## THE CONSTYTUTION OF THE GENERAL SOCIETY.

It being evident, from a steady decline of a proper cele bration of the National holidays of the United States of America, that popular concern in the events and men of the war of the Revolution is gradually declining. and that, such lack of interest is attributable. not so much to the lapse of time and the rapidly increasing flood of immigration from foreign combries, as to the neglect on the part of descendants of Revolutionary heroes to perform their duty in keeping before the pulbic mind the memory of the services of their ancestors and of the times in which they lives ; therefore the society of the sons of the Revolution has been instituted to perpetuate the mexuory of the menn, who, in the military, naval and civil service of the Colonies and of the Continental Congress, by their acts or counsel, achieved the Independence of the country, and to further the proper celebration of the amisersaries of the birthday of $\mathrm{V}^{\top}$ ashingeton, and of prominent events connected with the: war of the Revolation ; to mell. et and serure for pre servation the rolls, records amd other docmments relatine to

Each State Soriety shall cause to he tranmitled anmmally or oftener to the other State Societies, a circular letter cal ling attention to whatever may he thourht worthy of ols - rvation respecting the welfare of the Society or of the wneral union of the States, and seving information of the whers chosen for the year ; and copies of these letters shall also be transmitted to the General Secretary to bo. weserved among the recomls of the (leneral Society.

The State Nocioties shall reculate all mathers respectin= 1L.sH own affairs, consistent with the general good of the Fncmer ; juluc of the gnalifiention of their member: or of



homos on ly an oppositmon to the anterest of the commans dy in gencral or of the society in particular, may rember himself matorthy to contunte in member hip.

In orler to form funds that may be respectable, each member shall contribute upon his almission to the socicty and annoully thereater, such sums as the by-laws of the re. pective state Bocieties may require: but any of surb istate societies may provide for the endowment of incmber ships by the payment of proper sums in candt dization, which sums shall be properly invested as a pormanent fund, the income only of which shall be expended.

The regular meeting of the General Society shall telha covery three ycars, and special mectines may be hell upon the order of the feneml President or upon the reguest of two of the State socicties, and such meetings shall consist of tho (xeneral ()fineres and a representation not exceeding live deputies from ench state Socjety and the necessary os perses of' such mer-inger shali be borne by the State Socjetice

At the regular meeting. a General l'resident. Vice-I'ter ident, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and Chaplain shall be chosen hy a mejority of the votes present, to serve until the next regular general mecting, or until their suecessors are duly chosen.

At each ceneral meeting the circular latters which have Larll transmittel by the sevecal sitate societies shall be con-idered, an a alf hesatures taken which shall conduce to the


one all questions affecting the gualitications for membershap 1, or the welfare of any state Society as may hy proper memorial he presented hy such state soretety for consitl cration.

Any male person above the age of twenty-one yeare, of exood character and a descemblat of onc who. is a military, naval or marine officer, solhor, aakor or marine. in actual service. mader the an thority of any of the thirtern (iolonies or States or of the Continent al (Yongress, and remaining ahways loyal to such authority, or a decendant of one who signed the Declaration of Independence, or of one who, as a member of the Continental ('ongress of of the Congress of any of the Colonies or States, or as an official appointed by or under the authority of any such legishative bodios actually as sisted in the establishment of Ameriean Independence liy scrvices rendered during the war of the Revolution, hecoming thereby liable to conviction of treason against the丷ㅓㅇermment of Great Britain, but remaininer always loval to the authority of the ('olonies on States, shall he cligible to membership it the Society.

The secre tory of each state society shall transmit to the (iencral secretary a list of the members thereot, together wath the names and offirial designations of those from whom such members derive rham to membership, and thereafter upon the ahmission of membere in erach state

badge suspended from a mblon by a rine af gold; the badge to be elliptical in form, with escaloped ederes, one and oneguarter inches in length, and one and one eigth inches in wilth; the whole surmonnted hy a mold eagle, with wings displayerl, inverteil; on the olfverse side a medallion of gold in the centre, elliptisal in form, bearing on its face the figure of a soldier in Continental miform, with mosket slung; beneath, the figures 1775 ; the medallion surrounded by thirteen raised gold stars of five points each upon a border of dark blue enamel. On the reverse side in the center a medallion corresponding in form to that on the obverse, and also in gold, bearing on its face the Houdon portrait of Wishington in bas-relief", encircled by the legend, "Sons of the Revolution;" beneath, the figures 1883 ; and upou the reverse of the eayle the number of the batge to be en graved; the medallion to be surrounded by a plain gold border, conforming in dimensions to the obverse; the ribbon shall be dark blue, ribbed and watered, edged with bufi. one and one-quarter inches wide, and one and onc half inches in displayed length

The insignia of the Society shall be worn by the members On all oceasions when they assemble as such for any stated purpose or celebration, and may be worn on any occasion of ceremony ; it shall be carried conspicuonsly on the left breast, but members who are or have been officers of the Socirty may wear the insignia snspended from the ribhon around the neck.

The custodian of the insignia shall be the (Eeneral becere tary, who shall issue them to members of the Society under such proper rules as may he fommaterl by the fomeral

Sochety, and In shall keep a regrster of such lsance wherem titch insignia assumb may be identified hy the mumber thereof.

The seal of the Soclety shall he one and seven-eisths mehes in diameter, and slatl consist of the digure of a Min He man in Continental milorm, standing on a ladiler lead mer to a belfry; in his left hand he holds a musket and an whe branch, whlst his right grasps a bell-rope; above, the cracked Liberty Boll; issuing therefrom a ribbon bearing the motto of the Society, Exegi momumentum are perenmius: across the top of the ladder on a ribbon, the figures 1776 ; and on the left of the Mimute-mian, and also on a ribbon, the figures 1853 , the year of the formation of the Society; the whole encircled by a band three eighths of one inch wide: thereon at the top thirteen stars of five points each; at the bottom the name of the General Society, or of the State Society to which the seal belongs.

## Constitution.

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ARTICLE I. Name of Society.

The Soriety shall be known by the name, style and tita of "Society of Sons of the Revolution in the State of West Virginia."

## ARTICLE II

Obmets.
The objects of the Society are social, edncational and patriotic, and the society is formed for the particular pur pose of perpetuating the memory of the men who 13 military, naval and civil service of the Colonies and of the (Gontinental Congress, hy their acts or counsel, achieved the Independence of the Oountry; and to, further the proper celebration of the anniversaries of the birthday of Washington, and promincnit events connected with the War of the Revolution; to collect and secure for preservation the manuseripts, records and other docmments relatiner (0) that period: to inspire the members of the Society with the patriotic spiril of their forefathers, and to promote the feeling of fellowship amoner its members

Any male person, above the age of twenty one years, shall be elisible to membership in this Society who is duscended from an ancesior, as the propositus. who, either as a military, naval or marine officer, soldier, salor, or marine, or official in the service of any one of the thirteren original Colonies or States, or of the National Government representing or composod of those Colonies or States, assisted in establishing American Independence during the War of the Revolution, between the $19 t h$ day of April. 1775, when hostilities commenced, and the 19th day of April, 1783 , when they were ordered to cease.

Provided: That whern the elam of eligibility is based on the service of an ancestor in the "minute men" or "militia," it must he satisfactorily shown that such ancestor was actually called into the service of the State or United States, and performed garrison or field duty; and

Provided further: That when the claim of eligibility is basel on the service of an ancestor as a "sailor" or "marine," it must in like manner be shown that such service was other than shore duty and regularly nerformed in the Continental Nayy or the Nary of one of the original thirteen States, or on an armed ressel, other than a merchant ship, which sailed under letters of marque and reprisal. and that such ancestor of the applicant was duly enrolled in the ships company, either as an oflicer, seaman, or otherwise than as a passenger: and

Provided further. That when the clam of aligibility 1 s

Dased on the service of an ancestor at an "ollicial," such sorvie must have been performed in the civil serviee of the L'nited sitates, or of onc of the thirtecon oriminal States, and must have been suflicienty important in character to have rembered the oflicial sperially liable to arrest and imprison ment, the same as a combatant, if capturel by the enemy, as well as liable to eonviction of treason amanst the gov crument of (ifeat Britain.

In the ronstruction of this Artirle, the Voluntrer Aides we ('amp of General Oflieres in Continental Service, who were duly annomeed as such and who actually served in the field doring a campaisn, shall be comprelended as having performed qualifying service.

The eivil oflicials and military forees of the State of Vermont, during the War of the Revolution, shall also be (omprehemed in the same manmer is it they had belonemd fo one of the thirteren oriminal States.

Nos service of ath ancestor shall be deemed as yuatifim! sewice for membership in this society where such ancestor, altor assisting in the catme of American Independence. shall have subsequently either adhered to the enemy, of failed to maintain an honorable record throughout the Wat of the Revohution.

No persen shall he admitted as a member of this someter untess he be eligible muder one of the provisions of this Articte, and muless of grood moral chamater and adjudred worthy of beeming a member.

## ARTICLE, 1

()fficters.

The officers of the Society shatl be a ['resident, a V'itel'resident, a Secretary, a Registrar, a Historian, a Treasurer and a Ohaplain, who shall he chosen by hallot firom amoner the members thereof, annually to serve for the term of ont fear and until their successon* are elected and qualifert.

## ARTICLE V.

Board of Mintghis.
The Board of Managers of the Society shall be five ${ }^{m}$ number, who shall be chosen by ballot from among the members of the society annually to serve for the term of one year and motil their successons are elerted and qualified. The board shall have power to fill vacancies occurring in their own number.

## A RTICLE VI. <br> Abmission of Members.

Every application for nembership shall be made in writing, subscribed by the applicant, and approved by two members over their signatures. Applications shall contain. or be accompanied by, proof of eligibility, and such appli cations and proofs shall be smbmitted to the Board of Managers, who shall have full power to determine the qual ifications of the applicant.

Payment of the initiation fee and subseriphion to the declaration required by the Constitution of this Socjety shall be pre requisites of menbership.

## ARTICI, V III

I) EChafation.

Every member shall declare upon honor that he will condeavor to promote the purposes of this lnstitution and abserve the "Constitution" and "By-Laws" of this society, and, if he lee a "itizen of the I'nited states, shall declare that he will support the Constitution of the l'nited States. sinch declaration shall be in writing, and subsecribed by the member making it.

ABTICLE VIII.
Sume:cts I'ronimten
Ao question involving religious doctrine or the party politic: of the day within the United States shall ever be disculssed or considered in any meeting of this Society.

ARTICLE IX.
Commamoritions.

It shall be a standing regulation that the members shall, when practicable, hold a commemorative celebration and dine together at least once in every year.

## ABTICLE X.

SE.AT.
The seal of the Society shall be one and seren cighthe of an inch in diameter, and shall consist of the figure of a "Minute-man" in Continental mitorm, standing on a ladder leading to a belfry, amd holding in his beft hand a mosket
and an olive branch, and erasping in his right hand a bell rope. Ahove, the cracked "Liberty bell ": issuing there from a ribhon, bearing the motto of the "Bhos of mas Lievolution": *Ereyi Mommmentum Sire Percmminus." Across the top of the ladder, on a ribbon, the figures " 1776, " and at the left of the Mimme-man, and atso on a ribbon, the figures " $185: 3, "$ the year of the ('entennial com memoration of the permanent evacution by the British army of American territory; the whole encireled by a band Ghree-cishths of an inch wide: thereon at the top thirtern stars of fixe points each, and at the bottom the legend, "Sons of the Revohithon:" the following beine a lace simile thereot:


The Secretary shall be the enstodian of the seal, which shall be identical in every particular with this description.

## ABTICLE XI.

Insiunia.
The insignia of the Society shall consist of a badge pendiant from the ribbon by a ring of gold.

The hadge shall be elliptical in form, with escaloped edres, one and one-quarter inches in length, and one and one-eighth inches in width; the whole surmounted by a sold eagle, with wings displayed, inverted. On the obverse sile a madallion of gold in the centre, elliptical in form, heamer on its face the figure of a soldier in Continental miform. with musket slung. Beneath the figures " 1775 ;" the medallion surrounded by thirteen raised gold stars of five points each upon a border of dark blue enamel.
()n the reverse side, in the centre, a medallion, corresponding in form to that on the obverse, and also in goll, hearing on its face Houdon's portrait of Washington in bas relief, encircled by the legend, "Sons of tie Revolumion." Beneath the figures " 1883 ," and upon the reverse of the eagle, the number of the particular badge engraved; the medallion surrounded by a plain gold border conforming in dimensions to the obverse, upon which members may have their names engraved in script.

The ribbon shall be dark blue, ribhed and watered, edged with buff, one and one-half inches wide and one and onehalf inches in displayed length.

The insignia shall be worn by the members conspicuonsly and only on the left breast on all occasions when they shall asscmble as such for any stated purpose or celebration. The badge shall never be worn ats an article of jewelry.

dismimions and Dimenmayth.
No alterations nor amendments of the (:onstitution of thas society shall be made unless notice thereof be duly given in writing, signct by the member proposing the same, at a mersing of the Soricty, and unles the same shall be alopht
ed at a subsequent meeting held at least thirty days after such notice, by a vote of three-fourths of the members present, and in the notices issued for such meeting the fact shall be stated that a proposed amendment to the Consti fution will be considered.

## 䚡. 害 aws.

## SECTION I.

## Fees, Dues and Contributions.

The initiation fee shall be five (5) dollars; the annual dues three (3) dollars, payable on or before the first day of Pebruary in every year: Provided, that any member who shall have been elected during the last three months of the fiscal year shall not be required to pay the annual dues for the current fiscal year. The payment at one time of fifty (50) dollars shall constitute a life membership. The payment at one time of one hundred dollars (100) dollars shall constitute a perpetual or endowed membership, and upon the death of the member so paying, the membership shall be held by his eldest son, or such other descendant from the ancestor from whom he claims as he may nominate; in fitilure of such nomination, the Society may decide which one of the descendents shall hold the membership: Proridert always, that the Society reserves to itself the priv ilege of rejecting any nomination that may not be acecpta hle to it. All of those holding life or endowed memberships shall be exempt from the payment of the initiation fee and annual dues.

SECTION II.
I'mmaneat Finto.
All domations which shall be patil the Noxemety shat: remain forever to the ase of the Soeioty as a l'ermanent Finme, the income only of which may de expented.

SECTION III.

## Anntill Memtati

'The ammal neeting of the Society shall fre hedel on the 6th day of April (except when that day is a simdily. Whe meoting shall be held on the next ensuing (lay) at suth Hace as the board of managers shall ammally determine, of which every member shall have at least thirty days notier. at which a general election of officers ancl manager's bey hallot shall take place. In such clection a majority of the billlots given for any officer or manager shall constitute a choice; but if on the first ballot, no person shall receive such majority, then a further balloting shall take place, in which a plurality of votes given for any oflicer or manaser shall determine the choice.

SECTION バ:
Qeoreme.
St all meetings of the Society ten (10) members shall coustitute a quormu for the fransaction of business.

## SECTION V

PRESTDUNT.

The l'resident, or in his absence the Vice l'resident, or in the absence of both a chairmsh, pro tempore, shall pre side at all meetings of the Gociety, and shall have a castine"
sote. Ho shall pres reworder, athl deride all questions of onder, subject to ant appeal to the sociedy.

## BECTION VI.

The sorretary shall conduct the seneral dorrespondener of the society. He shall notify all members of their chection, and of such other matters as may be reguired bythe society. He shall have charge of the Seal, Certilicate of Incorporation, Constitution, By-Laws and Records of the Suciety, and shall issue certifieates of membership. Ife, together with the presiding ollicer shall certify all acts of the Society and in proper cases authenticate them under seal. He shall affix the seal to all properly authenticated certifiralles of membership and transmit them without delay to the members for whom they shall be issued. He shall, under the direction of the P'resident or Tice-I'resident, give due notice of the time and place of all meetings of the Society, and attend the same. He shall keep fair and aceurate records of all the proceedings and orters of the Society, and shall sive notice to the several officers of all votes, orders, resolves and procecdings of the society affecting them or appertain ing to their respective duties. He shall be Secretary of the Board of Managers and keep the record of their meetings 11 the reenulat minute book of the Society.

## SECTION VII

## TheAstrkefo.

The 'Treasurer shall collect and keep the funds and securities of the society: and so often as those funds shall
amount to one limndred (100) dollars, they shall he depors ited in some bank or banking house to be designated hy the Board of Managers, to the credit of "Society of Sons of The lievolution in the state of West Virginia," and shall be drawn thence on the check of the Treasurer for the purposes of the Society only. Out of these funds he shall pay such sums as may be ordered by the Society, or hy the Board of Managers. Ite shall kecp a true accomet of his receipts and payments, and at each amnual meeting, render it statement of the same to the Society, when a commiliee shall he appointed to audit his accounts. IIe shall give such security as may from time to time be required by the Board of Managers.

## SECTION VIII.

## Remistrak.

The heeristrar shall keep a roll of members, and in lus hands shall be lodged all the proofs of membership qualification, and all the historical and other papers of which the Socicty may become possessed; and he, under the direction of the Board of Managers, shall make copies of such similat documents as the owners thereof may not be willing \{o leate permanently in the kecping of the society.

## SECTION JN.


'Lhe ('haphain shall be a regularly ordaned minister of a Christian denomination, and shall perform such duties as urdinarily appertain to such ollice.

## H1sTいRI.AN

The Instorma, shall keep a detailed record, to he deposited with the Registrar, of all the historical and com memorative celebrations of the society; and he shall edit and prepare for publication such addresses, essays, papers and other documents of an historical character, (other than a Register of Members, as the secretary may be required to publish; and at every annual meeting, if there be a necrolorical list for the year then closing, he shall submit the same with carefully prepared biographenes of tho deceased members.

## SECTION XI

Board of Manatiers.
The Boart of Managers shall judge of the qualifications: of every candidate who shall make proper application for admission to the Society, and shall have power to admit him to nembership if found eligible under the constitution. Three negative votes shall constitute a rejection of the applicant.

They may, through the Secretary, call special meetings of the Society at such times as they may see fit, and shall call such meetings at any time upon the written request of ten members of the Society. They may also arrange for commemorative celebrations by the Society.

They shall recommend plans for promoting the purposes of the Society, and authorize the dishursement and expend iture of mappropriated money in the treasury for the pay
ment of the chrrent expenses of the somety it each ammal meetine of the society they shall make a report in writing.

## SECTION XII.

Orider of Businfes.
At all meetings of the Society and of the Board of Man agers the following order of business shall be observed su far as the same may be applicable:

1. Reading of minntes of prior meetings not previously acted upon.
2. Ehection of Oflicers and Managers when necessary
3. Reports of officers.
4. Reports of Committees.
5. Unfinished business.
fi. Miscellaneons husiness.

## SECTION NII

## Commitefe on Admissions

Tho Chamman of the Board of Managers shall appoint annually three members thereof as a Committee on Admis. sions, whose duty it shall be to pass upon the qualifications of applicants for admission to the Socicty, and report to the Boad of Managers.

## BECTION XIV

Expelsion avo Subpanshan.
The Buard of Managers shall have power to expel any enrolled member of this soreity who, by conduct unbecom-
ing a gentlemen and at man of honor, or by an opposition to the interests of the commmaty in general or of this suciety in particular, may remder himself unworthy to continue a member, or who shall persistently transeress, or, without grow exruse, wilfully neglect or tail in the performance of any obligation enjoined by the Constitution, By-Laws or any standing rule of this society: Provided, that such member shall have received at least ten days notice in writing of the complaint preferred against him, and of the time and place for hearing the same, and have been thereby aflorded an opportunity to be heard in person.

Whenerer the canse of expulsion shall not have involved turpitude or moral unworthiness, any member thus expel led may upon the unanimous recommendation of the Board of Managers, but not otherwise, be restored to member. ship by the Society at any meeting.

The Board of Managers shall drop from the Roll the name of any enrolled member of the Society who shall be two years in arrear in the payment of dues, and who, on notice to pay the same, shall fail and neglect to do so within thirty days thereafter, and upon being thus dropped, his memfership shall cease and determine; but he may be restored to membership at any time by the Board of Managers, on his application therefor, and upon his payment of all such arrears and of the anmual dues from the date when he was dropped to the date of his restoration. The Board of managers may also susperd any officer from the performance of his duties, for cause; which proceeding must be roported to the socjety and acted upon by it within
thirty days either hy rescision of the shepension or removal of the suspended oflicer from office or otherwise the sus. pension shall cease

## SECTI()N XV

Resignation
No resignation or voluntary withdrawal from member ship by any member enrolled in this Society shall become collective as a release from the obligations thereof, unless consenfed to amd accepted by the Boand of Managers.

SECTION XVI.

1) mequahfication

No person who may be emrolled as a momber of this so ciety shall be permitted to continue in membership when the proofs of claim of qualitication by descent shall be found to be defective and insuflicient to substantiate such claim, or not properly authenticated. The Society, or the Board of Managers, may, at any time after thirty days nolice to such person to properly substantiate or authenticate his claim, require the Secretary to erase his name from the list of members, and such person shall thereupon cease to be a member; Provided, he shall have failed or neglected to comply satisfactorily with such notice.

Where the Board of Managers shall direct the erasure of a person's name for a cause comprehended under this section, such person shall have a right of appeal to the next annual meeting of the Society; but he shall not he restored to membership unless by a vote of three-fourths of the members present on that occasion, or at a subsequent meet
