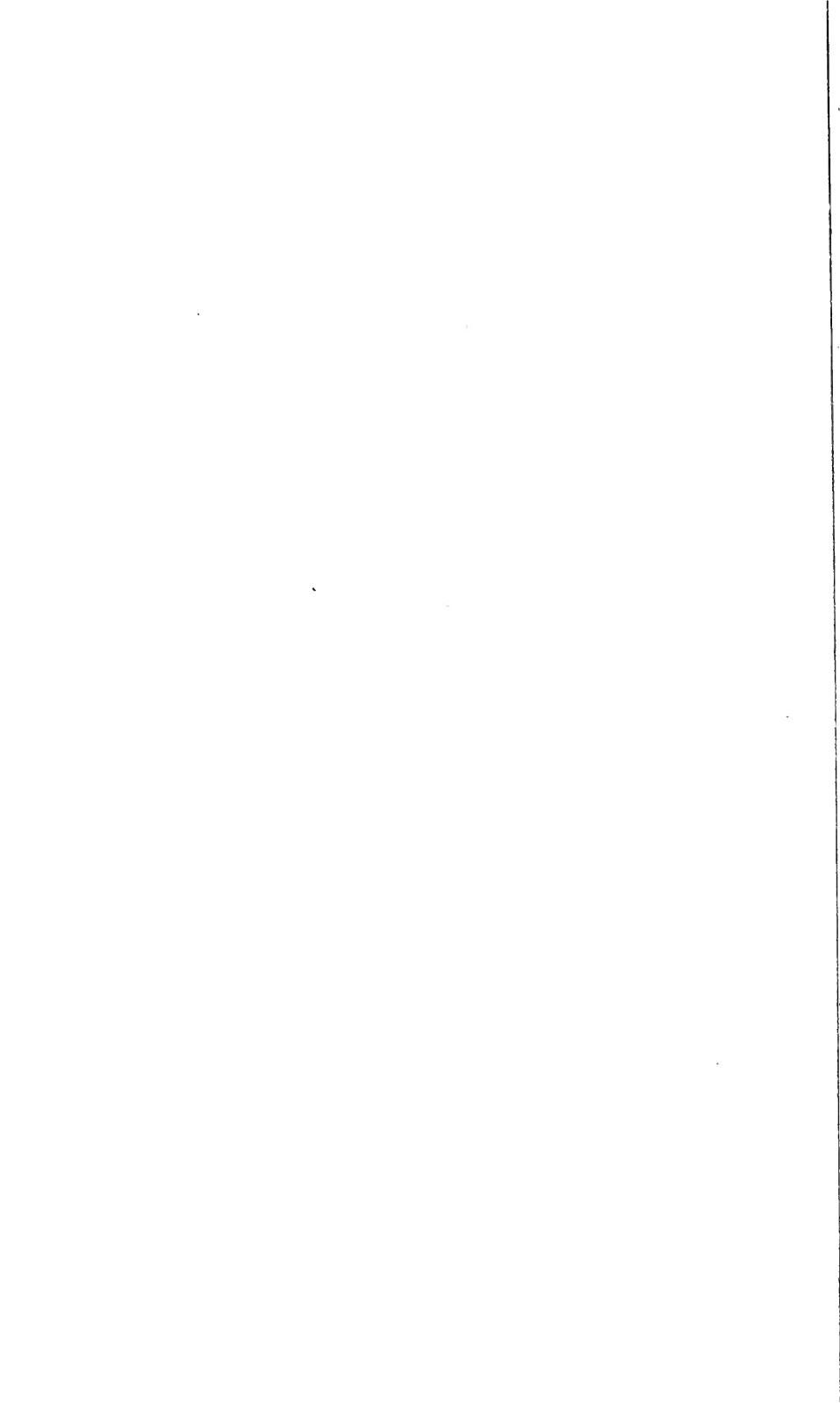

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

REUNION OF UNION EX-PRISONERS OF WAR AT MARIETTA, O., JUNE 10 AND 11, 1891.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 10TH, AT CITY HALL.

Opening address by first vice President E. R. Rose, introducing President Behymer. Address of welcome by Mayor Richardson, on behalf of the citizens of Marietta. Response by Colonel Behymer, President of the Association, which was brief and to the point.

ANNUAL ADDRESS OF PRESIDENT W. J. BEHYMER.

COMRADES:—That kind Providence that cared for us in camp, on the march, on the picket line, in the shock of battle, and amid the horrors of a rebel prison, has permitted us again to greet each other; to look each other in the face, and to recount again the thrilling adventures through which we were called to pass.

Comrades, we belong to a class different from that of any other soldiery in the world. There are in Europe men who have suffered the horrors of imprisonment in barbarous and semi-barbarous lands; but we represent a class who suffered as prisoners of war in a land boasting of its progress in the arts and sciences, and in the possession of all the blessings of Christian civilization. The men who captured, robbed, starved and taunted us, spoke our dear mother English tongue, and professed to be guided by the precious teachings of our English Bible.

We can truthfully say that amid the indescribable agony of Andersonville, Salisbury and Florence, we envied the brave men, who mid scream of shot and burst of shell, and bellowing of the mortar, charged at Gettysburg or Chickamauga, or who cheered the legions that stormed the intrenchments at Missionary Ridge, or the Wilderness.

History and poetry paints in glowing colors the valor of the brave men who, "mid sulphurous smoke and volleying ball," planted the colors on the captured works. But, while our Republic lives, we will be remembered as examples of patience, courage and constancy under trials such as could be borne only by the bravest.

Comrades, you are fewer in number than you were a year ago;

your locks are thinner and grayer, and the lines are telling that you are nearing that long, undisturbed sleep, to which the bravest must come at last. It is estimated that from thirty-five to forty thousand of the old soldiers, of all classes, are passing away each year; and, as the years come on this number will increase, till a mere handful will be pointed out as the remnant of those who, under God, preserved the integrity of the Union.

While there is, to the loyal citizen, a charm connected with any man who raised his arm for the Nation's defense, there is a peculiar interest in that class of men, who, starved, naked, and with aching hearts, such as no pen can describe, endured the unutterable agonies of a rebel prison. It may be well said:

"In Treason's prison hold
Their martyr-spirits grew
To stature like the saints of old;
While, amid agonies untold,
They starved for you and me.
The good, the patient, and the tried—
Four hundred thousand of them died,—
They died for you and me."

It should to us be a great consolation that the noblest men and women of the land place the highest estimate upon the services rendered to our country during our long imprisonment; and the loyal citizen almost dreads to contemplate that sad chapter in our National life that lies between the time when the exchange of prisoners ceased and the last gun of the war sounded. But, dreadful as was that agony, it was endured for our dear native land, in defense of the best government on the face of the globe.

No language can sufficiently laud the noble men who spurned that liberty and food which have been obtained by labor for the upbuilding of a cause, the hatefulest since Satan established his kingdom in this world.

But, Comrades, we turn from this dark chapter of our Nation's history to contemplate the great change that has taken place. Let us thank God at this hour for all his mercies to us. What a royal welcome have we received in this beautiful city, that is so intimately associated with the early history of our State, and, in place of becoming weary of these yearly reunions, they have steadily grown in interest, and we feel that this will be one of the most delightful of all our meetings.

We meet to-day under circumstances calculated to cheer the patriot. We look over our Republic and see it perhaps more united than at any period since "Appomattox." The bitterness and hate which rankled in the hearts of thousands, twenty-five years ago,

now lingers in the breasts of a few irreconcilables, who sulk and pout in obscure places.

Great railways—the bands of iron—have proven bands of love, in binding together the North and South. Millions of dollars of capital have been invested in the South in the development of the great wealth that lies imbedded in those hills and mountains over which many of us fought and amid whose fastnesses we hid as escaped prisoners. Gray old soldiers of both sections now plan and work side by side in developing the great industries of the South.

The humbler classes of the South—black and white—are rising in intelligence and in the acquisition of homes, as never before. Our republic is taking her place among the nations, and asserting her rights as perhaps she has not in her previous history.

We are entering upon a system of commercial trade which will send the mammoth productions of our Republic to all lands, and which will place upon the table of the humblest man of the land the fruits and other productions which, in the past, was to be obtained only by the rich.

As a people we are opening up and establishing all the industries that are possible in our land for the manufacture of all that a cultivated and refined people may need. The fierce fire of the furnace—the black smoke that shall pour forth from the tall stacks, the steam whistle, the hum and roar of the machinery—all this call willing hands to honest employment; the result of which is “honest,” with all the virtues which make up a loyal citizen. We are coming to a state when no man or woman need be unemployed, or complain, “No man hired me.”

The children of this generation shall see the stars and stripes floating over vessels of commerce on every water, and in every port of the civilized world.

And, Comrades, when our bodies are dust, our good swords shall be rust, and our souls be with God, we trust at that time the loyal millions of the great Republic will look back to the dark days of the Rebellion and bless God that there were men who loved their whole land, and who jeopardized their lives rather than allow her to be dismembered.

It is said that “Republics are ungrateful;” but surely we can hardly adopt such a harsh sentiment as to our Republic. While a different policy might have been pursued as to the treatment of the old soldiers, yet we are to remember that our friends had for twenty-five years, in their efforts to befriend the veterans, to contend with that old disloyal element that crippled the government during the

war,—that old traitor element of the North,—the meanest that crawled and hissed out of Hell.

But no government on earth has made such liberal provision in the way of pensions as has our government; and look at the homes to which our worn out, homeless men are gathered, as in the arms of a kind, pitying mother. The faces of our people mantle with shame and indignation that an old soldier should be compelled to seek shelter in a County Infirmary, and the millions say "No!" let these noble men, a Nation's pride, have a "home" and with all that that name implies.

A beautiful feature of our time is that on memorial days, and on such occasions as this, all classes unite in doing honor to the occasion. Men and women now come and strew flowers who twenty-five years ago planned in secret the destruction of the government.

As no one now is willing to acknowledge that his ancestors in the Revolutionary War were Tories, so even now but few are willing to confess that they or their fathers were Northern Traitors in the time of the Nation's trial.

Thank God! we live in a golden age. Let us appreciate it at its true value, and enjoy it.

Comrades, we are growing old, and some of us will no doubt "sleep that sleep that knows no waking" ere we meet again. While we are soldiers of the Republic, let us also serve that Being who covered our heads in the day of battle, and who has preserved us to see this happy day; so that when the last tat-too shall sound we shall lie down to rest with the patriot dead, in the assured hope of a glorious immortality.

7 P. M. Love feast and experience meeting at the City Hall, engaged in generally by officers and members of the Association. Speeches limited to 10 minutes. Of those who spoke at this meeting were Colonel A. W. McCormick, of Cincinnati; Colonel D. S. Wilder, of Columbus; I. R. Rose, of Marietta; D. M. Barrett, of Hillsboro, and others. During the evening there was a fine duet, played on the piano by the Misses Bertha Cutter and Clara Bohl, entitled the "Sleigh Ride." This was received with great applause by the large audience, and they were called back the second time, when they played another duet, "The Hay Makers." Also Miss Hallie Skivington, of Marietta, gave a fine recitation, entitled "The Ensign Bearer," which was very ably rendered, and greeted with great applause. There was also fine music rendered by the orchestra.

THURSDAY, JUNE 11TH.

At 7:30 A. M. Rev. T. J. Sheppard, of Kenton, Ohio, (formerly Chaplain of Andersonville Prison), assisted by the ministry of the city, conducted a religious and devotional service, known as an old fashioned army camp meeting, in the Unitarian Church on Putnam street. This was one of the most interesting religious meetings held by the Association, and the Secretary is only sorry that he is unable to give verbatim all that was said in the meeting. Of the ministers who were present there was Dr. Gear, of the Baptist Church, Dr. Wm. Addy, of the Presbyterian Church, Rev. Bishop, of the M. E. Church, Dr. Dickinson, of the Congregational Church, Dr. Boyd, of the Episcopal Church, Rev. Hanby, West Side M. E. Church, and other ministers, who all spoke Christian encouragement to the ex-prisoners, as did also Judge H. L. Sibley. I am very sorry that we have not got Judge Sibley's address; also of Col. A. W. McCormick, D. M. Barrett and numerous others. This service was clearly demonstrative of how ably Rev. T. J. Sheppard can conduct them.

At 9:30 A. M. the Association met at the City Hall to hold their annual business meeting. First in order was an overture by the Prospect Orchestra Band. President W. J. Behymer then announced that Comrades would be limited to 10 minute speeches. Comrade D. M. Barrett, of Hillsboro, O., was the first to speak, giving his experience while a prisoner at Libby and other prisons, which was very interesting.

Captain A. A. Taylor, of Cambridge, O., followed with a 10 minutes speech on "Fresh Fish" and experience at Richmond under the charge of the two notorious Turners, officers of the Rebel Army. Music by the orchestra. Speech by Colonel D. S. Wilder, of Columbus, giving his terrible experience while a prisoner at Andersonville. Chas. Durfey then sang "The Old Army Beans," accompanied by Geo. W. Patterson, of Columbus. Captain Gillespie, of Middletown, made a very touching speech on "prison life," followed by W. P. Madden, of Xenia, who also spoke quite feelingly on the same subject.

Comrade T. J. Sheppard, of Kenton, O., was called on and introduced by Comrade Wilder as the "Chaplain of Andersonville Prison," who, in reply, made one of his short and pithy speeches, giving a description of the pictures hanging on the wall, representing the condition of starving and ragged prisoners in the various stages from the time of capture to exchange.

Comrade H. M. Roach, of Batesville, O., was called out by the audience, and gave a very wonderful picture of his experience while a prisoner of War at Andersonville. His description of the place was very affecting at times.

At this point the Secretary was requested to read the minutes of the last annual meeting, held at Xenia June 12 and 13, 1890. Treasurer Esker then made his annual report, and the Association proceeded to the election of officers for the ensuing year:

Dr. W. P. Madden, of Xenia, O., presented for nomination the name of I. R. Rose, of Marietta, for President of the Association. D. S. Wilder seconded the nomination, with a motion that the rules be suspended and he be elected by acclamation. Motion adopted, and Comrade Rose declared duly elected for the ensuing year.

D. S. Wilder nominated Geo. W. Patterson, of Columbus, for First Vice President, which was seconded by Comrade Barrett. On motion rules suspended and he was declared elected.

H. L. Sibley, of Marietta, presented the name of Rev. T. J. Sheppard, of Kenton, for Second Vice President, which was seconded by R. G. Mains. Rules suspended and he was declared elected.

Colonel D. S. Wilder nominated L. J. Cutter, of Marietta, for Recording Secretary. Comrade Barrett seconded the nomination and moved to suspend the rules and have him elected by acclamation. Motion adopted.

Colonel A. W. McCormick, of Cincinnati, nominated Frank J. Esker, of Chillicothe, for Treasurer. Motion seconded by Comrade Sibley to make election unanimous. Motion adopted.

I. R. Rose, of Marietta, nominated Jno. C. Goldsmith, of Marietta, O., for Quartermaster. Geo. W. Patterson seconded the nomination, with the motion that the rules be suspended and he be elected by acclamation. Motion adopted.

J. T. Harris, of Columbus, nominated Geo. Musser, of Mt. Vernon, for Chaplain. D. S. Wilder seconded the nomination. A motion that his election be made by acclamation. Motion adopted, and he was declared elected.

The President appointed the following Comrades as Executive Committee: W. J. Behymer, Madisonville, O.; H. L. Sibley, Marietta, O.; James W. Lang, Kenton, O.; S. B. Piper, Barnesville, O.; D. S. Wilder, Columbus, O.

H. L. Sibley moved that T. J. Sheppard, of Kenton, O., be made an honorary member of the Association for life. Motion seconded and adopted.

The President appointed a Committee to audit the accounts of Secretary and Treasurer. The Committee then retired, and in a short time reported that they found the accounts of the Secretary and Treasurer correct in every respect.

F. J. Esker made a motion that the retiring Secretary, C. T. Keech, be given a vote of thanks for his services as Secretary, and

that he be paid the sum of twenty dollars out of the Treasury. Motion adopted.

A motion was also made and seconded to pay thirty dollars to the Prospect Band out of the Treasury. Motion adopted.

Rev. T. J. Sheppard made a motion that a Roster be prepared by the Secretary for the past eight years of all the members of the Association, with the proceedings of each meeting, and a Roster printed each year hereafter. Comrades Wilder and McCormick spoke at some length on the subject, favoring the motion of Comrade Sheppard if there was money enough in the treasury to pay the same. Motion was finally adopted. Motion then made and adopted that Colonel McCormick assume all expenses beyond the money in the treasury, and the Association assigned to him the duty of editing and supervising the printing of the same. This was done on the very generous offer of Colonel McCormick to assume such expenses.

At this point the President announced that the rest of the meeting would be devoted to the members in short talks in relating their experience while prisoners of war.

Comrade Garrettson then introduced R. T. Powell, of West Virginia, who was known in Andersonville Prison as "Little Red Cap." Comrade Powell then related fully his experience while at Andersonville. His recollections were told in such pathetic words of sincerity and truthfulness that it moved the fountains of feeling in the audience, and moistened many cheeks with tears.

Comrade M. V. Trough, of Parkersburg, West Virginia, the last to speak before dinner, related in a happy way some of the hardships and suffering he endured while a prisoner, making fun out of an experience, in which there was but little to make light of until it was all over.

It being now 12 o'clock noon, the meeting closed by the orchestra playing a fine selection. The ex-prisoners and their wives then marched from the City Hall to the Armory, where the citizens of Marietta, under the direction of the W. R. C., had prepared one of the largest and most sumptuous banquets ever seen in Marietta—certainly the finest ever given to our Association. The tables were decorated with flags and flowers, and were fairly burdened with good things to eat. The Armory was also decorated with flags. After grace, by Rev. T. J. Sheppard, all did ample justice to the banquet, while an orchestra from Marietta, led by Prof. Miller, played from the east platform. The tables were so arranged as to seat fully 600 people at the first tables.

After the banquet the ex-prisoners, their wives and families formed, and together with members of the G. A. R. and S. of V. and

W. R. C., all of Marietta, marched to the Ohio River where the two steamers, T. N. Barnsdale and T. M. Bayne, were in waiting to take the entire party on an excursion up the beautiful Ohio River, as had been previously arranged by the citizens of Marietta. This excursion was surely a very enjoyable trip to the ex-prisoners.

At 7:30 P. M. the Association re-assembled again at the City Hall, where it found the Hall packed with the citizens of Marietta, ready to greet them. The time was consumed in a love feast and general experience meeting, and the entire audience held until after 11 P. M.

The unfinished business was the election of a Corresponding Secretary, which, on motion, was left to the Executive Committee to appoint, whenever the place for holding the next Annual Reunion was decided. The time and place for holding the next Annual Reunion will be at Zanesville, June 16th and 17th.

Comrade Wilder then introduced Comrade W. M. Garrettson, of Chillicothe, O., as the toothless Hoosier from Indiana who, in turn, gave a brief and eloquent description of his trip South, and his recent visit to the old battle grounds of Chattanooga and Atlanta, and his visit to where the old prison pens had been. At the close of his speech Colonel A. W. McCormick presented to him, on behalf of the W. R. C., a very large and handsome bouquet, to which Comrade Garrettson responded very gracefully. Comrades T. J. Sheppard, Barrett and Madden, all spoke briefly but touchingly, after which the Misses Bertha Cutter and Clara Bohl gave a fine duet on the piano, entitled "Attack Gallop," which was received by the audience with great applause, after which Captain L. J. Cutter, of Marietta, was introduced to the audience and gave a short account of his prison life at Camp Ford, Texas, after which Miss Barrett, of Hillsboro, gave a very excellent recitation. Comrade Powell, of West Virginia, was called out from the audience and gave us another one of his brilliant descriptions of his experience in Rebel Prisons.

At the close of the Reunion all felt that this had been a grand success throughout, and the Association tendered a vote of thanks to the W. R. C., which had done so nobly for our enjoyment, under the command of Mrs. Captain Berry; also a vote of thanks to the Local Committee, in charge of Hon. S. J. Hathaway, and to the citizens of Marietta in general.

The Reunion was then closed with choice selections from the orchestra, and adjourned to meet subject to the call of the Executive Committee.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS.

CONSTITUTION.

PREAMBLE.

WHEREAS, A meeting of Soldiers of the Union army who served during the Rebellion, and were made prisoners of war by the Confederate Army, was called at the City Hall, Columbus, Ohio, August 10, 1880, for the purpose of organizing a State Association of Union Ex-Prisoners of War, the following is adopted as expressive of its purposes:

1. To hold annual reunions of Union ex-prisoners of war, and thereby renew, keep alive and vigorous the affection, sympathies, and kindred experiences engendered and shared in during imprisonment in rebel prison pens.

2. To preserve and hand down to posterity historical facts, as set forth by individual testimony, as to the character of those prisons and the sufferings therein endured for the Nation's life and the principles at issue in the war.

3. To cultivate a spirit of forgiveness toward those who bore arms against the Union and applied torture to Union prisoners of war, under the influence of a degrading institution and teachings of a treasonable character dominating their better manhood.

To give substantial aid, as far as practicable, to unfortunate and destitute comrades.

ARTICLE I.

SEC. 1. This organization shall be known as the Ohio Association of Union Ex-Prisoners of War.

ARTICLE II.

SEC. 1. The officers of the Association shall consists of a President, 1st Vice President, 2d Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, who shall serve until their successors are elected or appointed.

ARTICLE III.

Sec. 1. The officers shall be elected at each successive Reunion by ballot; a majority of all votes cast shall be necessary to a choice; provided, that if there be but one candidate for an office, the election may be by acclamation.

ARTICLE IV.

Sec. 1. The following Committees shall form an organic part of the Association, viz., Executive Committee and Auditing Committee.

Sec. 2. The Executive Committee shall consist of five (5) members, and be composed, *Ex-officio*, of the President, Recording Secretary, and five (5) comrades, who shall be appointed by the President, with the consent of the Association.

Sec. 3. The Executive Committee shall have power to fill any official vacancy that may occur by resignation, death, or otherwise, by a majority vote of its members.

Sec. 4. The Auditing Committee shall consist of three (3) members, to be appointed by the President. Its duty shall be to audit the accounts of the Treasurer, and report results to the Association.

ARTICLE V.

Sec. 1. Any Union ex-prisoner of war, honorably discharged from the service, may become a member of the Association by assenting to the Constitution and By-Laws, and registering his name, place of residence, company and regiment, or command, in which he served; date and place of capture, and place and period of imprisonment; it being understood that his statements in registering are based upon his honor.

Sec. 2. The membership dues shall be fifty cents, payable on registering for membership, and thereafter on or before each succeeding Reunion, except in case membership is held in a Division or District Association, as hereinafter provided, in which case the Executive Committee shall fix the rate per capita to be assessed each year, such assessment not to exceed fifty cents per capita.

ARTICLE VI.

Sec. 1. Union ex-prisoners of war, resident of any county or Senatorial district of the State, may organize Division or District Associations, auxiliary to the Ohio Association of Union Ex-Prisoners of War, provided such organizations conform to the spirit of this Constitution.

Sec. 2. Upon the organization of a Division or District Association the Secretary of such Association shall forward to the Recording Secretary of this Association a register of the members conforming to Article V., Section 1, and a copy of the Constitution and

list of the officers of the organizing Association, which shall be referred to the Executive Committee for approval, which approval shall entitle the members of such Association to full membership in the Ohio Association.

ARTICLE VII.

SEC. 1. Any member of the Association, whether membership be held through a District or auxiliary Association, or through direct admission to membership, may be expelled for conduct unbecoming a gentleman; or for misrepresenting his qualification for membership by falsely registering; or if the charge of desertion be standing against him; or if he shall have taken the oath of allegiance to the Southern Confederacy.

SEC. 2. In case charges are made against a member, the same shall be put in writing, and the charges and specifications signed by the comrade or comrades making them, and the names of the witnesses given, with their address. The President shall then appoint a judge advocate, a clerk, and five (5) comrades, who shall try the charges and report their findings in the case to the President. The President shall make his recommendations and present the same to the Association for confirmation.

ARTICLE VIII.

SEC. 1. The Constitution may be amended at any regular business meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present; provided, two weeks' notice shall have been given of the proposed amendment.

BY-LAWS.

I. Meetings of the following character shall be held at each Reunion: For the transaction of business, election of officers, etc.; for the relation of experiences in rebel prisons by comrades; and a mass meeting, to be of a public nature, in the order provided by a local committee of arrangements or the Executive Committee, as is most expedient.

II. The business meetings of the Association shall be governed by parliamentary usages, with the following order of business, as far as practicable:

1. Address by the President.
2. Reading of minutes.
3. Annual reports of Secretary and Treasurer.
4. Appointment of Committees.
5. Presentation of resolutions, memorials, etc.
6. Miscellaneous business.

III. It shall be the duty of every member to attend the various meetings of the Association, as far as practicable, and when appointed upon a committee to perform the duties involved, or signify their inability to do so.

IV. These By-Laws may be amended or suspended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote.

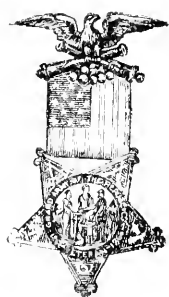

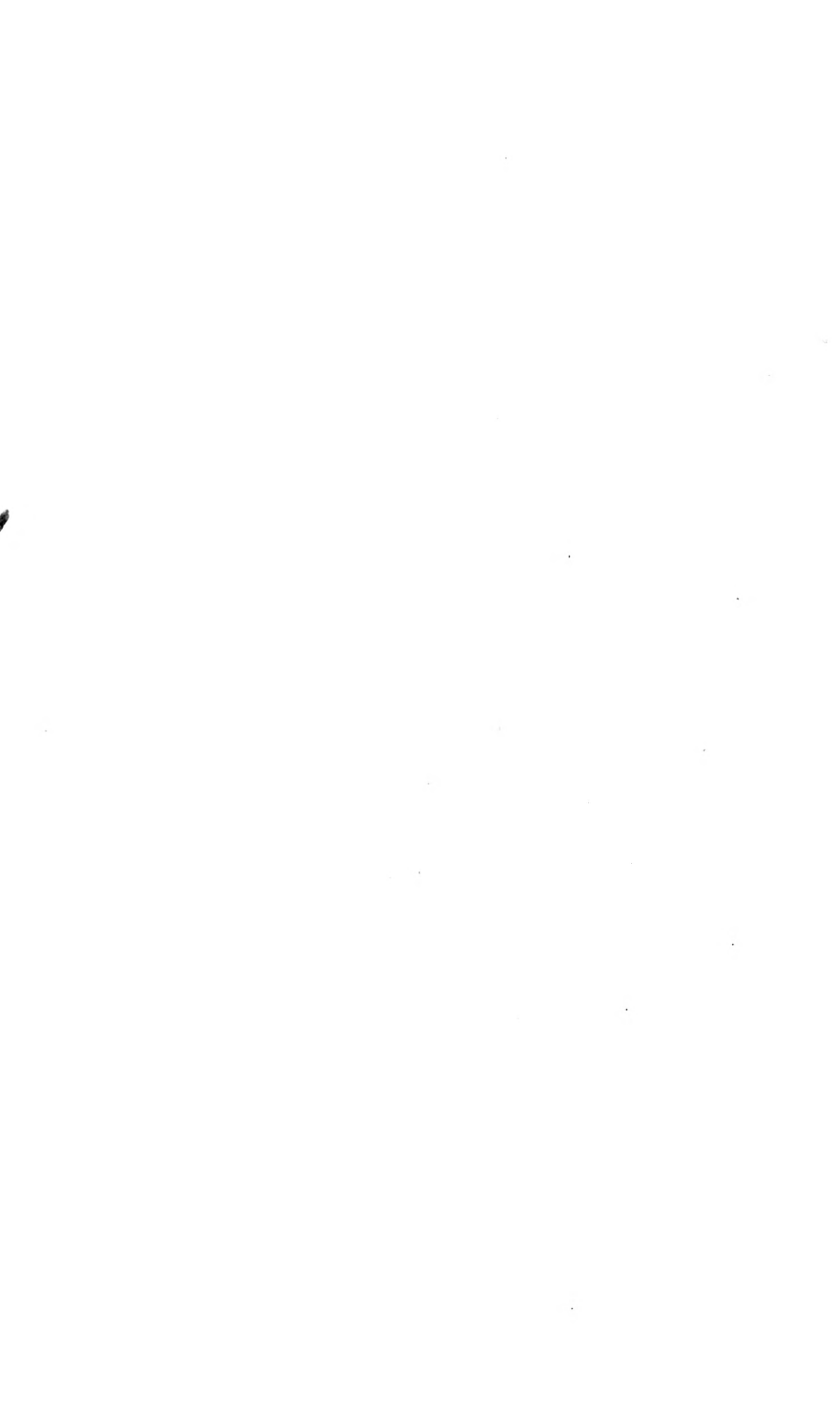
