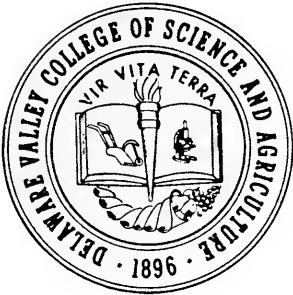

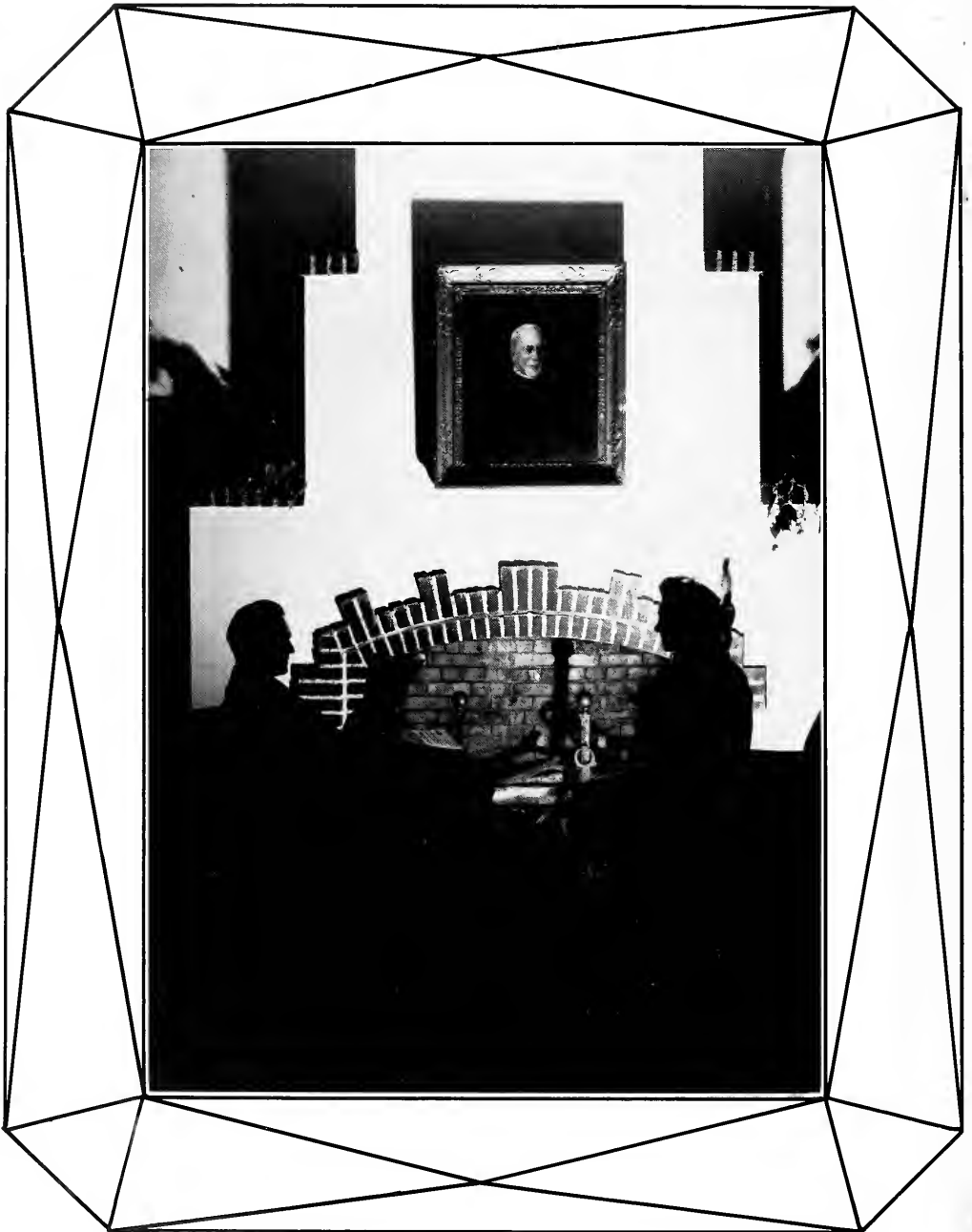
The Alma Mater

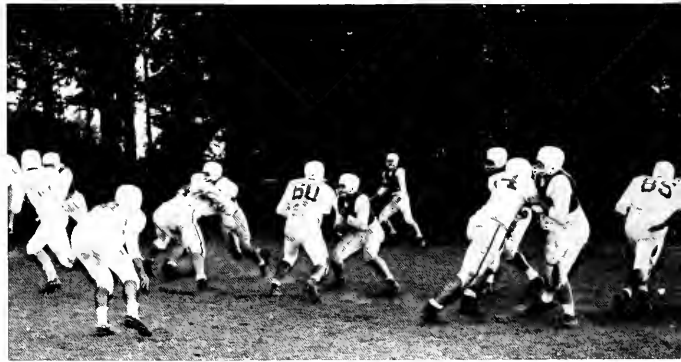

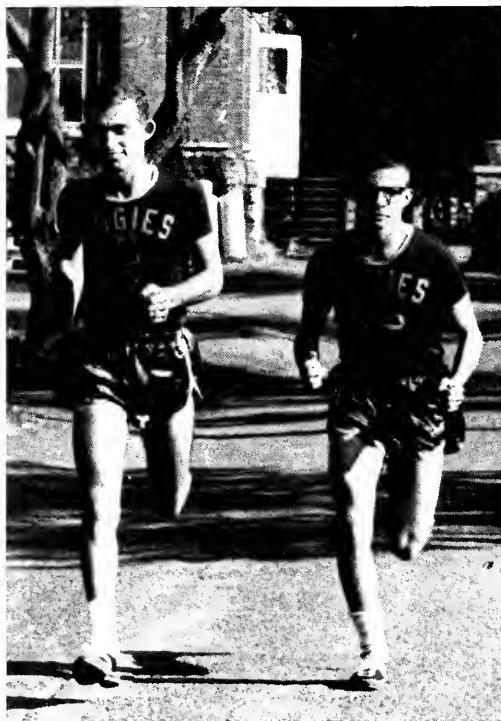

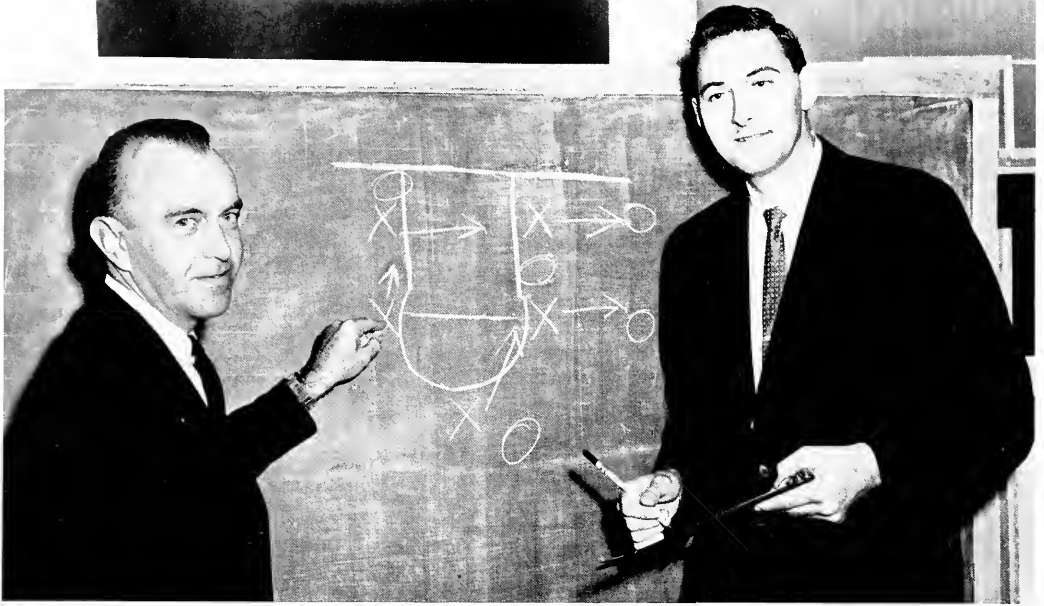

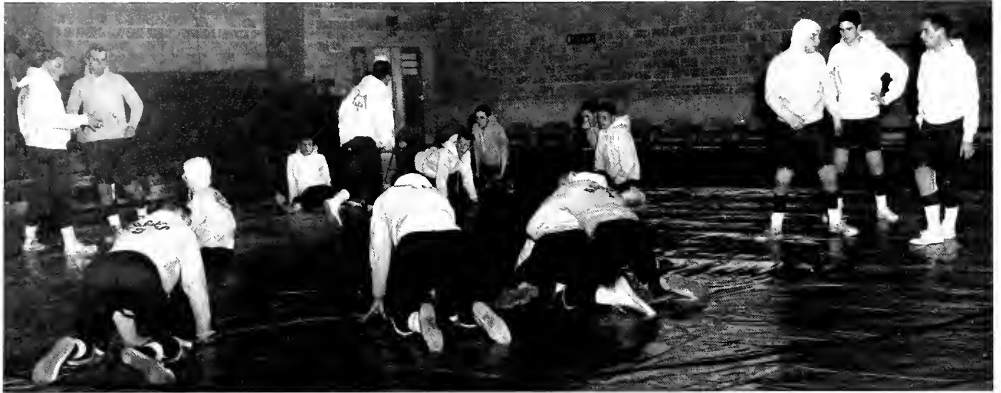

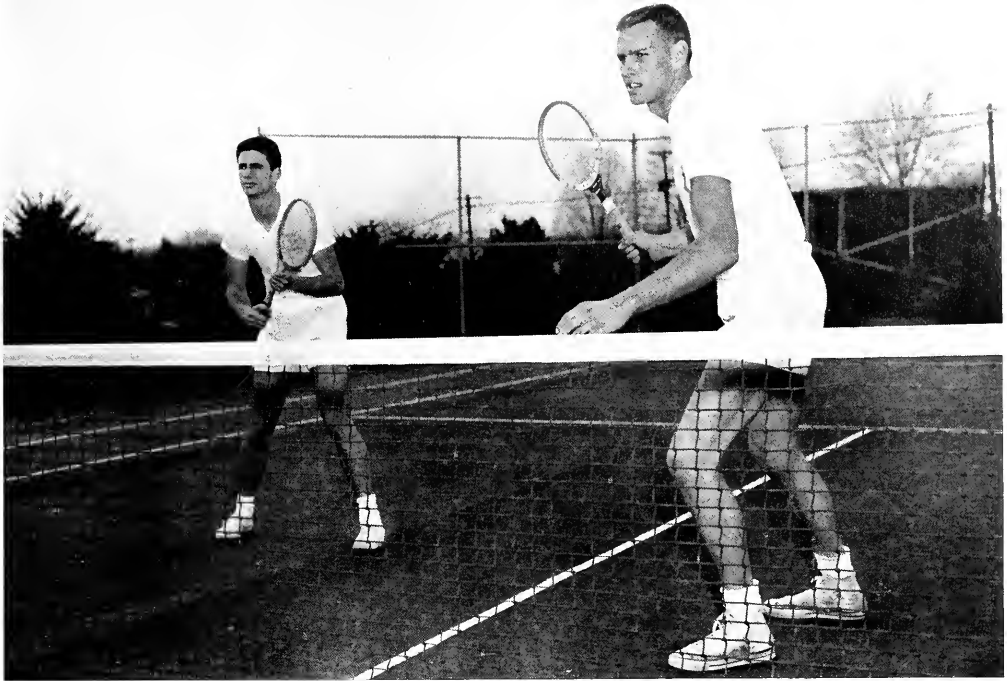
