PURPOSES AND OBJECTS.

"The purposes and objects of this Society are declared to be patriotic, historical, and educational, and shall include those intended or designed to perpetuate the memory of the men who, by their services or sacrifices during the war of the American Revolution, achieved the independence of the American people: to unite and promote fellowship among their descendants: to inspire them and the community at large with a more profound reverence for the principles of the Government founded by our forefathers; to encourage historical research in relation to the American Revolution; to acquire and preserve the records of the individual services of the patriots of the war, as well as documents, relics, and landmarks; to mark the scenes of the Revolution by appropriate memorials; to celebrate the anniversaries of the prominent events of the war and of the Revolutionary period; to foster true patriotism; to maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom, and to carry out the purposes expressed in the preamble of the Constitution of our country and the injunctions of Washington in his farewell address to the American people."

QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP.

Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of twenty-one years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is a lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times unfailing in his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militianan or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence, or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence, or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature, or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain.

REASONS FOR MEMBERSHIP.

It is a practical way of honoring a man's patriotic forefathers. It preserves for future generations the family pedigrees of members back to the period of the Revolution. Membership in this Society *insures* the preservation of two sets of the records filed, one by the State Registrar, and one by the Registrar General at Washington.

The Society encourages continued public interest in the men and events of the American Revolution;

To the youth of the families of members it teaches important lessons of patriotism and good citizenship;

By celebrating the important events of the Revolution, it recalls to memory the objects of that struggle and the principles for which our forefathers fought;

It leads to the marking of battlefields, routes of march and historic sites, by monuments and tablets; and to the preservation of historic buildings from destruction;

It encourages, and contributes to, the work of preserving and arranging in form accessible to the public, the priceless documents, letters and other relics of Revolutionary times;

By a wide distribution of leaflets, printed in words that all can understand, it teaches the millions of aliens in the United States what the Nation stands for, what it means for them to become a part of the body politic, participating in the duties and responsibilities of active citizens in an intelligent manner;

It is non-sectarian, non-political, uniting in friendly relationship men of all creeds, men of the North, South, East, and West.

[&]quot;The man who feels no sentiment of veneration for the memory of his forefathers; who has no natural regard for his ancestors, or his kindred, is himself unworthy of kindred regard, or remembrance."

HOW TO BECOME A MEMBER.

Trace your lineage back to the period of the Revolution through paternal and maternal lines and ascertain the names and residences of all male lineal ancestors of proper age for active participation in the struggle for Independence. This search may be guided by family papers and traditions, by published and original probate and land records of towns and counties, and by tombstone inscriptions. Search printed and manuscript records of military and naval service. Where two or more men of the same name are recorded from the same locality, identify as your own ancestor the one upon whom claim is based. Names of German, Dutch, or French origin may be disguised by translation into English or by various phonetic spellings.

Individual membership is through one of the State Societies. Every member of a State Society is *ipso facto* a member of the National Society.

Application for membership is made on standard blanks furnished by the Society. These blanks call for the place and date of birth and of death of the Revolutionary ancestor, and the year of birth, of marriage, and of death of ancestors in intervening generations. Membership is based on one original claim. When an applicant claims descent from more than one Revolutionary ancestor, additional claims are filed on supplemental papers. The application and supplementals are made in duplicate. One copy remains with the State Society, and one copy is permanently preserved in the Registrar General's office where a reference card index is kept of members' names and of their Revolutionary ancestors.

In referring to printed books the volume and page should be given.

Reference to authorities in manuscript must be accompanied by certified copies and authentic family records submitted, if required. Every application must be accompanied by \$5.00 (three dollars for membership fee and two dollars for annual dues for first year), and must be signed and sworn to by the applicant and endorsed by a member of the Society.

Application blanks may be obtained from the Secretary or the Registrar of the State Society, and when filled out should be forwarded to the Registrar, Mr. Frederick Bostwick, 144 Grove Street, New Haven, Conn.

A Certificate of Membership, steel engraved and engrossed, 18 x 24 inches in size, is furnished to all new members upon joining the Society.

On ceremonial occasions the insignia of the Society may be worn by any member. To secure the insignia it is necessary to procure a permit fom the Secretary General through the State Secretary. Upon receiving the permit from the Secretary General the insignia can be obtained from J. E. Caldwell & Co., Philadelphia. Price, silver, gold plated, \$9.00.

Lapel buttons ("rosettes") may be worn at any time when the badge is not worn. Additional buttons may be obtained from the State Secretary for 25 cents each.

SOME ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE CONNECTICUT SOCIETY

of the

Sons of the American Revolution.

This list, except for a few additions, is taken from one printed in the National Register of the Society of the Sons of the American Revolution for 1902, which was prepared for that publication by Jonathan Trumbull.

The Connecticut Society has preserved the following historic landmarks in the State:

1. The Lebauon War Office at Lebauon, Commecticut, in which were held the meetings of the Council of Safety during the Revolution. This Council was appointed by the General Assembly of Connecticut early in the war, with power to forward troops, munitions of war and supplies, together with other powers, making the Council a substitute for the General Assembly when that body was not in session.

The building was restored and repaired by the Connecticut Society in 1891, is owned by that Society, and is now used as a public library and depository of Revolutionary relics.

For further particulars see "The Lebanon War Office," published by the Society in 1892.

2. The Nathan Hale Schoolhouse at New London. This building in which Nathan Hale taught from May, 1774, to July, 1775, at which time he joined the Army, has been purchased by the Connecticut Society, with the assistance of the Daughters of the American Revolution. It has been restored to its original condition, and removed to public ground granted for the purpose. The building was dedicated, with appropriate ceremonies, on the 17th of June, 1901. It is now occupied as the headquarters of the Lucretia Shaw Chapter, D. A. R.

At Compo Beach in Westport, Connecticut, there was dedicated on June 17, 1910, a monument which represents "The Minute Man," a life size statue of a Revolutionary Patriot. This memorial was erected by the Connecticut Society of the Sons of the American Revolution to commemorate the resistance to the landing on April 25, 1777, of the British troops under General Tryon for their march to Danbury.

The Society has contributed to the preservation of the Putnam Wolf Den at Pomfret, Connecticut, which has now been acquired by an organization for the purpose of preserving this landmark in commemoration of the youthful heroism of General Israel Putnam.

In 1906 the Society contributed to the fund which was being raised for "The Memorial Annex" to be added to the Groton Monument House, at Groton, Connecticut.

It has restored and preserved the memorials at Lebanon erected over the remains of Jonathan Trumbull, the Governor, and William Williams, the Signer.

It should not be forgotten in this connection that to The Connecticut Society The National Society gives the credit of inaugurating the movement which resulted in the establishment of Flag Day on June 14th.

Bronze tablets have been placed as follows:

June 29, 1894.—On the elm tree in front of the Wadsworth Atheneum in Hartford, commemorating the first visit of Washington to Connecticut. See Year Book, 1895-6, p. 47. This tablet, since the removal of the tree, has been in the rooms of the Connecticut Historical Society.

July 5, 1895.— At Beacon Hill, New Haven, commemorating the defence of New Haven at the time of Tryon's invasion, July 5, 1779. The proceedings at the ceremony, with addresses in full, are recorded in a book published by the David Humphreys Branch of the Society.

June 17, 1896.— In the Lebanon War Office, indicating the character of the building, and recording the names of some of the prominent men in the Revolution who have been within its walls. See Year Book, 1897-9, p. 51.

June 17, 1901.—In the Nathan Hale Schoolhouse at New London, commemorating the service and martyrdom of Nathan Hale, and indicating the character of the building.

June 6, 1904.— Upon the front of the Union League Club in New Haven in memory of Roger Sherman. The inscription on this tablet states that upon the site of this building stood the home of Roger Sherman, and near here in 1793 he died.

July 4, 1913.— The Col. Jeremiah Wadsworth Branch placed a bronze tablet on the Wadsworth Atheneum to mark the site of the home of Col. Jeremiah Wadsworth, Commissary General of the American Forces in the War for Independence and a trusted friend of George Washington and "Brother Jonathan Trumbull." Here in 1775 he entertained Washington on his way to assume command of the Continental Army at Cambridge. In the southwest chamber Washington met the French Commander Count Rochambeau and considered the plans which in October resulted in the fall of the British power in America.

June 27, 1914.—A bronze tablet was placed on the Hotel Taft in New Haven to mark the site of the old Beers Tavern where Washington remained over night on his way to Cambridge.

June 27, 1914.—A bronze tablet was placed at Westport marking the spot where the Farmers made a stand against the British during the famous raid on Danbury during the Revolutionary War.

The Society has issued, upon carefully attested applications, 2,000 bronze grave markers, designating graves of Revolutionary Soldiers and Patriots in the State. These marks were designed by a member of the Society, and adopted for the purpose of marking graves of Revolutionary Patriots throughout the State.

The Society has, in several years, awarded prizes of \$100.00 each year, for excellence in original essays on subjects connected with the American Revolution, by pupils in schools throughout the State.

The publications of the Society have been Year Book for 1891, 214 pages, Octavo, Year Book for 1892, 274 pages, Octavo, Year Book for 1893-4, 450 pages, Octavo, Year Book for 1895-6, 614 pages, Octavo, Year Book for 1897, '98, '99, 701 pages, Octavo, Year Book for 1900, '01, '02, '03, 854 pages, Octavo, The Lebanon War Office, 1896, 96 pages.

The David Humphreys Branch of the Society has published "Songs of the Revolution," 1893, "Exercises at the Unveiling of the Beacon Hill Tablet," 1895, and "Revolutionary Characters in New Haven," 1911. The last named publication contains a large amount of historical information not heretofore published.

A pamphlet containing the addresses and describing the ceremonies connected with the unveiling of the Compo Beach Memorial was arranged and published by Henry C. Sherwood, of The Gen, Gold Selleck Silliman Branch of Bridgeport.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I

NAME.

The name of this Society shall be The Connecticut Society of the Sons of the American Revolution.

ARTICLE II.

NATIONAL SOCIETY.

This Society is a part of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. It recognizes all State Societies of Sons of the American Revolution as coequal and entitled to receive from this Society such assistance and information as may best promote the objects for which these societies have been organized.

ARTICLE III.

OBJECTS.

The objects of this Society are to perpetuate the memory and the spirit of the men who achieved American Independence; to encourage historical research in relation to the American Revolution; to preserve documents, relics, and records of the individual services of Revolutionary soldiers and patriots; to mark, by appropriate monuments, historic places within this State; to promote the celebration of patriotic anniversaries, and by these and similar means to impress upon the present and future generations the patriotic spirit which actuated our ancestors and established the Republic of the United States of America.

ARTICLE IV.

MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1. Any man not less than twenty-one years of age, who is descended from an ancestor who with unfailing loyalty

rendered material aid to the cause of American Independence in the War of the American Revolution, either as a military or naval officer, sailor, soldier, or official in the service of any of the original thirteen Colonies or States, or Vermont, or as a recognized patriot whose services are of public record, shall be eligible for membership in this Society, if found worthy.

HONORARY MEMBERS.

Sec. 2. Women may be admitted as honorary members, subject to the conditions as to age and descent established in the case of active members

APPLICATION.

SEC. 3. All applications for membership in this Society shall be made in duplicate, upon blank forms furnished by the Society. They shall be signed with the full name and address of the applicant, and shall also be signed by at least one member of the Society nominating and recommending the applicant.

ARTICLE V.

OFFICERS.

The Officers of this Society shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Registrar, an Historian, and a Chaplain, who shall be elected by ballot for the term of one year, and shall continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified.

ARTICLE VI.

BOARD OF MANAGERS.

Section 1. There shall be a Board of Managers whose duty it shall be to conduct the affairs of the Society, which Board shall consist of the officers of this Society, the delegates to the National Society, the Secretaries of the several branches of this Society, *ex-officio*, and fifteen others.

SEC. 2. The Board of Managers shall have power to fill any vacancy occurring among the officers of the Society, the members of the Board, or delegates to the National Society.

ARTICLE VII.

MEETINGS.

- Section 1. A meeting for the election of officers and the transaction of business shall be held annually, in the City of Hartford, on the 14th day of June (the anniversary of Connecticut's Declaration of Independence), or if said day falls on Sunday, then on the following day; and a meeting for social purposes shall be held annually at such a time and place as the Board of Managers may determine. At each annual meeting there shall be elected, in addition to the officers provided for in Article V, fifteen members of the Board of Managers, one delegate-at-large, and one delegate for each fifty or fraction of fifty exceeding twenty-five members; said delegates, together with such officers as are provided for by the Constitution of that body, shall represent this Society in all meetings of the National Society.
- SEC. 2. Ten members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of this Society.
- SEC. 3. The hour for holding the annual meeting shall be 12 o'clock, noon; and the time and place for holding any special meeting shall be designated by the Board of Managers.
- SEC. 4. Special meetings of the Society shall be called by the President, when directed so to do by the Board of Managers, or whenever requested in writing by fifteen or more members, on giving fifteen days' notice, specifying the time and place of such meeting and the business to be transacted.
- SEC. 5. Special meetings of the Board of Managers may be called by the President at any time, and shall be called upon the request of five members of the Board, made in writing. Five members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board.
- SEC. 6. General business may be transacted at any special meeting of the Board of Managers or of the Society.

ARTICLE VIII.

BRANCHES.

LOCAL ORGANIZATION,

Section 1. Ten members of this Society residing in any town or county of this state may send a written request to the Board of Managers, asking authority to associate as a Branch of this Society in such town or county; and the Board of Managers may grant such request.

NAME

OFFICERS.

Sec. 3. Each Branch may have a President, Secretary, and Treasurer, and such other officers as the by-laws of the Branch may determine.

MEMBERS.

Sec. 4. No person shall be admitted into a Branch, as a member, until after his admission into the State Society in the manner provided by the Constitution and Laws of this Society, and until he has paid the annual dues and fees as provided by said laws. And any member suspended or expelled, or in any way losing his membership in the State Society, shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Branch.

BY-LAWS.

SEC. 5. Each Brauch may make by-laws, rules, and regulations for its government so long as such by-laws, rules and regulations do not conflict with the Constitution and By-Laws of this Society, or with the Charter, Constitution, and By-Laws of the National Society.

ARTICLE IX.

AMENDMENTS.

This Constitution may be amended or repealed, provided written resolutions to that effect are first presented to, and approved by, a majority of the Board of Managers present at any meeting of said Board; provided said amendments are subsequently approved by a majority of the members present at any meeting of the Society; and provided, further, that whenever this Constitution is to be amended, repealed, or in any way changed, notice thereof, specifying said changes in full, shall be sent to each member of the Society at least ten days before such action is to be taken.

BY-LAWS

FEES AND DUES.

Section 1. Applicants elected by the Board of Managers shall become members of this Society upon payment of the membership fee and dues for one year. For active members, the membership fee shall be three dollars and the annual dues two dollars. For honorary members, the membership fee shall be fifty cents and the annual dues fifty cents. The payment of thirty dollars by an active member, or of five dollars by an honorary member at any one time shall constitute the person paying such sum a life member, and such person shall thereafter be exempt from payment of annual dues.

Annual dues shall be payable to the Treasurer by enrolled members on the 10th day of May in each year, but new members qualifying between the beginning of the calendar year and the date of the annual meeting shall not be liable for the payment of dues during the next succeeding society year.

A member who shall remain in arrears for dues for three months after notice of his indebtedness has been mailed to him, directed at his last known residence, may be dropped from the rolls by the Board of Managers, and may be reinstated in his membership by said Board upon the payment of his indebtedness to the Society.

Applications for membership shall be accompanied by the membership fee and one year's dues; which sum shall be refunded in case the application shall not be approved, or the applicant shall fail of election.

PERMANENT FUNDS.

SEC. 2. All receipts from life membership shall be set aside and invested under the direction of the Board of Managers as a Permanent Fund, of which only the income shall be used for the payment of ordinary expenses.

MEMORIAL FUND.

SEC. 3. There shall be a Memorial Fund to be used for the preservation of graves and monuments of Revolutionary soldiers and patriots; the marking of historic spots; and the purchase of historic places and buildings. This fund shall consist of all receipts from bequests, special subscriptions, and any regular funds of the Society, voted by the Board of Managers.

SOCIAL MEETINGS.

SEC. 4. The Society shall hold an annual meeting for the purpose of celebrating some event in Revolutionary history, the time and place of holding such meeting to be determined by the Board of Managers; and said Board shall also determine the manner of such celebration.

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

SEC. 5. The regular meetings of the Board of Managers shall be held on the third Tuesday of April and October in each year.

PRESIDING OFFICER.

Sec. 6. The President, or in his absence the Vice-President, or in their absence a chairman *pro tem.*, shall preside at all meetings of the Society and of the Board of Managers, and shall have a casting vote. The presiding officer shall preserve order and shall decide all questions of order, subject to appeal to the meeting.

DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT.

SEC. 7. The President shall be the official head of the Society. He shall perform such duties as usually pertain to that office and as are designated in these By-Laws.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

Sec. 8. The Secretary shall conduct the general correspondence of the Society, shall notify members of their election and of such other matters as the Society may direct. He shall have charge of the seal, and of such records of the Society as are not

herein given especially in charge of other officers of the Society; and, together with the presiding officer, he shall certify all acts and orders of the Society. He shall, under direction of the President or acting President, give notice of the time and place of all meetings of the Society and of the Board of Managers, and shall give such notices of the votes, orders, and proceedings of the Society as the Society or Board of Managers may direct.

DUTIES OF THE TREASURER.

SEC. 9. The Treasurer shall receive and have charge of the funds of the Society; he shall deposit the same in the name of the Society, and shall pay out for the benefit of the Society only, in such sums as the Society or Board of Managers may direct, or upon the order of the Secretary, countersigned by the President. He shall keep a true account of his receipts and disbursements, and at each annual meeting shall make a full report to the Society. His accounts shall be audited by a committee to be appointed at the annual meeting. The books of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be open to the inspection of the President and Board of Managers at all times.

DUTIES OF THE REGISTRAR.

SEC. 10. The Registrar shall receive all applications and proofs of membership. He shall examine the same and report his opinion thereon to the Board of Managers. Imperfect and incorrect applications may be returned to the applicant by the Registrar for correction or completion. After applications have been passed upon by the Board of Managers, he shall, if the applicant is accepted, forward one copy to the Registrar General of the National Society, and shall make a record of such parts of said application as he deems necessary, in a book of forms prepared for that purpose. The original application with the accompanying proofs shall be kept on file. He shall also have the custody of all historical, geographical, and genealogical books, papers, manuscripts, and relics of which the Society may become possessed. He shall receive twenty-five cents for recording each accepted application, and shall make a report in writing at each annual meeting.

BOARD OF MANAGERS.

SEC. 11. The Board of Managers shall judge of the qualifications of applicants for membership, and shall have control of the affairs of the Society. They shall appoint an auditing committee and a committee on necrology. They shall have the power to suspend or expel any member of the Society for sufficient cause, by vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board present at any regular or special meeting; provided that at least two weeks' notice of such proposed action shall have been given to such member by notice mailed to him at his last known address. A member so suspended or expelled shall have the right to appeal to a meeting of the Society from the action of the Board of Managers.

DUTIES OF THE HISTORIAN.

Sec. 12. The Historian shall keep a record of all facts in connection with the Society which he may judge to be of historic value and shall make a report in writing at each annual meeting.

DUTIES OF THE CHAPLAIN.

Sec. 13. The Chaplain shall perform such devotional and religious duties as may be called for by the Board of Managers in the course of business or exercises of the Society.

AUDITORS.

SEC. 14. Two Auditors shall be chosen by the Society by ballot at its annual meeting. They shall audit the Treasurer's accounts for the year following the date of their election, and shall report to the Society at its annual meeting after their election.

AMENDMENTS.

SEC. 15. These By-Laws shall not be altered, amended, or repealed unless such alteration or amendment shall have been proposed in writing at a previous meeting of the Board of Managers and entered upon the records, with the name of the member proposing the change, and also adopted by a majority of the members present at a regular meeting of the Society, or at a special meeting called for that purpose.
