Dear Friend May:

As our friend Wallcut has opened this letter, (according to the discretion you left with him,) to see what are its contents, I improve the opportunity to say, that I saw some of the Hubbardston friends, at Gardner, and promised them I would attend a conventional meeting in H. on Sunday, August 3rd; so you may make the arrangements accordingly. Who will be with me on the occasion? One will be sufficient, and I should like to have your company, if convenient. I think two speakers are sufficient at the meetings, besides it being more economical. The collection at G. was \$12.50 above the local expenses.

I am willing to go to Lowell on the 10th, but should like to make it sine qua non that Phillips shall go with me. We must try to bring it about, if we can.

I hope to meet you at Milford on Sunday.

I will speak to friend Jackson about seeing Mitchell immediately.
